



Broadcasters Fight Restrictive Legislation

RACTICALLY unnoticed by the general public, there is being waged in Washington a bitter fight against legislation which, according to some members of the radio industry, menaces the very existence of broadcasters and threatens practically to eliminate much of the best program material now offered the public.

The battle revolves around what is known as the automatic copyright bill introduced by Congressman Vestal of Indiana, already passed by the House of Representatives and expected soon to come before the Senate. Under this legislation, all literary works would automatically become copyrighted and broadcasters using them without license subject to heavy penalties for infringement.

The automatic copyright, it is charged by broadcasting interests, would open the way for "racketeering," since it would give to authors, composers, and publishers the right to charge what they pleased for permission to perform their compositions, and to make whatever regulations surrounding such performance as they saw fit.

The average broadcasting station, it was declared during hearings on the bill before the Senate patents committee, uses about two hundred different pieces of copyright music a day. They now operate under licenses. The Vestal bill would enable the composers to demand a totally different arrangement from that which is now in force.

Under the bill, the committee was told, it would be possible to collect royalties from every station broadcasting a chain program in which copyright music was used. Further, the automatic copyright provision would make it impossible for a broadcaster to determine whether a particular composition was protected, and many stations would not dare use material of a doubtful nature, since to do so might render them subject to severe penalties for infringement.

If the legislation is to be enacted, it was urged, there should be a provision that only the station originating a chain program should be held subject to action in case of suit for violation of copyright. Otherwise, it was pointed out, a large number of broadcasters who used the program in good faith, relying upon the originating station to see that the law was not violated and themselves having no power or means of deleting any part of the program, might find themselves facing suits for heavy damages.


Why Squawk, Says E. W.

MICROPHONE GOSSIP

- • Dick Rickard, master of ceremonies for the Don Lee chain's morning "Feminine Fancies" program has had a varied and colorful career in spite of his extreme youth. He has made fourteen round trips to Alaska on passenger vessels, and a half a dozen to the Orient on the Dollar liners. For several months he was connected with an aviation experiment to determine if radio broadcasting could be carried on successfully from an airplane. During that time he was in the air each day. He is a graduate of the University of Washington, majoring in English literature.
- Caryl Coleman, NBC producer, started his career, like so many radio folk, on the stage. More properly speaking, it was a tent show. Caryl was in his 'teens, and thrilled with pride when they gave him the juvenile lead part in "Old Homestead." He earned \$18 a week, which looked bigger to him at that time than any of the salaries he has won since.
- • Sam Wineland, KFWB's fine musical director, has a background of both concert and microphone training, and an unusual ability to direct classical and popular programs. He started out at the tender age of ten being a child prodigy, and when he was sixteen Luigi von Kunitz, eminent Austrian violinist and concert master, was so impressed by his talent that he took the youthful virtuoso to Vienna. He studied at the Brussel Conservatory for two years under Cesar Thomas, and had, as a fellow student, the American composer, Charles Wakefield Cadman.
- Stuart Strong, who is heard on KJBS every week-day at 8:30 a.m. as The Observer is rapidly extending his activities in the field of special announcing. Although his continuous microphone experience is of less than a year's duration, Stuart has a distinguished service record as a speaker, won in the 1928 presidential campaign, and at the University of California, where he participated in thirty-seven intercollegiate forensic battles. His hobbies are dogs, basket-ball and work.

- • Marie Leon, soprano of San Jose who is now singing over KPO, belongs to one of the oldest and most prominent families. Her grandfather, Lazard Lion, came to California in 1845 and in 1852 opened a store in San Francisco on the site which is now occupied by a leading department store. Later he went to San Jose and opened a furniture store, which is still flourishing—the institution celebrating its seventy-fifth anniversary this month. Miss Leon is a niece of the late Ed Jobson, famous character actor of the movies. Miss Leon is a regular artist of the 9:30 to 10:30 Wednesday morning periods.
- • The rewards of right living are not always what one expects, according to Clarence C. Moore, bass soloist and announcer at KOA, Denver. Moore has gone to church all his life. One Sunday recently he directed the choir, sang a solo, and helped pass the collection plate. Then on the way out, he slipped on the steps and for the next two weeks had to walk on crutches.
- • The capacity of Carric Andrew's bantam Austin was strained not long ago when Clarence Talbot, KGA's "diminutive" six foot four inch announcer with his camelhair coat, Bob Crosby, brother to the famous Bing, and Carric Andrew with his heavy camel-hair coat, all loaded themselves within the limits of poor "Betsy Austin" even to the point of closing the doors. Needless to say, the unloading caused commotion.
- • Tommy Harris, KFRC popular singer, featured daily on the Happy Go Lucky Hour, is making personal appearances at the Roof Garden Cafe on Saturday nights.
- • Vernon Rickard, radio tenor, well known on the Pacific Coast for his beautiful interpretations of popular ballads and musical comedy and light opera songs—also appearing in leading rôles in stage productions of several well-known musical comedies, is heard from KMTR every week on several programs with the studio orchestra.
