


S OME three hundred years ago a weary band of storm tossed refugees landed upon America's New England coast and dedicated a new country to personal liberty and freedom from persecution. The most precious heritage bequeathed to every American by history and preserved by the Constitution of the United States is the right to "life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness."

By the martyrdom of our forbears and the fundamental law of the land we are adjured to be *tolerant*, to exercise *forbearance*, to refrain from forcing our views and preferences on others, to practice the *Golden Rule* doing unto others as we would have them do unto us.

Likewise the advertisers who provide fine programs are entitled to consideration. These programs cost advertisers Yet they make no direct huge sums. charge. They depend entirely on your appreciation expressed in voluntary PA-TRONAGE, to pay the bill. When you like a program show this appreciationeven go out of your way to actually BUY the product or service whose originators make possible such programs. And be sure to tell the merchant you are buying that brand because you heard it advertised over the radio.

There will be better radio programs and more of them, and controversies on the subject will cease ONLY with the universal application of the Golden Rule —and the conscientious patronage of deserving raido advertisers.

More Suggestions

A recent annual subscriber, but a weekly purchaser for nearly three years, I feel like adding to a very imperfect ballot with certain comments on other letters, etc.

Mrs. Gertrude B.'s suggestion for stacoöperation is excellent. Inevitably tion peoples' tastes vary. While I dislike jazz intensely I realize some like it and it would not be fair to ignore their likes to meet mine. But it is more than irritating to search over the dial for some "decent" music in vain. We used to have the radio on regularly during dinner, somewhere between 6 and 7 p. m., since the time change we have had to quit! It seems to me the Lucky Strike was passable two or three years ago, now it is hopeless, and the same wretched stuff three evenings a week is rather steep. The "Packard" program used to be dandy; the last two evenings impossible. To lie in bed and listen to the radio used to be great; at times now one has to shut it off-last evening (Saturday) for example. My radio is a Philco nine-tube, so can get a good many stations. But power lines are very troublesome and reception varies in consequences. One can generally be sure during the day to get KFI, KPO, KGO, KFRC, KTAB if code signals don't interfere-which they do very often, and sometimes extending way up the dial. Ten-thirty a. m. today (Sunday) only KPO available below KHJ, and now the "Yeast Foamers!" Why jazz Sunday morning? Between code and power noises reception is bad; KHJ poor and the only other station just now is KROW (I think), pretty poor. L. W. L. has the idea too; let those who want jazz, speeches, "poor" music of one sort and another have their innings, but surely it ought to be possible for some station that can be heard normally to provide decent music at the same time; not necessarily "heavy" stuff; opera is good, but there is a lot of lighter music that is really musical.

Cannot stations be given in the WEEKLY in regular order every day? Alphabetically,

for example. Now one has to search for a particular station, and rarely is it in the same place two days running. Given that change the WEEKLY would be almost perfect, more so if some other stations were included regularly, such as KTM and if the chains other than NBC and CBS were listed regularly too. It would help if the keys were given for the chain stations; one can't remember all of them. Some organ programs are fine, example from the Tabernacle; but it is rather irritating to go to bed expecting a good organ, then have to get out and shut off the radio because jazz comes instead. I realize changes will occur too late for correction at times, but I do wonder whether some could not be avoided.

This is intended as constructive criticism and represents the ideas of a good number. By such expressions of opinion improvements may follow.

HIEF among the distinguishing traits of Dorothy Churchill, KFWI, San · Francisco, staff artist (aside from her unusually pleasing lyric coloratura voice) is the fact that she does not love to cook, hates housekeeping, and cares not a tinker's



darn for the Italian dishes. Thoroughly cosmopolitan, having studied and lived in New York and most of the European capitals, sung in successful operattas, and worked in pictures in Hollywood, she is now a San Franciscan by choice.

And how's this for versatility? She personally manages a

DOROTHY CHURCHILL large estate near Napa, voraciously devours the financial pages in the dailies, and as a pet hobby supports a school for poor mountain children in Tennessee.

On the air Miss Churchill does the "better things" so well that obstinate program directors won't let her realize her pet yen to sing jazz.

N Reno, Nevada, they called Ted White "the tenor who sings the soul of a song." It wasn't a press agent who coined the expression, but a music critic, and radio audiences, wherever Ted is heard, echo the thought.

This dark-haired, slow-smiling, slow-talking lad with the soft Southern accent, who is a frequent soloist with NBC's Vagabonds, didn't intend to be a singer when he left college. It was his ambition to become a good newspaper man, but after he achieved that aim, destiny drew him to an entirely different path.

Oddly enough, it was a national tragedy-President Harding's death-which changed Ted's whole life. Sent from New York to San Francisco by the United Press to cover the departure of the Harding funeral train, Ted's tenor voice, raised in informal singing among the newspaper men gathered on the coast from all sections of the country, roused comment. Ted had always liked to sing, but never took his voice seriouslyin fact, he never even joined the Glee Club at Columbia University while he was a student there.

But members of the San Francisco Press Club insisted he sing at a club concert, so

Ted good-naturedly did so. Then the Bohemian Club, San Francisco's famed and exclusive organization of writers, painters and celebrities, asked him to sing at the annual jinx in Bohemian Grove, Still willing to please, Ted consented, and was surprised to find an offer of a vaudeville contract waiting him when he returned to San Francisco.

He balanced the sum it offered against his salary as a newspaper man, and was shocked at the difference. Telegraphed his resignation to the New York office of the United Press, and became a singer in earnest. His vaudeville tour ended in the East, but a night club in New York quickly of-fered him a job. Since then, six busy years of continuous warbling in varied parts of the world have followed. Ted has sung in Havana, Panama City, Shanghai, China, Reno, and other spots where good singers are in demand.

Old-time Nevadans and brief residents in Reno, divorce bound, alike appreciated the unusual quality Ted brought to every song, a quality which lies either in his voice or his manner of singing-his followers can't decide which.

At any rate, that business of "singing the soul of a song" is said to have reconciled more than one prospective divorced couple. one or both of whose members were in Reno.

When Ruth Roland decided to produce Cornelius Vanderbilt's book "Reno" as a film, she imported Ted to Hollywood as an outstanding piece of Reno's "local color." The picture "flopped"

but Ted got over in Hollywood just as he had done in Reno, and signed a radio contract.

When NBC's Artist's Service signed him for appeaarnces in San Francisco, it was his first engagement in this city since he arrived here to cover the Hard- 🖡 ing train's departure.

Athen's Tennessee,, where his father was a well-known physician. His favorite diversions are swimming, at which he is an expert, gardening, at which he is an enthusiastic amateur and books. Lous Bromfield and D. H. Lawrence are his favorite authors.

S ELDY ROACH, NBC actor who is known as "Dad' Roach to countless followers in western states where he has "trooped for half a century, has watched America grow up.

He started pioneering when he was a little boy of ten, coming across the continent in a prairie schooner, and he climaxed a long career of trying new things, when he stepped for the first time before the microphone in the San Francisco studios of the National Broadcasting Company, not long ago. Since then he has been heard in numerous NBC radio dramas, adventuring in the world's newest art.

Seldy was born in Illinois, but when he was ten years old, with eight brothers and sisters younger than himself, an intrepid pair of parents moved the family to Currier, Kansas. They lived in pioneer fashion just outside the settlement's stockade, where—the year was 1872—unfriendly Comanche Indians still roamed. They scalped some of the Roach's neighbors but never harmed Seldy and his family.

The little boy may have helped to protect the household through a friendship he struck up with some of the Comanche braves whom he found raiding a watermelon patch one day. Instead of running away, Seldy showed them how to pick the ripe melons instead of green ones, and the Indians thereafter never molested anything on the Roach homestead but the melons.

The Thespian instinct must have been strongly rooted in young Seldy, brought up so far from cities and theaters. He was only 17 when he joined a minstrel show in Colorado, and from that time on was a "trooper." Stock, repertoire, medicine shows, it was all

the same to him. True to the traditions of his craft he could support Booth in "Hamlet" one season and make good in a "med" show the next.

Barrett, Keane, McCullough, Nat Goodwin, Mrs. Leslie Carter and many other famous stars greeted "Dad" season after season when he or she came

West and played in stock companies in San Francisco, Salt Lake City or Reno. "Dad" never left what he calls "the sagebrush"— California, Colorado, Utah, New Mexico. He stuck to these states on tours, and never felt the Broadway urge. His audiences were scattered through cities and small towns and EAN Clairmook, KFRC's petite star, is a small bundle of vital, interested energy, measuring about three and one-half feet, and barely bothering the scale at forty-nine pounds. She has large luminous brown eyes, chubby dimpled cheeks, and a row of flashing teeth that would have made Cleopatra writhe in envy.

Miss Clairmook's two principal loves are ice cream and gum. Or, "ice-krim," as she calls it. Creating a disturbance in the back yard at home is one of her major activities. She tends a bed of pansies, plays at washing clothes and keeping house, and invents a million other things to do together with hor little playmate

her little playmate, Jeanette. Jeanette is one year Jean's senior and her inseparable companion. Jeanette is five. Their play together is many miles removed from the business of broadcasting.

Miss Clairmook laughs a great deal. However, this is putting rather a loose interpretation upon the word "laughs." It would be better to say that she giggles a great deal. It's just one of her methods of getting rid of her store of constantly replenished energy.

Jean at four is already a veteran entertainer. At the age of two and one-half she made her first public appearance singing "Ain't She Sweet." It was at a Shriner's luncheon and the affair was broadcast.

About a year ago she crashed the gates of the KFRC Happy Go Lucky Hour, a discovery of Al Pearce, the program's guiding spirit. Her first song on KFRC was "Whoopeee," which she still sings occasionally as an encore at public appearances, to the great delight of the audiences. Her interpretation of the song is as unusual as it is annusing.

The first song she ever sang, however, was "Mary Lou." She sang that just about the time she was beginning to talk, either a little before or a little after. Her home town is San Francisco. She is an only child and lives with her father and mother at 807 Lyons Street.

That old wheeze about a rolling stone gathering no moss is out. It becomes "a rolling Moss gathers no stones," which adaption is made by John Moss who recently joined the KFI-KECA staff. And another thing Moss reverses-he stands six feet two inches, weighs 196 pounds, is blonde with very, very blue eyes, an engaging smile and sings bass. All of which is unorthodox as most everyone knows; that's tenor type-the usual basso being a chunk of a fellow hardly over five feet high. Moss was born in England 27 years ago. There he learned to paint, swim, wield an oar on his college crew and also a tennis racquet. He studied in the Royal Academy of Music, London, came to Victoria, B. C., for further instruction under a noted Italian teacher and then to San Francisco with Dr. H. B. Byeining. Moss has been in concert in Canada and United States-25 weeks as bass soloist in a San Francisco theatre and 60 weeks with radio station KFRC, San Francisco. In private life, he is still John Moss, bachelor.

• • Success of the "library studio" for celebrities in the NBC Chicago headquarters has led the NBC in New York to transform a reception room into a similar studio there. The homelike atmosphere and its utter change from the appearance of a broadcasting studio puts the speaker at ease and has much to do with conquering "mike fright." • • • A visitor made the almost fatal mistake of commenting, in the presence of John S. Young, recently, that announcers must have an easy time. NBC's dapper announcer had just finished telling the world about the music in a Russian program, and without saying a word handed to the visitor the program continuity script on which appeared the following names: Rachmaninoff, Rodjesivensky, Bachmetieff, Turchaninoff, Pratopopoff, Bogoyavlensky, Glazounov and Ippolitov-Ivanov. A somewhat flabbergasted visitor suddenly remembered a previous engagement elsewhere.

• • "Pete" Barlow, KFRC'c versatile drummer, who takes the part of Axel on the Golden State Blue Monday Jamboree, on a recent trip to Sacramento with the Schwartz Ginger Band was descended upon by a delegation of high school orchestra drummers. They wanted some of the "low-down" on Pete's tricks on the drums. He spent a half-hour with them in the dressing room, explaining how he did it.

• • Annette Hanshaw's habit of memorizing the words to her songs—including the ones she sings on Columbia's Van Heusen program—is one of long standing. According to her mother, Annette was a singer at the age of sixteen months, and by that time had learned the words of twentyfive songs.

• • Charles Lyon, the announcer who never gropes for a word, has deserted the Chicago National Broadcasting Company studios temporarily to assist KOA, the Denver NBC station, through its summer vacation schedule.

Lyon, while one of the youngest, is one of the most popular announcers in the NBC organization. With several seasons on New York's Broadway and five years in "stock," he brought a rich background of acting experience with him when he entered radio two years ago. He still carries his Actor's Equity card.

• • Sam Coslow, famous composer of popular songs and talking-picture music, is the lastest celebrity to join the entertainment roster of KNX, Hollywood. Coslow is heard nightly except Fridays and Sundays singing with his orchestra. He has written the music and theme songs for such

pictures as "The Vagabond King," "Paramount on Parade," "Honey" and "Dance of Life," and has composed several of the reigning song hits of the day. The phonograph companies bill him as "The Voice With It," so the fair fans of KNX will be given a chance to hear just what "It" is.

• • Hearing his master's voice calling out his name, "Bill," a little fox terrier, dashed to the loudspeaker, wagged his tail ferociously and barked "hello" to Cecil Underwood the other night. When Cecil left Spokane to join the Pacific Division of NBC he gave his little four-footed pal to the best man at his wedding. In the two years of their separation "Bill" has heard and recognized Cecil's voice many times. But when, in a little dog skit in a recent Associated Spotlight Revue, Cecil was privileged to whistle and call out "Bill," the dog's joy knew no bounds.

• • • The United States Marine Band swung into its first selection of the afternoon. Music flowed softly from the instruments. Stanley Bell, Columbia announcer in Washington, stood by, a satisfied look on his face. Crash! Stanley jumped. Flashed a worried look at the bandsmen. Not a marine in the room changed expression. Not a note was lost. A look out the window explained things. A group of marines were indulging in a ball game. Somebody hit a home rumthrough the window of the broadcasting room at the barracks. But the marines kept the situation well in hand.

• • • When it comes to unique ideas for remote control broadcasting, the Paris Inn, feature of KNX, Hollywood, weekly schedule, makes a bid for recognition. Perhaps nowhere else in the country are forty entertainers presented every hour; a grand opera coach (incidentally a friend of the great Verdi) employed to rehearse the songsters; grand opera stars employed to entertain diners, or the proprietor an ex-opera singer, a holder of swimming records and a boniface.

The singing waiters, twenty of them, are hired first for their qualifications vocally. If they can't sing, they can't "wait." They must report for daily rehearsals and sing as they purvey viands. Even the captains and head waiters warble both at work and over the air.

All questions should be put in clear, simple form, and should ask directly what is wanted. Give full name and address. Personal replies or diagram will be supplied for a fee of one dollar each.

QUESTION: What is the best length aerial for a Philco eleven-tube receiver? Also how to correctly tune it to the kilocycles. I have set it on the kilocycles from 550 to 770 and from 1000 to 1500. It is off five kilocycles from 770 to 1000. I have not found anyone so far that can tune it.—Alton M. B., Santa Rosa, June 7.

ANSWER: Your receiver is not critical to antenna length. From 60 to 100 feet flat top will be found very satisfactory. Height is an important factor. Generally the higher the better.

The balancing of this receiver cannot be done without the use of an oscillator. This oscillator must be set exactly at 175 kilocycles. Without this, it is useless to attempt to balance the dial readings. If you cannot find anyone in your city who has the correct equipment, I would suggest that you ship the set to the Philadelphia Storage Battery Co., at 218 Fremont Street, San Francisco, California. They will make the necessary adjustment for you, free of charge.

QUESTION.—I have been unable to find any dope about the pentode tube in any magazine. I would like to change my 171 power tube to a pentode. Will you please answer the following questions for me?

What size bias resistor is required for the pentode tube?

What is the correct value for the plate and grid resistance and the condenser between the plate and grid?

What type output transformer do you recommend? BEN J. S., Mill Valley, Calif.

ANSWER.—The bias resistor for this tube should be 418 ohms. The pentode tube has a very high amplification factor and, unless special means are taken to prevent interaction from plate back to the grid, the total amplification will be greatly reduced and the loud speaker is apt to howl. When a resistor is used as a means of providing grid bias, it is necessary to also use a large condenser across the bias resistor. The capacity of this condenser should be at least 15 to 20 micro-

farads. A better method for providing the proper grid potential is to utilize the drop in voltage across the power choke. This can be done by the use of resistors of the proper resistance connected across the choke with tap to grid return taken at the proper place. If you will write me personally in care of BROADCAST WEEKLY, I shall be glad to send you complete information regarding this method.

The plate resistor for the pentode should be 150,000 ohm; the grid resistor 1 megohm and the coupling condenser .006 micro-farad.

The output load resistance for the pentode has a very critical value. It should be between 6000 and 8000 ohm. For a dynamic speaker output, I know of only one transformer which meets this requirement. This is the Thordarson type T-4843 transformer.

QUESTION.—My mother has been sick in bed for some time. She likes her radio very much, but as the bedroom is located far from where the receiver is, she cannot hear very much. Now, what I would like to ask you is if it is possible to use another speaker together with the one in my set. My set is a Radiola 82. Thanking you for your help in this matter, I am, very truly yours,

ANSWER .- For a temporary connection it is hardly worth while to go to any great expense to connect an additional speaker. A magnetic speaker can be connected to the two plate terminals of the power tubes. This connection will somewhat impair the quality of the reproduction from the dynamic speaker but not enough to be very noticeable. To retain the same quality as with the dynamic speaker alone, it is necessary to change the output transformer of the receiver to one having secondary output terminals for both magnetic and dynamic speakers. Such a transformer is rather costly, and unless the installation is to be permanent, I would recommend the plate connections as outlined above. Your radio service man should be consulted when making this connection.



IT'S A SYSTEM

Musical numbers at times consume more time during actual performance on the air than when rehearsed. Τo meet this contingency orchestra leaders at Columbia studios have devised a system of signals by which they can alter the program while it is in progress. Alternative endings are written into all dance scores and designated as "one" and two." To indicate either, the conductor simply holds up one or two fingers. In addition the dance scores are divided into sub-sections, each of which is designated by a letter of the alphabet. By pantomiming one of these letters with his fingers, the conductor is also enabled to order a cut almost anywhere he wishes.


