


Illustration above shows the heavy specially-designed Colonial Hardware which gives the MAY-FLOWER the distinctive artistic charm of old Colonial furniture.

NO VESTED RIGHT TO AIR

RMED with a decision of the United States Circuit Court of Appeals at A Chicago that broadcasters have no vested rights in the air, the Federal Radio Commission next fall is expected to proceed with its plans to relieve congestion by the elimination of a number of inferior stations.

The decision by the court was rendered in the case of Station WMBB-WOK, relicensing of which was refused by the com-The owners of the station announced their intention of broadcasting without a license, and injunction proceedings were instituted by the Department of Commerce, the appellate court affirming the injunction granted by the District Court.

Owners of the station fought the injunction proceedings on the ground that they had invested large sums in the erection of the station and the development of its business, and that the radio commission had acted arbitrarily in denying a renewal of the license without providing any compensation for loss of their property rights.

In sustaining the Government's contention that the broadcaster had acquired no vested rights, the court declared: "We are well satisfied that there is a vital difference between the rights of one whose property is confiscated by judicial decree and the rights of one to the use of the air, which right is dependent upon a Government permit limited both as to extent and time. The former is vested. The latter is permissive.

The radio commission, since its creation

in 1927, has succeeded in reducing the number of broadcasting stations by more than 125 through the refusal to relicense stations guilty of violations of the radio law or regulations, but has hesitated to eliminate stations not giulty of actual violations but which are felt not to be rendering service in the "public interest, convenience and necessity" because of the question of property rights. The commission's efforts in this direction, it is believed, now will be directed largely toward the relief of high-grade stations which are forced to share time with stations in the same area which do not meet the commission's standards of good broadcasting.

Cases of this nature have already come before the commission, and there are pending for consideration next fall examiner's reports recommending the removal of stations. The time division requirement between the stations is an expedient resulting from the existence of an excess number of broadcasting stations. Such time division is a handicap to the stations involved, financially and from an operating standpoint, and accordingly limits the maximum service to the listening public.

Under such circumstances, public interest, convenience and necessity would be served by a consolidation of assignments in a progressive, well managed and adequately financed station through the elimination of stations which do not meet standards of good broadcasting.

Her sentiments are also mine, absolutely. To enjoy classical selections, one must not only have a cultural background but an educational one as well. And that absolutely does not mean being "high hat" either. The people who are the "high-hatters" are those who think that moronic thing called "jazz" is the only music there is. The truly educated person finds and enjoys the best in each. For there are good points to be found in all things. Most jazz I find very depressing, it does not cheer me up at all; it appeals to the physical, not the mental, side of one's make-up. I think that the Hollywood Bowl concerts each Saturday evening over KFI beat all the Jamborees and Happy Go Lucky hours together. They really stand for something and are not a passing fancy, a bauble to be played with, if you will.

And as for the proposal to put the Happy Go Lucky Hour on in the evening—heaven forbid! Aren't there enough Jamborees and Spotlight Revues on the air in the evenings without getting a further duplication? I certainly believe the Happy Go Lucky Hour performs a big service to the lonely housewife and shut-in in the afternoon. Leave well enough alone; don't ruin its service by transferring it from afternoon to evening.

KHJ and KFRC are to be commended on the many noteworthy concert programs that they produce every evening. I hope that they won't ruin that good record by going cheap—the way of least resistance.

In my opinion, practically all the stations in the Los Angeles and San Francisco areas have shown marked improvements in the last six months, excepting KTAB, KTM (this station has slipped quicker and farther than any other station recently), and KMCS; KTAB and KMCS because of nediocre programs; KTM because of objectionable ones.

All the rest have done more than their share to improve themselves.

Please don't change to hour listings. They are so inconvenient and awkward. The reason why I subscribed to your magazine was because of the far superior plan of station by station listings. They are easier to read, quicker to find, and better to look at. Why, any newspaper will give you the hour-by-hour listings. One takes a radio magazine to get superior service, not just a poor duplication. And, believe me, Broadcast Weekly, as is, gives that superior service admirably; keep up the good work.

Let me also congratulate the producers of such interesting programs such as Memory Lane, Standard Symphony Hour, Sperry Smiles, Columbia Nit-Wits, and NBC's Matinee. And as for dance orchestras, I enjoy Rudy Vallee and the Canel Quarter Hour (Morton Downey and Tony Wons) the best. They're all excellent. Thank you.

After her graduation from High School in Omaha, she attended the Damrosch Institute of Musical Art in New York, and during the summer months she first acquainted herself with the pipe organ. Soon afterwards her family moved to Los Angeles, where she found a position on

the console of a large motion picture theatre organ, and after a series of increasingly important engagements she went to New York and radio.

ANE GREEN, star of many revues and musical comedies, now scintillating before a KFRC microphone, came by her talent for entertainment honestly. It was right in the family. Her mother had played Topsy in Uncle Tom's Cabin hundreds of times. Her father was a musician. She had uncles in the circus business.

And so, little Jane wasn't compelled to blaze any new trails when she became interested in the show business in Los Angeles at the tender age of ten. Her home previous to that time had been Louisville, Kentucky.

During grammar and high school days Jane was active in musical and theatrical activities. After high school she walked into her first job, singing the popular songs of the day in a Los Angeles Cafe known as McKees. She smiles now when she confesses that she was only sixteen at the time.

It was experience she wanted and shortly after she tried out for the Orpheum circuit and was turned down. Right then and there Miss Jane Green decided she should headline over the Orpheum circuit before she was through, just to show them a thing or two. And Miss Jane Green did, for quite a few seasons, just that little thing. Determination is also one of her qualities.

While she was still at the Cafe, Irene Castle and Anna Held saw her there and persuaded her to go to New York. The war happened along and Jane played the army camps of the country from coast to coast. It was Leon Errol who recommended her personable talents to Mr. Zeigfeld who booked her for the Zeigfeld Roof where she played a solid year. From then on engagements came thick and fast. Here are just a few to give you an idea. With John Murray Anderson in "What's in a Name"; "On the Century Roof" with Eddie Cantor for three seasons; with Schubert's Bernard Collier Revue; at the Tent Cafe, in New York; headlined over Keith Orpheum for several seasons; played at the Kit Kat Club in London; was starred in the Greenwich Village Follies and was featured in several Cafes in New York, Miami and Los Angeles. Now she has settled down to the quiet life of the

Speaking of settling down, she was playing a radio engagement some two years ago when a young gentleman by the name of Ron Wilson presented himself as her accompanist. Well, to phrase it in the rustic manner, the upshot of the whole affair was they got married soon after. Mr. Wilson, in addition to being a piano player, is also an aviator which has earned him the title of the flying piano player.

She is just a little thing, five feet three inches tall (including French heels) and weighs in the

vicinity of 118 pounds. Her eyes are brown, her hair reddish blonde.

She likes to be active. Golf she is fond of and swimming, also horseback riding. She has driven her own car for the past ten years. Now she is going in for aviation

S OMETHING like twenty years ago there existed in the city of San Jose, California, an institution owned and operated by two brothers in their early teens which might be described as the Pearce Brothers Milk Distributing System.

The two brothers were Al and Cal Pearce, now associated with KFRC and the Don Lee

Broadcasting System.

But wait a minute—there was a Happy-Go-Lucky element tied in with that earlier system. The boys were on their way through the local grammar and high schools and they built up a milk route working before and after school. There wasn't a great deal of time for sleep and meals. Al didn't fully realize that. He carried a banjo with him and many is the time Cal had to go out and remind him that business came first. He would be found entertaining a crowd some place with songs and banjo selections while frantic customers telephoned demanding their milk. That was really the beginning of the Happy-Go-Lucky Hour over KFRC and the Don Lee Coast Network.

When Al was ten and Cal a couple of years older the boys put on an act at the old Redman Theatre in San Jose, doing harmony numbers. That was their first public appearance with the commercial element involved. A very small amount of money changed hands, however—perhaps it shouldn't have been mentioned.

In high school, theatricals intrigued the hard working, melody loving brothers and they sang in the "Mikado." Al was Nankipoo. The parents of the students taking part agreed that it was the greatest production of the Mikado ever presented.

They sang in a church choir and were one-

half of the San Jose High School quartet which was awarded a national prize at the Panama-Pacific International Exposition, and doubtless would have won the international prize had there been one in stock. Since then they have sung with the San Francisco Real Estate Glee Club and the Olympic Club. Before go-

pic Club. Before going in whole-heartedly for radio, however, they passed through a stage selling real estate.

Al is very fond of swimming and wooing the beneficent rays old old man sunshine. Cal's favorite sport is golf, and a row of cups at home testify to his skill. PALE words fail in any attempt to silhouette Marian Boyle, popular pianist of KHQ in Spokane. Black and white can never do more than to faintly shadow her vivid personality. Her charm has the indescribable freshness of youth, of an abounding vitality and of a ready wit.

Marian was born a few years ago . . . oh maybe eighteen or twenty . . . in Vancouver, British Columbia. She was born with a heritage of big grey Irish eyes, softly waving brown hair, a ready smile and an unusually

keen appreciation of good music. All of these qualities she still has . . . and how.

She likes to swim, to motor, to dance. She plays a fair game of golf, but she has found that her early morning class to perfect her French, and her day-time and evening activities at the Studio interfere with making much real prog-

ress in the game at present. She plays piano solos of the finer type beautifully, plays popular numbers in duo arrangements with Norman Thue, conducts a Dinner Hour Quartette at the Davenport Hotel and the KHQ String Trio. She is considered a very sympathetic accompanist. Her favorite composer is Liszt. Her favorite reading, she says, is found in the upper reaches of a speedometer, but so far she has not collected much evidence in proof of this. Of course, her youth is in her favor . . . Though born in Canada, the family home was moved to Seattle while Marian was still quite small. She followed the customary little girl pursuits, and began the study of piano. She attended Holy Names Academy, and after finishing there, enrolled in the Cornish School of Music to continue her preparations for a "career."

- • Aunty McKasser (KHJ), the old and sturdy pal, the love-seared. noble soul who makes the world a better place each week with helpful hints and heart administrations for her little housewives, is none other and not only the versatile Elvia Allman. The stuff is written by Dick Creedon, a retired farmer. Several weeks ago a gentleman of the old school complained that Aunty was not the sort of female he wished his children to associate with. Consequently Aunty is given a bath and careful scrutiny now before being given the privilege of the microphone. It's very trying for the old gal, but all in the interests of democracy.
- • Max Peacock, KROW's jovial and rotund young announcer, will join the ranks of Oakland benedicts shortly. He is to be married August 10 to Wanda Nelson at the First Presbyterian Church in Oakland. Miss Nelson heard Max's voice on the air, admired his air personality, met him through friends, and they shortly became engaged. The young couple will motor through Southern California on their honeymoon.
- Caltana Christoph is said to have one of the most unusual names in radio—or any place else, for that matter. Her mother was determined to get her an unusual name and used two states for sources, California and Montana, the first and last syllables respectively. Miss Christoph was born in Montana while her sisters had first seen the light in California. The reason for the choice of such an unusual name was the fact that Caltana was born on Friday, the 13th.
- • "Exceptionally strong signals of excellent modulation" were received in Germany from W2XAF, Schenectady, during the short-wave broadcast of the Schmeling-Stribling title fight. The report, which was given in German from the ringside in Cleveland, was relayed to all stations of the Reichs Rundfunk Gesellschaft, which coöperated

- with NBC in the transatlantic program. Innumerable fans in the Fatherland were rewarded for an all-night vigil by hearing at dawn that Max had established himself as a great champion.



I could stand more dramas from the pen of Keltner Williamson. His "Jungle" and "Two A. M.," recently presented over NBC, were knockouts. Talk about mental stimulus! I got so excited listening to that "over the top" thing that I all but chewed up my pipe. And the girl friend just about fainted. Man, she was sweet! That Hodgins chap who directs the players is no slouch, either. He pulls every ounce of acting ability out of his bunch every minute of the time they're on the air. My compliments, gentlemen!

I wish somebody'd tell me if the readers on the Pacific Feature Hour in the broadcast which originated at KFI, July 18, were high school kids or regulars. 'Course if they were untrained kids they could be forgiven.

Directors oughta go easy on English dramas. Or—if they've just gotta put 'em on, discretion should be shown in selecting the players. Only one actor in several hundred knows an authentic English accent.

I wax poetic when the Savino Tone Pictures float in. Like to close my eyes and visualize an enormous iridescent web in the process of being spun by a fantastic, unreal spider with a magic wand. The treble voices are so exquisitely intermingled with the violins, the deep voices with the cellos, I am lost in a maze of harmonious color, with senses drugged as by overpowering tube roses. . . sublimely unconscious of beginnings and endings, tomorrows and yesterdays. If your mood is suicidal and you feel

the need of etheralism, tune in this broadcast some evening and drink, old pal, drink. It may leave you exhausted or refreshed, whatever the state of your constitution, but I assure you, brother, there's no headache after. CBS attraction.

Art Lindsay is doing double duty these days over KPO. Announcing and singing. He has a pleasing voice either way. Wide range with smooth persuasiveness. Gives a neat intimate touch. After all, most of us listen in at home, and it's comfortable

not to be shouted at.


A CBS feature of interest is "Arabesque," a fascinating desert play. It is excellently cast and has a fine coating of sophistication running through the lines. Carries a load of romance. Feel like I've been to a modern movie holding hands with Amelia (the girl friend) after each chapter.

Dixie Dinah at KFRC has a pleasing voice, but her continuity is too doggy for the type of performance she offers. Minus the artificial words plus a dialect, she'd go a lot bigger.

The Spotlight Revue on Saturday nights, coming over NBC, is as nearly perfect as an hour and a half show can be. Music, drama. nonsense. Something for everybody. The high lights to me are the school scene, Jack and Ethyl, and the Walter Beban sketches. Professor Knicklebine and his scholars behave as though they were having the time of their lives. Jack and Ethyl furnish a serious but always exciting interval. Kinda wish they were doing the glamorous plays as in former days . . . never will forget Miss Berwin's beautiful work in Lola Montez. . . . but naturally I realize the more ambitious dramas would be impractical with their time cut in two. And now a hand for Beban. The boy is keen. Knows his stuff from the inside out. Manages to inject a prevailing news item or suggestion without leaving a bad taste in the mouth. An' that's somethin'!

Survey shows preference for dance music. Poland discards radio tax, adopts American commercial system.

N with the dance" say Philadelphia radio fans in a recent survey conducted by Mr. Herman S. Hettinger of the University of Pennsylvania covering 2,250 radio-owning families representing a very carefully selected cross-section of that city. A very intensive study of the radio habits of these families was made for the purpose of ascertaining the relation of individual musical preference to the listener's age and economical status. What must have been Mr. Hettinger's embarrassment to discover that a chosen audience of the cultured East but a few miles from those famous centers of learning, where Princeton and Harvard radiate their erudite effulgence, should be so careless as to openly admit a preference for just ordinary jazz. Whether Western taste has so far strayed from the paths blazed by the immortal composers no survey has yet shown. Perhaps, where ignorance is bliss 'tis folly to be wise, academic ambitions to the contrary notwithstanding.

The surest, most practical way to record a preference for any program is to purchase the merchandise of the advertiser sponsoring the program. Most important, such an expression of approval has the additional advantage of helping pay for the program and making its continuance possible. And don't forget to tell the merchant you heard it advertised over the radio.

Emulation is the most convincing form of flattery. None other than Poland, that

country of dramatic history and musical genius which gave the world its one and only Paderewski, is reported to be adopting the American plan of commercial broadcasting. The present Polish system is operated by a private concessionaire of the government, for the support of which each radio owner is taxed \$3.66 per set. But Dr. Sigismond Chamiec, director of the system, "Polskie Radjo," after an extended sojourn in this country observing the commercial American system, finds programs so much better here that he has decided to try the advertising plan in Poland. As this is being written, two United States Senators, the President of a great mid-western University, the Governor of that state, and three world-famous musicians are on the air in a single half-hour program. No wonder Dr. Sigismond was impressed. Maybe some day even proud and phlegmatic John Bull will get wisewho knows.

Next time you sign your name to a letter, remember that is practically all that leading radio advertisers are doing today when they announce their name and product in connection with a fine program. Certainly enterprises voluntarily expending fifty million dollars annually for your enjoyment are entitled to add their signature. And if you like these programs, surely the least you can do is to ask for that brand when you purchase merchandise of that class. Patronize deserving radio advertisers.
