### THE PUBLIC MUST BE SERVED

HATEVER its present status, any industry which has attained that venerable age where it can stage an "Old Timer's Night," may reasonably be assumed to be sincere both in its pride and its ambition. In such a celebration recently held by the Pacific Radio Trade Association, the narratives and anecdotes of its pioneer patriarchs brought out many interesting and significant facts.

In its infancy, radio broadcasting was a guileless child of almost Simon-pure amateur parentage. It was entirely the protege of mechanical geniuses and imaginative experimenters who fostered it dutifully enough, as they then interpreted and were equipped to carry on their duties, but with almost no conception of its destiny or tremendous social significance, and without giving it either direction or strength of character. For these parental shortcomings, however, the public and its governmental agencies are equally culpable. And the inevitable happened. Commercial interests, ever alert to opportunity, were quick to appreciate the growing power and gigantic possibilities of this infant prodigy, and promptly and painlessly performed one of the outstanding kidnaping feats of all history. They tumbled this brilliant child from its amateur standing and adopted it as

Now, one of two things must happen. Either the foster parents must voluntarily mend certain of their ways, demonstrate their own sincerity and good intentions, and recognize the inalienable rights of the real parents, or the real parents, whose anger has been righteously aroused by the treatment

accorded the child, will exercise their power of mandate and enforce its return. Surely, interests powerful enough to achieve the progress radio broadcasting has made during the past decade cannot deny their capacity to remedy their own faults or justify the sacrifice of audience rights by pleading commercial necessity.

Program changes are necessary to radio progress and public interest, but should never be made without due and sufficient advance notice. In accomplishing this broadcasting stations have only to emulate the standard practice of more mature advertising mediums, such as magazines and newspapers and adopt and enforce a "deadline," beyond which time limit absolutely no program changes or period shifts would be made.

It is neither good business nor good strategy for any station under any conditions to surrender its principles, sacrifice its prestige and "sell out" the public by permitting advertisers to levy arbitrary or unreasonable demands. History shows that no advertising medium which has permitted this practice has long survived. Radio has become too important a factor in the everyday life of the American people to permit its power to be mis-used or public rights ignored.

To the extent that commercial broadcasting stations serve public interests and advance the progress of radio, Broadcast Weekly shall continue to sustain the sincere effort of such stations and contribute to that purpose. But, the radio public must be served, and Broadcast Weekly is its one champion throughout the West.

ELL, thank goodness, these here political broadcasts which have been cramming our loud speakers this past month, will soon be as rare as a member of the Ku Klux Klan at a Catholic picnic. On November 7 we'll hear the final arguments. Then the case goes to the great American jury for decision. The microphones of the big networks will have done their jobs.

But they'll be called to arms again Tuesday night, November 8, to report to the populace of the firty-eight states who is going to rule this land of the free for the

next four years.

The broadcasters will rather regret the end of the political campaigns, for they realized many thousands of dollars extra reve-

nue from both the big parties.

As an example, when President Hoover talked for one hour and forty-five minutes over the combined NBC and CBS networks the chains collected \$20,000 from he Republican National Committee for the eighty-seven station hookup. But they paid out almost as much to sustaining artists unable to broadcast because the chief executive talked forty-five minutes more than the original hour allotted his program. Here's the lowdown: artists scheduled to appear are under contracts which call for payments whether they appear or not, provided cancellation is no fault of theirs.

They say that Ed Wynn collected \$6,000, his fee per appearance, though his program had to be cancelled. But occasions like that have been rare during this political season.

After November 8, the regular scheduled programs will be back to normal, we hope.

That Donald Novis lad certainly hitched his wagon to a skyrocket! From obscurity he has risen to the pinnacle of radio fame almost over night. It was but two or three years ago that he won the Atwater Kent amateur audition contest. That was his start. He studied hard. Then got some work in the movies. Radio beckoned him. He was heard over the Pacific Coast in a program originating from Los Angeles. Then some of his programs were piped East for the folks back there to lend an ear to. Guess they liked him plenty. For he was sent for by the NBC. He's been singing on sustaining programs—coast to coast. And now comes the news from New York that he is to be the featured soloist in a commercial

beginning in January for which the Wood-

bury soap people are going to pay for. Folks out here will hear him at 6:30 p. m. over the KGO network.

Cap'n Dobbsie and a number of the Shell Happytimers, together with other KFRC luminaries, have become movie actors, if you please. Yep, they're strutting before the camera for a fillum to be known as "The Phantom Ship of Joy," which is being made by the Robert Connell Productions of Hollywood. Most of the scenes are being filmed on an old sailing vessel anchored in the Sausalito harbor. Ed and Dicey are carrying the comedy parts.

Dick Rickard, ex-KFRC assistant production chief and more recently manager of KGB, San Diego, has been named production boss at KFAD-KFVD in Los Angeles.

In fact all arrangements have been made with the Shell Oil Company for a series of theatrical engagements for the two old cronies in theaters on the Pacific Coast during this month. The call of the waves (water) has been answered by Harrison Holliway. He went and bought himself a nifty yacht recently and is now spending his weekends exploring the nooks and crannies of San Francisco bay.

Me, oh my, how those "Cross Cuts from the Log of the Day" fans were riled when the program was sold to a sponsor and was chiseled down from an hour to just fifteen minutes a day! Letters poured into the NBC by the hundreds the second day the new setup went into effect and they're still coming. Dr. Laurance Cross, who conducts the affair, also received lots of telephone calls. The smart sponsor, however, is tacking on another fifteen minutes, making it a half hour in all.
