



RACTICALLY two thousand years have elapsed since the acknowledged Creator of the universe commanded "Thou shalt not kill," but "Love thy neighbor as thyself."

Since then wars, past and anticipated, have caused world-wide poverty, distrust. and animosity. Yet today the machinery of death and destruction is being organized on a scale never before approached in human history, with more men armed and trained for legal nurder than are active in espousing and exemplifying true Christianity. What a paradox. What suicidal stupidity. What barbaric blasphemy.

If one one-hundredth of the money appropriated for military purposes during the past decade had been spent instead for Radio receivers and programs for the weary peoples whose daily toil produced those revenues, the world would not now be trembling on the brink of another cataclysmic struggle. If instead of arming men with guns, governments equipped homes with Radios, and spent for the broadcasting of enlightenment, inspiration, and wholesome home enjoyment the money now shot into the air in preparation for wholesale slaughter-how much happier the world would be, what impetus would be given the progress of civilization and the spread of Christianity. Here is a cause worthy of the ideals and dynamic spirit of home-loving, Christian-thinking, democratic America.

The same force that flashed word of the murder of Yugoslavia's King Alexander on fateful October 9 could have saved his life and spared the world the possible dire consequences of his tragic end. His Croation killer, Petrus Kaleman, was not *born* a political plotter and assassin. Could he have chosen his companions and entertainment at will from the elite of the ether he most probably would have developed an entirely different character and philosophy. Radio as we know it would have changed his entire conception of his fellow beings, his king, his God, and his own mission in life. King Alexander was a self-appointed dictator. However exalted and altruistic a ruler's motives, however beneficent his acts, the assumption and exercise of the power of government without the consent of the governed is tyranny. As long as a century and a half ago that famous orator-statesman, Edmund Burke, warned the peers of proud England that: "It is contradiction in terms, blasphemy in religion, and wickedness in politics to say that any man can have arbitrary power."

Not all the armies of Europe were adequate to prevent the assassination of *Dictator* Alexander. *Radio* would have enabled him to refute false propaganda by talking direct to *all* his people. Of a kingdom it could have made one great happy and enlightened family, ruled not by a greatly harassed and much misunderstood dictator, but presided over by a kindly patriarch known, respected, and beloved throughout the length and breadth of h:s land.

Our own government is now spending money to clear brush from hillsides and build new highways. Is it *less* important or *less* proper to open new avenues of enlightenment and remove the blight of ignorance from the mind? Our government rears great edifices for education and endows huge libraries. Than Radio is *any* force capable of accomplishing more educationally?

Arrangements should be perfected whereby some broadcasting station or chain, government-owned or otherwise, have microphones permanently established in the halls of Congress and other important official centers, to enable the people to tune in their government at any and all times it is in important public session. A plan should be evolved whereby the government or some other agency, gratuitously or otherwise, take the steps necessary to assure *every* American home being equipped with a modern Radio receiver.

Must an *epidemic* of assassinations and revolutions enshroud the world in a reign of terror and destroy the very foundations of civilization, or will we dedicate ourselves to these fundamental ends *immediately*?

S. degree in education, a bass voice tempered in church work, years of activity in all sports and a thorough knowledge of several foreign languages. Known as one of the leading scholastic debaters in college, Canady has toured the United States and Hawaii as a forensic speaker. He is 27 years old, married, sails boats for a hobby. He is of medium height, dark complexion and built like a wrestler.

A 20,000 to 1 chance gave Rowene Williams her long-sought "break" in radio directly by way of the star's entrance in the new "Hollywood Hotel" series heard over the coast-to-coast Columbia network.

Last June when the sponsor signed contracts for the broadcast time over Columbia, the entire hour-long program had been planned and cast with the exception of the girl to play the ingenue rôle. Dick Powell, Ted Fio-Rito and his orchestra, William O'Neal, El Brendel, Muzzy Marcellino, the Debutantes, Louella Parsons and movie stars for guest appearances had been signed on the dotted line.

The sponsor held a theory that somewhere in the nation there was undiscovered talent capable of meeting the exact requirements for the part of the hat check girl who rises to fame through her singing in the "Hollywood Hotel" floor show. A nation-wide search for the "undiscovered" girl was begun. Auditions were held by all Columbia stations, and from 20,000 girls twelve were chosen for the New York finals. When these twelve had been heard in New York by a distinguished group of judges, Miss Williams was chosen the winner. Cameras flashed, congratulations were offered, and Rowene told people "I didn't think I had a chance in the world."

Rowene Williams was born in Buffalo, New York, June 14, 1906. When she was very young her family moved to Chicago and then to Minneapolis, where she attended high school and business college.

Her childhood ambition was to be an actress, later to become a singer. Her mother sang beautifully but had never trained her voice. She encouraged Rowene to cultivate hers. Rowene's father was a hotel manager and further encouraged her interest by permitting her to sing at banquets, luncheons and during the meetings of different clubs. She was eighteen years old then.

Four months' training at a business college was enough to convince her that a business woman's career was not for her. She found work as a soloist with the Luigi Lombardi Symphony Orchestra and toured the countryside in and around Minnesota. In 1929 she went on a concert tour from Minneapolis to Chicago, and started on her opera career the latter part of that year with the Ewin City Civic Opera Company. Her debut was made as "Leonora" in "Il Trovatore." During the last three years of her five years' association with the opera county, Rowene was heard over WCCO. Columbia's Minneapolis outlet. Last spring she decided to concentrate on radio work and moved to Chicago. She was just beginning to be noticed there and had had several stage and broadcasting engagements when she heard announcements of the "Hollywood Hotel" auditions and enrolled for a chance at stardom.

SIDE GLANCES: Has blonde hair ... dark grey eyes ... is five feet, six inches tall ... weighs 134 pounds ... is not married . . . speaks Italian, French and German . . . has no hobbies . . . says she never had time for them . . . likes to play golf, watch football games and travel . . . has a pet toy Boston bulldog named "Midge" . . believes if she wears certain colors she will have luck . . . is also superstitious about certain numbers, and has used the name of Neno Williams in connection with her professional work because it is a lucky name, according to numerology . . . never sang popular songs until she went to Chicago last spring and began singing in theaters and in radio . . . Rosa Ponselle and Lawrence Tibbett are her favorite opera stars.

A PERKINS, realistic sketch of homelife, came to NBC networks in December, 1933, after running four months on WLW, where the program achieved enormous popularity. It is heard in the West daily except Saturday and Sunday at 1:30 p. m. over the NBC-KGO network.

The principal character is shrewd, kindly old Ma Perkins, played by Virginia Payne, a radio actress who has played the rôle since the program started. Other leading characters came to Chicago with Miss Payne.

She has been in radio eight years, holds two degrees from the University of Cincinnati and until she left that city for Chicago was an instructor in dramatic art in a private school. She began her radio career in the days when radio actors received no pay but were allowed to sign taxicab slips for transportation. So the entire cast went joyriding every day to make certain they were well paid.

She says her interpretation of Ma Perkins is based on no single living person, but is a composite of many persons she has known, including her mother.

Dave Rubinoff has invented the world's first collapsible, pocket-size violin. When he got the idea he went to Frank J. Callier, famous Hollywood violin maker, who laughed when he heard the maestro's plan, but when Rubinoff thundered that he knew it could be done Callier got busy and at the end of seven weeks handed the violin inventor the finished product.

The new Rubinoff violin is the same length as a standard violin, but it has a tiny sounding box. The fingerboard breaks in two pieces on a hinge. Even the bow is collapsible. The complete unit fits either into Rubinoff's coat pocket, or into a leather container which looks much like a camera case.

It cost Rubinoff several hundred dollars but he says it is worth it because it solves one of his greatest personal problems. Now, with his collapsible violin Rubinoff can feel free to go anywhere with less chance that he will be recognized and bothered.

Sinclair Greater Minstrels, oldest and most famous minstrel show on the air in the East, are now heard by Pacific Coast listeners from 6:00 to 6:30 p.m., Mondays, over KPO, KFI, KFSD and KTAR.

This show has been on the air continuously since March, 1928, and will celebrate its 300th consecutive performance on October 22. Gene Arnold, writer and interlocutor of the program, is the only member of the original cast still on the show. In over six years he has missed only five broaddasts. The original cast of three has grown to twentysix, including Arnold; a male quartet; an orchestra led by Harry Kogen; 'Joe Par-sons, bass and Cliff Soubier, Mac McCloud, Bill Childs and Fritz Clark as the end men.

Arnold has written every script but listeners themselves write all of the jokes. Thousands of them come in weekly. The show

follows the basic pattern of an old-time minstrel production. Every attempt to change it has brought protests from listeners. Nationally known minstrel players and fan associations have written Arnold letters commending the program for keeping alive the minstrel form of entertainment at a time when the minstrels have almost passed from the legitimate stage into oblivion.

After a long and successful career as a juvenile comedian in films, Tom Hanlon deserted the cinema for radio, and now is heard as announcer of Ted Fio-Rito's nightly dance frolics from the Ambassador Hotel, Los Angeles, over NBC, and also on the MJB Demi-Tasse Revue. Hanlon was born in Scott, Kansas, on November 7, 1906, and typifies in his robust and genial personality the youth and virility of that state.

In high school and college, Hanlon played football, still retaining a deep interest in that game. His only hobby is radio, both as an announcer and listeners. He is single, over six feet tall, weighs 225 pounds (but once weighed much more); women are unanimous in saying that his complexion and hair are totally wasted on a male.
