Lest We Forget

ITH program builders scurrying to line up their winter menus—which they hope will be tempting—a word of advice seems called for. All right then, here it is: "Lest we forget!"

And to amplify further, what we really mean is: "Lest we forget in building programs that a show doesn't have to be terrifically complicated in order to entertain!"

With their wild rushes to dazzle the eyes of the radio audience many of the directors responsible for programs have forgotten the meaning of the word "simplicity."

After all the radio as an entertainment factor was originally a marvelous substitute for the phonograph. The phonograph gave you songs, symphonies, dance bands and an occasional comedy skit like Uncle Josh at the Huskin' Bee or Cohen on the Telephone. No efforts were made to aggrandize the only banjo player who strums a guitar backwards and they didn't make a record of a man simply because he fell out of a balloon and landed topside up. They didn't complicate things-and the phonograph entertained the American home until the time came when radio did for nothing what the phonograph record had been doing for 75 cents or a dollar and a quarter, "The Rosary" is still pretty standard entertainment. Listeners might hiss Stravinsky if played on a musical saw, but they will listen to a hackneyed piece like "Dance of the Hours" over and over again. A number doesn't have to be new if it is good.

For certain intelligent souls in radio who are developing new media and new songs and new stories, the palm must be extended, but

for the lads who strain their innards trying to be "different" and in so doing take the entertainment out of radio, we can repeat what we said at the outset: "Lest we forget!"

IT took a tax expert to ferret out the inside reason why so few motion picture stars have been inveigled into fat contracts to broadcast over the air.

It really isn't worth while financially for a film star to sign for a radio series. They get very little money out of such a venture! This does not mean that they may not charge a sponsor a huge fee, but that the star winds up with very very little of the vast amount for his own purse.

If a star is big enough in Hollywood to mean anything as a radio star, possesses a name big enough to be considered a drawing card by a prospective sponsor, then that same star is likely to be earning not less than \$2,000 a week, or \$100,000 a year. When you deduct the taxes Uncle Sam, the State of California and other various taxing bodies take from a large income, you are well up into the surtax class. And when you get there, the amount of taxes due on large sums increases in size.

So what happens? Should a star decide to go on the air for thirteen weeks for \$3,000 a week, that is \$39,000, but a very small part of it is left when it is added to the other income and the whole thing taxed.

Moreover, a star has risked his reputation, worried about material writers, been made the target of editorial criticism—and ofttimes ruined his movie house box office drawing power—all for a few thousand extra dollars.

• • • Don Thompson, Associated sport-caster, is quite a trouper these days. Between Saturdays, when he broadcasts local football games for the Associated Oil Company over NBC, Don is on the go spreading the pigskin gospel throughout Northern California.

With a supply of slow-motion football films, a stock of inside dope and a snappy personality as his tools. Don faces Rotary clubs, Lions, Oddfellows, Elks, Dads' clubs, P. T. A. meetings, schools, and all shapes and forms of organizations as a football missionary.

Needless to say, he "scores a goal" every appearance he makes.

appearance on the ether waves.

His pre-radio professional experience grew from his work as director of his high-school harmonica band; he is, oddly enough, still single, plays the piano as well as accordion, and admits he has no hobbies. He is of medium height, brown eyes, light olive complexion, black hair.

- • Anne Seymour, star of NBC's Grand Hotel cast, is anything but the swooning, lavender-and-old-lace type of young woman she is sometimes called on to portray. Driving her own car from New York to Chicago she was stung on the hand by a wasp. Scarcely stopping to kill the insect she kept right on driving.
- • Paul Lamkoff, KMTR's versatile Russian baritone who sings in so many tongues, arranged a good deal of the score for the picture "Treasure Island" filmed by M. G. M. Mr. Lamkoff is a composer as well as an arranger and singer.
- • A radio romance that began long ago in Denver, when Mary Wood, pretty blonde soprano, used to listen to the NBC Woman's Magazine of the Air, just to hear Edward Fitzpatrick's violin solos, comes to happy culmination December 15 when Miss Wood and the NBC conductor will be married.

They met for the first time when the Denver songstress came to San Francisco and sang over NBC networks from here. One of her first programs was the Magazine of the Air, on which Fitzpatrick directs the Magazine Melodists. When she went to Los Angeles the acquaintance continued by mail, and she returned recently to say "yes" to the handsome Irish musician's plea.

The bride-to-be is well known to radio audiences both as a soloist and as a member of noted ensemble groups. Fitzpatrick came to radio from symphony and theater work. A friend of the late Victor Herbert, he substituted successfully for Herbert when the famous composer was conducting orchestra in San Francisco, and became so popular with Herbert's audiences that the composer told his friend with pretended envy: "Well, it took an Irishman to prove himself as good a man as me, anyway!"

• • Lawrence Tibbett's zeal for realism nearly wrecked an NBC studio when he sang selections from the opera "Emperor Jones" recently. He had reached the scene in which the "Emperor" rings a hand bell for his subjects, who remain in hiding. He throws the bell to the ground in disgust. Tibbett did his own bell ringing and throwing and with such vigor that the instrument sailed across the studio to crash within six inches of the control room window as engineer and production man scurried for their lives

- • Andy Potter, KGGC chief announcer, broke into radio fourteen years ago with his own station, one of the first broadcasters in the country, while still in high school.
- • Mabel Goodwin Cleland, well known Northwest writer and beloved by thousands of radio listeners for her broadcasts as the "Teacup Philosopher," recently left Seattle after a residence of seventeen years for San Francisco to live with two of her daughters.

It's titled "Just Once Too Often." The disc will soon be on the market, and the vocaling of the Rhythm Kings assures it of wide popularity.
- • It may be a lot of fun to be able to write the lyrics and music for an original musical comedy an hour long each week, but it interferes with your attendance at football games. At least so say Howard Dietz and Arthur Schwartz, who write the lyrics and music for "The Gibson Family," the Ivory Soap show heard every Saturday night over the NBC network. Both are alumni of Columbia, and with alma mammy's eleven playing great football this year, they have only one thing to mourn for—that

- they cannot see 'em in action. In addition to working on tunes all week, both men attend the dress rehearsals of the programs Saturday afternoons and hear the broadcasts in their composing studio in an uptown New York hotel.

THAT vital and charming younger daughter of the Barbours has a portrayer who is just as appealing in person as Claudia is on the air.

Kathleen Wilson is a dark-haired, darkeyed little person of twenty-three who has crowded as many experiences into her own short lifetime as Claudia Barbour has. Member of an interesting California family whose interests range all the way from social science to the stage, Kathleen grew up in a Berkeley household where she studied stage

craft and political economy simultaneously. Her father is Ben F. Wilson, well-known lecturer and writer who worked with Ramsay MacDonald and Philip Snowden in the days when the British Labor Party was in its youth. Her cousins, Irving Pichel and Violet Wilson, gave Kathleen her early stage experience, in Shakespearean productions directed by Pichel before he entered the films.

When she was graduated from high school her father took Kathleen to Europe with him and she traveled widely there, accompanying MacDonald on a speaking campaign through Scotland, then touring the continent until they came to Italy, where Kath-

leen spent the winter with friends who lived in an old Florentine palace—"We nearly froze to death," is her comment on that glamorous interlude. She studied painting and fencing in Italy and became so proficient at the latter that when she returned to the United States and enrolled at the University of California she won and held the women's fencing championship during her stay there.

She made her radio debut four years ago and the quality of her fresh, young voice—one of those all too rare ingenue voices capable of registering emotions with color and subtlety—made her one of the finds of the microphone.

"Dead Men Prowl," a mystery serial by Carlton E. Morse, provided her first radio rôle, and she appeared in several others including "The Golden Flame." She was selected for the part of Claudia in "One Man's Family" without an audition, so thoroughly did she fulfill the requirements of the rôle in voice and personality. In one matter, however, she differs utterly from her ether self; she may belong, like Claudia, to the generation that worries Father Barbour so intensely, but her matrimonial experience, unlike Claudia's, has been happy. She was married a year and a half ago to Rawson Holmes, Stanford graduate.

So deeply did Claudia's early adventures in life impress themselves upon listeners that many believed her to be a real girl. When Kathleen lost her voice with a severe case of laryngitis, and Claudia had to be sent to Europe by the resourceful playwright, hundreds of listeners wrote, telephoned, and even telegraphed inquiries and regrets. When she returned last spring the NBC switchboard almost collapsed under the calls which poured in after the broadcast.

Kathleen has danced since she was able to walk, and appeared with Ruth St. Denis when she was six. If she had to choose another career besides, acting she would find it difficult to choose between that of a ballet dancer or a painter; she loves both of these avocations of hers, and feels that they are two of the many mediums of art, to be followed on the theory that acting is a combination of all the arts. In books she prefers Russian novels; in music, Debussy and Ravel, and she hopes some day to play Lady Macbeth.

NEWS and COMMENT

The Tacoma Elks Lodge have just inaugurated over KVI their eighth season of presenting their weekly "Stocking Fillers" program. Every year about one hundred men from all walks of life give their time six days a week for two months, in order to put this well known series on the air. The object of the program is to gather clothes, money, toys, and other contributions that are to be distributed to needy children of the vicinity.

Tommy Burns, widely known Tacoma singer is directing the programs this year, and Max Frolic is directing the orchestra. All artists for the program donate their talents in the interests of the goal in view. Many new performers have been developed

from these programs.

The "Stocking Fillers" broadcast every Friday from 9 to 11 o'clock from the main auditorium at the Elks Lodge. There a special soundproof studio has been constructed for the broadcast, so that the huge crowd that formerly jammed the studios of KVI can come here to see and hear the program as it is presented. Of course, the time is donated by the station for the programs, which have a very successful past record.

The climax of the "Stocking Fillers" programs comes Christmas morning. Then the children of the community are brought together at the Elks Lodge, to enjoy a hearty Christmas dinner with all the traditional "fixin's." Besides that, the Elks put on a special show for them, with much of the talent that has appeared on their previous air programs. And then—food, clothing, equipment for school, and other necessaries for a more pleasant life during the winter are distributed to the children. The work of more than two months is now successfully finished—and the happy smiles on the children's faces are more than ample reward.

Offers to pay at the rate of \$100 a minute and upward, in one case reputedly \$1,666 a minute, for radio appearances were reported today to be claiming the attention of several film stars.

In former days movie magnates had a way of swooping down on Broadway, fat checkbooks in hand, and taking the cream of the stage crops.

Now these same producers are watching a little swooping in their own direction, although the effect of the reputedly impending raids would not be the removal of any actor or actress from the screen even temporarily.

Although the report has never been confirmed, Greta Garbo reputedly has been offered \$25,000 for fifteen minutes on a nation-

wide broadcast.

Katharine Hepburn, Gloria Swanson, Shirley Temple, Charles Ruggles, Mary Boland, Bing Crosby, Lanny Ross, Eddie Cantor, John Barrymore, Joan Crawford, Adolphe Menjou, Clark Gable, Franchot Tone, Leslie Howard, Bebe Daniels, to mention but a few, are among those who either have already appeared "on the air" or who are listening to proposals that will fatten their purses considerably.

Crosby and Ross, of course, came to the screen via the radio, and it is only natural that they should continue their broadcasts. Their radio pay, although not revealed, is certain to be large.

One of the most conspicuous examples at present of the transfer from screen to microphone is Mary Pickford, whose first broadcast was attended by all the pomp and ceremony of a Hollywood premiere.

Pay for the average well known actor or actress ranges from \$1,500 for fifteen minutes up to \$6,500, which is the price for Hepburn, Swanson and the tiny Temple girl—

with variations possible, of course.

The team of Ruggles and Boland is reputed to split \$2,500 for each microphone appearance, while Eddie Cantor, several years ago, drew \$10,000 weekly for his combined screen and radio appearances, and his popularity has not diminished.

Lionel Barrymore, however, can't be bothered with radio. The great George Arliss is reported—not first hand, by any means—as having said that he wanted \$100,000 for thirteen broadcasts, and those who know his delicious humor believe he did so because he

was reasonably certain nobody would take it up. So far, no one has. His "Green Goddess," headed for the loud speaker, has Claude Rains, a stage actor, in the Arliss rôle.

Time was when most any Hollywood personality would appear on the air free of charge, figuring the national publicity was

well worth the expended effort.

On November 15, KFWB, Warner Bros.' Hollywood station, boosted its power to 2,500 watts, an increase of 1,500 watts. They have already applied for an additional 2,500 watts, and that they will get the extra power seems already assured.

Ψ

The sales organization of KHJ, Los Angeles station of the Don Lee network, has recently added to the department two new salesmen, G. O. Burke, and Amory Eckley, according to an announcement by C. Ellsworth Wylie, general sales manager of the Don Lee system.

Eckley, who has had some ten years' advertising experience in Los Angeles, was transferred from the sales organization of the San Francisco Don Lee station KFRC.

The expansion was made to build up a more efficient sales organization to meet increasing business, according to Arthur J. Kemp, sales manager of KHJ.

Coincident with the expansion, James D. Fonda was made advertising service manager. He is now concentrating his efforts on an up-to-date market survey of the eleven

western states.

Other changes at KHJ include the promotion of Kenneth Niles, former chief announcer, to be a producer; Clarence Hamilton, announcer, to be chief announcer and day supervisor, and Charles Bulotti, Jr., announcer, to be announcer and night supervisor.

William Goodwin, assistant production manager who was on leave of absence during the California political campaign, returned to his duties at KHJ November 12.

 Ψ

Television is now a practical reality in Germany. The radio exhibit in Berlin displays for sale row on row of receiving sets to show sound films in the home. Authorities are preparing to broadcast full evening television programs, beginning in January.

The biggest television company in the world was formed recently, with the combination of the British company, Baird Television, and the Germans' Loewe & Company, Bosch, and Zeiss works in a corporation known as "Fernsehgesellschaft." Twentyfive per cent of the stock is owned by Baird. The company cooperates with the German National Postal Company, which broadcasts television films. The radius of the station,

broadcasting on a seven-meter wave from Berlin daily, is forty miles. Broadcasts often are received within a radius of 120 miles.

The concern is convinced that this can be increased soon, or that, by installing relay stations, rural districts can pick up the programs. The Berlin station broadcasts scenes directly into a transmitter, or uses regular films, the same as the movies.

Radio stations WCOA, Pensacola, Fla., and WOC, Davenport, Iowa, have been added to the Columbia Broadcasting System, the world's largest network. There are now 102 outlets associated with the chain. Seven years ago, the original Columbia unit network consisted of sixteen stations.

WCOA is owned and operated by the Pensacola Broadcasting Company in the San Carlos Hotel, has 500 watts power and broadcasts on a frequency of 1,340 kilocycles, 233.7 meters.

WOC operated on 1,420 kilocycles, 211.1 meters, and is owned by the Palmer School of Chiropractic in Davenport, Iowa.

The most unusual pipe organ in the world is nearing completion in one of the big NBC studios in Radio City and will be heard by network listeners at an early date.

Specially designed for broadcasting by Acolian-Skinner in cooperation with NBC engineers, the new three-manual instrument will reproduce an almost unlimited variety of orchestral effects while matching in beauty of tone and flexibility of operation the organs of the greatest cathedrals. Its three keyboards of sixty-one notes each, and its twenty pedals, magnetically operate 1,024 pipes which are housed in a special organ loft at one end of the studio behind two sets of shutters, also electrically controlled. Chimes, which can be played on all three manuals and by the pedals, and a harp also are included in the banks of stops on each side of the console.

Every combination of string and woodwind orchestral effects can be produced at a touch of the fingers, the many sets of couplers and plungers beneath the keys of each manual permitting instantaneous variation of the thousands of effects and combinations.

A huge electric blower, which, like the entire studio itself, is set on springs, sends washed air to the pipes. More than 400 wires lead from the organ to the magnetic switchboard to hook up each of the stops in scores of combinations.

Foremost organ experts have been working with the NBC engineering staff for many weeks in planning and voicing the pipes to fit microphone requirements, and to take advantage of the unusually perfect acoustics of the studio.

The tip of a flag pole serving as an antenna, hollow wires which like water pipes carry electricity without leaking, and a quartz crystal scarcely thicker than a hair which acts as a control by vibrating 5,000,000 times a second, are among the features of the radio system just placed in operation by the Police Department of the City of Newark.

The system jointly produced by the Western Electric Company and Bell Telephone Laboratories uses an ultra-high frequency. 30,100 kilocycles. This is within a new band tentatively assigned for police work by the Federal Communications Commission to relieve crowding in the medium bands. A leader in opening up this band, Newark gains the advantage of radio operation free from atmospheric disturbances and from overlapping with other stations.

In addition to a main control room at headquarters, duplicate controls together with the transmitter are located on the 34th floor of the National Newark & Essex Bank Building, highest building in Newark. Vacuum tubes in the transmitter multiply the vibrations of the hair-thick crystal six times producing the precise frequency required.

A "concentric" transmission line composed of one copper tube within another runs to the roof, the outer tube preventing the escape of any current and thus making the line "water tight." The line runs up the inside of a 100-foot flag pole topped by a 22-foot brass tube which acts as the antenna 600 feet above street level.

In addition to forty police cars, receiving sets are planned at headquarters, precinct stations, several fire department cars and homes of officials.

Lanny Ross, his current engagement before the motion picture cameras completed, is back in the NBC Radio City studios, continuing his broadcasting and preparing to give ambitious young artists in the East a radio hearing on the broadcasts featuring Ross and his Log Cabin Orchestra every Wednesday evening.

Auditions are being conducted to select the best available talent from among hitherto unknown microphone aspirants to perform as guest artists on the New York programs which began a few weeks ago.

The series went on the air while Ross was working in pictures on the West Coast and brought to the microphone a number of promising young singers who had never had a chance before the nationwide radio audience.

Ross himself had the same hard road to travel to fame as the newcomers that are getting a "break" in Ross's Log Cabin show. A few short years ago an obscure college

boy with an untried voice and unrealized ambitions, he got a radio hearing and began the career that has gained him recognition from coast to coast.

Consequently, with his own experience fresh in his mind, he enjoys the opportunity of presenting the youthful talent from New York City and the surrounding district in the programs from Radio City.

 Ψ

Erecting the nation's tallest self-supporting radio antenna, more than doubling its day-time power, and installing a new 5,000-watt transmitter, Station KOL. Seattle CBS outlet, is expected to have a vastly increased listening area. The new equipment was put into operation November 18.

Towering nearly 200 feet higher than the Statue of Liberty, (490 feet as contrasted with 305 feet), the new "vertical radiator" is a good twenty feet higher than any similar radio tower in the United States.

Simultaneously with the installation of the new transmitter, speech amplifying equipment and vertical antenna, KOL commences broadcasting on an increased power of 2,500 watts daytime and 1,000 watts after sundown.

KOL's magnificent pipe organ, broadcasting studios and executive offices will remain in the Northern Life Tower.
