



B ECAUSE of renewed agitation against the advertising phase of sponsored programs, coincident with the hearings held recently by the Federal Communications Commission before which certain elements favored complete or partial government control and even public ownership, we herewith give our readers the highlight results of a recent survey conducted by *Radio Art*, which covered the entire country, embracing all classes of people and representing what is believed an honest national opinion.

Of outstanding significance was the high percentage of listeners who believed sponsors were justified in advertising their products. The majority of objections to advertising on the air came from people who obviously were not in the market for the products advertised and not financially fixed to buy. A study of the returns indicate that there is not so much listener's opposition to sales talk as has been supposed. The conclusion is reached that those who were able to mention specific programs were honest in their belief that these programs contained *too much* mention of the advertiser's product.

That listeners generally are fair minded regarding radio advertising is evidenced by the answers to the question: "Do you feel that people who are providing the radio program are justified in advertising their products?"

Ninety-five per cent of those interviewed went on record in the affirmative and only 5 per cent declared that sponsors were not within their rights in devoting time to advertising. The latter are those who obviously have a preference for the European government owned system which is purely entertainment and propaganda.

Other results of the survey, in relation to other phases of radio broadcasting, were illuminating. The half-hour program was favored by 64 per cent; 20 per cent favored fiteen-minute broadcasts while 14 per cent favored a forty-five minute period. Dance music leads the field in popularity by a wide margin. Other types of programs which were well up in the scale of listener preference included news, comedy and drama. In breaking down these three major program divisions some preconceived notions are slightly dented. For example, news was divided into four divisions, viz., commentators, news summary, dramatized news and sports. News summary types of programs were first with a rating of 31 per cent; sports scored second with 24.7 per cent; commentators and dramatized news tied for third place each with 22 per cent.

One surprising fact revealed is the popularity of sports broadcasts. In the past sponsors who aired sports have renewed their contracts, indicating complete satisfaction with the results of their air advertising and the programs.

Despite the fact that a few comedians are in the spotlight the programs featuring well known comics take second place to humorous skits. Fifty-four per cent of the listeners questioned favored the skits compared with 43 per cent who thought comedians were best. Three per cent declared that they had no choice.

This naturally suggests the question: "Are high priced comedians worth while?" It is impossible to provide an answer, because many of the comedians have drifted from the joke telling stage to that of creating comic situations. The trouble with comedians, long recognized by the listening public and by performers themselves, is the difficulty of obtaining a constant supply of material. Some of the best known comedians on the air have suffered from inability to get the right material and many of them have turned to humorous situations as a way out of the dilemuna. The thing resolves itself down to a question whether the program would be just as effective if lower priced actors were hired to put over the comic situations or humorous skits or whether high priced comedians can do this to greater advantage.



• • The One Man's Family cast celebrated Thanksgiving a week in advance of the rest of the world. A Thanksgiving dinner with turkeys, cranberries and "fixin's" was the pleasant surprise the Barbours met when they finished the broadcast of their first program under their new sponsor, Wednesday, November 21. A long table at the Palace Hotel was laid for a family dinner, with Henry Barbour at the head and Mother Barbour at the other end.

 Viola Washburn, KOMO's vivacious. golden-haired, blue-eyed girl, is an ingenue of unquestioned acting ability. She was discovered by George Godfrey several years ago while appearing in a "Little Theatre" play. Mr. Godfrey, struck by her potentialities, sought her out after the performance and the result was her entrance into radio. Her amazing insight and characterization has made her easily the most outstanding dramatic figure of drama in the Northwest. She can play the entire range of human life, from infancy to old age, one as well as the other, having played a crying babe in one breath and the grandmother in the next. A very promising future is in store for this young actress, who works hard on every part she is cast for, no matter how small. She is a graduate of Ballard High School in Seattle and studied drama under the tutelage of Mr. Godfrey. Enthusiastic about everything, her favorite sports are horseback riding and swimming.

• • Is Hale a Scotch name? Or, did Travis Hale, of the Al Pearce Three Cheers, drop the Mc? When Travis took Renee Winkler down to the license bureau to get their marriage license he made her pay for half of it. Of course he made a gesture to pay the whole \$2, but he felt pretty safe they wouldnt' be able to change a fifty dollar bill. They were married at the Wee Kirk 'O the Heather in Hollywood, November 17.

• • Clay Osborne, KFI-KECA production manager, spent his vacation playing with stone, brick, mortar and trowel. Result, a decorative fountain and fishpond with a windmill that uses the same stream of water in a continuous flow.

• • • Roderick Mays, the smiling announcer heard on KYA's Dinner at Six shows up periodically with a nose and cheek a bit red from sunburn. He says he's been playing tennis and we find that Rod does quite a bit, usually with Mrs. Mays, but we haven't yet discovered who wins. ••• The Gary-Evers orchestra heard over KYA is the only incorporated orchestra on the coast, having a legally enforceable contract to undertake all work as a unit with all income distributed ten ways. The boys are all bachelors although difficulty arises keeping them that way at times. A tip to aspiring girl vocalists might be that this popular orchestra is trying hard to find the right girl to sing with them. And, too, the Gary-Evers orchestra is one of the youngest having a full time engagement on the Pacific Coast.

• • • The National Broadcasting Company makes an earnest effort to coöperate with all fan requests. But the latest has the company stumped. E. Nimmo, writing from Rotorua, New Zealand, asks that KFI, NBC's affiliated station in Los Angeles, change its wavelength because native stations sometimes interfere with his reception.

• • • Mary Livingstone's sister and Jack Benny's sister-in-law lives with them. Defying the time-honored slogan that "Three's a Crowd," she fits harmoniously into the Benny menage. Handling the fan-mail and helping out at rehearsals are among her activities.

• • John Fee, who recently was signed to portray KYA's Story-teller, will be remembered as the hated villain in the Odeon Music Hall seen a few weeks ago in San Francisco. John has been in stage and radio for many years and is a thorough veteran at the game. Besides his narration work, John has been successful as actor, director and teacher.

••• Ed Lynn, author of the radio dramatic versions of "Peter the Great," "Catherine the Great" and "Benjamin Franklin" broadcast over KHJ, received word recently that "The Saga of Lief Ericson," an epic style poem written by him and which had its world premiere at the Hollywood Bowl this summer, will be played by Leopold Stokowsky and the Philadelphia Symphony Orchestra next December 20. The program will not be broadcast, however. The music to accompany Lynn's lyric was written by Sigurd Frederickson.

• • • Cy Trobbe, KYA's musical director, has one of the largest music libraries in radio. The maestro informs us that he has over torty thousand orchestrations on his shelves. It's nearly as tough to figure out the card index and find certain pieces as it is to play the music itself but when somebody wants something, well, try to stick Trobbe. • • James Melton has gone and done it. ... Signed a moving picture contract with Warner Brothers. Rumors that Jimmy had picture bids have been rife for months. But he actually didn't close the deal until just the other day. The contract demands that he report to the west coast studios within the next six or seven months, but it makes proper provision for his radio work. The tentative picture vehicles chosen for the singing star of Town Hall Tonight, are "Broadway Gondolier" and "New York, London and Paris."

• • Clarence Meyers, formerly radio editor of the San Francisco *Call-Bulletin*, has been appointed by the MacGregor and Sollie Electrical Transcription Studios of San Francisco to handle special publicity work.

• • If you want to know anything about the music of the past fifteen years just write to Peter Van Steeden. For the young NBC maestro's music library is the envy of Radio Row. Peter not only has a complete file of all the popular music of the past fifteen years but he has his file cross-indexed according to dates, names of compositions, composers and arrangers.

• • • Add one-time occupations of famous radio people: Tony Wons, star of the House by the Side of the Road program, made enough money to help his family by working in a factory daytimes and in an orchestra during the nights.

NEWS and COMMENT

Metropolitan Opera, annual music treat for the vast radio audience, will be back on the air for listeners from coast to coast this season through the courtesy of the makers of listerine. The sponsored series will start on Saturday, December 29, and will continue for twelve or more weeks.

As a special feature the opera broadcasts this year also will bring Geraldine Farrar, one of the most glamorous and beloved stars in the entire history of the Metropolitan Opera Company, to the microphone as a radio raconteuse.

The famous prima donna, who retired from the operatic stage twelve years ago at the very peak of her fame, will discuss the operas and the singers and will entertain listeners between the acts with intimate, back-stage stories of her own and the present day at the Metropolitan Opera House.

Through special arrangements between the Metropolitan Opera Company and the National Broadcasting Company, the Christmas Day matinee performance of "Hansel and Gretel" also will be heard on the air as usual. This and other complete performances of the world's greatest operas by the nation's most famous artists will be heard throughout the United States, Canada and the Hawaiian Islands over an NBC transcontinental network including at least eighty stations.

This year Geraldine Farrar and her interesting and original comments and stories will be a special treat for those who hear grand opera over the air. Milton Cross, NBC announcer, also will be in one of the NBC boxes at the opera house, and will relate the stories of the operas for the listening audience.

Geraldine Farrar will have her own microphone in one of the grand tier boxes. This box will contain a glass door through which the lady who once charmed thousands from the other side of the footlights can survey the scene in the auditorium. The box also will contain a small piano, on which she will accompany herself when she wishes to sing certain passages to illustrate her remarks.

From time to time the famous diva will ask celebrated members of the opera company to come to her box between the acts to speak to the radio audience, and will match their stories of the Metropolitan today with her own memoirs of the days fifteen years ago when Geraldine Farrar and Enrico Caruso were making operatic history on the same stage.

As in previous years, the broadcasts will be of regular, full length performances by the Metropolitan Opera Company, and will be picked up direct from the stage of the Metropolitan Opera House.

During the first year of its existence the Radio City headquarters of the National Broadcasting Company has become a mecca for radio engineers from all parts of the world. From countries in every continent experts have flocked to the New York home of NBC to examine the world's most modern and most efficient broadcasting plant.

Nineteen countries, so far, have sent delegations, committees or lone investigators to find out how Radio City was built, how it operates on its split-second schedule, how the coast-to-coast networks are "fed" their constant diet of entertainment and information. The nations represented to date are: Argentina, Australia, Austria, Brazil, Canada, China, Czechoslovakia, England, France, Germany, Holland, Italy, Japan, New Zealand, Poland, Russia, Siam, South Africa, and Sweden.

As a result, O. B. Hanson, chief engineer of NBC, has been kept busy acting as host and guide, while directing the technical operation of the world's largest broadcasting system.

According to Hanson, the things which interest foreign engineers most are the acoustical control system, developed and perfected by NBC engineers; the multiple switching system to shift programs instantaneously from one place to another, and the system of pre-setting network hook-ups to await the mere push of a button.

Recent visitors at Radio City from across the ocean were members of a committee from the British Broadcasting Corporation, including Lord Selsdan, P. C., K. B. E.;

N. Ashbridge, chief engineer of the BBC; F. W. Phillips, assistant secretary of the British post office, and Col. A. S. Angwin, assistant chief engineer.

At noon Sunday, November 11, KOIN-The Journal, in Portland, dedicated their new 5,000-watt transmitter. The station broadcasts on a granted power of 2,500 watts daytime and 1,000 watts night, but the new transmitter is designed to take care of the future.

The job is a composite one designed and built by Louis S. Bookwalter, ex-CBS, New York, who is now technical director of KOIN-The Journal, and its companion station, KALE. KOIN on 940 kilocycles is now sending out signals from the most modern transmitter west of the Mississippi. It is a no generator, and therefore humless signal, has an audio spectrum 30 to 10,000 cycles, porcelain water cooling system for the tubes, and instead of the generators, employs twenty-six rectifier tubes in the power bank. This is one of the most recent changes in transmitter design. It operates on class B modulation, which assures 100 per cent modulation, the second station on the Pacific Coast to employ this improvement, the first being KALE.

The master control is fool-proof and complete. The operator has under his hand complete control of all equipment, and a safety valve, trip-over system, is a guarantee against destructive power surges.

So he recently packed his bags and his hunting togs and journeyed into the frozen north, finally coming to roost up near Canada's Yukon territory, a thousand miles from civilization.



Astonishingly small is the number of applicants who can meet the pronunciation test devised for announcers' auditions. Not one candidate out of ten pronounces them correctly. In a recent audition at which twenty men were tried out, eighteen failed miserably on the announcing test and two were barely fair. The final arbiter so far as pronunciation is concerned is Webster's International Dictionary.

FROM an obscure pianist to the composer of world-famous dance tunes and modern classics—that is the amazing transition made by George Gershwin who conducts the "Music by Gershwin" program over a Columbia network. Today, at 36, he is hard at work on an opera.

Such accomplishments, even for a person gifted with Gershwin's unusual ability, would be impossible without the determination and vitality which have characterized him since boyhood days. A native of Brooklyn, George first felt the kindling of his musical soul at the age of ten. Maxie Rosenzweig, a fellow grammar school student, was responsible for this early awakening. But Maxie, known today as Max Rosen, violinist, might have blighted the hopes of the average artistic aspirant. "I don't think you have enough talent to justify a career in music." he bluntly told young George. Yet George continued his studies. Today Gershwin's "Rhapsody in Blue" is a twentieth century classic. His dance rhythms have been demanded by sophisticates and simple folk in London and Paris as well as in every American community.

George's early musical education seriously strained the family's limited exchequer, although his lessons only cost 50 cents each. Eventually he put himself under the tutelage of Charles Hambitzer, Jr., the first to recognize George's talent and to encourage him musically. Although he learned some of the principles of harmony from Hambitzer, it was the youth's own instinct which served as his chief guide through the major technical hazards of his most serious works.

The embryo pianist-composer was not friendly toward a prescribed scholastic education, After attending the High School of Commerce in New York for two years, he said farewell to the classroom and obtained a job as piano-pounding song-plugger at Remick's music house for the sum of \$15 a week. After two years he resigned to become pianist in Fox's City Theater on Fourteenth Street. The job lasted one day. A comedian "razzed" him unmercifully in front of the audience, and George departed embarrassed and outraged, without even taking time to collect his pay check. Twelve years later the Fox Company paid him \$50,000 so Paul Whiteman could play his "Rhapsody in Blue" in the movie, the "King of Jazz."

Following his untimely exit from the vaudeville house, Gershwin obtained an engagement as accompanist to Louise Dresser. In that capacity he met Max Dreyfuss, guiding genius of the Harms music publishing firm. Dreyfuss offered to give Gershwin freedom to write without confinement to set hours at a salary of \$35 a week.

From that time the record of George Gershwin's life is mainly a listing of countless musical hits. His earliest musical comedy was "La La Lucille," written in 1919. Then followed scores for five of George White's Scandals; for the musical comedies, "Lady Be Good," "Funny Face," "Of Thee I Sing" and "Let 'Em Eat Cake" and many others.

A thin, dark-haired, aesthetic looking young man, Gershwin, for all his fame, remains a sympathetic, gracious human being among the outstanding figures of Twentieth Century America.

STEP up and meet John McIntire, Hollywood's leading announcer, heard on numerous NBC programs, who explains that he is Irish, and that is why his name is spelled that way.

McIntire's is the announcing voice you hear on Rudy Vallee's Fleischmann program, on Marv Pickford's dramatic half-hour for Royal Desserts, on the Hall of Fame series emanating from Hollywood, and the same one you heard on Jimmie Durante's broadcasts for Chase & Sanborn.

McIntire's buoyant personality was first given to the world twenty-seven years ago in Montana—and in a log cabin. After fifteen years of comparative primitive life, however, the McIntire's came to California and son John enrolled at the University of Southern California, where he majored in speech and dramatics.

After graduation he spent two years before the mast as a naval seaman, then returned to start in radio as a dramatic reader. His hobbies include such sports as polowhen possible—fencing and boxing. He is unmarried, and his ambition is to be a successful writer of stories and plays. He already has sold some of his works to publishers.

it shows musical talent, but I would like to say that the lilting swing along the base-line and the rounding-out of upright strokes, plus the very curvilinear, graceful capitals, are the signs of the feeling for time and rhythm, tune, and melody.

Edna's writing is a type which expresses general all-round artistic sense, with musical talent and dramatic instinct predominating.

* * *

The swinging, rounded, open and "curly" style reflects a large share of charm and personal magnetism, spontaneous expression, grace of manner, and a terrific sense of humor. Edna Fischer loves the pleasurable and humorous aspects of life, and is fond of gaiety and sparkle of all kinds. Furthermore, she is the type who can always enter into good times, and get a maximum of enjoyment out of them. Her nature is sociable, friendly and genial, without restraint, repression or inhibitions of any kind. Everything about her is open and expressive. She is frank and caudid to an extreme degree, but is the type who can be that way without giving offense. The abundance of curved and rounded formations in her writing, and particularly the garland-shaped "n's" reveal diplomacy and graciousness. This writer is a girl who can get away with a lot on the strength of her personality and magnetism. Charm is her greatest asset of life.

Her writing is characteristic of people who seem emotional, because they are volatile and impulsive, and sometimes a bit on the effusive side. But that upright style, with firm, confident and decisive strokes, shows that Edna Fischer is a self-governed person, who can keep her emotions in hand at any time that suits her. Her imagination is warm, but her heart is actually quite cool.

She is a self-confident, self-sufficient individual, who can stand on her own feet, and who will always see to it that she does well by herself. Her gracious and sparkling personality masks an enterprising, decisive character, and a good deal of calculation. She is an ambitious person who never loses sight of her objectives, and never forgets "effects."

Those circular i-dots always show a nature which is concerned to a great extent with effects and impressions. In addition, they express desire for distinction, sensitiveness to beauty, moodiness and artistic aspirations. Frequently, they denote susceptibility to fads.

Notice the excess of "looped" formations in Edna's writing. This is the calligraphic expression of a kindly, tender, protective instinct, which likes to help, shield and shelter others. It signifies tenderness, generosity and a wealth of human kindness, and belongs to the truly domestic nature, which loves home, family, children, and animals. Such a writer would create the *spirit* of a home, which is what really makes one.


