THE year of 1934 has been the leanest in recent years in the matter of developing new talent for radio. This is partly due to the scurrying of sponsors for "big" names and as a result such stars as Grace Moore, Beatrice Lillie and others are high on the horizon as 1935 unfolds its programs.

Probably the outstanding individual star of 1934 was Helen Jepson, who a year ago was a member of Paul Whiteman's chorus and who today is a star in her own right with a Metropolitan opera contract and everything. The veteran showman, Roxy, was responsible for the year's other outstanding talent development-the team of Herbert Kingsley and Cicki Chase. Practically unknown until, with one of Jean Paurel's unusual arrangements, they auditioned for Roxy, along with a group of other new-comers, they were grabbed and pushed into a headline position by Roxy. They have advanced by leaps and bounds and demands for their appearance in person—a sure sign of success in radio-have been increasing as the weeks go by. Roxy has also contributed such talented newcomers as Lillian Morton, Amy Deloro and Alfredo Saville.

While not exactly "developments," the Swift hour, featuring Sigmund Romberg and Professor William Lyon Phelps, has brought two characters to the microphone for whose

presence the ether fare is richer.

"One Man's Family," in getting the sponsorship of Kentucky Winners cigarettes, created no little stir because a sponsor means that the program is heard every Wednesday night at a specified hour instead of being booted around the dial as had been happening.

Frank Black with his "rhapsodic symphony" for Coco Cola, enriched the airwaves by doing perfectly what several lads in the past had tried to do without any but ordinary success.

The coming of Mary Pickford to the mike, too, has created no little stir.

And under the guiding hand of Deems Taylor, Chase and Sanborn have shown that opera can be both tuneful and understandable—a fact myriad of radio listeners have doubted in the past.

Captain Tim Healy, with his Stamp Club of the Air, bowed in with what might seem a dull subject and made it live for millions of fans.

But the year failed to produce another Jane Froman, another Boswell trio, another group of Mills Brothers or another Joe Penner. However, in the class programs it made up for the lack of individual discovery.

ADIO is rapidly becoming addicted to one of the vices that has for many years existed in the book publishing business and in motion pictures. Let a producer come out with a gangster drama that proves a hit, and five others come along with plays in which the hero talks out of the corner of his mouth and dies by bullets aimed at his ample back while he was trying to creep home and say goodbye: (1) to the old life; (2) to crime, and (3) to Mom, upon whose doorstep he died.

The choir influence is now prevailing in radio. Few producers of programs seem to realize that their best efforts have all the sympathetic quality of a circus calliope playing "Hearts and Flowers" and that diction to the member of the average choir, is a word long forgot or whose meaning was never, nevah known. And because Fred Waring and a very few others have been able to make effective use of the choir, lo and behold they spring up overnight. Once you needed a hotcha band leader; now you must have, as a component part of a successful radio program a choir capable of doing "Rock of Ages" in rhythm and jazzing up "Home Sweet Home" with "oh-wooos" and other forms of wolf calls.

Just as Jack Pearl went steadily down the scale of popularity because he kept demanding "vas you dere, Sharlie?" long after even Sharlie cared, so will the vocal fire whistles foisted upon our tender ears disappear. Right now they are la mode.

MICROPHONE GOSSIP

- • The first mail of the New Year brought a proposal of marriage to Ruth Clark, the one Clark Sister still remaining in radio, and who conducts a shopping program on KLX daily. The proposal was inspired by her picture which had appeared in the paper a day or so previously and was from a love-lorn swain temporarily stranded in Oakland. It was several pages in length and ended—not with P. S. I love you, but with "I am badly in need of shirts, socks and shoes." Ruth, however, decided to stick to broadcasting.
- • The Bluettes—Marian Peck, Theresa Aezer and Meredith Gregor—popular Columbia-Don Lee network harmony team, after six years of successful harmonizing, have broken up.

Marian Peck, soprano of the trio, has taken to law, accepting a position with a well known San Francisco law firm. Miss Aezer, arranger and accompanist of the team has charge of the music library of KFRC in San Francisco, during Miss Ruth Rush's extended leave of absence. Meredith Gregor the third member of the popular group, has returned to her home in Long Beach, California, to manage property affairs for her mother's estate.

• • • Al Schuss, former KOMO-KJR announcer, has been announcing the Alexander Woolcott all-star programs for Nash over the Columbia Broadcasting System.

Schuss, going under the name of Allen Hale, left KOMO-KJR to take work with the United States Department of Justice. After a few hair-raising experiences in Cicero, Al joined the announcing staff of WBBM in Chicago.

Northwest listeners have heard his voice over the Columbia network frequently of late. He announced the Christmas and New Year programs for Nash Motor Company. On these programs appeared a number of the outstanding names in radio and pictures.

• • Marsden Argall, a baritone with an American and European record that is outstanding, has joined the KYA vocal staff. The newcomer is far from unknown in San Francisco as he has frequently appeared with the San Francisco Opera Company. Abroad his experience has been with the opera at Nice, Vienne, Parma, Verona, Lake Como and elsewhere. In the United States aside from his San Francisco seasons, he has appeared with the Los Angeles Opera and with the San Carlos Company. Argall was with Merola during the first season at Stanford

- in 1921. Among other records he was the first singer to step on the stage before an audience at the new opera house, appearing in a major rôle in La Tosca.
- • Betty Borden, rhythm singer and society debutante of Pasadena, who has appeared in special productions on The Shell Show, was the star entertainer at the Pasadena Junior League's annual dinner Saturday, December 22. Not only did she sing, but she also demonstrated her ability as an expert dancer, and in addition, made charcoal portrait sketches of officers of the club. At 18 she finds herself in demand as a singer, a dancer and an artist, and has chosen radio as her career.
- THE DOG-GONE TRUTH: Recently on her Matinee Hour, Kate Smith presented a novelty pick-up from Grand Central Palace, New York City, where art students draw live animal models. When the broadcast was returned to the studios, Kate kiddingly remarked: "Now that we've learned something new about animals, children, you can take your dogs to school tomorrow for special study." But the boys and girls of the country took Kate at her word. For teachers and parents called up Columbia headquarters in stations various local Manhattan and throughout the nation to find out why the youngsters insisted on bringing their canines into schoolrooms. Some were indignant, others thought it funny. Nevertheless, the fourfooted animals both of blue ribbon and dubious ancestry followed the children to the schoolhouses, just as Mary's little lamb followed her. Only no one's written a poem yet about "Kate's little kids" who got the teachers' goats.
- • Chuck Cook, the new Al Pearce tenor yodeller was raised in Idaho, Kansas and Texas though he is now living in Long Beach. He has worked on many middle-western and all of the southern California stations.
- • Lawrence Tibbett is responsible for the Metropolitan Opera's inclusion in its schedule this year of "In the Pasha's Garden," by the young American composer, John Seymour. Seymour sent the script to the NBC baritone, who thought so much of it he urged the Met to consider it.
- • Morey Amsterdam, Al. Pearce comic, was sent seventeen cakes and a flock of telegrams on his birthday. Morey wired his parents congratulations upon having such a wonderful son.

- • Rosemary and Priscilla Lane's new gowns were sent them by sister Lola from Bebe Daniels' American Maid Dress Shop in Hollywood.
- • Where are those lads who said you live for two years in radio and then fade away? Only Arthur Tracy of the once-great has passed behind radio's eight ball. Morton Downey is getting more money than ever, Kate Smith comes back at a huge fee—something her manager said she would get before she took a sponsor—and the Boswell sisters have done right well with Bing Crosby. And now comes Phil Spitalny, one of the earliest to offer complicated arrangements on the air waves. A sponsor feels he can give Rudy Vallee competition and not without cause. It will be highly interesting to note just what happens when Rudy gets competition, especially from another master showman like the long-haired Phil. And the sponsors seem to be "renewing" all our old acquaintances!!!

• • KFRC's master of the baton, Claude Sweeten, offers the most logical reason for the seemingly indefinite life of old "hot" songs like "St. Louis Blues," "Dinah," "Sweet Sue," and others of the same family.

Sweeten believes that "the simple, basic theme that runs through these tunes makes them perfect for arranging. And so long as band leaders, arrangers, and other note-handling brethren of the profession desire to make these songs synonymous with their names, and put their style into the arrangements, these songs will live."

• • • During the last ten years Dell Perry, studio accompanist and soloist of station KROW, has been heard over KFRC, KFWM, KJBS, KYA, KGO and WEBC. She will be remembered by her host of friends as the popular member of the piano team of "Piano Capers," which broadcast over the NBC chain for over three years.

Previously she toured vaudeville as a member of the four-piano act, known as "Jerry and Her Baby Grands," over the Keith-Orpheum circuit. Later, as a member of the "California Sun-Kist Maids"—also a piano foursome—she traveled the Pantages circuit.

• • • Yahbut and Cheerily, stars of The Shell Show, recently appeared by invitation before the Cartoonists' Club in Hollywood. There were more than eighty cartoonists present, among them some of the biggest names in the newspaper world. Laughmakers themselves, the cartoonists are considered to represent one of the coldest audiences possible. Yahbut and Cheerily, however, put on an act for them in their tropical costumes which caused the cartoonists to roar. As a result of their appearance, several cartoonists made proposals to Yahbut and Cheerily to use them in a cartoon strip. The boys are considering the offer,

- • Being becalmed for seven weeks in the Southern Pacific in a four-masted schooner was no place for a busy, active personality like Captain Phillips Lord, the radio artist. The enforced calm left plenty of time on the hands of Captain Lord and the rest of the crew and the idea of doing nothing but fish, read and wait for a blow between his weekly NBC radio broadcasts did not appeal to Captain Lord's temperament so he was forced to take up the art of chess and checkers. Phil is hoping that by the end of his world cruise he will be the best deep-sea chess and checker player on the high seas.
- • Tony Stanford, who produces the Sunday afternoon Lux NBC dramas, doesn't let radio interfere with one of his pet theatrical superstitions. Puzzled as to why his rehearsal wasn't going as smoothly as it should, Tony soon found a solution. He stamped back into the control room and rubbed his hand briskly over the engineer's head. It's supposed to bring good luck—which it did for the remainder of the rehearsal.
- • A newcomer in KYA Lyric Quartet is Helen Andrews, who is now being heard as the contralto. Miss Andrews is well known in Bay musical circles and has a wide circle of followers. In addition to appearing with the quartet, she will be heard in solos with the orchestra.
- • Gordie Sandis and Marjorie Belasco, two new songbirds of radioland, have been engaged by Hal G. Nichols, owner and president of KFOX, to sing popular ballads over that station on alternating days during the week.
- • To add to the quirks of romantic fan mail, there's the case of Betty Barthell and Connie Gates, both CBS songstresses, who received letters proposing marriage from the same fan within one week.
- • The bell that announces Alexander Woolcott's Town Crier program has been quite a problem at the Columbia studios. Shortly after a bell with the desired tone finally was produced by the sound effects department, it was lost, strayed or stolen. Anyway, it wasn't to be found. The mystery was mentioned by Woollcott in his next broadcast and several days later he received two bells—one from a New England school teacher and another from "a listener." In order not to offend either sender, Woolcott alternates the bells on his programs.
- • The "Coral Fishers" as Tetrazzini sang it, will be heard over KYA some time in the near future, with Claire Upshur, director of the Lyric Quartet singing. Miss Upshur has Tetrazzini's own copy of Tosti's song with all her marks and phrasings upon it and will sing it as it was originally by the great coloratura.

NEWS and COMMENT

Effective January 7, the Carnation "Contented Hour" entered its fourth year on the ether, and is now taking in the southeastern group of National Broadcasting Company stations, which include WRVA, Richmond, Va.; WPTF, Raleigh; WTAR, Norfolk; WWNC, Asheville; WIS, Columbia; WJAX, Jacksonville, and WFLA, Tampa. In all probability, WIOD, Miami, will be added later, when time arrangements are completed.

This popular weekly concert is a much admired veteran among musical programs. It is already coast-to-coast, and the addition of these stations in the Southeast will bring the "Contented Hour" into every home in the nation by the most convenient tuning.

"Contented Hour" has the largest orchestra broadcasting from Chicago. This outstanding group of musicians is under the direction of Morgan L. Eastman, one of radio's pioneer conductors. The distinguished Carnation quartet, composed of Messrs. Pitts, Muir, Larson and Schmidt, with Bob Childs at the piano, is famous for the most difficult operatic selections and simple home melodies. The lullaby spot is occupied by a well known Chicago contralto who appears on this program as "The Lullaby Lady." Jean Paul King is the announcer.

One of the busiest men in radio is Emil J. Polak, National Broadcasting Company's musical counselor for the Western Division. Along with an imposing background of a musical education in New York, Prague. Dresden, Leipzig and Berlin, he has acquired a knack for getting things done.

In a recent interview, we pried out of him

his weekly schedule as follows:

"Sunday morning I direct Singable Songs, a program played by the popular orchestra, and its title tells its nature. At noon, Concert Gems with the concert orchestra. And Sunday evening I prepare incidental music for the Shakespearean dramas. That's an interesting task; there's not a great deal of Elizabethan music extant suitable for our set-up, so I compose and arrange the necessary music in the proper mood and style. That's Sunday.

"Monday brings the concert orchestra in the Master Library and a program for the male quartet for which I make all the ar-

rangements.

"Tuesday is the mixed quartet day, another

program of original arrangements.

"Wednesday—the 'day-off.' All I do on this day is—prepare programs for the week and make some new arrangements.

"Thursday afternoon there's the concert orchestra in the Restful Hour; then Every-

body Sing, which means just what its title implies. The popular orchestra sings—if not well—at least loud.

"Friday is the day of the Caswell Coffee program, one of the distinctive features of Pacific Coast broadcasting with tabloid presentations of musical comedies, and of course, I select and arrange them for the mixed

quartet and orchestra.

"And Saturday—String Time—a splendid string group with my arrangements of popular songs and old ballads. Later in the day—the Cecilians, an interesting group of soprano, contralto, violin, organ and piano, with some more original arrangements and in the evening the Emil Polak hour, 'Opera Time,' with the concert orchestra.

"That's the week! And in summing up one finds that in radio programs one must be prepared to present any portion of symphony or grand opera to 'You're the Cream in My Coffee.' So, doubtless, there are points of advantage in an education on two continents and in grand opera, musical comedy, concert tours and dance hall experiences."

Experiments in ultra short waves by Marconi, Italian electrical wizard, are being duplicated on a more humble scale in the San Francisco Bay area by Alan Cormack, technical director at KFRC. Mr. Cormack has recently built a tiny transmitter, mounted on a panel less than three by four inches in size, with which he has been able to send radio messages and music on a wave length of three-fourths of a meter, or more than 400,000 kilocycles. Reception so far has been limited to a comparatively short distance, but Mr. Cormack says that under favorable conditions the broadcasts from the midget outfit should be audible for thirty or forty miles.

Practical cookery and smart musical entertainment will be combined for the morning radio audience in a half hour show when Frances Lee Barton's new program goes on the air over an NBC coast-to-coast network.

The Kitchen Party, as the new series will be known, will feature the well known cooking authority and a cast of popular musical entertainers, including Al and Lee Reiser, ace piano team; Jimmy Wilkinson, baritone; Warren Hull, musical comedy master of ceremonics, and others to be selected in weekly broadcasts from the NBC Radio City studios under the sponsorship of General Foods.

The mother of eight children, Frances Lee Barton has been broadcasting General Foods' Cooking School of the Air every Thursday morning for the past three years. Her long practical experience and her genuine interest in housewives' problems have made hundreds

of thousands of radio friends for her, and have elicited countless letters which are largely responsible for her sponsor's decision to feature her on an augmented afternoon program over an enlarged network.

Their sparkling wit and whimsical philosophy already have made Lum and Abner one of the West's favorite air features. These two lovable old Ozark country hill billy char-

acters made their first appearance over KNX, January 7, and are broadcasting nightly except Saturdays and Sundays at 6:30 to

6:45 p. m.

Although in the program a number of characters are heard, Lum and Abner portray not only their own parts, but all the others, too. And in their own typical Ozark country style, they tell each night what all the folks down in Pine Ridge are a-doin', and what is happening around the Jot-Em Down store, of which they are the sole proprietors.

In real life, Lum and Abner are Chester Lauck and Norris Goff, who write their broadcasts as well as act them. It was four years ago that Lauck and Goff started reliving, via radio, the lives of the characters with whom they had been familiar since

early childhood.

Natives of Mena, Arkansas, they were engaged in business in that town when a twist of fate started them on a radio career. At the request of the local Lion's Club, Lauck and Goff teamed together in a sketch for a benefit performance over a Hot Springs radio station. In a very short time they broke all

fan mail records and, confident that they could "make the big time" Lum and Abner went to Chicago for a network audition.

As a chain feature, their success was even greater and now they rank among the topnotchers in the broadcasting field. Also heard over KGO five nights a week, 6:15 to 6:30 by means of electrical transcription.

Jack Pearl returns to the air as the central figure of a new series of programs sponsored by Frigidaire beginning February 13, from 7 to 7:30 p. m., P. S. T., over the nation-wide Columbia network. Pearl, previously identified as Baron Munchausen, returns to the microphone in the new character of Peter Pfeiffer. Pearl will be assisted as in the past by Cliff Hall, known as "Sharlie."

Mr. David Sarnoff, President of the Radio Corporation of America, has made the fol-

lowing announcement:

"The RCA Victor Company and the RCA Radiotron Company, the two wholly owned manufacturing subsidiaries of the Radio Corporation of America, have been consolidated into a single organization to be known as 'RCA Manufacturing Company, Inc.' The consolidation is being made primarily for convenience of operation. The present officers and management of the two subsidiary companies will continue in their respective positions, and the factories located at Camden, N. J., and Harrison, N. J., will continue their operations as at present.

"The present trademarks on the products manufactured by these companies will be continued through the establishment in the RCA Manufacturing Company, Inc., of two divisions, which will be known as the 'RCA Victor Division' and 'RCA Radiotron Di-

vision.

"Mr. E. T. Cunningham will be the President and Mr. David Sarnoff the Chairman of the Board of Directors of the RCA Manufacturing Company, Inc."

Sam Moore, noted Western radio personality, who has been featured on many transcontinental broadcasts and local programs, joined KFRC as master of ceremonies for the Happy-Go-Lucky Hour, popular Columbia-Don Lee network afternoon variety show on Monday, January 14.

Moore was featured in Ziegfeld's Midnight Frolic for two years, co-starring with Eddie Cantor, Fanny Brice, W. C. Fields, Will Rogers and other noted stars. He left Ziegfeld for vaudeville, and was a headliner for many years with Carl Freed, in the comedy, musical and novelty team of Moore and

Freed.

Entering radio early in 1929, Moore became popular on network programs, many of which he personally produced. He was the first to introduce the musical saw to the airlanes,

and is also the originator of the musical balloon. His versatility is remarkable when it comes to making music. He manages to cajole music from such unmusical instruments as old spoons, dishpans, nail-pullers and what have you. In addition to his skill with these contraptions, Moore is an expert with the banjo, violin, guitar and harmonica. He brings to KFRC airlanes the accumulated experience of many years of successful broadcasting.

R. M. Brophy, former Canadian radio executive, has been appointed manager of sta-Company, replacing Donald Withycomb, who becomes general manager of one of NBC's associated stations in Philadelphia, it was announced today by Richard C. Patterson, Jr., executive vice-president of the company.

Brophy has been active in the Dominion radio field for more than fifteen years. During that time he advanced from a workbench in the Canadian Marconi Company factory in Montreal to the position of assistant general manager of the company, which post he resigned last year to join the National Broadcasting Company in New York. In his new position he will maintain the close contacts with the Canadian Radio Broadcasting Commission which he established while active in the Dominion.

The new department head, who will act as liaison officer between the Radio City headquarters and the individual stations of the two big NBC networks, was born in Montreal in 1900. After leaving school he worked for five years in every phase of the radio manufacturing field. From 1924 to 1926, Brophy held the combined positions of supervisor of station CFCF, Montreal, and assistant sales manager of the Canadian Marconi Company, and in the latter year he was appointed sales manager. This work, including advertising and station supervision continued until last year, when he was promoted to the assistant general manager post. He also was president of the Quebec Radio Trades Association.

PROBABLY the hardest working orchestra director in these parts is Lloyd Solberg of KOMO-KJR. Not only does he work hard himself, but he keeps his musicians and vocalists right up on their toes all the time-and yet, they stick to him to a manand to a woman.

Lloyd Solberg has to keep busy because he rects "Musical Mannequins," "The Angelus directs "Musical Mannequins," "The Angelus Hour," "Highlight Hour," "Waltz Dreams," "Sweethearts on Parade," "Latin-America Nights," "Greater Washington Hour," "Mystic Asia," "Silver Strings" and many others. Of course you might call it work, but Lloyd Solberg is so interested in his music that it is all play for him.

He demands rehearsals before every program, and requires his vocalists to rehearse day after day until his critical tastes are sat-

isfied.

Although born in Rhineladner, Wisconsin, Solberg has been in Seattle since his year one. But since coming to Seattle he stuck pretty close to home. He admits he has been to Vancouver, but he hasn't been out of the state, in spite of the many offers he has had to go to San Francisco and Hollywood as musical director of large theaters there.

Solberg played over the radio for the first time in 1925, when as first violinist of the Olympic Hotel Orchestra he played on the dedicatory program. Since that time he has been on the radio pretty regularly. He was concert master for the "Concert Under the Stars" series. He was also solo violinist and concert master for the Coliseum Theater when it was doing "big time" in 1920-21. He was 19 at that time and the youngest concert master in the United States. During 1927 he was at KJR. In 1929 he joined KOMO as concert master, where he has continued for the last three years as musical director.

When questioned as to his ambition, Solberg shot back: "It is to direct a little symphony orchestra to play symphonic and popular ballads for the enjoyment of all the people.

The many people who have not visited the KOMO-KJR studios will recognize Mr. Solberg as the director for the past eleven years of the Frederick & Nelson String Trio.

A close second to music in Solberg's estimation is hunting and fishing. He rarely fails to get the limit or near-limit on each trip. However, he came second best one day this season. When hunting on the Skagit Flats he shot a duck which "flopped like a ton of lead." Solly walked over to pick it up, to find the duck making a hasty retreat. Twelve shots were fired, but the mallard got away.

Solberg's biggest thrill in radio took place early this year when he directed a twentytwo-piece orchestra, featuring eleven singers, in a national hook-up from KOMO-KJR. It was the dedicatory program for the new KOMO-KJR studios in the Skinner Building.

Mr. and Mrs. Solberg live at 1922 Franklin Avenue, where Solberg spends quite a bit of time giving his twelve-year-old son lessons in violin and piano. The boy is going "great

guns" on the mouth organ.

HANDWRITING

AND

Radio Personalities

MINETTA S. ELLEN (Fanny Barbour to you)

HIS is a very interesting handwriting, because of its pronounced characteristics. The main ones are the carefully executed letters, exact punctuation, and a certain rectilinear rigidity to the whole. These things would show up to better advantage if I were able to reproduce the full letter in natural size.

NOTE: This handwriting is considerably reduced from original.

Great mental energy and clarity are reflected in this kind of writing. It shows particularly, talents along scientific, technical or mathematical lines, plus an exacting conscientiousness, and almost a mania for accuracy in detail and minute particulars. This writer is an ultra-thorough, orderly and systematic person, of the type who would keep files and indexes, and who, whether consciously or not, would tend to "budget" her time and resources, and lead a life in which rule, routine and regularity played a prominent part. There are no signs of carelessness or haphazard habits in this writing.

The punctuation is highly significant. It is all exactly placed, and none of it is omitted. In some cases, short dashes are used, in addition to the normal stops. In many places, punctuation is duplicated. For instance, underlined words have two strokes instead of one. This occurs three times, even though not in the words "what next" which are shown. But notice the two dots after those words.

The interpretation, which is greatly enhanced by the rather constrained style of the

writing as a whole, is extreme caution, prudence and guardedness, extensive deliberation and reflection about every move, and the tendency to check impulses and weigh words carefully.

There are a good many "regressive" formations in this writing. That is—movements to the left. Examples in the illustration are the final strokes on the lower projections of "g" and "y" and the long leftward sweep before the completion of the capital "M." These (in such an exactingly conscientious handwriting, showing qualities of reverence, veneration, and so forth), denote the nature which tends to look backward a good deal, dissect events and analyze their causes and possible future effects, and treasure memories and traditions.

Since Minetta Ellen's rectilinear writing, with many breaks in the words, denotes clear thought, decided analytical and critical qualities, keen intuition, and quick penetrative insight . . . and because the type of writing shows great discipline and self-control, while her firm strokes and long, strong t-bars express will power, grit and determination. . . . we may be sure that here is a person who can profit by mistakes, live by logic and reason, and govern future actions by past experiences.

Throughout this letter there are many decidedly looped formations. An example is the capital "M" of the signature. This is a sign of the kindly, tender, protective instinct, which likes to help, shield and shelter others. There are many indications of generosity, too—but always a prudent, wise and careful generosity. The slope of the writing and the many rounded forms (even though the writing is primarily angular, indicating activity and energy) show affection, sympathy and tender feelings.

Other general indications in Minetta Ellen's writing are idealism, intensity of a bottled-up sort, extreme nervousness, aspiration and constant desire for self-improvement, reserve and dignity, positive opinions, and a rather blunt honesty.
