

REAKING through a tiny microphone no larger than a matchbox, fastened to his coat lapel, a device he described as "permitting one man to be heard above a multitude," Dr. Alfred N. Goldsmith, noted scientist and consulting engineer of the RCA Manufacturing Company, described and demonstrated some recent scientific developments from the leading radio research laboratories to more than 400 guests of the Cleveland Chamber of Commerce, meeting in the Statler Hotel in Cleveland recently.

The lapel microphone worn by Dr. Goldsmith utilizes the "velocity" principle of operation in which reproduction is obtained by the varying impact, or velocity of the human voice on a sensitive metallic ribbon within the mechanism. With this device a public speaker can move about freely without impairing the quality of the sound.

Pointing out that we already hear and will eventually see by radio, Dr. Goldsmith suggested that in the remote future radio might appeal to man's other senses, such as touch, taste and smell. For example, he said, there was the possibility of transmitting three-dimensional replicas of objects in the studio through "Telefactile Broadcasting," so that a solid representation which "might even be touched as well as viewed could be sent into the home." "Telegustatory Broadcasting," or transmission of taste, might make it possible to "taste" a fine brand of coffee, for instance, by radio. The transmission of smells would perhaps be easier, he said, since the "Telelfactory" receiver need only spray into the air a duplicate of the odor transmitted. He emphasized, however, that these possibilities were now "only whimsical and remote imaginings."

To illustrate the remarkable progress which has been made in improving the quality of sound motion pictures. Dr. Goldsmith demonstrated for the first time in public a radically new system of high quality sound-on-film recording which according to the RCA Victor engineers who developed it will be the

"motion picture sound of tomorrow," because it completely eliminates background hissing noises and theoretically, makes possible the ultimate of realism in sound-on-film recording and reproduction. Using a special film recording of a musical performance in the Radio City Music Hall in New York, Dr. Goldsmith called attention to the ability of the new system to reproduce the full definitions and shadings of all the instruments in the orchestra over the complete audible range of sound, as well as to the complete absence of hiss during the quieter portions of the music. With the new recording method, the sound waves are halved into two separate but symmetrical sound tracks, one negative and the other positive, automatically climinating the unused portions of the sound track which is a necessary part of all existing sound-on-film systems.

Speaking of the development of facsimile picture transmission, or the transmission of "still" pictures by radio, Dr. Goldsmith said that ultimately facsimile transmission will become a public broadcasting service of great popularity. Any printed or pictorial material will, sooner or later, be capable of speedy transmission instantaneously into a multitude of homes provided with simple automatically functioning receiving equipment, he

While describing the steady and orderly development of television experimentally as amazing, Dr. Goldsmith felt it necessary to temper optimism with a note of restraint in discussing the future of television broadcasting. The problems of television extend bevond purely technical considerations of transmitter and receiver, he said. There is the tremendous economic problem of launching a nationwide television service, when the cost of connecting numerous broadcasting stations of only limited service range in a network is at present staggering. Then there is the question of supplying almost overnight a demand for talent which will be pleasing to

MICROPHO GOSSIP

 That clear and decisive announcerial voice heard on Grace Moore's Tuesday night broadcasts for Vicks from Hollywood over an NBC network belongs to one of the best known, yet seldom seen, screen commentators.

It is that of Gayne Whitman, whose voice it was that described the wonders included in John Hix's "Strange As It Seems" series of shorts for Universal; the series of "Vagabond Adventures" travelogues for Van Beuren, and who did the running commentary in Will James' story "Smoky" for Fox and still another film "Last Wilderness."

- • So many of the phonograph records made by Raymond Paige, KHJ musical director, sold during the Christmas holidays that the recording companies are clamoring for more new discs by him and his orchestra. Ray will accommodate them as soon as he can get a little spare time away from his regular duties at the studio.
- • Grant Pollock, KFRC announcer, is the grandson of Colonel John M. Dunning, who was decorated by Abraham Lincoln for distinguished service in the Civil War and for also being the youngest soldier to participate in that war. He was nine years old when he enlisted.
- • KTAB scored a notable radio scoop when it reported a detailed description of the arrival of Amelia Earhart at the Oakland Airport upon the completion of her solo flight from Honolulu to the mainland.

Credit for the success of the undertaking goes to Frank Wright, manager of KTAB, who cooperated with officials of the Columbia Broadcasting System in putting an accurate account of her arrival over the air and feeding the service to ninety-four stations in the United States and twenty in Canada.

On the ground from almost the very outset of the flight, KTAB kept an all-night vigil as the girl flier winged her way eastward.

- As Miss Earhart stepped from her plane, Bob Dunn, KTAB announcer, secured an interview with the famous flier. It was the second beat scored by KTAB, the station having reported the landing of Kingsford-Smith upon the conclusion of his trans-Pacific flight from Australia.
- Carl Kroenke, stage and screen character, has been signed by the MacGregor & Sollie Broadcasting System, to star in a new Hollywood mystery serial entitled Shadow."

Production is starting now at the Mac-Gregor & Sollie studios in San Francisco on

this latest thriller of the air. It is to be released over the fifty stations affiliated with the broadcasting system. John Eugene Hasty is author of "The Shadow," which is packed full of thrills, crime, intrigue, romance.

Kroenke is a veteran of both the stage and screen and for the past five or six years has been making a steady headway in radio.

• • Bennie Walker McLaughlin, editor of the NBC Woman's Magazine of the Air, is proud as only a showman can be, of the way his father and mother "knocked 'em dead" when they appeared with him on the

Magazine the other morning.

Back in Slatington, Pennsylvania, where the elder McLaughlin was a business man with a flair for amateur theatricals Bennie sang his first songs in duet with his father, and his mother at the piano supplied the accompaniment. Distance has separated them for a number of years, so when the two arrived in San Francisco for a holiday visit Ben made them promise they would appear at the microphone with him some morning. When they fulfilled their promise, Ben's father had Magazine stars and spectators outside the glass window crying one moment and laughing the next, and his mother's touch on the piano won her an ovation of her own.

Despite the fact that the McLaughlins have two children on the air-Cheri McKay, heard from Chicago with the Merry Macs, is Ben's sister-it was their first appearance on the radio.

- Charles J. Correll, Andy of NBC's Amos 'n' Andy, paid \$250 for a rare white Pekingese dog while vacationing in England last summer and thought the price was pretty stiff. Three weeks ago the animal died and Andy decided to replace it. After considerable effort he located another one like it in Michigan. But he didn't buy it. The canine turned out to be a Blue Ribbon winner and the price quoted to Andy by its owner was enough to make anyone swoon. It was \$4800.
- • Pioneering a new movement in radio to test the effectiveness of comedy before it is placed on the air, Eddie Cantor, in his

new series, beginning February 3, will stage his rehearsals before an invited audience. Each Sunday afternoon he will rehearse his show at the Columbia playhouse before an audience, as a sort of preview. In this way Cantor will be able to test the laugh-getting power of his gags before he takes the air with them, and with such a guide will be able to delete, revise, and substitute as indicated in order to make a better show for the Sunday evening listeners.

- • Georgie Stoll, maestro of The Shell Show, has a large menagerie of miniature animals. Among them are included fantastic creations of artists, some of which look like they were sent from other planets. A friend of Georgie's, examining his menagerie, saw something missing, so as a Christmas present he sent Georgie a miniature snake. It has an electrical attachment and when the current is turned on its eyes glow fiercely. Now Georgie says all he has to do to complete the collection is to add miniatures of Adam and Eve and the apple.
- • Since KJBS has taken to the air with the increased power of 500 watts, verified reception has been reported along the eastern seaboard from Maine to Florida and at Alberta, Canada.
- • Tony Gale, Kate Smith's pianist and arranger, was playing in Philadelphia the other night when he got a phone call from Manhattan. His wife was expecting a baby at any moment and there wasn't a train for two hours. So Tony hired a taxicab and drove ninety miles to New York, arriving at the hospital simultaneously with the baby. The meter registered \$30. It was a girl—and Tony christened her Kate.
- • Two brilliant names formerly linked with NBC made their initial bow on KNX air lanes January 11. They are Myron Niesley, tenor, and Harlan McCoy, bass-baritone. Both are featured on Jerry Kilgore's new "D'Italia" show, fifteen minutes of all Italian music with the songs and announcing both done in Italian.
- • Raymond Leheney, KYA thespian, dropped a wallet containing \$28, a number of personal papers of no use to anyone and a lodge card. However, some honest man found the pocketbook and mailed it back to the owner. The only trouble was that he mailed it back entirely empty of lodge card, papers and money. The rest of the story is that the wallet was worth twenty-five cents and Leheney paid twelve cents postage due on the package bringing it back.
- • Rita Lane, soprano of the Carefree Carnival, has had a letter from Gabrielle De Lys, the contralto songstress who has gone to New York to appear on the Armour broadcast. . . . Gabrielle is thrilled with her

new work and its opportunities, likes New York fine and enjoys her new associates . . . but admits she's homesick for San Francisco.

• • Ran Wilde, leader of America's allstar college orchestra has opened a limited engagement in the Embassy Room of the Hotel St. Francis, broadcasting nightly over the facilities of the Columbia network through KFRC.

Wilde's musical group, hailed by many critics as the "ace campus band of the country." consists of fifteen artists and features Harriet Kaye and Joe Luke, vocalists.

- • Bob Crosby, brother of the Bing, has been squiring Vera Van around New York, and sat in the studio for her first appearance with Don Novis and Freddy Martin's band over CBS. It's no romance, however. They are old friends from California.
- • A complete library of imported records has been assembled by Rod Hendrickson of KTAB over a period of nearly ten years. The set is valued at several thousand dollars and consists of complete works of the Vienna Philharmonic Orchestra, the Royal Opera Orchestra of London, the Royal Opera Orchestra of Amsterdam and a score of others.

A select group is played each Tuesday evening over KTAB during the Loudon Fantasy period, from 8:15 to 8:45 o'clock.

the eye as well as the ear in such quantities as would drain the available supply in Hollywood, for instance, in a very short time. Then there is the important question of who will pay for the high cost of putting this talent on the air, for commercial sponsors would be called upon to pay a substantial portion of the cost of a feature-film production for an hour's broadcasting. That these problems will be solved in time Dr. Goldsmith did not doubt, but it is evident, he said that much must yet be accomplished in the interim.

A remarkable new device called an oscillograph was connected to a number of radio receivers to permit everyone to "see" the characteristics of the human voice or other sound in the form of fluctuating waves. Λ stream of electrons, otherwise known as a cathode ray, paints a continuous picture of the sound waves on a glowing or "fluorescent" screen. The oscillograph, according to Dr. Goldsmith, is expected to become to electrical, physical and mechanical research and development what the X-ray is to diagnosis in medicine. Originally designed for radio service men and engineers it is finding seemingly limitless application in many other fields, including certain phases of the aviation, automotive, and public utility industries.

NEWS and COMMENT

It is rumored that "One Man's Family" is to have another sponsor. In the broadcast of January 23, no mention was made of Kentucky Winners cigarettes or any other product, leaving the inference that the Royal Family of radio is again foot loose, fancy free, and not required to "dunk" their cigarettes. A rather sad blow, with father Barbour convalesing from an illness and the stock and bond business in a slump. However, there is no likelihood that they will be cast adrift or placed on the relief roll.

Two of the loveliest voices of the Metropolitan Opera and the concert hall will grace the new 1935 Chesterfield series.

Lily Pons, who is recognized as the world's favorite coloratura soprano, will be featured every Wednesday from 6 to 6:30 p. m., PST. Lucrezia Bori, acclaimed as the outstanding lyric soprano of today, will be presented as the soloist every Monday, at the same time. Andre Kostelanetz and his orchestra and vocal ensemble will be heard in support of the stars and will also be featured in their own programs of brilliant dance melodies during the same period each Saturday.

When Lily Pons made her Metropolitan Opera debut in 1931, the world learned that the rarest of voices, a truly great coloratura, had been found. Miss Pons, who is of French-Italian parentage, was born in Cannes on the French Riviera. She was graduated as a pianist from the Paris Conservatoire at the age of thirteen and took her first vocal lesson at the age of twenty-one. After three years of study she made her operatic debut in Alsace, followed by a series of engagements in the French provinces. Casazza, veteran impressario of the Metropolitan, received a cable from the South of France while she was singing there, advising him of the new and great discovery. A few weeks later she was on her way to America for her Metropolitan audition. In one week she signed with the "Met," with a recording company, and with a concert bureau. On January 3, 1931, she made her debut with the Metropolitan. The next day she awoke to find herself after one of the greatest ovations rendered to a singer in modern times, by both the critics and public. Since that overwhelming triumph she has been the most soughtafter artist in the concert field and has repeated her triumphs not only in the leading cities of the world but also on the air, far beyond the confined of the concert hall. The current season is her fifth with the Metropolitan.

Lucrezia Bori, who has been one of the most beloved artists in America, since her Metropolitan Opera bow in "Manon" in 1913,

was born in the sunny Spanish city of Valencia, of a long line of illustrious ancestors. As a child her natural and unusual singing talents were evident, and she gave her first performance in public at the age of six, singing at a charity concert for the benefit of soldiers' orphans. In Spain she studied with the Italian master, Favaro, and when she was seventeen she went to Italy to study with the equally renowned Spaniard, Vidal. After six months of intensive study she made her debut in "Carmen," to register immediate success. After two years at the famed La Scala opera house in Milan and a historic triumph in Buenos Aires she arrived in New York to make her first Metropolitan Opera appearance in November, 1931. Since then "Bori the Magnificent" has been a favorite performer with both opera and concert audiences, and she, too, has increased her popularity immeasurably in a number of guest appearances at the microphone. Her qualities of leadership and her popularity were recognized when New York was threatened with the loss of the Metropolitan. She was chosen as Chairman of the Committee for Saving Metropolitan Opera and planned and ran a campaign which raised the \$3,000,000 necessary to assure New York another season of opera by the traditional and distinguished "Met" company.

The engagement of the two outstanding stars, whose clear and lovely voices are perfectly suited to the microphone, marks one of the most important events of the new radio year.

C. P. MacGregor, president of the MacGregor and Sollie Broadcasting System, has announced the granting of a ninety-day leave of absence to John Eugene Hasty, production manager, who goes to New York to produce two special radio programs.

Hasty goes to New York where he has been especially engaged by two nationally advertised commodities to write and produce radio shows which will be broadcast over a nationwide network from coast to coast.

One of the accounts is sponsoring Al Pearce and His Gang. Hasty will write material and help produce the radio shows for the Gang in their biggest radio engagement to date.

The first programs are scheduled to come through about April 1.

Hasty is considered the West's foremost and most prolific writer for radio. For several years he wrote much of the material used on the Blue Monday Jamboree over the Don Lee network. Previous to that he was in charge of the radio department of McCann-Erickson Advertising Agency in San

Francisco. His radio serials are known to thousands of fans in all parts of the country.

He joined the MacGregor and Sollie firm about two years ago as a writer and producer and soon became production manager. In that capacity he has written dozens of important radio productions.

The recent broadcasts from the foundation for the San Francisco pier of the Golden Gate Bridge, involved a situation that not even radio engineers often have to face. In making the necessary technical preparations for the unique broadcast, Alan Cormack, KFRC's technical director, had to enter the airlock and endure an atmospheric pressure of sixty pounds to the square inch. Those who have suffered the agonies of returning to earth from a high altitude when flying will understand what this meant. Mr. Cormack, however, luckily escaped with a minimum of discomfort. Not so some of his companions, who "hollered" to be let out before the pressure had gone up ten pounds above normal. It is an old story, of course, to bridge engineers. Beyond being inclined to stagger a bit and having to puff against a closed nose to the accompaniment of popping ears, Mr. Cormack suffered no ill effects.

Mike Mannerisms.—"Ten seconds!"

Dead silence in Columbia's Number One studio. A couple of dozen artists and an entire orchestra are immobile, scarcely breathing. Each person reflects how strangely interminable ten seconds can be when they are counted off by stopwatch. Each has his eye rigidly fixed on a man sitting in a glasspaneled compartment. That man has one hand on a control switch. The other hand is poised high, visible to all in the studio. Suddenly he brings it down sharply, thrusting a commanding finger in the direction of Announcer Harry von Zell.

Von Zell stands before a microphone, his hand cupping his right ear, his sharp eyes

gleaming.
"The March of Time!"

Howard Barlow stands on the podium with his baton raised. He swings the stick in a deft arc and the orchestra snaps into its theme.

Time is now ready to be remarched before the microphone, and all those actors whose voices are familiar to regular listeners prepare to impersonate kings, presidents, and

newsworthy nobodies.

A full head of mostly gray hair over a lean, gentle face distinguishes Bill Adams, who recently won Mrs. Roosevelt's praise for his imitation of the President's voice. Just as adroitly Bill might reproduce the voices of Ramsay MacDonald, Prussia's Herr Goebbels; or he might take his unassuming stand before the microphone to imitate a prominent professional personage or—and this is another Adams specialty—a negro.

It is Huey Long you hear on the March of Time, It's Jack Smart imitating the Kingfish. Rotund (240 pounds), affable, Jack approaches the "mike" with an assumption of pomp and gusto before shouting or drawling Louisiana lingo. Huey himself could employ no more stirring gestures. But Jack can also confine his voice to a dull monotone and take off a plain New York cop or an insurance agent.

Ted di Corsia has General Hugh S. Johnson down pat. Ted's a tall, dark lad who can frown himself into some terrible person he is not. For imitations of the General, Ted draws his mouth down at the corners and barks as much invective as the microphone will stand. He can establish just as easily, however, the identity of an amorous young

gentleman caller.

And if it's something in the nature of an affectionate and adoring average husband there's Frank Readick to give listeners that impression. Frank is short, dark and wears a thin mustache. Like von Zell, Readick cups an ear. And don't think he can't grimace and snarl and reproduce the likes of a terrifying criminal.

The quiet, wary voice of Bruno Hauptmann on the witness stand is brought to the air by Dwight Weist. Dwight is a quiet, careful-mannered individual. He is tall, fair and conservatively mustached. He leans sidewise toward the microphone in a cautious, confiding way and rarely speaks above an intimate, conversational tone.

When there's a simple narration of a dramatic incident, like the deaths of "Apple Annie" and her husband, Westbrook Van Voorhees' voice furnishes the effective medium. Van Voorhees, tall, custom-tailored, impeccably groomed, rocks to and fro as he speaks and nods feelingly over the plaintive details. Van's another ear-cupper.

THREE pretty girls, three fresh, young voices, three temperaments as different as possible—and no arguments!

What, no arguments?

"Only at rehearsals," say Annette Hastings, Marjoric Primley and Imelda Montagne firmly.

The trio, which N B C audiences know as the Coquettes, constitutes one of the most interesting groups on the air today. The girls

have been singing together for five years, and the lasting friendship which holds them together bears witness to the good sense upon which their three-cornered partnership was founded.

"When we first organized the trio we made some rules which have never been broken," explains Marjorie Primley, who is the accompanist as well as the mezzo voice of the three.

Problems of singing style, choice of programs, arrangements, and such matters are discussed, according to these rules, at rehearsals only. When only two of the girls are present they don't talk shop.

"But the rehearsals, when all three are on hand—off comes the lid!" they say. "We criticise one another unmercifully, and get everything off our chests. Nobody's feelings are hurt because we all know that when the rehearsal ends, criticism does, too."

The Coquettes are heard transcontinentally when they appear on the Carefree Carnival Monday nights at 5:30 p. m. and appear on various programs during the week.

Annette Hastings, who is the soprano of the trio, has been a radio star since she was eighteen and a singer since she was sixteen. A plump girl with ruddy hair, large hazel eyes and an irresistible sense of humor, she used to be known as N B C's baby star.

Imelda Montagne, the contralto, is a tiny little figure with dark hair, brown eyes and the creamy skin of her French ancestry. She is Mrs. Melville Walter in private life; her marriage to the San Francisco restaurateur took place last summer. Marjorie Primley, the mezzo, is the tallest of the group, a darkhaired, blue-eyed girl with a fascinating pair of dimples.

The girls differ as much in background as they do in appearance. Marjorie was born in Lincoln, Nebraska, but grew up in San Francisco. Her talent as a pianist made her well known before she was out of her teens, and she made her radio debut as a piano soloist.

ART VAN HARVEY was shunted into a radio career by a decline in trade-paper advertising . . . now as Vic of tremendously popular Vic and Sade sketch on NBC network is one of the nation's leading "mike" artists . . . born Arthur H. Van Berschoot on August 23, 1883, in Chicago . . . suppressed childhood ambition for stage when mother told him "an actor is an emissary of the devil" . . . but took part in all school plays from kindergarten to eighth grade . . . at fourteen went to work as office boy at Chicago Board of Trade. . . . Fired for sneaking away to theaters. . . . After many jobs, turned his gift of mimicry on vaudeville audiences for several years . . . set out to sell farm advertising in 1917, when such papers were in heydey, and he succeeded . . . turned to radio after prosperity started around the corner, in livestock business . . . scored instant hit with his natural imitations . . . chosen to play part of Victor Rodney Gook when Vic and Sade came to NBC air lanes ... his characterization of drawling, dryhumored accountant, now brings fan mail by the thousand. . . . Art has light complexion and gray hair . . . is five feet nine inches tall and weighs 165 pounds . . . is master of eight dialects . . . picked up Jewish in Chicago's Ghetto, Italian from his barber, and brogue from Irish mother . . . credits Dutch father with talent for mimicry . . . female ancestors served as ladies in waiting to queens of Denmark . . . but Art insists on being as plain as famous air character he portrays . . . spends most of spare time at lodges telling stories . . . is crazy over animals and smoked sturgeon . . . is married to girl with whom he eloped after meeting her on blind date . . . and would rather be America's leading comedian than President.



HANDWRITING Radio Personalities

MYRTLE VAIL of Myrt and Marge

OR a change from Pacific Coast artists, "Myrt," who lives in Chicago, but entertains people all over the country, will be the subject of this page. Later I will do "Marge," the other half of the famous radio team.

Senerely Mystle Vail: Mystle Myst is Jan. 7th-

NOTE: This handwriting is considerably reduced from original.

Myrt's handwriting is large, irregular and heavily traced, reflecting ambition, pride, courage, imagination, sensuousness, and a good deal of driving personal force.

Her t-bars are, without exception, long and thick. This denotes an indomitable will-power and a never-say-die spirit, and is the sign of one who has the grit and fortitude to survive any amount of opposition and difficulty, and who is not easily daunted by obstacles.

The fact that most of these t-bars are thickened as the pen leaves the paper, means that Myrt must guard against over-aggressiveness. Since the writing in general expresses a large share of generosity, kindliness and sympathy, we may be sure that the hint of selfishness carried by those club-shaped t-bars is defensive rather than offensive. Myrt's handwriting typifies one who has had to struggle for herself a good deal, and who has developed a fighting spirit and an unyielding determination through force of circumstances.

The pressure is definitely heavy—always an indication of sensuousness. That is, love

of beauty in all forms, and appreciation of everything that appeals to the physical senses, or strikes the mind as being pleasant. Myrt is keenly responsive to color, rhythm, perfumes, fine fabrics, luxury of any kind, the pleasures of the table, good times, and material comforts. Her taste leans to the lavish and voluptuous, rather than to the delicate and ethereal.

The general style of the writing, and particularly the long horizontal finals (such as the one at the end of her Christian name) show extravagant impulses and a tendency to reckless spending—not only for herself, but for others. The wide-spaced writing and the very open capital "D" (not shown here) reflect the very lavish and open-handed nature—always ready and willing to do things for others, and to lend a helping hand wherever needed. Apart from that "protective armor," which I mentioned before, there is no selfishness shown in this handwriting.

This is absolutely an irregular hand. The letters vary greatly in size. The base-line is decidedly an up-and-down one. Even the pressure, although fundamentally heavy, is nevertheless uneven. The qualities denoted by this general irregularity are: imagination, moodiness, sensibility, and a temperamental personality. Myrt is a restless, changeable, versatile type, who must have an active, varied, interesting life, in order to have health, happiness and peace of mind. But, irrespective of conditions, she is always subject to extreme ups and downs of optimism and pessimism.

The positive qualities of hopefulness and enthusiasm predominate in her writing at present, which is to be expected in one enjoying success such as is her lot.

There are no artificial or unnatural formations in this writing. It reflects a sincere, genuine, frank, candid and straightforward nature, completely devoid of pose or pretense, and averse to sham, hypocrisy and "red tape."
