

Active Radio Listening Urged

N appeal for more active listening by the radio public is made by Lyman Bryson, Professor of Education at Teachers College, Columbia University, whose study of "The Use of the Radio in Leisure Time" has just been issued by the Radio Institute of the Audible Arts.

According to Professor Bryson, whose work in the study of leisure time has won him wide prominence, the use of the radio in leisure time will be a great influence for our own happiness and good if we make it so.

"Good listening is not mere passive acceptance," he states. "A good listener is like a reader who knows his way about in a great library. He knows that there are many books which, however interesting they might be to someone else, are of no use to him. But he also knows that by choosing wisely he can keep a constantly expanding interest in his reading.

"It is bewildering but also exciting to live today. No one can quite keep track of all the new things that are being said and thought and done. The influence of the radio itself has helped to create new arts and modify old ones. The invention of new forms of communication has made it possible for new ideas to expand quickly and to be known almost at once to a great many people. Those who are saying new things in new ways are finding a hearing more quickly than they ever could before. The radio could be like a friend who is in touch with all the movements of this lively world and able to report them to us while we sit comfortably

"This brief listing of things the radio can bring to us in leisure hours at home is, of course, only a small part of what might be given and it touches only upon a few of various uses to which the radio may be devoted. No one would say that leisure time must always be spent seriously or that radio listening is to become a solemn affair. We do not like our friends the less because they can occasionally smile. Gaiety is a very precious thing. We can be most grateful to the radio because it has broadcast a good deal of amusing nonsense. It is not necessary to point out that humor may be educational

"The things that are good are the things that last. The experiences which make leisure time something better than a tiresome emptiness are those that have in them the zest of discovery. And good listening is not mere passive acceptance."

One of the most interesting things about the radio in America at the present time, according to Professor Bryson, is that almost any type of program can be heard at one time or another. Most of us, he claims, have taken this bewildering variety for granted and have made little effort to study the opportunity which radio offers and find out how it can best be used.

Professor Bryson, whose article is addressed particularly to women's groups, lists some educational advantages to be derived from radio, including knowledge of art, music and drama; increased skill in the household arts; better understanding of the care and training of children; advice on what to read and why; and familiarity with science, philosophy, and current events.

Professor Bryson's paper is one in a series of studies on various aspects of radio to be made available from time to time by the Radio Institute of the Audible Arts, which was organized recently for the purpose of stimulating public appreciation of worthwhile radio programs.

MICROPHONE GOSSIP

• • Bennett Fisher, KOMO-KJR announcer, son of D. R. Fisher, left February 20 on the Rosandra, passenger freighter, for Europe. Fisher, accompanied by his wife, Palma, will travel via the Panama Canal, straight to Italy where he plans to study singing for two years in Milan.

The vacancy left by the departure of Bennett Fisher, KOMO-KJR announcer, will be

filled by John P. Heverly.

Mr. Heverly, who worked for the Government two years in the Orient on technical radio work, will be both an announcer and technician at KOMO and KJR. He formerly worked at stations WMT, Waterloo, Iowa; KGIR, Butte, Montana; KGVO, Missoula, Montana; and KPCK, Seattle. He attended Iowa State Teachers' College, Cedar Falls, Iowa

- • John Nesbitt, brilliant young commentator, whose "Headlines from the Past" is a nightly feature on KFRC, is a writer of pulp yarns in his off hours. He has had stories published in such publications as Sea Stories and Weird Tales. He has also written humor sketches for the New Yorker and other nationally known magazines.
- • "Ezry," the prized Irish Terrier of Mable Todd, Al Pearce comedienne, wandered away from home and was gone two days. He came back by himself, physically pretty dilapidated but a much wiser dog spiritually.
- • It's taken a long time to get a full confession from Frank Parker about his recent personal appearance in Chicago. But at last the truth is out.

It seems Parker, Mary Livingstone and Jack Benny were all virtually imprisoned in the Chicago Theatre for a week. Another two days and they'd probably have been carving last messages in the woodwork. Their first contract called for four performances a day. Then, waiting crowds formed a queue around the block, even with the temperature at zero.

So the Parker-Benny-Livingstone troupe agreed to give six shows daily. The shows being an hour long, that alone would almost

have imprisoned them.

However, they still made a few efforts to dash out for food. Every time they dashed, fans dashed after them, and on several occasions both the Parker coat and the Benny coat were stripped of buttons. They were flattered—but decided to have their food brought in, and for excitement during waits they played runniny.

- • Time and the CBS National Amateur Night bring all things. Now it is a rooster with "mike" fright. This white-crested Polish cock accompanies its master, so its master says, by crowing a melodious accompaniment to the young man's singing. So the hopeful amateur tucked the cock-a-doodler under his arm and came to a CBS National Amateur Night audition. But sight of the "mike" struck Sir Chanticleer stubbornly dumb and crow he would not. Once outside the studio again the cock shrilled his lustiest, for which he was smartly cuffed by his disappointed master.
- • One loyal Ma Perkins fan, who listens in regularly Monday to Friday afternoons over the NBC network, is addicted to historical research and reports the following: "Perkins," she writes, "is an ancient and honorable American name; 274 Perkinses from Massachusetts fought in the Revolution. One of them was an artillery officer at Bunker Hill. At present thirty-seven Perkinses are in Who's Who."
- • Mort Werner's "Open House" program on KGGC every night at ten o'clock is attracting a lot of attention. Radio celebrities from all over town gather nightly to appear on Mort's program and see him do things with phonograph records nobody ever did before.
- • June Gilman, receptionist at the Oakland studios of station KROW, came West in 1927 because she wanted to see the "wideopen" spaces. Today she says she has never yet seen an eagle, a rattlesnake, or heard a coyote yell. And she's a little disappointed with the "wild West."
- • Organists, too, have a sense of humor. Announcer Don Forbes of KHJ had just finished giving a commercial announcement . . . was rather proud of the note of sincerity he had injected into it . . . when Claude Riemer found himself playing "Did You Mean it."
- • Tom Howard is drawing down many an orchid for his fine work on the Rudy Vallee hour. Tom has one of the best comedy deliveries in radio, an adroit sense of humor, and a capable straight man in George Sheldon—this vaudeville veteran has what it takes for air success.

- • Tizzie Lish, Al Pearce comic, is superstitious about his, pardon me, her costume. She still clings to the moth-eaten dress and hat she used when she was with Al Pearce over a year ago. The day it falls to pieces will probably be a high spot in her career.
- • Two days following Stuart Buchanan's appearance on "Calling All Cars" in the rôle of the "badge bandit," motion picture director Claud Barton summoned him to participate in the filming of "Car 99."
- • Frank Cope, bell-ringer of the KJBS Alarm Klok Klub, was a course official during the recent National Match Play golf championship at the Presidio Golf Course.
- • Although he was born in Greencastle, Indiana, of Irish parentage, Harvey Hays, NBC narrator and actor, spent most of his youth in far away India, near the foot of the Himalaya mountains.
- • Chester Stratton, youthful CBS actor, has a silver pencil without which he refuses to perform either in rehearsal or broadcast. With that pencil he signed for his first professional engagement and he now treasures it with as much superstition as sentiment. Fellow artists recently missed Stratton as they were about to begin a rehearsal although they had been chatting with him a short time before. With the rehearsal delayed ten minutes, Stratton strode breathlessly in, explaining that he had forgotten his pencil and gone back home for it.
- • There is a surplus of ex-percussion men with the Al Pearce Gang. Tizzie Lish was a drummer in a Syracuse theatre pit for years, under his right name of Bill Comstock. E. J. Derry of the Three Cheers drummed for a living in Kansas City. And Ralph Richards, pianist, was a drummer in his Portland High School band until they kicked him out for beating cross rhythms.
- • "Tiny" Ruffner of Captain Henry's Show Boat recently received this letter from a young woman: "At Ballard, Washington, an Edmund Ruffner and myself were captains of a spelling bee. We were the only two left when the word "ruffle" came up. I failed and Edmund spelled it. Are you that Edmund Ruffner?" He is.
- • There was realism about that crash of splintering wood when Don Ameche broke down a door to propose to June Meredith in First Nighter on a recent Friday night. Don didn't break down a door, it's true, but Sound Effect Technician Bob Opper inadvertently did. After much rehearsal, Opper found that the sound of breaking down a door could best be simulated by dropping a pile of lumber, crushing a strawberry box and kicking open a small "sound effects" door simultaneously. When the big moment

- came during the broadcast, however, Opper went about his work with such vehemence that he actually broke down the small door which is used for sound effects.
- • "That was so enjoyable," the mayor of Weehawken, New Jersey, said to Ed Wynn after the comedian's broadcast, "that you deserve a medal." So the mayor walked on the stage of NBC's largest studio, and before an applauding crowd of 1,500 spectators presented Wynn with an honorary fire chief medal. The applause turned to pandemonium when the proud recipient, opening his coat, revealed a collection of similar medals that covered every inch of his vest.
- • When Nat Shilkret conducted a Palmolive Hour the other night without a script, which he had left at home, it wasn't the first time the NBC maestro had proved master of an emergency. He recalled that at a previous broadcast someone walked off with his music stand, carrying script and score—but he carried on from memory.
- • Johnny Hauser is just about the only young man in radio who can skip home for a snack between numbers. Johnny lives with his family in the same home where he was born, just a few blocks from Radio City.
- • In the summer of 1932 Ben Bernie heard Little Jackie Heller singing in a night club in Atlantic City. Impressed by the tiny tenor's voice and his left-handed guitar playing, Bernie offered him a two weeks' engagement in Chicago. Jackie remained with Bernie for two years.
- • In the early days of radio Don Mario, Spanish tenor of NBC's Penthouse Serenade, was a song plugger for Irving Berlin. His job was to travel from station to station in the East and feature Berlin's compositions. Jack Smith, whom radio listeners now know as "Whispering Jack," was Mario's accompanist.
- • Whispering Jack Smith's propensity for soft singing brings him hundreds of letters from listeners. A girl in the Bronx wrote Jack as follows: "I would like to make your acquaintance. I am a telephone operator and it would be very nice to meet a man who couldn't shout at me."
- • Charlie Lung, some of whose "one hundred voices" are heard on the D. S. S. program and "Charlie Lung and His Gang," insists that he would have been decorated by the French Government during war, but no French officer could be found with enough fortitude to kiss him. Modest Charlie!
- • Harry Foster, Al Pearce tenor, was a college chum of radio's beautiful songbird, Jane Frohman, at the University of Missouri. Harry says her pictures don't do her justice.

NEWS and COMMENT

An increase in Hollywood broadcasting is forcing the construction of new and large National Broadcasting Company studios in the film capital within the next few months, Merlin H. Aylesworth, president of NBC, said today, adding that the studios will be constructed with an eye toward television.

That Hollywood and its many film concerns will be importantly concerned in the transmission of television is a foregone conclusion, said Aylesworth, who also is president of Radio Pictures and chairman of the

board of RKO.

When television is perfected, or made as near perfect as it can be, Hollywood will have one of the nation's first television transmitters, the NBC head declared. It will be in conjunction with the NBC studios now being planned.

"Television," stated Aylesworth, "will be forced out of the laboratories when the public demands it. And it will become a hundred million dollar business. When that time comes, NBC will be the first to offer it.

From his unique position of radio and film chieftain, Aylesworth surveyed the two fields, denying that radio has hurt the film industry, but stating that instead it has developed many new stars who are now box-office attractions. Radio's influence, he continued, has extended even into the grand opera field, which now, as a result of broadcasting, is at its highest plane in American history, and becoming more Americanized daily.

Her unusual talents and ability to be versatile has reaped rewards for comely Dorothy Scott, young radio dramatic star.

She has recently been signed on contract with the MacGregor and Sollie Broadcasting System to appear in a number of feature programs, some of which have already been produced or are in the process of production.

Although hardly out of her teens, Miss Scott, an attractive young blonde, has had theatrical experience that equals the average seasoned trouper's. At the tender age of four, she made her debut as an actress, playing the part of the fairy in "Jack in the Beanstalk" on the legitimate stage.

Later she was prominently identified with the Children's Theater of San Francisco until

she was fourteen years old.

When she was fifteen, she had her first experience before a radio microphone and has been active almost constantly since that time in radio dramatizations.

Miss Scott has had considerable musical comedy experience, too, having played with De Wolf Hopper in "The Mikado," "Pinafore," "The Bohemian Girl," and others.

She was a member of the cast of "The

Miracle," produced in San Francisco some years ago by Max Reinhardt.

Probably her best known radio work to date was in the rôle of Patricia Hunter in "One Man's Family."

At the MacGregor and Sollie Studios, Miss Scott will be one of the featured characters in the fast-moving musical variety show-"Hi-Hilarities." In addition to this she plays important rôles in "Cecil and Sally" and "Eb and Zeb."

The western stations affiliated with the MacGregor and Sollie Broadcasting System

include the following:

The ears pick up rumblings that the "Hollywood Hotel" program is due for a shakeup. Highly advertised, the program never got over in the way it should. Dick Powell on the air didn't have the lure Dick Powell has on the screen, and the oozing of film stars into the program with material which they had chosen themselves for the most part did not hold many listeners spellbound. But the sponsor, it is reported, is not giving up. On paper it looked great-on the air it sounded anything but. Hence a promised shuffling of the cards.

Actors and actresses are best in material chosen for them, instead of material they choose themselves. Radio's best male singers now know the type of songs they can best render, and they cling to them. You rarely catch them out of their depth. The public is

too fickle.

They have finally got Frank Black, maestro on "the pause that refreshes" program, and others, to the point where he admits he is as busy as he cares to be. Arranging for that "ninety-voiced symphony" plus the cares of his other three programs, keeps the iron maestro about saturated with work. For last week, to the amazement of those who have said Black was never too busy to take on more, he turned down a program with the explanation "can't spare the time."

New sound-proof monitoring rooms are being constructed for each studio at KFRC, San Francisco, as part of the Don Lee Broadcasting System's program to introduce the most modern in equipment and broadcasting facilities for the ultimate in efficient and perfect transmission.

Studio control desks, designed by Harold Peery, chief engineer of the Don Lee Broadcasting System, and built by members of the engineering staff, are being installed in the monitoring rooms. Compact and no larger than an average size office desk, this cabinet contains all the transmission equipment. The cabinet provides control of eight microphones sound-effect equipment, and talkback features to give instructions to producers. Each of the studios at KFRC will have the benefit of individual monitoring.

Along with the new monitoring rooms, special client's rooms are being built where sponsors may, with comfort, direct the production of their program. The monitoring booth and client's room are being installed at a cost of approximately \$5,000 per studio.

A player of hunches is James Melton,

golden-voiced tenor.

A hunch that he might make a good lawyer sent the young Southerner to the University of Florida. There Jimmy studied a little, tooted his saxophone, and sang in the college glee club.

But Jimmy was wholly unaware of what lay before him until he happened to sing for the late Dr. A. A. Murphree, then president

of the university.

D'r. Murphree also had a hunch.

"Young man," he told the black-haired, smiling youth, "you possess a God-given voice. You must develop it."

The president's hunch sounded like a good one, despite the fact that the "sax" playing at college dances was adding to the Melton funds and that he had never given his voice a thought. But Jimmy found a teacher and settled down to study. Finding that the home-town training lacked scope, he went north to Vanderbilt University at Nashville. There he became a pupil of Gaetano de Luca, the opera singer. De Luca was convinced that Melton had the goods.

The energetic Jimmy cotinued his saxophone tooting to pay for his vocal work and schooling. At night he was the ingratiating band member who occasionally obliged with a chorus or two. By day he was a hard-working college and vocal student. It was excellent training for the future radio star. His playing made him understand the problems of the vocalist. He was convinced that any song worth singing is worth singing well. That is why over the air today his programs are always varied. He can follow a grand opera aria with a popular Tin Pan Alley tune. He sings both with superb artistry.

Finishing college, a hunch sent him to New York. The story of Jimmy's breaking into the big time is widely known. Not to be denied, he crashed the famous Roxy's office by singing in the hallway. A hunch without action isn't worth a dime, is Melton's dictum! He put it to use in this situation and it made him a fixture on the famous Roxy Gang broadcasts.

And although Jimmy is a player of hunches he is not superstitious. He is genuinely serious about his career and nothing seems to discourage, deter or dampen him in his enthusiasm for music.

The Music Library of the National Broadcasting Company has often come to the aid of harried musicians, but not until the other night was it ever called upon to assist at a surgical operation. Here's how it happened:

A patient about to undergo an operation in Bellevue Hospital, New York, refused to submit to the ether cone until the words of a favorite Wisconsin song were first read to him. The surgeon, ever ready to accommodate, peeled off his rubber gloves and phoned the NBC music library for help in tracing

"How will 'Hello Wisconsin' do?" the

librarians ventured.

The surgeon would see. No, he informed them after a pause, that was not the song. There was a little more research among the archives, and from the racks which contain data on Mascagni and Moussorgsky came a classic entitled "My Name Is Yon Yonson." This time the librarians had hit it. They read the lines to the surgeon.

The surgeon pulled on his gloves once

more and began:

"My name is Yon Yonson. I come from Wisconsin. . . .

The patient sank back . . . and breathed deeply. The music librarians had a cure for Wisconsinitis.

You might not guess it, but Phil Baker is an old softie about Beetle. The comic, it develops, is really chuckling when the vinegarvoiced heckler rants his loudest.

In a moment of weakness Baker has broken down to explain the strange devotion which he entertains for radio's most relentless

haunter.

"You see," begins Baker, "Beetle is the audience. He's really the sour-faced fellow who sits with hand poised on his radio dial, daring me to be funny. If my gags are bad, it's Beetle who breaks in with a warning, 'Oh, yea, That's what you think!'

So, just when Baker is about to get the air, Beetle saves the day by interrupting the comedian. None of the other performers would think of taking such frank liberties. After all, they reason, Baker is the boss!

Not so with acid-tongue Beetle. He's never happier than when he is telling the

"You see," confides Baker, "radio comedy needs a lot of relief. It has long been my theory that you can't be funny for a whole hour, or even for thirty minutes, on the air. If you think you can, try it!"

"Beetle was with me on the stage before I came to the air three years ago," continues Baker. "He brought laughs in the theatre; why shouldn't I let him haunt me on the ether? Well, somehow he has been a great help. When the sailing is going too smoothly, he's there to make things interesting."

Beetle is the most unique of all that strange radio race-the stooges. No studio visitor has ever seen him. Not even the members of the broadcasting staff are acquainted with him. He is still, and always will remain, as far as Baker is concerned, an unsolved mystery. No other detail of Baker's Friday night program causes as much excitement in the studio as does Beetle. When his waspish voice is first heard by those fortunate enough to be invited to a Baker broadcast, there is much craning of necks and a profound stir of repressed excitement. But the mystery remains as deep and as dark as ever, for Baker, clever showman that he is, will never reveal the sleight-of-hand wizardry which plucks Beetle's jaundiced laughter out of thin air and hurls it into the microphone.

Which ought to prove that under the skin Baker and Beetle are really a couple of de-

voted brothers.

Roxy has won another contract renewal

for himself and his radio gang.

Signed for his first commercial series last fall, Roxy's Saturday night programs over the nation-wide Columbia chain have become one of the outstanding musical-variety programs on the air. The response of radio critics and listeners alike prompted the sponsor to renew the veteran showman's engagement early in December, and this continued approbation caused a second extension of contract, effective the middle of March.

Since returning to the air last September, Roxv has developed an entirely new array of stars, each one of whom has turned down attractive offers for individual programs out of loyalty to the kindly impresario who gave them their radio start. Listed among these performers, entirely unknown until the pioneer broadcaster brought them to the microphone in his current series, are Aimee Deloro, golden-voiced soprano; Larry Taylor, youthful baritone interpreter of popular songs; the tricky song-and-piano combination of Vicki Chase and Herbert Kingsley; and last but not least, Ruth Carhart, husky-toned contralto from Kansas, whom Roxy considers as having the greatest potentialities of any artist whose career he has ever sponsored. In view of the fact that he has brought out such musical celebrities as Eugene Ormandy, Jimmy Melton, Jessica Dragonette, Mario Chamlee and many others, his predictions for Miss Carhart's future should carry weight.

Other members of his gang who will continue to be heard include Henrietta Schumann, brilliant young concert pianist; the Roxyaires quartet, coached by Ed Smalle, noted vocal arranger; and the mixed chorus and augmented orchestra, containing many

of New York's foremost instrumentalists, under the baton of Leon Rosebrook.

Hints to Those Who Aspire to Be Radio Announcers: In the spring, so it seems, young men's fancies turn not only to love but also to thoughts of becoming radio announcers. Each year, at about this season, KNX receives an unusually large quota of queries from college students who ask, "What can I do to become a radio announcer?"

They also ask numerous other questions, and in order to standardize the answers, Thomas Freebairn-Smith of the KNX announcing staff, has prepared a mimeographed chart which he hands out to all aspirants who feel the call of the mike.

Here are the questions and Mr. Smith's answers:

1. What is the nature of radio announcing work?

To be able to deliver a message clearly, convincingly, and accurately by means of the human voice—taking the printed word and making it sound like an original thought. (The essential difference between reading and announcing.)

2. Is there a demand for radio announcers?
There is always a demand for good announcers to replace the many bad ones and

misfits that are at present on the air.

3. What are the personal qualifications? Cheerfulness, honesty and ambition, which, after all, are essential in any occupation. These, coupled with quickness of thought and a normal intelligence, are the requirements that are second only to that prime factor—the possession of a good resonant voice and the ability to use it.

4. Is there a reasonable chance for advancement?

There is room at the top in every profession, and advancement for a good man in the field of broadcasting is faster than in most conventional occupations.

5. What education is needed?

All the education that you can get—the more background you have, the more thorough and convincing is your work. No announcer is really convincing who does not sound like an authority on whatever subject he may happen to be discussing on the air. Study music thoroughly. Read and digest everything that your spare time and means will allow.

6. What salary can be expected to start? Whatever you can get. You should almost be willing to pay for the chance to do any "mike" work, because only familiarity can bring ease of delivery. Some small stations may give you a break, but do not be discouraged by refusals. If you have the stuff, that break will come.

LHOUETTI

NAME and success at 18! That happens Fin story books and once in a while in real life. It has happened to Miss Betty Borden, society debutante of Pasadena, who at 18 finds herself starred in radio network programs and is currently appearing on the Shell Show over NBC from Hollywood.

Her interpretation of rhythm numbers and blues is so unique it has classified her as a real "find" in radio. In her Shell Show broadcasts, she is featured in special arrangements under the direction of Georgie Stoll, maestro of the variety hour heard every Monday night from 9 to 10 p. m.

the Lanny Ross contest.

Miss Borden started her radio career by winning the national Radio Stars Magazine contest under the direction of Lanny Ross. in competition with hundreds of girl singers in many cities. Originally she had no intention of entering radio, because she had studied art, is very proficient with brush and pen and charcoals. But when she sang for her friends, they sensed something new and subtle in her voice, and forced her to enter

She is a great granddaughter of Gail Borden, inventor of condensed milk and founder of the milk company of that name. She attended the exclusive Westridge School for Girls in Pasadena, then the smart Marlborough School for Girls, where she won two art scholarships, one at Mills College at Berkeley, and the other at the Sarah Lawrence College for Girls in New York. Her entry into radio has caused her to forego the scholarships, and she studies every day under a private coach to perfect herself and continue in radio as a career. Miss Borden is also an accomplished dancer, and has appeared in this capacity for the Junior League.

OHN EUGENE HASTY, newest Al J Pearce radio scribe, is one of the oldest continuity writers in the business. Jack, as he is affectionately known-it's John Eugene only over the air-has had as many as six full-fledged serial programs riding the ether waves at one time. The nature of these serials has varied from, "Is your wife enter-taining this winter?" "Not very, but I'm used to it now," type of gag comedy to death-ray mystery drama with territying screams tearing the midnight air to shreds.

You'd imagine from the diverse type of his writing that Jack was built on the Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde plan but he isn't. He's the most obliging, likeable, reasonable and easy going chap you ever met. After writing until four o'clock in the morning he hasn't any more temperament at breakfast

than a cowslip has horns.

Jack was born at Lafayette, Indiana, and came West to San Diego when he was sixteen. During the war he was head of the publicity bureau for the U. S. Marines at San Diego. He graduated from magazine writing into radio.

He finds relaxation from long hours over the typewriter in puttering around his country place at Los Altos. He likes to run down there upon a moment's notice. Still on the sunny side of forty he has been married nearly ten years and has two youngsters,

John, Jr., seven, and Olive Anne, eight. Jack's joining up with Al Pearce will mean a brand new Eb and Zeb series which will be heard Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. In addition he will write other comedy

acts mostly of a topical nature.

HIGH in a swanky Manhattan hotel overlooking Central Park, there's a bright bit of Hollywood. It's the apartment of Madame Sylvia of Hollywood, and Sylvia

herself is the gayest thing in it.

White flannel slacks, white sweater, a yellow chiffon handkerchief about her throat to match her corn-colored hair, smooth skin, keen blue eyes, and a sense of humor that bubbles all over the place—that's Sylvia. At fifty-three, she has more pep, looks younger and acts younger than many a woman less than half her age. She does a hop, skip and a dance around her room like any chorineexpresses her opinions vehemently, knitting away on an afghan while she talks-drops the afghan, jumps up to illustrate a story, scolds her pet cats-Finka-Finka and Kala-Kalaputs you in a whirl trying to keep up with her. She has no patience with women who let themselves be unattractive.

"I was the ugly duckling of my family," she will tell you. "My mother was a successful singer in Copenhagen. She was beautiful. My father was handsome, an artist. My sister was lovely. She was just what my mother and father wanted her to be. Me! I was a tom-boy-awkward, lost in a parlor. Why, when I came to this country I weighed 158 pounds, and I had freckles as big as-as -peas! Not little coy freckles, but huge splashes on my face! I decided I was going to do something about it—and now, look at me!"

One looks at her and marvels. For Sylvia, surrounded by her California plants, flowers, and photographs of famous stars of stage. screen and radio whose curves she can take the credit for-Sylvia is the most incredible of all her "finished products."

Sylvia's beauty advice is given to a nationwide audience each Wednesday evening over

EN BERNIE, "The Old Maestro of Jazz," has the grandest handwriting. Personality drips from every line and letter. It's no wonder the man is one of America's popular masters of ceremony.

This large, rapid, spaced-out and very sloping style is always a reflection of a truly magnetic nature, because the qualities it denotes—ardor, warmth, intensity, sympathy, enthusiasm, imagination and generosity—are the very essence of personal charm and magnetism.

None of Ben Bernie's feelings are lukewarm, and none of his interests are half-hearted. He is eager, impulsive and often impetuous, with the nervous, highly strung temperament which could never tolerate a monotonous, hundrum, routine existence. Action, speed, movement, change and variety are the breath of life to him. He must have excitement. He must have adventure. And he must have stimulation. If those elements aren't where he is, he'll go where they are, so to speak.

Zip and zest, animation and vivacity, and all the peppy, dynamic and electric qualities are embodied by this kind of writing. YOWSAH!... as Ben himself would say... He loves life, and has the capacity for getting a maximum of enjoyment out of it.

That curved underscore beneath his signature denotes ease in talking, personal spontaneity and the capacity for influencing others. The speed of execution, and flowing, open, connected style, showing rapidity of thought and fluency of expression, of course enhance this

Any kind of bar beneath a signature shows a degree of confidence, and in general, the

consciousness of ability—not necessarily conceit, but just self-esteem. In this particular writing there are no signs of vanity or pose.

Ben's curved underscore, read in conjunction with the basic style, the curved i-dots, many quick curly strokes and upward trend of the lines, expresses a powerful sense of humor, and a good share of imagination.

The spaced-out form, wide margins on the page and swinging, upturned finals signify generosity of the lavish variety, which is often foolish and reckless. Extravagant impulses are shown in Ben's writing. He's a free spender, not a hoarder. His "hand" tells, too, that everything in the way of gambling, chance-taking and speculation intrigues him. In that, of course, it's the element of excitement which "gets" him.

All of his characteristics are to the Nth degree—frankness and candor, too. That's what gives him the breezy informality and nonchalance in his humor and wise-cracking. There's absolutely no constraint in his make-up.

The tall capitals reveal ambition, aspiration and pride, while the handwriting as a whole expresses big ideas, desire for recognition, and love of beauty, elegance and grandeur in all forms, as well as strong emotions, and a feeling for romance and sentiment.

Ben Bernie is the versatile, rather than the specialist type. I won't dwell on the musical end of things, since everyone knows that about him. Instead, I'll mention a number of other fields in which his talents could find expression. He could be a whizz of a journalist, humorous columnist, promoter, investigator, publicity agent, original advertisement writer or theatre manager, for instance.

But regardless of all else, he is, first, last and always—a PERSONALITY... WHAT a handwriting! Whoops, Ben.... We like it.... YOWSAH!
