TOMMY HARRIS, "Little King of Song" has resumed his radio reign. After a plucky fight against serious illness, "Tommy" is back again with his radio friends. But that is just like Tommy.

He was only ten years old when he played hookey from school and climbed upon the stage of the Granada Theater in San Francisco to try out in a singing contest. He won the contest. Determined on an entertainer's career all the persuasion of his father, who wanted him to follow in the paternal footsteps, availed not. He cut so many classes of high school in order to ap-

pear at vaudeville houses in and around San Francisco that at seventeen his tired family finally agreed to let him discontinue school.

At eighteen he had his own dance orchestra on the *President Wilson*, and he and the orchestra sang and played their way around the world, visiting Italy, India, China, and Egypt. When he returned, he was offered a place on the staff of a San Francisco radio station, and has been before the microphone ever since, doing everything from comedy rôles to ballads, until illness intervened. But Tommy is back again, and we are all glad.

### Special Events

His Holiness, Pope Pius XI, will be heard over combined NBC nation-wide networks on Easter Sunday, April 21, at 3:30 a. m., P. S. T., when he imparts his blessings to the crowd which gathers annually in the square before St. Peter's in Rome.

It will mark the first time that the impressive Easter ceremony, from the Loggia of St. Peter's, is heard in this country. The words of His Holiness will be short-waved across the Atlantic through the cooperation of EIAR, Italy's broadcasting service.

Impressive music of the benedictory services at St. Peter's also will be heard during the half-hour broadcast, which will be released in the West over a network headed by KPO

John Charles Thomas, famous American baritone, will return to the air as the star of a new radio dramatic serial with music in which he will both sing and act, beginning Wednesday, April 24, at 6 p. m., P. S. T.

Our Home on the Range, as the new series will be known, will feature the celebrated operatic star as a singing ranch owner, and will be on the air from Radio City studios over a nation-wide network for forty-five minutes each Wednesday.

The noted baritone will be supported in Our Home on the Range by William Daly's orchestra, and a large cast of actors and assisting vocalists now being assembled. There will be two or three soloists in addition to Thomas, and one or more vocal groups. A dramatic story of life on the range, with a strong love interest and comedy relief, will link the weekly broadcasts together. The current series of the "Church of the Air" programs will continue on the Columbia network until June 9 and present nine leading churchmen during the spring months. These broadcasts will conclude the fourth consecutive season.

#### Tom Mitchell Dies

NBC folk are mourning the loss of a singing voice and a friendly laugh, stilled forever when Tom Mitchell, beloved songster

of the microphone, died suddenly at his home at 1835 Vallejo Street, San Francisco, on April 9.

Death interrupted the baritone singer, one of the most popular figures on the NBC artists' staff, just as he was preparing to leave for a morning broadcast. It apparently came without notice, and was instantaneous. The singer, al-

though suffering from a heart ailment, had not shown signs of illness. He and Mrs. Mitchell attended the wedding of Miss Eleanor Wobber and James Leonard Hanley of San Francisco the evening previous; Mitchell was the soloist, and sang "I Love You Truly," and "Because."

Tom Mitchell was born in Bradford. Yorkshire, England, forty-four years ago. The son of a well-known musical family, he turned naturally to music, and when his parents came to the United States to live. Tom became a choir boy at St. Thomas Episcopal Church in Boston, where his voice attracted much attention. He studied music in Boston, and before he was twenty was traveling on the Keith Vaudeville Circuit. Vaudeville and musical comedy in the East held him for the next few years; he scored a success in "The Three Twins" and other productions.

One of the first stage singers to become interested in radio, he chose the microphone in 1923 and sang before it in San Francisco, Los Angeles, Portland, Seattle, and other Pacific Coast cities during the last ten years.

In addition to his wife, the singer leaves two children, Marlyn, seven, and Tom, Jr., ten, and a sister, and two brothers in Boston.

#### Mario Chamlee to Play Humorous Air Rôle

Tradition has it that Mario Chamlee was the first member of the Metropolitan Opera Company to sing over the radio. That was in 1922. Now he is the first operatic star to turn radio humorist.

In the new air serial, "Tony and Gus," to have its premiere April 29. Chamlee will portray the first name rôle—that of a romantic Italian youth with a consuming desire to sing in opera. Frankly humorous, the characterization contains an underlying vein of rich realism, but the script is so designed as to permit Chamlee also to sing at each broadcast.

#### KTAB Dedicates New Studios

In a full hour show, KTAB officially opened their new studios in San Francisco atop the Russ Building, Thursday evening, April 11. In his dedicatory remarks, Phillip G. Lasky set forth a program of expansion and service for the veteran station, on its tenth birthday. Mr. Lasky enjoys a wide reputation as one of the country's most progressive radio executives, coming to KTAB from KDYL, Salt Lake City.

The station remains under the same ownership, with Wesley I. Dumm heading the organization, and with Mr. Lasky as general manager.

Well wishers who broadcast felicitations included His Honor, Mayor Rossi, of San Francisco, and Chief of Police Quinn.

Captain Bill Royle, as master of ceremonies, introduced Don Vinton's orchestra, Jean Wakefield, Bettye Baird, Frank Galvin, Gertrude Ahearn, Chubby Coleman, and others.

#### Seattle Easter Service

Millions of radio listeners throughout the United States will be "tuned in" as Seattle worshippers gather this year on the slopes of Washelli for the Seventh Annual Easter Sunrise Service. The entire service will be broadcast over KOMO and a nation-wide network.

A fifty-piece symphonic orchestra, under the baton of Lloyd Solberg, will accompany the singing of the hymns by the audience as well as the choral numbers by the Amphion Society and the massed choirs of the North End churches. The latter group will sing the Hallelujah Chorus from Handel's "The Messiah," as a climax to the service.

The Rev. Dr. Peter W. Erickson, pastor of the University Presbyterian Church, has been selected by the committee in charge to deliver the Easter message. Assisting clergymen will be Brig. James Dee, Divisional Commander of the Salvation Army; the Rev. B. P. Richardson, pastor of Queen Anne Baptist, and the Rev. Ernest Barber, pastor of Trinity M. E.


The Easter service will be on the air from 5:00 until 6:00 a.m., Pacific Standard time, Easter Sunday, April 21.

### Seasoned Showmen Aiding the Amateurs

THE amateurs have gone and done it! It is a long time since any radio idea has so quickly and so definitely become a national craze. At first, many of the shows were pretty sour. The main idea for a time was a big laugh at the expense of the "boob." In fact, "boobs" were preferred. But with the entry of seasoned showmen into the picture, cruel, vulgar methods gave way to constructive methods.

There are many highly diverting amateur hours on the air, ably presented. But it is well to define the meaning "amateur," as applied to worth-while program possibilities.

Every professional is a radio amateur in a sense, until microphone experience is attained. Every person who can claim the right to aspire to professional radio standing, based upon a real ability—undeveloped perhaps—is an amateur.

No one is really an amateur painter, musician, or writer, until ability or talent approaches very closely to professional standards. Experience, polish and study alone turns the possessor of "talent" into an "artist"

Among the able impresarios aiding the

amateurs to find their opportunity, are Major Edward Bowes, S. L. Rothafel (Roxy), and Ray Perkins. These showmen recognize the possibilities of discovering genuine talent among the inexperienced.

The methods of these men are closely akin to that of consultants. They give of their experience and theatre wisdom and at no time tolerate the pitiful writhings of a deluded aspirant in public.

Out of today's crop of aspiring amateurs, if properly encouraged, or repressed, there may spring the spectacular star of stars of tomorrow.

All who are interested in making good on the air, will do well to study the methods of the seasoned showman in presenting the amateur.

There is no diploma that will take the place of experience. If you think you are an entertainer, don't try it out on your friends, but on those who do not care particularly for your feelings. Try out in amateur theatricals, small radio stations; but before even that, get the advice of a competent teacher, perferably one who will not accept pupils below a certain talent standard.

Just the same, we harbor the sneaking suspicion that Miss Day could skip buckety-buckety (apologies, Bea Lillie) from "Clouds" to "Carmen" with no more effort than it takes Charlotte Greenwood to scale the backyard fence.
