The Week's Special Events on the Air

VENTS for the week include the CBS broadcast Monday at 12:30 of the arrival of the Fleet at San Diego. Also George Bernard Shaw, at 1 p. m., Tuesday, over CBS, from London. KGU, KGO, KDYL and net broadcast "Kamehameka Day," from Honolulu.

The Max Baer-Jimmy Braddock fight for the heavyweight championship of the world will be brought to radio listeners blow-byblow direct from the ringside in Madison Square Garden Bowl on Thursday, June 13, over a coast-to-coast network of the National Broadcasting Company.

Graham McNamee and Ford Bond, who gave listeners the ringside description of the Baer-Carnera fight a year ago, again will be at the microphones for the broadcast.

The sponsors of Paul Whiteman's Music Hall broadcast, usually heard over an NBC nation-wide network on Thursdays at 6 p. m., P. S. T., have agreed to stand aside that night in order that radio listeners everywhere may follow the progress of the championship battle.

Paul Althouse, noted tenor, will be the guest of the Sunday Evening Hour, with the Ford Symphony Orchestra under the direction of Victor Kolar, heard over the Columbia network on Sunday, June 9, between 5 and 6 p. m., P. S. T.

The arrival of the fleet at San Diego will be broadcast over the Columbia network on Monday, June 10, between 12:30 and 1 p. m., P. S. T. The ships are returning from Honolulu, which served as a base during extensive war games in the Pacific.

Cyrena Van Gordon of the Metropolitan and Chicago opera companies, will be the guest of Cobina Wright, heard over the Columbia network on Monday, June 10, between 11 and 12 noon, P.S.T.

One of the most spectacular sports events of 1935 will be described by Ted Husing over the Columbia network on Saturday, June 15, between 1:30 and 2:15 p. m., P. S. T. It will be a mile race between Bill Bonthron of Princeton, Gene Venzke of Penn, Glenn Cunningham of Kansas and Jack Lovelock of New Zealand. All four of these men have held world's records for the mile with Cunningham present title holder at 4 minutes 6.7 seconds. There is a good chance that a new

record will be set. This race will close the broadcast from the Princeton invitation track meet.

The series titled "How Can We Stay Out of War?" has been extended to Wednesday, June 12, with Newton D. Baker scheduled to speak on the final program of the series.

The International Labor Conference at Geneva will be discussed in a broadcast from the Swiss city over the Columbia network on Sunday, June 9, between 8:45 and 9 a. m., P.S. T. Some of the noted personalities in attendance will be heard in short comments on the proceedings.

Happenings on KQW

A fast moving fifteen-minute commercial program of popular, melodious variety called "Musical Moments," took to the air through KQW in San Jose last week. It is scheduled three times weekly over KQW—7:45 to 8 p. m. Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. "Musical Moments" are transcribed programs sponsored by Chevrolet with a minimum of commercial copy.

KQW also sends word of Scott Head, a young maestro on his way to the big time. His dance band is now under contract to Music Corporation of America

Scott Head is featured at the Saturday night dances in the Cocoanut Grove of the Casa Del Rey in Santa Cruz and broadcasts from KQW every Saturday night from 10 to 10:30. When the summer vacation season opens in Santa Cruz June 20, Scott Held will begin a series of nightly broadcasts over the popular San Jose station, KOW.

KQW's M. F. "Woody" Woodling has been in the business of broadcasting in the combined role of announcer, continuity writer and operator for the past three and a half years. Woody was transferred from KJBS in San Francisco to its member station of the Northern California Broadcasting System, KQW in San Jose. His specialties are the popular "Breakfast Hour" heard daily from 7 to 8 a. m., as well as the various remote dance broadcasts.

Stoopnagle and Budd will be co-starred with Waring's Pennsylvanians on the Ford broadcasts starting the first week in July. New time effective then will bring the program on Tuesdays, beginning July 2, from 5:30 to 6 p. m., P. S. T.



Jerome Kern to Write Music for Lily Pons' Picture

New music by Jerome Kern, internationally famed composer, will soon be on your radio. He has been signed by RKO-Radio Studios to write the musical score for "Love Song" (tentative title), the Pandro S. Berman production which will introduce Lily Pons, operatic and radio star, to screen audiences.

Kern, who is one of radio's best loved composers, first arrived at eminence in the musical comedy field when, in 1914, he composed the song "They Didn't Believe Me," which Julia Sanderson sang in "The Girl from Utah."

Since 1914 his list of successes has grown with leaps and bounds, and today he is regarded as one of America's greatest composers. Some of the hit musical comedies for which Kern wrote the music are: "Very Good Eddie," "Leave It to Jane," "The Night Boat," "Hitchy-Koo" and "Sweet Adeline."

His smash hits include "Show Boat," "The Cat and the Fiddle," "Music in the Air," "Sally" and the sensational "Roberta," which RKO-Radio picturized with Fred Astaire and Ginger Rogers co-starring.

"Love Song" will be directed by John Cromwell from a screen play by Edmund North and James Gow. The story is an original by Elsie Finn and David G. Wittles. Production is scheduled to start July 1.

The rousing reception given Honorable Archie and Frank Watanabe, feature KNX artists, at a recent meeting of the L. A. Breakfast Club, was reported by members to be unequaled in their past history.

The results of Watanabe's efforts to hold the notes of his "dear employments" very serious speech are better imagined than described. "In conclusion," says Honorable Archie, "the most important point to remember, my friends, is (turning to next page handed him) to send this letter to five of your friends!"

Radio at the Exposition

With the opening of America's Exposition in San Diego May 29, radio assumed a major role in the presentation of musical entertainment, special events and other attractions to be offered in the Fair throughout the sumer.

A modern, scientifically designed Radio Building is under construction near the east entrance to the Exposition and adjacent to the Palace of Better Housing. On completion, the Radio Building will contain two modern studios sufficient in size and equipment to handle any type of program originating in the Exposition.

Many of the Exposition's radio programs will originate at points outside of the Radio Building. An adequate pick-up system has been provided to service such origination points as the Ford Bowl, the Spreckels Organ, House of Hospitality, Cafe of the World and other focal points where both sustaining and sponsored programs will originate for the networks.

For ten years Bill Sharples, on his early morning broadcast from KNX, has been working toward increased patriotism, particularly for the schoolrooms. For ten years at 7:15 sharp, Bill and his little Honor Scout, "Willie," have sent out over the air the inspiring Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Thus it is of interest that recently the Los Angeles School Board inaugurated daily allegiance ceremonies in the assemblies of all city schools—further, before every School Board meeting all members must now repeat in unison, "I Pledge Allegiance to the American Flag—"

A very happy man is Bill Sharples to realize his years of efforts toward this goal have at last been successful.

Ferde Grofe, Burns and Allen's musical director, wrote his first popular musical score on the back of a restaurant menu. Grofe, in anguish over the "jazz" he was hearing in a Los Angeles beanery penciled his own arrangement and it launched his career.



ROBABLY no country in the world has so many short-wave stations per ratio of its population as Java. This is due in some measure to climatic conditions, for, situated as Java is in the tropical regions, static is of such intensity in summer as to make reception on the ordinary broadcast band almost impossible. Short waves provided the only efficient way of over-coming these atmospheric disturbances, and this small island in the Dutch East Indies now has a total of 64 broadcasting stations operating on wavelengths between 49 and 175 meters.

The latest addition to this transpacific family of short-wave transmitters is a new 10,000 watt station on 3.06 meg, which announces as YDA and broadcasts the same programs as the familiar Bandoeng station on 6.12 meg. In spite of the comparatively high wavelength used, this new transmitter has already been reported by many coast listeners with excellent signal strength between 3 and 6 a. m.

The powerful 80 kilowatt phone station PLV of Bandoeng, Java, is again broadcasting programs in the morning between 7 and 7:30 a. m. The exact schedule is not known as yet, but the transmitter was heard on 9.47 meg. Tuesday and Thursday of last week with excellent volume.

Mr. Van den Enden's informal English broadcast, which have been heard for some time over HJ4ABL on Saturday evenings between 8 and 9 p. m., are now being broadcast over HJ4ABB, "Radio Manizales," on either 6.11 or 7.13 meg. fom 8 to 9 or from 9 to 10 p. m. Choice of a definite wave will depend on listener's reports.

It might be mentioned that HJ4ABB is also on the air Wednesday evenings between 6 and 7 p. m., with a fine Spanish program conducted by this same popular announcer.

Since June 1, station VE9GW of Bowmanville, Ontario, Canada, has been operating on a new schedule. It is now on the air Thursday, Friday and Saturday from 5 a. m. to 2 p. m., and on Sunday from 10 a. m. to 6 p. m. No change has been made in the frequency of 6.09 meg.

Illinois Hears Japan by Shortwave Each Afternoon

Japan is being regularly heard each afternoon by Charles A. Morrison, at Bloomington, Illinois, president of the International DX'ers Alliance.

"There is really nothing particularly remarkable in my reception of Japan in the afternoon," Mr. Morrison said, with regard to his accomplishment. "This is simply a contact schedule between JVF, Nazaki, Japan, on 19.1 meters, 15,620 kilocycles, and KWU in Dixon, California, on 19.4 meters, 15,360 kilocycles. At 3:45 p. m., Eastern Standard Time, JVF puts on their tone signal and a minute or so later starts to call San Francisco in voice. Usually they call "Hello, San Francisco, this is Tokyo calling." "Hello, San Francisco, this is JVF, Tokyo, calling, etc. As soon as San Francisco (KWU) answers they measure noise and, if the circuit is satisfactory, go into inverted speech for their commercial calls. At about 4 to 4:05 p. m., E. S. T., they both sign off in voice. Sometimes JVF uses phonograph records for these tests. Both sides of the conversation can easily be heard by tuning two different receivers to the opposite ends of the circuit. We quite often use this sort of a reception hook-up here.

"Japan can be heard almost every morning now on 28 meters, 10,740 kilocycles, using the JVM call. JVM relays the Japanese Broadcasting Company from 1:40 to 2:20 a. m., E. S. T., and from 4 to 7:40 a. m., E. S. T., daily. During the winter JVT on 44.4 meters, 6,750 kilocycles is used to relay the JBC. It is well to remember that it is characteristic of Japanese short-wave stations that quite often they may be very weak when first tuned in but will pick up considerable volume after being on a few minutes."

The DX Corner

Amando Cespedes Marin, of NRH fame, is now operating station TIRCC irregularly on 6.55 meg. between 5 and 8 p. m.

PHI of Huizen, Holland, is now broadcasting on 17.77 meg, daily except Tuesday and Wednesday from 5:30 to 8 a.m. The station has also been heard Thursday afternoon between 12:35 and 3:45 p.m. in the east, but reception west of the Rockies at this time is probably impossible.

HJ1ABE of Cartagena, Colombia, is now broadcasting its weekly short-wave club programs on Monday night between 8:30 and 9:30 p. m. The frequency is 6.11 meg.

HH2R of Port au Prince, Haiti, has been heard testing irregularly on 9:54 meg, between 4 p. m. and midnight.

ZTJ of Johannesburg, South Africa, has a new schedule which theoretically comes at the best time for reception in this country. They are now on the air Wednesday and Saturday at 9 p. m., PST, using a frequency of 6.09 meg.

PRADO has resumed its weekly broadcast for Ecuadoreans in Europe and may be heard on 15.44 meg, Sunday afternoon between 3 and 4 p. m.

HKN of Bogota and HJ5AG of Cali, Colombia, are testing irregularly with musical programs on the 40-meter amateur band between 7 and 9 p. m.

GCS, one of the few English phone stations to be heard west of the Rockies, contacts WLA of Lawrenceville, N. J., almost every evening near 6:30 p. m. GCS uses a frequency of 9.02 meg., and WLA 9:17 meg.

LSX of Buenos Aires, Argentina tests with W2XAF on Monday at 3:30; with WET on Saturday between 4:30 and 5:45 p. m.; and an unknown station on Wednesday irregularly between 5 and 7 p. m. The frequency is 10.35 meg.

CMHD, the new short-wave station in Havana, Cuba, is now being received on 10.20 meg, almost every afternoon until 5:15 p.m.

Deal was engineered by the Tommy Lee Artists' Bureau, who set the band on a nightly CDLBS spot from 10 to 10:30, and a twice weekly transcontinental, 8 to 8:30, Tuesdays and Saturdays over CBS.

More new dancing rhythms are being dished out locally by (Play Don) Bestor and his orchestra from the Palomar (KH)-CDLBS 11-11:30 p. m.), and Bill Fleck, old time favorite, from the Cafe de Paree (KHJ-CDLBS 9-9:30 p. m.). Hollywood is getting a taste of what a songwriter gone bandmaster sounds like with the debut of Bud Cooper and his orchestra from Club New Yorker (KFWB 11:30-12 midnight). Cooper is famed for penning "Does You Mother Know You're Out, Cecilia?" "Red Hot Momma" and "Feelin' Kinda Blue." Others of course. On June 10 Freddie Martin's music politely replaces Henry Busse's "brass" dance band in the Cocoanut Grove (KFWB 8:30-9 p. m., KFI-NBC 11:30-12 midnight). Hal Grayson's orchestra may be heard at some future time over the CDLBS, playing in Honolulu.... Grayson left Los Angeles for Hawaii May 27. Dick Jurgens, popular San Francisco maestro, leaves Los Angeles to head for a tour of one night stands up to Seattle, where he opens at the Victor Club, still broadcasting over CDLBS.

Meandering Through the Studios: KFWB's popular soprano, Ruth Durrell, will confine her singing to bed for the next two weeks. She'll entertain nurses and doctors of the Good Samaritan Hospital, where she's recovering from an emergency operation. KHJ's Charley Bullotti (no kin to the similar-voiced announcer, Harry Von hoosted to San Diego Exposition radio boss for all Columbia programs originating there. . . .
