

## The Week's Special Events on the Air

PROGRAM producers are active again, with many new and promising features for the week. The National Educational Association Convention programs occupy both networks from Monday to Thursday. The CBS schedule, 12:45 Monday, 11:15 Tuesday, and 11:15 Thursday. The NBC will broadcast five sessions: Tuesday, 2 p. m.; Wednesday, 9 a. m. and 5:45 p. m.; Thursday, 9 a. m. and 2 p. m. Another Educational event is the address by J. W. Studebaker, United States Commissioner of Education over NBC, 8:30 a. m., Thursday, from Columbus, Ohio.

Other events of the week include the first programs of the Western World Wave Club over KJBS on Monday, Wednesday, and

Friday at 9:15 p. m.

Stoopnagle and Budd join Waring's Pennsylvanians over CBS on Tuesday at 5 p.m., and Edwin C. Hill adds 6:30 p. m. on Tuesday to his present CBS schedule of Mon-

day and Wednesday at 4:15.

KGB, San Diego, is the originating point for the CBS airing of "Spanish Serenade" on Saturday at 7 p. m., not forgetting Ted Fio-Rito's "Summer Hour," CBS, Sunday at 3 p. m. Ray Paige's "Musical Mirror" at 7 p. m., and the Brahms Festival over KGO net on Monday at 3:30 and 4:30, Thursday.

Symphonic music rules the air waves this week with the Los Angeles Symphony (over CBS) at 8 p. m., Tuesday and Thursday; Howard Barlow, Sunday at 11 a, m., and the Portland Symphony on Saturday at 3 p. m. NBC offers Kansas City Philharmonic with De Wolf Hopper on Sunday at 1 p. m., and Standard Symphony on Thursday at 8:15 p. m. Regular symphonic NBC features still remain on the schedule.

Gogo DeLys, French-Canadian vocal star of the NBC "Hit Parade," has been invited to appear as guest artist at the Canadian Festival of Music to be held at Toronto during August. In addition to featuring a group of numbers, Miss DeLys will present several American artists with whom she has appeared on the air.

THE Sunday Evening Hour, CBS, signs off this week, as does "Newspaper Adventures," KFRC, and Fred Allen's "Town Hall Tonight," NBC. Claude Sweeten's "Salon Moderne" has a new spot—8:30 instead of 7 and we wish this excellent feature could find a spot and hold it. Bea Lillie also signs off.

CBS shuffles the schedule with many changes. Among them, Sunday, Eddie Dunstedter, at 9:30 a. m. instead of 10:30; "He, She and They," 10 a. m. instead of 9:30; "Between the Bookends," 10:30 instead of 10 a. m. and "Happy Hollow," 10:45 instead of 10.30. On Wednesday, "Gravel Pit Courtroom" replaces "Mr. and Mrs." at 9:15 a. m. (also Friday), "Sunset Serenade" replaces Ted Fio-Rito at 4:30 p. m. and Gino Mancini, tenor, steps into the Clande Hopkins Orchestra spot at 7 p. m., Wednesday, followed at 7:30 by "Moon Glow" with Connie Gates and organist.

## Ted Fio Rito Pinch Hits for Wayne King

Ted Fio Rito and his orchestra have supplanted Wayne King's musical aggregation on the latter's regular Sunday and Monday evening spots from 6 to 6:30 p. m. over the Columbia network.

Maestro King, who has enjoyed one of the most prolonged and successful radio careers on record, has joined with his men in taking

a well-earned vacation.

Beginning with the broadcast of July 7. Wayne King will again take over the baton, to continue his dreamy waltzes for the duration of the series.

Ethel Merman's presence in Hollywood to play a feature rôle in the new Eddie Cantor picture, tentatively titled "Dreamland," has been postponed because of her Sunday night broadcasts from the New York CBS studios.

#### "The Show Must Go On"

George Frame Brown was willing to submit to a little surgery, but balked at being out of Tony and Gus, the NBC radio sketch of which he is author and co-star. Confined to his bed in Manhattan's Lenox Hill Hospital after an operation, Brown insisted that the show go on from his bedside. So it was arranged to "pipe in" the patient from the hospital during his convalescence.

Brown's sudden illness didn't ruffle the composure of members of the Tony and Gus cast. Hasty last minute changes arranged for Brown to be stricken with "poison ivy." Thus written out of the cast, Mario Chamlee, featured singer of the program, who has the rôle of an Italian youth with operatic ambitions, took the spotlight. Fortunately, the script called for Chamlee to present his "first concert" in New York.

#### Bernie to Appear in San Francisco July 9

Ben Bernie (Yowsuh, the Old Maestro himself) will arrive in San Francisco with all his lads on Tuesday, July 9, for a brief visit

They will present their regular weekly broadcast for the East from NBC's 111 Sutter Street studios at 4 p.m., P.S.T., then will pack up their instruments and move into the

Fairmont Hotel for the evening, playing there for dancers. They expect to leave the following morning.

#### Connie Gates Starred in New Series

"Moon-Glow" is a new program tailor-made to the talents of its star, Connie Gates, on the Columbia network on Wednesday, from 7:30 to 7:45 p.m., E.S.T. Described as "an island of song bounded on four sides by a torrent of jazz," the "Moon-Glow" program is styled as an attempt at something entirely different in radio production. The moon is again put to use as program background.

#### Jolly, Isn't It? Haw!

John Watt, the British Broadcasting Corporation's air producer and "compere," a word borrowed from the French, meaning the equivalent of "master-of-ceremonies." who was interviewed on CBS by Kate Smith, had Columbia studio folk intrigued with more than a thick English accent. It was his fantastic name. "Yes, it is rather queer, isn't it?" he answered those who could not refrain from commenting. "You know," he said, "I'm quite the laughing stock back home. Everyone I meet asks me, 'I say, John, how is your brother, Kilo?'"

## News and Comment

The "Symphony" Comes Into Its Own

NOT many years ago lovers of serious music would wait for months for an opportunity to hear a good symphony orchestra. Occasional concerts were major social and cultural events, viewed by the uninformed as "high brow" affairs, and an avowed love for the symphony was considered merely a pose.

But today the entire country is symphony minded to the extent that if sustained interest counts, symphonic music has become the most generally "popular" of all musical enter-

tainment.

The better radio hours, "symphonize" their popular music, and it is hailed by the multitudes. All of which goes to show that popular music is familiar music, and the higher

its quality the more popular.

Standard Oil, in sponsoring eight consecutive years of symphonic broadcasts, has contributed magnificently to a better understanding of symphonic works. By selecting works that are first of all musical, they have avoided the pitfall of inviting ridicule by lovers of beautiful music who are impatient with the conceit of the innovator whose first idea is to be "different."

The current week offers splendid fare for lovers of good music, superbly performed. The Los Angeles Symphony, under Henry Svedrofsky, offers two concerts: on Tuesday, July 2, over CBS at 8 p. m., and Thurs-

day at the same hour. The Tuesday concert programs, Mozart's overture to the "Marriage of Figaro," and part of the seldom heard concerto for viola in B Minor by Handel; the brilliant "A Night on Bald Mountain" by Moussorgsky and Moskowski's brilliant "Bolero."

The July 4 program, features Victor Her-Venice," the "Dirge" from MacDowell's "Second Indian Suite" and "Irish Tune" and "Shepherds Hey" by Percy Grainger.

The Standard Symphony at 8:15 Thursday offers Herbert's "Pan Americana" and selections from "Naughty Marietta": two Indian Dances by Charles Skelton, selections from the "Grand Canyon Suite" by Ferde

Grofe, and the "El Capitan" March by John Philip Sousa.

These concerts, while featuring lighter music than is usual, will be refreshing and stimulating to all devotees of good music. Other symphonic features include the Portland Symphony on Saturday afternoon at 3 p. m. over CBS; the popular Howard Barlow Symphony Hour at 11 Sunday morning, CBS, and the Kansas City Philharmonic Orchestra at 1 p. m. Sunday over NBC.

#### Radio Guild in New Sunday Series

NBC's Radio Guild, which has been one of the most popular dramatic series on the air for years, will move to a Sunday morning period on July 7, in order that additional listeners may be able to enjoy it, those who are otherwise occupied on week day after-

The Guild programs will be heard from 10:30 to 11:30 a. m., Pacific Standard Time, over an NBC-KPO network, following the close of the Theatre of the Air series, which proved that Sunday morning is an ideal time for presentation of dramatic programs.

The series will be opened with four repeat performances, plays which already have achieved wide response in their radio adaptations. These will be John Galsworthy's "Justice," which has been heard twice before over NBC networks; "Clear All Wires," by Sam and Bella Spewack, which has been given once before; Wildred Brooke-Ley's "Chopin," which has been presented three times, and Shakespeare's "Midsummer Night's Dream," with Mendelssohn's famous incidental music, which has been heard four times before on the air.

The famous weekly dramatic series was inaugurated by the NBC in 1929, and has been running continuously since. Many of the present actors have been with the group ever since the first performance, and all are

widely experienced radio "troupers."

Prior to July 7, the Radio Guild will contique to be heard in its regular Monday afternoon period over KGO and KDYL.

NBC announcers will describe the spectacular play-by-play details of the third anmual contest between the major league rival teams, directed this year on the playing field by Frank Frisch, manager of the world champion St. Louis Cardinals of the National league, and Mickey Cochrane, pilot of the Detroit Tigers, American League pennant

winners.

It is expected that a colorful crowd of 80.000 will jam Cleveland's huge Municipal Stadium to see the battle on Monday, July 8. In case of postponement the game will be scheduled for Tuesday, July 9.

The umpires will call "batter up" at 10:30

a. m., Pacific standard time. Other details of the broadcast over NBC networks will be announced later.



THE British Broadcasting Corporation has announced its intention to extend the Empire Station at Daventry, which is now operating with a power of 15 kilowatts, by the addition of two new transmitters employing 40 kilowatts each. The two existing outfits will then be combined to form one transmitter with a maximum output of 40 kilo-

watts, making available three transmitters in all. There will also be extensions in the aerial system, based on the data collected in the experimental work which has been carried out at Daventry by the British Broadcasting Corporation during the past two and one-half years.

Despite many reports to the contrary, station HJ1ABE of Cartagena, Colombia, is still on the air with its regular Monday evening programs. During the past few weeks, reception has been particularly good during these transmissions between 7:30 and 8:30 p. m. A variety show takes up the first thirty minutes, and is followed at 8 p. m. by the famous "Hawaiian Boys of HJ1ABE," who only a few weeks ago celebrated their

second successful year with this station. Orchestral music is provided by a real "hot" studio orchestra, and the leader can frequently be overheard shouting his "Come on, boys, let's have it."

Most announcements are given in English, and the signature song is a well-known organ selection. The frequency used is 6.11 meg.

\* \*

These Javanese broadcasters are becoming so numerous on the abbreviated wavelengths that the attentive listener has become somewhat bewildered as to the correct calls and locations. Most of the transmitters belong to the famous NIROM chain in the Dutch East Indies, the key station of which is YDA, a 10-kilowatt outfit which is located at Tandjongprick, near Batavia. This transmitter operates from 7:30 to 10:30 p. m. on 6.04 meg., and from 2:30 to 7 a. m. (to 8:30 on Saturdays) on 3.04 meg. The latter schedule only is audible in this country, and then only irregularly.

The most reliable station for America's Pacific Coast is YDA2, a relay station which broadcasts with 1500 watts on 6.12 meg. Incidentally, a new relay transmitter has been reported with good volume every Sunday morning between 2:30 and 7 a. m. on a frequency of about 10.95 meg. This station is not listed, and is evidently a new outlet for the network.

The NIROM also operates an East-Java network, with YDB of Sourabaya on 4.47 meg, acting as key station. The same schedule as that of the western chain is maintained.

The only broadcast station on this island which is heard consistently in America is PMY of Bandoeng, which usually crosses the Pacific with a fair signal between 2 and 6 a. m. on a frequency of 5:14 meg. However, a number of other transmitters are on the air every morning in the wee small hours, and present a good target for the DX fan. Best bets include YDU3 on 5.26 meg., YDL2 on 4.81 meg., and YDU2 on 4.60 meg.

Station COC of Havana, Cuba, the famous

Station COC of Havana, Cuba, the famous "Voice of the Evergreen Land," has been on the air several evenings recently as late as 6:40 p. m., relaying the programs of CMBB and pleading for Cuba's share of the popular American tourist trade. COC also has a regular Sunday evening schedule until 7 p. m. on 6.01 meg., and do not forget the Saturday night programs of typical Cuban music between 8 and 9 p. m.

Not to be outdone by the Cuban broadcasting salesmen, station XEBT of Mexico City is demonstrating the delights of interior Mexico for the benefit of summer vacationists. This station also reads fan mail and dedicates musical numbers to listeners every Thursday night from 9 to 9:40 p. m. The frequency is 6.00 meg.

A letter from W3XAL of Bound Brook, N. J., informs us that the station now broadcasts on 17.78 meg. daily from 6 to 7 a. m., and on Tuesday, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday from noon to 1 p. m. Monday, Wednesday, and Saturday programs are transmitted from 2 to 3 p. m. on 6.10 meg., and an experimental broadcast is featured Saturday only on the same frequency between 9 and 10 p. m.

As we go to press, best European reception is still being wafted over the ether via GSD on 11.75 meg. between 7 and 8 p. m. The same station is also heard fairly well between 3 and 5 p. m. and later between 8:30 and 10:30 p. m.

## The DX Corner

The Fiji Island station VPD seems to have changed its schedule slightly, now not coming on the air until 10 p. m., and then usually only to test with Sydney. Listen in on 13.07 meg.

HKV of Bogota, Colombia, South America's strongest broadcaster so far as Pacific Coast listeners are concerned, is now broadcasting every Tuesday night until 8 p. m. on 8:80 meg., and irregularly on other nights.

HJ4ABB of Manizales, Colombia, has been heard several times lately until 7:30 p. m. on 6.11 meg. Letters from fans are read, and musical numbers are dedicated to listeners every Wednesday from 7 to 7:30.

Kay Thompson, another ace vocalist from the West, brings even more than a voice to the loudspeaker—she brings ideas. And they have caught on to the point where a "Kay Thompson arrangement" is referred to as often as a "Ferde Grofe arrangement" was in the old days. She has sopped all the efforts of mixed vocalists, and with her three boys and Lennie Hayton's orchestra, she has something very definite to offer.

And in addition to all these already landed, we are told that Ruggles and Boland, Bebe Daniels and Ben Lyon, Helen Hayes, and even Laurel and Hardy of the movies, are under consideration for starring rôles in the near future.

It would seem that California has come with both feet—and is still en route.

One of the reasons that talent has been developed out there, practically in carloads, while the output in the East has been rather sad of late, is that they let them take their own sweet time about it out there. It is a little difficult to be spontaneous when you are limited to three minutes' time.

that fall.


