News and Comment

NEW features this week constitute an inaugural of the 1935 Fall Radio Season. Sunday brings back the "Church of the Air" and "Voice of Experience" over CBS. On Monday, the new Grace Moore program is scheduled over NBC. Sigmund Romberg and Deems Taylor, "Crime Clues" and one of the classics of radio—"Great Moments in History" return via NBC on Tuesday. Two new NBC major features occupy the Wednesday Spotlight—Warden Lewis Lawes, and the new "Rendezvous Musical." The Atwater Kent program with Jessica Dragonette, soprano, and Josef Pasternack's orchestra opens a new series, Thursday over CBS.

From now until change from daylight saving to standard time schedules, many new programs will have their fall premiere. See day by day schedules for time of new features beginning on page 16.

Historic Events to Be Revived Over NBC from Actual Scenes

THE glory that was Greece and the glory that was ancient Rome—and Florence, Venice, Versailles, Paris, Heidelberg, and other famous historical spots in Europe—will be revived for NBC listeners in a series of programs from the actual scenes, beginning in October.

Dr. Franklin Dunham, educational director of the NBC, after conferring with John F. Royal, NBC vice-president in charge of programs, recently returned from a trip to Europe during which he arranged with foreign radio officials for an increase in broadcasts to the United States.

The programs will be designed to benefit history students in schools and colleges as well as the general listener, Dr. Dunham said.

"Here we will be carrying out the greatest mission of radio to education," Dr. Dunham stated, "by bringing to the classroom a picture of events and places of great historical

importance which vitalize the lesson, thus doing for the school what it cannot do easily itself."

The broadcasts will be interesting as well as educational, will be delivered in clear easily understood English, and will be based on material from verse and stories.

It is planned to set up microphones on the actual scenes, such as the Acropolis and Parthenon in Athens; the field at Marathon, where the Greeks defeated the Persians; the Coliseum at Rome; the great art centers of Florence; Palace of the Doges in Venice; the battlefields of Waterloo and Hastings, where William the Conqueror landed; the Holy Land, Vienna, Plymouth, England, and others.

"The millions of Americans who have wanted to visit the world's great historical shrines thus will be enabled to do so by radio," Dr. Dunham pointed out.

The American School of the Air will be resumed on the Columbia Broadcasting System October 21, and will be heard Monday through Friday between 11:30 and 12 noon, P. S. T.

U. S. Senator Frederick W. Steiwer of Oregon will be heard over the Columbia network when he addresses a meeting of the Women's National Republican Club on Tuesday, September 17, from 11:30 to 12 noon, P. S. T.

George Fischer's "Studio Whispers," usually heard at 8:15, will be released hereafter at eight o'clock.

Tibbett to Sing to His Largest Audience

LAWRENCE TIBBETT will be heard over one of the largest networks ever engaged for an individual soloist when he returns to the air on Tuesday, September 24. Eighty CBS outlets will be linked every Tuesday night from 4:30 to 5 p. m., P. S. T., to carry the voice of America's famous dramatic singer.

While Tibbett's fame has spread far and wide, relatively few have been able to hear him at the Metropolitan or during his limited concert tours. With his contract for CBS appearances, his programs will reach a far greater number of listeners than at any time previously in his radio career. As already announced, Don Voorhees has been engaged to conduct the accompanying symphony orchestra when the popular baritone is broadcasting from New York.

Toward the end of October the baritone will begin his annual fall concert tour, which will again take him to the West. During this period several of his broadcasts will originate at CBS stations along the road. In December Tibbett will begin preparations for his eleventh season at the Metropolitan Opera.

Phil Baker Signed

Phil Baker, stellar radio, screen and stage comedian, has been signed to headline a new series of weekly programs over an extensive CBS network, starting September 29.

For many seasons one of the outstanding entertainers of the legitimate stage, Baker first turned to radio two and one-half years ago and within a short period became one of the air's most popular performers. Phil's wit has also attracted the attention of the Hollywood magnates, and he has just completed work for a featured rôle in the new Twentieth Century-Fox release, "Thanks a Million."

Atwater-Kent Starts Tenth Anniversary

Inauguration of the new Atwater Kent concert series over the Columbia network on Thursday, September 19, from 4:30 to 5 p. m., P. S. T., will mark the program's tenth year of presenting the leading talent in the realm of fine music.

The Atwater Kent program is today recognized as one of the most important pioneering movements in radio. To it are traced the popularization of serious music performed by the foremost artists of the world, the origin of the guest star vogue and introduction of new young talent through the Atwater Kent national radio auditions held annually from 1927 to 1932.

Probably the most significant change in broadcasting took place in 1925, when the Atwater Kent series established itself by disregarding all previous forms and standards. By an adventuresome move it proved that something more than a dance band supplemented by vocalists could be accepted. The

response showed so overwhelmingly the demand for good music from the pens of the masters, interpreted by masters, that today this form of entertainment is an essential commodity of the air.

Almost every famous name in fine music has appeared on the Atwater Kent programs in the last ten years, notable among them being Rosa Ponselle, Lawrence Tibbett, Grace Moore, Albert Spalding, Josef Hofmann, Louise Homer, Beniamino Gigli, Richard Bonelli, and Reinald Werrenrath.

Carmel's Famous "Bal Masque" to Be Broadcast

All of the color and merriment of the second annual Bal Masque staged by artists and writers of Carmel will be brought to eastern listeners of the Columbia Broadcasting System over the coast-to-coast network at 7 p. m., P. S. T., Saturday, September 21.

The broadcast will be direct from the floor of Hotel Del Monte, where artists and writers whose names are household words, as well as screen stars, members of society and other celebrities from all parts of the State gather annually for this big event, which rivals the artists' balls of Paris in its splendor and bizarre buffoonery.

Harrison Holliday, manager of KFRC, in San Francisco, will be master of ceremonies for the festivities, and the music will be provided by Bob Kinney and his Del Monte orchestra.

**Helen Hayes Turns Down
Movie Contract**

TURNING down an \$85,000 contract for a single motion picture, Helen Hayes has decided to give up her highly successful screen career in order to concentrate on her first series of broadcasts to be heard over an NBC coast-to-coast network this fall and winter, starting September 30. The famous actress also will curtail her theatre appearance until the radio programs are well under way. She will be heard in the West from 9 to 9:30 p. m., P. S. T., each Monday, over the NBC-KPO network.

"I have nothing against Hollywood," declares Miss Hayes. "There simply is not room in my life to be active in the theatre, on the screen, and over the radio at the same time and still do justice to all of them."

California Composers' Concert

The California Composers and Writers Society will present on Sunday, September 15, at 1 p. m. over station KYA in San Francisco, Stella Howell Samson, concert pianist, Eugene Bone, composer-pianist and speaker, Mabel Ethleen Palmer, California poet and composer, and Galen M. Harvey, State president of the organization, in the first of a

series of new programs, featuring noted artists, new writers, composers, and authors.

The Society was organized to encourage new and young composers, writers, and authors to attain that which they aspire to. It is open to all writers, composers, and authors, young and old, in California.

Bits about One Man's Family: William Andrews, who announces this NBC serial, has not worn a hat for eight years. . . Kathleen Wilson, who plays Claudia Barbour, paints, fences, writes poetry, arranges music, and makes her own clothes. . . With the Symphonists



AN announcement of great significance was made on September 3 over NBC by Merlin H. Aylesworth, president of the National Broadcasting Company, that should interest every serious composer and music lover.

Reviewing the activities of the NBC Music Guild since its inception, Mr. Aylesworth announced awards for best original works in Chamber Music forms submitted by American born composers, or, foreign born composers residing in the United States who have taken out first naturalization papers.

There are to be three awards, the first \$1000, and two more \$500 and \$250 respectively. Compositions are restricted to string quartet, two violins, viola and cello; string quintette, two violins, two violas and cello; quartet for piano, violin, viola and cello and quintette for piano, two violins, viola and cello. Latitude is given where other combinations may be used for example, any quartet or quintette of all strings, all wood-wind or all brass.

Other conditions are that works submitted must be in the sonata or suite form, and occupy 20 to 25 minutes playing time. Every composer attempting to write in the chamber

music forms, should examine available miniature scores of works such as the Schumann Piano Quintette, the Mozart Piano Quartet in G Minor, the Dvorak Piano Quintette, the Mozart, Beethoven and Schubert string quartettes. The Schubert Quintette in C is one of the noblest works in all chamber music.

Any reader of Broadcast Weekly competing who desires a list of the world's greatest chamber music works available in miniature score form, is invited to request same.

The NBC Music Guild Awards Committee of seven judges will be announced later. An entry form must be secured by application to "NBC Music Guild Awards Committee, 30 Rockefeller Plaza, New York City. All works must be submitted by February 29, 1936, and the awards will be made April 1, 1936.

Dimitri Shostakovich is the 29-year-old composer of Soviet Russia whose opera, "Lady Macbeth of Mzensk" aroused such heated discussion in recent months when it was introduced to American audiences in Cleveland, New York and Philadelphia. He is also known to Americans through symphonic works and compositions in small forms.

Our advices from New York state that "It is important to recall with respect to Shostakovich's music that he expressly renounces allegiance to any such antiquated doctrine as 'Art for Art's Sake' and declares his belief in the social and economic mission of music."

Debussy's piano prelude, "La Cathedral Engloutie" ("The Engulfed Cathedral") with its strange and haunting harmonies, its feeling of shadow and mystery, suggests the Breton legend of the submerged city of Ys. It is a tradition of the sea-faring folk of the Breton Coast that on calm days the tolling of church bells can be heard from the depths of the waters. "La Cathedrale Engloutie" has been transcribed for orchestra.

Schubert's Fifth Symphony is his most important work in that form before the "Unfinished" symphony and the great C

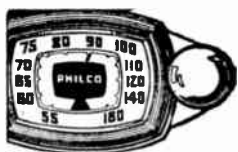

major symphony of what Schumann called "heavenly length." Schubert was only nineteen when he composed the Fifth symphony. That acute critic of symphonies, Percy Goetschius, finds that while the fifth stems frankly from Haydn and Mozart, it nevertheless possesses an "attractive physiognomy of its own." It is scored for a small orchestra even for its time—one flute, two oboes, two bassoons, two horns and the usual strings; no clarinets, trumpets, or drums."

Chesterfield Announces Return of Series

RETURN of the brilliant Chesterfield series for three years a pacesetter in both popular and concert entertainment, was announced today by the Columbia Broadcasting System. The program will present Lily Pons and Nino Martini, two of the brightest stars of the Metropolitan Opera Company and the international concert field, in alternate recitals with the popular concert orchestra and vocal ensemble of Andre Kostelanetz.

It was also announced that David Ross, for years an outstanding announcer for the Columbia network and winner of the diction medal of the American Academy of Arts and Letters, has been engaged exclusively for the new Chesterfield series.

The 1935 fall series, one of the major radio events of the year, will be opened by Miss Pons with Kostelanetz on Wednesday, October 2, in a half-hour's popular concert from 6 to 6:30 p. m., P. S. T. Martini will have his premiere on Saturday, October 5, at the same time. The Chesterfield stars will perform on the same schedule each week thereafter.

"Broadway Varieties" Program Extended

"Broadway Varieties," popular CBS musical revue, has been given an extension of contract. It will continue to be heard over the Columbia network through Wednesday, September 25 from 4:30 to 5 p. m., P. S. T. Commencing the following week it will be heard on Fridays at the same time.

Benny Returns to Network September 29

Jack Benny's return to his Sunday night spot on an NBC coast-to-coast network, following his first vacation from radio in several seasons, has been set for September 29 at 8:30 p. m., P. S. T., in a repeat performance for the western states. The popular comic will be inaugurating his fifth series of broadcasts, and aided by his heckling poetess-partner, Mary Livingstone, Jack will introduce two new cohorts on the fall series. Michael Bartlett, screen and stage tenor-actor, will replace Frank Parker, while Johnny Green's band will be heard instead of Don Bestor and his orchestra.

Murray joins KFWB as "emsee" and producer of the brand-new Variety Show, scheduled to hit the air in mid-September. The new program is being designed after the old-time "Hi Jinks," with eighteen or twenty variety acts, Jack Joy's full augmented orchestra, and typical Murray wisecracks, fashioned by two or three expert writers. Many old favorites, formerly associated with Murray, will probably step in line for the new show.

Widespread Enthusiasm for "America's Hour"

A FLOOD of letters and telegrams in praise of the Columbia Broadcasting System's "America's Hour" has been received since the programs were inaugurated in mid-July.

California History Over KROW

Dramatized lessons in California history have been resumed over KROW between 1:30 and 2 p. m., after being discontinued during the school vacation period. This feature, which is sponsored by the adult division of the State Department of Education through the Emergency Education Program, goes directly into the history classrooms of hundreds of schools in northern California. The continuance of the program during this school term is the result of a questionnaire sent to school principals asking if the material being broadcast was of educational value.

Practically all the replies related that it was one of the most instructive programs being heard by the students, and urged that the sequence of the historical data of California be carried through over the radio to the present era. All the facts presented in the dramatization are authenticated by William G. Paden, superintendent of the Alameda public schools, an authority on the history of the State. The program is being directed by Norman Field.

Lennie Hayton, young ork-leader on the "Hit Parade" show, was at one time chief arranger for Paul Whiteman. The young maestro was also selected by "Pop" to conduct his excellent orchestra during broadcasts, and Lennie says it was about one of the biggest things that ever happened to him.

George Burns and Gracie Allen have been signed by a new sponsor for a new series of weekly broadcasts over the nationwide Columbia network beginning Wednesday, October 2, from 5:30 to 6 p. m., P.S.T. They will be heard each Wednesday thereafter at the same time, from 8:30 to 9 p. m., P. S. T.

George and Gracie's current radio series for another sponsor will end on Wednesday, September 25, which means their long radio run will continue uninterrupted even for a single week.

Frank Parker will be starred in "The Atlantic Family" beginning Saturday, September 14. The program will originate in Philadelphia and will be heard over the Columbia network between 3 and 3:30 p. m., P.S.T., presenting a famous guest star each week.

Two of the foremost stage actresses will be heard over the Columbia network on Monday, September 16. Eva La Gallienne will be the guest of "America's Little House" at 12 to 12:15 p. m., P.S.T., and Judith Anderson will be starred in the Radio Theatre at 5 to 6 p. m., P.S.T.

The reunion of Admiral Byrd Expedition members will be broadcast over the Columbia network on Wednesday, September 25, between 5:30 and 6 p. m., P.S.T. During the program there will be a formal presentation of the Columbia medal to Byrd for outstanding contribution to radio.

Congressman Sol Bloom will address the nationwide audience of the Columbia Broadcasting System on Saturday, September 21, from 4:30 to 4:45 p.m., P.S.T., on the subject, "Constitutional Misconceptions."

School in New York. Each year, President Bristol selects one pupil who has been signally successful for the previous twelve months.

Barry McKinley, youthful baritone star of "When Dreams Come True" over NBC, made history when he ordered his attorneys to withdraw a proposed action against a lad who has been calling himself "Barry McKinley, the Dream Singer," on a small New Jersey station. Said Barry: "Imitation is heart-warming flattery, and I wish the kiddo a lot of success." The lawyers thought it might damage McKinley's standing, but Barry ruled otherwise.

Joe Penner is holding out for \$10,000 a week in theatres and, to date, no sponsor has met the new price he has placed on his services.

Hay diet followers, whose numbers are growing in radio daily, now include Tito Guizar and Connie Gates. Both are following the menu edicts of the famous doctor.

A third sponsor has hobbled up to show unusual interest in bringing back to the airwaves the hundred-voiced symphony of popular music Frank Black created for that soft-drink sponsor last season. It is one of radio's most expensive programs, too, so that is a sign of better times. Most of the new shows, with the exception of the return of the Sigmund Romberg opus, are dramatic offerings, and the major league shows are a bit slow in being announced.

Most of radio's famous announcers are giving up their network affiliations and turning free lance. James Wallington left so he could be with Cantor, and now Kelvin Keech, one of radio's oldest and best mikemen, departs from the scrolls of NBC to handle a lot of programs on both networks. Keech, who has one of the largest followings of all the announcers, has been in demand for several years for programs on both networks and now he has taken the step which enables him to talk where he wants to—for that certain healthy pay envelope.

Paul Whiteman is about to make it a three-cornered fight with Rudy Vallee, pioneer master of the variety program, and Al Jolson, famous as "the world's greatest entertainer," who is doing something along the same lines from the Pacific Coast. Whiteman is about to launch a variety type of program. He is picking on very tough opposition in Vallee and Jolson—even for Whiteman. But if it makes for better listening, it will be a fight that will call for no action on the part of the League of Nations.

Adele Ronson's first radio part was in a "True Story" drama back in 1930. Now she's the feminine lead in the "Buck Rogers" programs, that fantastic thriller of life as it may be 500 years from now. From truth to

fantasy, from 1930 to 2435, and from a small part to a principal role—that's not such poor progress in five years.

If you wanted to entertain "One Man's Family," you'd need first of all a large dinner table, and second, a versatile cook. Here are the dishes which various players of American family life prefer above all others:

Page Gilman, youngest actor in the cast and portrayer of Jack Barbour, chicken a la king.

Bernice Berwin, who plays Hazel, likes chicken Maryland style, and Kathleen Wilson, who is Claudia, likes hers with a touch of curry powder—chicken Burmese, it's called.

Minetta Ellen, the lovable mother of the family, thinks there is no delicacy to rank with pumpkin pie, in keeping with her New England ancestry.

Michael Raffetto (Paul), whose forbears were British and Italian, gives the crown to raviolis, if they are prepared in the authentic Italian manner—with a sauce that takes several hours to cook.

Winifred Wolfe (Teddy), is a plump little girl in real life and no wonder—her favorite is chocolate pie with "lots of whipped cream."

Barton Yarborough, the youthful Clifford Barbour, says he likes everything. J. Anthony Smythe (Henry Barbour, the father) disagrees violently. The head of the family declares that he is the only real connoisseur in the cast. His favorite meal is a big dish of raw meat a la tartare. "Delicious," he says.

Broekman estimates that he spends a mere 100 hours a week working on his music, but doesn't want to forget some of the ideas for trick arrangements or new tunes that may come to him while he's trying to go to sleep.

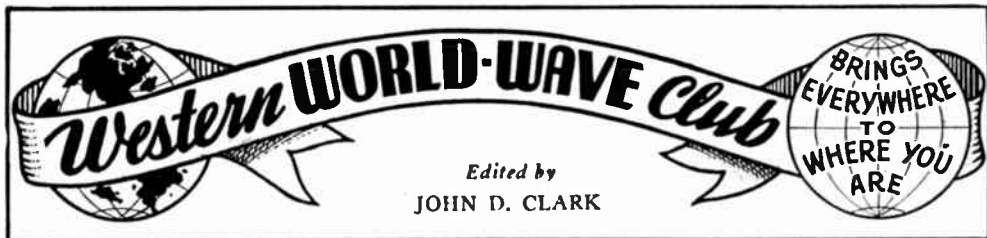
