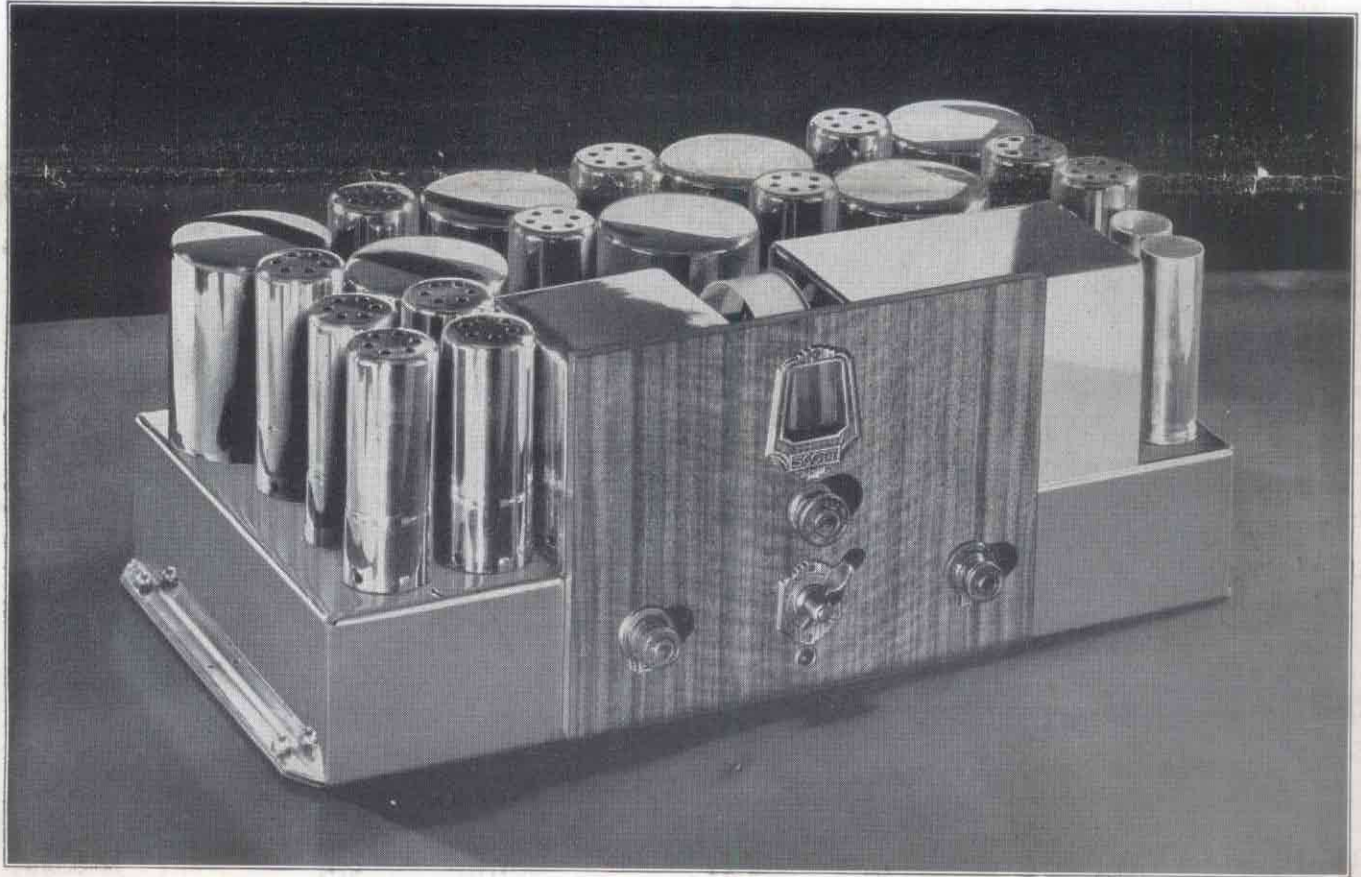

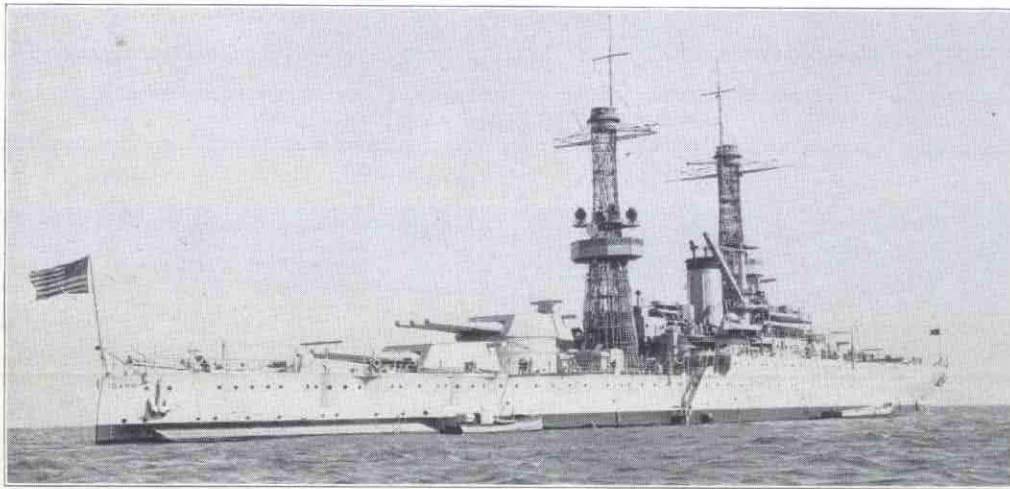

Scott Receiver Installations on Private Yachts—Ocean Liners—Battle Ships

One of the most difficult types of radio installations to make is that on ocean liners, yachts or battleships. All modern boats have a large number of different kinds of electrical equipment using motors, which unless very carefully filtered, and kept in perfect condition, create considerable electrical interference. Added to this is the fact that they are fabricated principally from steel, and the mass of metal absorbs a large part of the radio signal, making it absolutely necessary to employ a receiver that is extremely sensitive.

The antenna problem is also a difficult one, because the transmitting antenna is always very large, and the receiving antenna must be kept away from its vicinity. A radio receiver installed on a ship must have every part protected against the effects of moisture, as the salt sea air plays havoc with any part that is not properly protected and impregnated to stand extreme climatic conditions.

The photographs show one or two of the ships on which Scott Radio Receiver installations have been particularly successful. On the installation on Mr. W. K. Mellon's yacht, "The Vagabondia," it was necessary to build a special Teakwood cabinet to match the wood in the salon where the SCOTT ALLWAVE FIFTEEN is installed.

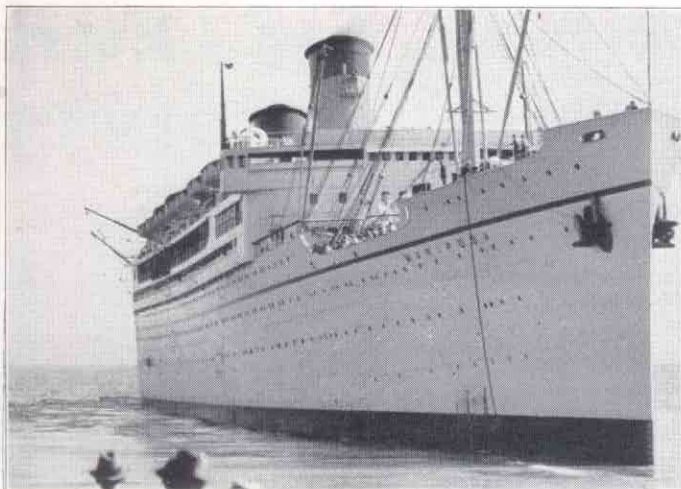
The console on Mr. Mandell's yacht, "The Buccaneer," also was built

specially from old English Oak, to match the wood used in the paneling of the Smoking Room.

On the yacht "Buccaneer" a SCOTT ALLWAVE FIFTEEN is installed in the Smoking Room, and from it are run six special lead covered lines to extra speakers located in the Drawing Room, Dining Room, Mr. Mandell's private stateroom, the Crew's Quarters and also to the Aft Deck, and on the Sun Deck. Each of the speakers has a separate volume control and switch so that the volume can be turned up or down, or switched off, and either one or all of the speakers can operate at the same time at full volume, if necessary.

The installation on the liner Mariposa was particularly successful. A special test was made every night of reception on the Mariposa, on a voyage between Sydney, Australia and Los Angeles, California. During this test, a special program transmitted each night from station WBBM in Chicago was picked up and reported on by cable each night direct from the liner.

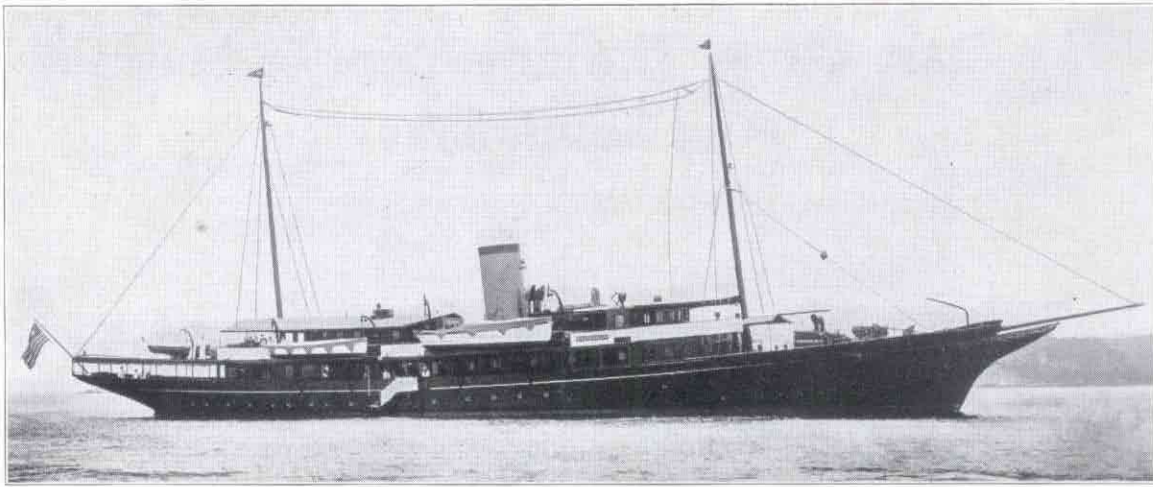

The Matson Liner "Mariposa."



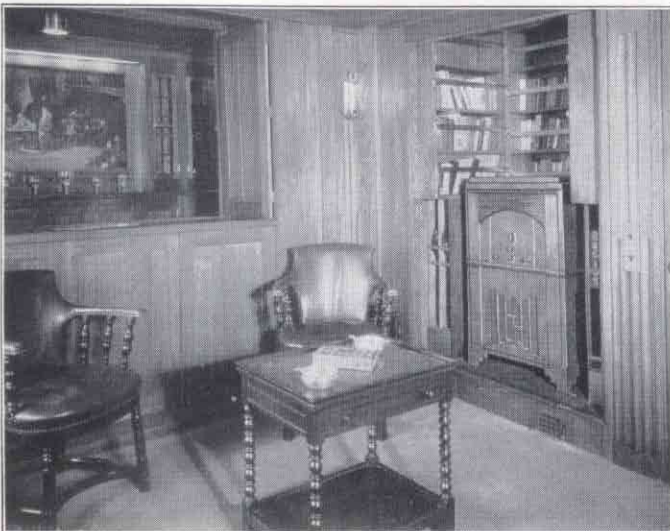
Scott Allwave on "Mariposa."

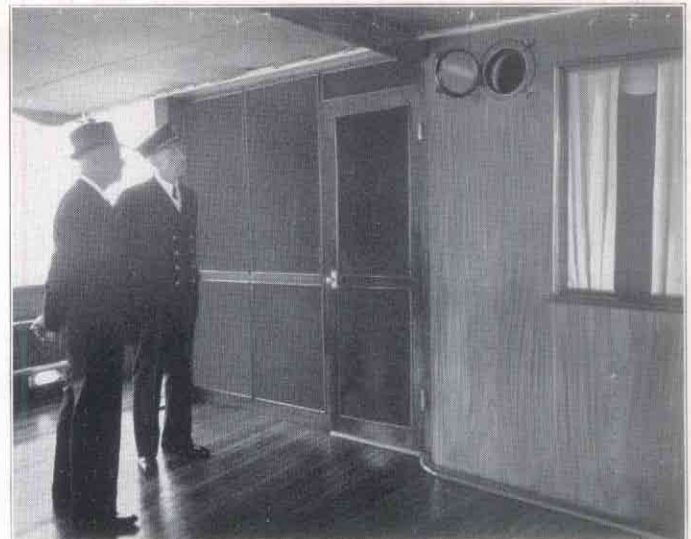
Smoking Room on "Buccaneer" with Scott Allwave Fifteen.

The Start Of A Thrilling Trip To Hawaii And South Seas



The Viva—Now Sailing in the South Seas.

As these lines are being written there is a small 50-foot yawl plowing its way thru the seas, enroute to the islands of the South Seas. Last June, Mr. and Mrs. Stephen Miller decided that they were tired of city life, where they had been living for the past ten years working to pay taxes, and fight the depression, and decided to get together what was left, and while still young enough enjoy life, leave the cities and see a little of the world.

Last year they began their search for a boat in Seattle, Washington, one that would go anywhere in the world safely, yet would not require a millionaire's purse to buy. After a six months' search, they bought the yawl "VIVA."

Mr. Miller studied Law at Michigan, Economics at Stamford, Literature at Harvard, and Philosophy at Heidelberg in Germany. For the past ten years he has been writing articles for a number of the leading American magazines, as well as several books.

Mrs. Miller not only is an authoress, but an expert photographer and artist, so that in future months you will probably notice articles describing the thrilling experiences of these two very adventurous people.

On board the boat with Mrs. Miller is a colored boy brought up in Mrs. Miller's home in the South, who was in the Navy during the War but has always wanted to go back to sea—a regular man "Friday."

Several months were spent completely fitting out the yawl for its long journey, and the picture on the opposite page shows the SCOTT receiver installed in the boat itself, here are some particulars: The yawl is 50 feet overall; has a 12-foot beam, 16½-foot draft; sail capacity 1000 sq. ft., heavy duty Marine 12-horse power engine for getting in and out of port.

The real start of the trip was made on July 4th, when they entered the annual Honolulu race. I don't believe I can do better than give you Mrs. Miller's own description of this trip, an account written from Honolulu.

"There is so much pleasant and otherwise that I could write about. It was discovered by the end of the first twenty-four hours, that we had nothing but three empty headed frightened "Rah Rah" boys from — University, not the least bit interested in racing and not sailors at all as they had been recommended. At the first blow they all became so downright scared, I thought we would have at least one burial at sea. So our sailing resolved itself to jig and jigger sailing, and that coupled with three days of almost total calm, ran our time to 17½ days, and we came in sixth. We should have made it in 14 to 15 days maximum, but out of it all has come an absolute confidence in our ship, and considerable confidence in making a "land fall." You haven't any idea how

good land looks to an amateur navigator after 17 days at sea.

"We also learned a great deal about human nature that should make the future easier. We would probably be hunting this dot in the pacific yet, if it were not for our SCOTT radio. One of these morons took my chronometer and stop watch, and was looking at it, without my knowledge, of course, until I heard a plank below, and went down to see both rolling around on the cabin floor. They were useless the rest of the trip (this was seven days out) and I found on our arrival here (Honolulu) that the staff and balance wheel of one was broken and the main spring in the other. This was just one of the many little vicissitudes of the trip.

"So our radio supplied our only time, and we were able to get the signals from Los Angeles all the way over. We got many stations all over the world, but I do not feel we have ever obtained the best out of the set due to the aerial. We had the set installed in San Diego by an expert radioman, to be sure it would be OK. On the way over the aerial, rigged from cross arms on the main mast, went down, due to the constant pressure of sailing before the wind. A bird cage aerial was rigged up and served to get the time signals, but we took it down as soon as we got them, to save it.

"But the aerial was all wrong in the beginning, in principle. It was strung up to cross arms parallel with the metal

stays, and the wire was about 1/16 of an inch thick. I tried to argue about it at the time, but I was assured I knew nothing about it; that it was being properly done.

"My brother from Texas, who was to have sailed with us, but who was called back six days before sailing, has now joined us here. We have carefully gone over your aerial instructions, and have consulted with the Engineer of the Globe Telegraph Company. He knew all about the Scott Receiver, and said it was the finest made.

"We secured 200 feet (I intend to use about 100 feet of aerial now) of stranded wire and all other necessary material, and tomorrow my brother is rigging the new aerial up the main mast itself. There is no metal on it as we are gaff rigged and only wooden hangers pass over it. I think it was marvelous to have received Los Angeles all the way over with the Jury aerial we had.

"We were the only ship that had a radio aboard that was working when it came in. Every skipper that was in the race has been aboard, as well as many others, looking at the set, and everybody says it is the finest made today.

"This is a beautiful country, but as you have been here yourself you know all about it. We find ourselves lingering much longer than we had planned. We have never enjoyed greater hospitality, and have been entertained by everyone.

"We are going to cruise to all of the islands here getting in some hunting and fishing. There is supposed to be deer, water buffalo, pigs, goats, plover and pheasants on the various islands, as well as big fish up to six hundred pounds.

"We are getting everything fixed up now and am preparing for our long trip to the Marquesas and Tahiti in the early part of October.—Best regards, Frances Miller."

Here at the Laboratory we receive many interesting letters which describe the thrilling experiences of owners of our receivers. Some of them are in use on little Islands which are only shown on the largest of maps, and letters from these owners tell the part radio plays in bringing the rest of the world to the homes in these lonely spots. But this trip on the little "VIVA" is something different, and I am sure there is hardly a reader of this issue of the News that does not envy them their good fortune, and wish them the best of luck and smooth sailing for the rest of their jour-

Letters from Every Part of the World Come to the Scott Laboratories

UNIQUE STAMP COLLECTION SHOWS INQUIRIES FOR SCOTT ALL-WAVE HAVE NOW BEEN RECEIVED FROM 167 FOREIGN COUNTRIES

The stamps illustrated on this page will not interest the veteran stamp collector, for all are issues in use at the present time, and interesting only from the standpoint that they have come to us on letters addressed to the Scott Laboratory from various parts of the world.

Some eighteen months ago we thought it would be interesting to start a collection of foreign stamps that were received in our own mail. Day by day the collection has steadily increased, until now it shows we have received inquiries from 167 different foreign countries and have so far shipped Scott Receivers to 143 of them.

LETTERS RECEIVED IN EVERY LANGUAGE

These stamps have come to us on letters written in every language. So large has our mail become from foreign lands, that it requires the services of two expert translators to translate the foreign letters into English, then, after the letter is written, to transcribe the reply. If a letter is written in French, it is answered in French; if in Italian, the answer goes back in Italian, or in whatever language the letter may be written.

So many of our inquiries now come from countries using French or Spanish, that all of our literature must be translated and printed in French and Spanish, as well as English. Where orders are received from countries using languages other than English, French or Spanish, a copy of our installation instructions is typewritten in the native language.

MANY FOREIGN VISITORS TO LABORATORY

So well known are Scott Receivers in foreign lands, that hardly a day passes during which we do not have a visitor from some foreign country who, if he does not speak English fluently, is instantly made to feel at home by one of our staff who talks to him in his native tongue.

When the Kahn of Hyderabad, one of India's greatest rulers and son of the richest man in the world, came to Chicago he was a visitor to the Laboratory on the same day he arrived here, and a SCOTT ALL-WAVE is now bringing to him in his palace in India, programs from all parts of the world. The Kahn knew all about SCOTT RECEIVERS before he arrived here, for he had listened to one frequently in a friend's palace in Bombay.

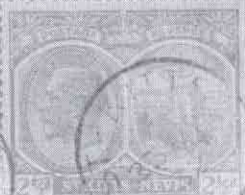
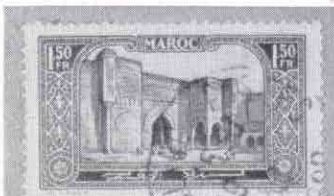

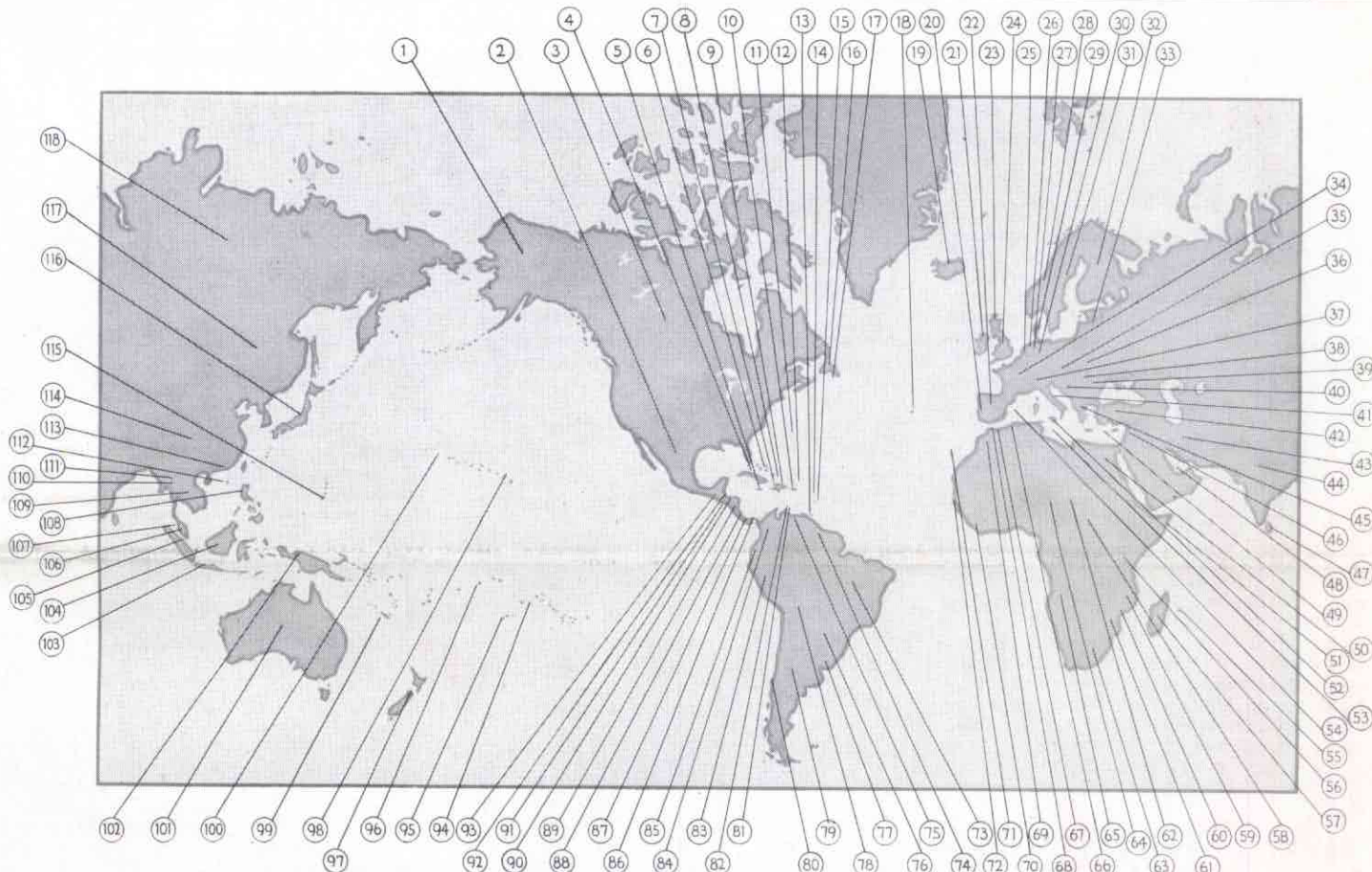
There are, at the present time, 206 countries now issuing their own postage stamps, and it is interesting to find that letters from 167 of these countries have been received at the Laboratories inquiring about them DURING THE PAST EIGHTEEN MONTHS ONLY.

HOW TO SPEND AN INTERESTING HALF HOUR

If you wish to spend an interesting half hour, get out a large map of the world, and run down the list on the opposite page, tracing out the location of the various countries. In the list I am giving the name of the country, together with the number of different stamps which have been received in our mail from that country.

The world wide reputation of SCOTT ALLWAVE RECEIVERS has been steadily built up in the years past by their ability to give regular consistent performance, year in and year out in all parts of the world. We have now shipped SCOTT RECEIVERS to all the countries shown in bold face type, while those shown in light type are countries from which we have not as yet received orders. 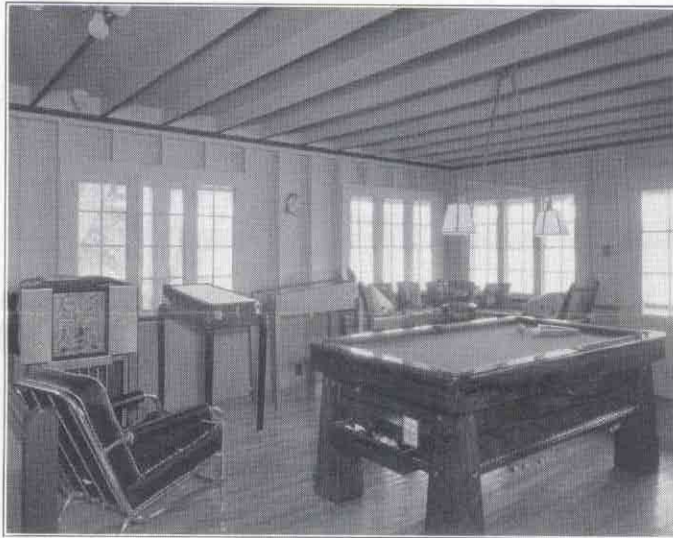
Rudy Vallee and His Connecticut Yankees Enjoy Reception from Scott Receivers.
