<u>ITALY</u> <u>Radio Bolzano,536kC</u>, has increased power to 20kW.. "<u>Radio</u> <u>Marconi</u>", was recently inaugurated at Bologna.

LITHUANIA A new 50-100kW station will be built to replace the present one broadcasting at Kaunas on 155kG.

Radio Ankara is now broadcasting on 153kC.

BROADCAST RECEPTION EXPERTS

In Warren C. Reicherdt and Evan B. Roberts, both of Massachusetts, IDA probably has two of the most expert and successful foreign BCB dx'ers on this continent. Lack of space prohibits a more detailed re view of their respective records, but collectively they hold 249 foreign BCB veri's from 154 separate stations. These include 86 TA's 36 Aussies, 16 Japs, 14 SA's and 2 from Hawaii.

TA veri's by countries are: Aus-tria (4),Czech (6),Danzig (1),Danmark (1), Estonia (1), Finland (1), France (14), Germany (13), Great Britain (1), Holland (1), Hungary-(4), Ireland (2), Italy (8), Latvia (2), Norway (1), Poland (4), Portugel (1), Spain (5), Sweden (10), Switzerland (2), USSR (1), Africa (3). The season just past saw Even Roberts taking the lead, with 135 and nearly 50 foreign BCB veri's reports still out. The highlights dx'ing were unhis season's of doubtedly the verifying of many smell Swedish stations, some having only 200 wetts. Reichardt, however was the first to verify one of these fine catches. The April G.C. for 1935 carries the story of his Helmstad, Sweden, veri'. Another fine one this season is LIP, a 50-watter from Australia.
