It is a desktop publishing program made by Manhattan Graphics Corporation (163 Varick Street, NY, NY 10013-9990), and it is absolutely superb -- quite the equal of programs costing quite a bit more. I recommend it very highly indeed. Now on to the first letters of the New Year...

From Cathy Turner (Yonkers, New York) comes a wonderful letter to start off with; she is the first to take me up on an invitation I issued to all NASWAers -- but read on. . .

I am not quite sure what to make of the following letter (actually, letter within a letter) which comes from *Roland Schulze* (Stuttgart, West Germany). His letter is in the form of a carbon copy, with my name and address typed afresh at the top of the first page. Obviously, this letter has been circulated more or less widely, and you may very possibly see it elsewhere:

I wish to share with you an experience which will serve as an alarm to other shortwave listeners and DXers. For almost 13 years of shortwave listening, receiving a QSL for my reception reports has always been fun and a thrill. But this time the QSLs and letters I received from some stations were rather a shock and a nuisance. I couldn't help but think that something 'fishy' was going on in some radio stations when it comes to QSL.

I have just received a very strange and alarming letter from Radio Uganda, a station alleged not to answer any reception reports of their home service in the tropical bands. I heard this station last October 7, 1986 at [Roland leaves a space here for the frequency which he does not supply; I note, however, that in December FRENDX Log Report B, he reports hearing Uganda on 4976khz {listed in RDI and ILG as a domestic service} - sgm]

\_\_\_khz and sent them a report with a personal letter, postcard, and one U.S. dollar for postage and enclosures. This was my very first time to insert a dollar in a letter. It is because an IRC is more expensive that the dollar here in West Germany; that is, one IRC costs DM2.20 and one dollar U.S. costs only DM1.98.

To my surprise came this handwritten two-page letter from the above mentioned station signed by Leopold B. Lubega with a photo of himself and his wife. His letter which is self-explanatory reads as follows [Roland has transcribed the letter into typescript, and has also enclosed a photocopy of the original -- sgm]:

Dear sir,

Your reception report dated 7 October 1986 was received here. I was very happy to learn that as a shortwave listener you got so interested in our station, it is also surprising that our Home Service could reach you so far away from us.

According to our station logging of that date, I would like to confirm to you that you listened to our station, Radio Uganda. This is a 10kW transmitter NEC make just installed. It uses a vertical incidence log-periodic antenna omnidirectional. This is achieved by arranging two similar antennæ in quadrature. It is made by TCI of America. This transmission is intended for Home Service, but we are encouraged that we can reach you.

Uganda is a small country as large as U.K. with a population of about 13 million people. This country popularly known as the source of the Pcarl of Africa is the source of River Nile and has the second largest fresh water lake in the world, Lake Victoria. The capitol is Kampala.

About myself. I am aged 44 years married with six children, I have many hobbies but the first is travelling. My problem is always finance. Most of my travels abroad are sponsored by Government on official duties. I have not visited many countries and I have not been to Germany but I hope one day I will.

Our country has gone through three terrible civil wars as you have heard, I believe. In September last year I had a chance to go to Japan for one month on official duties. During that period I saved money and bought a reconditioned can at about \$1500 U.S. Dollars. This was the family dream coming true; they were very happy. Unfortunately the car was destroyed during the last year so we remained a miserable family again. Here in Uganda it is very difficult for a civil servant to buy a car -- we are very poor.

When I read your letter I got the impression that you are a kind man and have enough money to sacrifice and assist a black family somewhere in Africa --Uganda. I and my wife have been thinking of a kind person through whom our dreams can come through like Mr. Roland Schulze to fund raise at least \$1500 U.S. Dollars and send it to:

to acknowledge receipt of that money to us at the address below:

P.O. Box 8226 Kampala

This man can send me another car F.O.B. I will try to raise shipping charges. Please let your friends have this appeal to fundraise for the same cause. I can tell you a car is very important in Uganda as we have no public buses or trains as in your country. One day I pray when you visit Uganda you will see for yourself. I intend to send you a full picture of my family of four daughters and two boys: Josephine, Cathy, Oliva, Sylvia, Daniel and William.

Here in Uganda we hear that the kindest people who give the biggest assistance are Germans from West because you are hard working and kind people. Please under any circumstances never send money to Uganda by Post -- it gets lost. I prefer that in any future correspondence you use my personal address of: P.O. Box 8226, Kampala.

Enclosed are photographs of myself and my wife. Sorry for inconveniencing you. We look forward to hear a happy answer from you and your family.

This letter is absurd! I really don't know whether to laugh or be angry to the v/s but I feel sad about it for this person doesn't know that he is destroying the image of his station.

What can you say about it? Has anyone received the same letter too? If so, then it will be fine if you share them for the benefit of us DXers so that we can find ways how to beat the v/s's 'tricks' and get a QSL.

Please print entirely my letter in the section of your club's magazine you think it is most appropriate. I can only say, watch out, v/s might put you into trouble.

I, for one, was absolutely and completely charmed by this whimsical and thoroughly amusing letter (the above is an *exact* transcription of the original): anger, in this instance, would be completely out of place. While not for a moment doubting the sincerity of Mr. Lubega's intentions, and realizing that he certainly did not intend to invoke humor (quite the reverse), there is a great deal of humor to be derived from an apppreciation of how we must appear to a large part of the world. Does anyone else have a similar experience to tell us about? Indeed, has Mr. Lubega contacted anyone else about his problem. Above all, *who* is MITOSHI MIYAZAKI? Finally, a nice letter from Log Report Distributing Editor John Henault (Abington, Massachusetts). He enclosed a letter from "SANI RADIO" which acknowledges a reception report from Harold Levison. Writes John: "I especially liked the writer's comments about station personnel using the transmitter for 'personal use' after regular transmission hours end." Here then is the letter, which gives some interesting insights into SW broadcasting:

Our frequency is 4755kHz, as licensed with the government of Honduras at geographical coordinates of 15 degrees and 16 minutes north and 83 degrees 46 minutes west in the town of Puerto Lempira, Gracias a Dios. Our call letters are HRRI and we are called "SANI RADIO" (which some listeners have confused as "Family Radio"). Our administrative and operations center is in the coastal town of La Ceiba, Honduras.

Facto Lempira, with a population of some 2,000 and, La Ceiba, with a population of around 60,000 are the departmental capitals of Gracias a Dios and Atlantida.

The name Sani comes from a Miskito Indian word for the "majao" vine which is native to the area and is an important source of string. Many years ago, the children of the area invented a game to imitate the missionary radio services whereby they made their own "radios" by connecting two dried coconut halves with a stretched piece of sani string. These were the first "sani radios" and since then the phrase has evolved into a slang expression for oral transmission of information like the English expression of "through the grapevine."

Our purpose is to provide bilingual (Spanish/Miskito) educational and public service broadcasts to the Miskito Indian population of the area. [¶] Our transmitter is a Sintronic SI-A-10 with 10kW of power and we use a simple 30 meter long dipole antenna at a height of 15 meters which is probably around 20 meters above sea level.

Presently, we are financed by funds from the United States Agency for International Development. [9] The International Rescue Committee was founded in 1933 during the rise of facsism in Germany. Since then, the IRC has been dedicated to assisting refugee and needy populations through educational and health programs around the world.

The grand opening of "Sani Radio" was on August 25, 1986 which went over very well, was broadcast live, and attended by more that 200 local persons, as well as guests from the Honduran Ministry of Education, Ministry of the Interior, and the United States AID mission.

Over the next year we hope to commercialize the station to some extent in order to cover basic operational costs as well as possibly to enter into a cooperative agreement for national educational broadcasting and will seek funding from private and public sectors both nationally and internationally. We are expressly prohibited from transmitting partisan political or religious programs.[¶] Our programming will be in Spanish, Miskito, and Sumo languages and initially will cover cultural, informative, and entertainment programs which will evolve rapidly to include extensive bilingual primary and adult education programs. The target audience for the educational programs will primarily be from refugee settlements incorporating some 40 village study centers in remote areas each being supplied with a radio, battery, solar panel, nails, blackboard, and student supplies.

We presently have a large staff of some 30 persons including educational script writers, producers, announcers, studio operators, and administrative personnel. [¶] Occasionally we have English transmissions in the evenings after normal signoff which gives myself and technical staff as well as friends the chance to enjoy radic broadcasting and tell about our project.[¶]Our hours of transmission in indigenous languages will be from 0600 to 1000, and 1600 to 2000 *local Honduran time*. Every Thursday evening from 1800 to 1900 we read international letters over the air. To date we have received letters from New Zealand, USA, Norway, England, Wales, Scotland, Hungary, Panama, Australia, Spain, France, Holland, India, Japan, Italy, El Sal vador, and Luxemburg. --- Thank you once again [signed], Edward A. Pfister, Pro gram Manager for Operations, International Rescue Committee

#### SUNDAY

- 1630-1640v: "P.O. Box 9516" (Radio France International). This is a regular feature of the Sunday edition of "Paris Calling Africa". It is a typical mailbag program with man and woman co-hosts reading letters from listeners in Africa, North and South America, and Asia. The length of the program varies from week to week and on the longer editions they answer listeners' questions. (11.705/15.315)
- OO25-OO35: "Calling DX-ers" (Spanish Foreign Radio). A good but not outstanding DX program featuring news items of interest to hams and DX-ers--such as the newly proposed television cable system in France or satellite communications--ending up with a few brief DX tips taken from Spanish or other European DX publications (9.630/6.125. Repeated at O125 and O525 on the same frequencies).

#### MONDAY

- 1240-1255: "Innovations" (Radio Australia). This program features the invention, development and marketing of new scientific innovations of Australian origin--including a satellite mapping system, a rock crusher used in gold mining and a portable work bench for the home hobbyist. Features interviews with the inventors. (9.580/6.060)
- 0045-0100: "This is America" (VOA). A fifteen minute look at some topic of relevance to life in America. Past programs have featured the opera in the United States, advertising, and special programs featuring the customs and traditions of Thanksgiving and Christmas. This program is in Special English. (9.650/5.995. Not on 9.455 or 6.135 which carry "Music USA: Standards" at this time).

#### TUESDAY

- 1145-1200: "Asia Now" (Radio Japan). The program is divided into two parts, the first part being brief news items from the Asian region, and the second being a single feature story relative to Asia, such as the 6th Party Congress in Hanoi or Japanes efforst to help underdeveloped Asian nations. Other areas of Asia than Japan figure prominently in the special feature segment (6.120).
- 2215-2230: "Kaleidescope" (Radio Berlin International). A potpourri of features about Germany (East) including interviews with German trade union members who are undergoing retraining, art ehibits, and German film festivals. Usually three or four segments per program, the content of which is widely varied.(6.125. Repeated at 2225 on the same frequency).

#### WEDNESDAY

- 1330-1135: "Martha in Beijing" (Radio Beijing). A trip around the People's Republic of China through the eyes of an American correspond featuring Chinese medicine, traditional and modern, and other topics of interest. (9.535/ Repeated at 1230 on 9.535/11.650 and at 0030 on 15.445)
- 1805-1830: "Pop Scene" (Radio Kuwait). A man and woman host introduce in chatty, informal style the pop hits of England and America.
- WEDNESDAY (contined)

largely rock oriented, but also playing some C & W and other pops, including soul and reggae (11.675).

#### THURSDAY


- 1120-1130: "China in Construction" (Radio Beijing). A program featuring the economic reforms now under way in China and the industrial and financial development that have resulted from the reforms instituted by D'eng and the new Chinese Communist Party. The emphasis is on the new China being built from the old. (9.535. Repeated at 1220 on 9.535/11.650 and at 0020 on 15.445).
- 0145-0150: "DX Microphone" (Radio Prague). A technically oriented DX program featuring a weekly talk on some technical subject related to DX-ing, such as propogation, aerials, or receivers. No DX tips. (5.930/7.345/9.740/11.990).

#### FRIDAY

- 0010-0030: "Top Priority" (Radio Moscow). This is a panel discussion show featuring an announcer and two regular weekly guests from Institute for North American Studies. Topics in the past have included Star Wars, the American decision to violate the SALT II agreement, and the implications of the November congressional elections in the United States. (7.115/7.310/5.915: Repeated at 0210 on the same frequencies).
- 0230-0245: "Chinese Old Songs" (Voice of Free China). This program features Chinese songs from the 30's, 40's, and 50's, some programs concentrating on a single songwriter or a singer, others including a mixed bag of singers and songwriters. Some of the music is quite melodious even if the lyrics are in Chinese, those these are sometimes translated by the program host, Lili Lil (5.985. Repeated at 0730 and 0330 on Saturday on the same frequency).

SATURDAY

- 1240-1255: "Focus"(Radio Austria). This program varies from week to week, some programs being devoted to music (largely classical) while others are devoted to political or social topics, such as the recent Austrian elections or a vacation spot in the Tyrol (15.320).
- 1300-1330: "Compass North" (Radio Finland International). Greetings. Since my last column in August, I've been relatively inactive as far as monitoring goes, except for my daily dose of BBC news. So I haven't noticed too much on the bands that's new and/or unusual.

**South Africa:** New, but not too unusual, is the South African Broadcasting Corporation's Raels S service, on a new frequency of 4880 kHz from 0400 UTC. I've also heard it at around 2130 UTC. It was noted by Al Quagheri in Glenn Hauser's Listener's Notebook (October) that the former frequency, 3250 kHz, has been dropped. I assume Radio 5 is still on 7170 kHz from 0520 UTC, but I haven't heard it there. Anyway, Radio 5 is definitely a departure from what one usually hears on the rather stuffy Radio RSA external service. The programming is targeted at teenagers and young adults, and consists mainly of music. It is broadcast on 8 medium wave stations throughout South Africa and relayed on shortwave. Besides the music, which is mostly pop, I love the commercials. Cigarette advertisements are not prohibited in broadcasting in South Africa, and commercials are common for brands such as 'Paul Revere' cigarettes. You can also hear local merchant advertisements, ("Early Bird TV Repair" and such), as well commercials in local languages.

While we're down on 60 meters. I should note that **Racis RBA**'s 4990 kHz transmission at 0300 UTC has been audible here, but not nearly as well as on the higher bands so I've yet to recommend this frequency to anyone. Also, 4835 kHz has supposedly been dropped. This frequency was for the SABC National Service, **Bpringlok Racis**. This station was my first QSL for 60 meters, as well as for the African continent, so its being dropped strikes a nostalgic chord for me. I wonder if anyone has heard the service on its higher frequencies, 9695 & 11790 kHz.

HCJB: Saludes Amiges, HCJB's "program of international friendship" will re-broadcast its ANARC special recorded live last July at the ANARC convention in Montreal. Host Ken MacHarg was joined by at the ANARL convention in Flortreal. Host Ken macharg was joined by HCJB personality John Beck in interviewing various guests, including Arthur Cushen, lan McFarland, WRTH editor Jens Frost, and a number of others attending the convention. The re-broadcast can be heard on Sunday, February I 1987 (0800 UTC on 11925, 9745, and 6130 kHz; and 1900 UTC on 17790, 15270, and 11740 kHz); and on Wednesday February 4, 1987 (0200 UTC on 9870 and 6230 kHz; and 0630 UTC on 9870, 1970 the second seco 6230, and 11910 kHz). Saludos Amigos can be heard each week on these same days and times. Usual programming consists of inspirational music, letters, and various features and topics. The address for the is: Saludos Amigos, HCJB, show 1345. Box Jeffersonville, Indiana 47131.

**BBC:** The World Service's Popular Music Organizer Dave Tate has recently begun a new series called MultiProble. This show has been in the works since early 1986, and features three different editions every week, each with a different host. MultiProble 1 is hosted by Richard Allinson. It airs on Mondays at 1830 and 2330 UTC, and on Tuesdays at 1215 UTC. Richard's show specializes in new releases, studio guests, music news, and competitions and guizes. MultiProble 2, on Wednesdays at 1830 and 2330 UTC, and Thursdays at 1215 UTC. features Paul Burnett of the BBC's Top 20 program. This edition goes a bit further, covering the British Top 40 chart. The final edition called, of course, MultiProble 3 is devoted to "interviews with British's newest young bands, a look at pop films and books, a word about fashions in music and style." The host of this edition is Sarah Ward, otherwise known for her show, Sarah and Company. According to London Calling, the aim of the show is to "streamlin the World Service's popular music programming and, it is hoped, nicel compliment the zany antics of Dave Lee Travis and A Jolly Good Show; Rock Salad hosted by the irrepressible Tommy Vance; Ton Myatt and Sandi Jones and their Sunday request shows; not to mentio *Counterpoint* with former Manfred Mann star Paul Jones and Bo Holness with **Anything Goes**." I think this is a really good concept From what I've heard of the show so far, I think it will go on t become one of the more popular pop-music programs offered by th BBC.



#### THE COMPLETE HANDBOOK OF RADIO RECEIVERS & TRANSMITTERS By Joseph J. Carr

If you want to understand you rig and do real troubleshooting and repair you must add this book to your collection. Originally published in two volumes, it is now available bound in a single edition. It covers all areas of radio theory, taking the reader through the guts of some of the most popular equipment in use today. This book will show you the actual mechanics of using test gear and technique to bring your tired and broken gear into shape. Carr makes some very sticky subjects understandable to the rank novice. If you run out to your local book dealer and force him to dig through Books In Frint and order all these titles, and if you really give them a good read, you will find yourself able to attack all manner of radio difficulties. In using these books it helps to remember that old engineering axiom that a large problem is often best solved by breaking it down into its component smaller problems. Good turn of a phrase because, very often, "components" are the problem in electronics. So you really need to acquire at least one more book.

#### SEMICONDUCTOR REPLACEMENT GUIDE By Radio Shack

Every now and then a part will go PHHFFFFIIITIT!!! When this happens, Murphy's Law always indicates that the original replacement is only available from a camel trader in Swaziland. Enter the Semiconductor Replacement Guide. Actually you can use anybody's guide but Radio Shack's is the easiest to get your hands on. After you have used the guide a few times you will discover you can cross reference not just for RS parts but most any semiconductor you will need. Also if you are interested in tube gear you will need to scour the hamfests for an old Tube Substitution Guide for the same reasons. Radio Shack Catalog #276-4009

Another good source of cheap data is to send for all those free catalogs in the back of radio magazines. By glancing over component catalogs, you will get a feel for what is available and how to go about getting the parts you need with the best speed and service. Not such a bad idea when your Humpler MNKB receiver goes dim in the middle of a dead of winter DX session.

#### One final point...

If you have not written the manufacturer of your receiver to obtain the factory repair manual you are a very silly person. Even if you never intend to lift the covers of your rig yourself you will find this to be a useful document to have around when repair and alignment does become necessary. If you do intend to repair or modify your equipment you will find such documents invaluable. If your gear is older and out of production you can obtain schematics and service data through Howard W. Sams PHOTOFACTS system. Ask your local TV repair supplier about how to get Photofacts.

Well there you have it folks. Armed with this knowledge you will rival even the great Baba Ram Grid Bias in radio information.

We have been running a little short on receiver reviews folks so lets get writing out there. Keep those cards and letters coming folks.

# Computer Corner

Welcome to 1987! To get the year started, our first contribution comes from none other than the former editor of Computer Corner, Bill Cole. So, without 'urther delay, here is;

#### The ANARC BBS

### A Brief History by Bill Cole

The origins of the ANARC BBS can be traced to December 1984. Bill Krause of the ANARC Computer Information Committee and I had several conversations about the value of a BBS for making DX information available on a timely basis. We decided to try to put a shortwave BBS on-line and over the next few months we pried to find some software that would meet our needs.

By May of 1985 we hadn't found any software that we liked. It was at that point I decided that the only way to have the BBS we wanted was to write it hyself. Fortunately. Bill had collected a couple of disks full of public domain elecommunications software. One of the programs, The CHIPS BBS, held promise. Ifter a thorough rewrite, which reduced the program size by 15% but retained all features, something called the FRENDX BBS emerged in early July 1985. Bill and I fecided that we were far enough along to exhibit the BBS at ANARCON 85. As can be deduced from the name, the features of the board loosely followed FRENDX with og Reports A-D. Technical Topics, USL Reports, and Computer Corner message bases. The exhibit was a success, however, the software was far from perfect. le spent the first hour of the exhibit working out a bug discovered at the last inute.

Encouraged by the enthusiasm generated, especially by George Wood of Radio Weden International, Bill set September 1, 1985 as the target on-line date for a UBS sponsored by the ANARC Computer Information Committee. The board was to be wamed The ANARC Shortwave BBS and would use the, hopefully, debugged FRENDX BBS oftware. The original BBS did not facilitate the Up or Downloading of text or rogram files. We decided, mistakenly as it turned out. that these features were eccessary for the success of the board. I spent most of my free time in the conth of August adding and trying to debug an Up/Download feature.

Within a week of the target date, Bill Krause had the BBS on-line. The riginal board was operated using a Commodore 64, 1702 Monitor, Commodore 1650 Kodem, C-Itoh printer and two Commodore 1541 drives for about 340k of storage. Infortunately, there were still a few hidden 'bugs' in the program. Our friend, word, developed an uncanny knack of finding them. Every time poor George alled from Sweden, the board would lock-up or crash.

By the end of November 1985, the ANARC BBS had logged a substantial number f callers. We were using a password access system and had over 50 registered sers. We also had sufficient user feedback to begin to evaluate the system. Ince the software bugs were worked out, the major criticism was one of speed. lost of our users called long distance and were mindful of charges. Several rogram modifications brought speed increases. We decided that we could save urther time by doing away with passwords and becoming an open board. This was a cod decision. With only one exception, there has not been any trouble with iving all callers full immediate access to the board. Two other areas needing modification were discovered. For some unknown reason, most users were more interested in reading from the board than in posting messages on the board. The other being that only one user had downloaded from the library and no one had uploaded to the library. To correct the first, we arranged to carry Radio Nederland's Programme News and RCI's Program Previews. Later, RSI's Sweden Calling DXers was added and these features were incorporated into the International Forum. These were an immediate success drawing much user attention. We took a long hard look at the Up/Download feature since it utilized one whole disk drive and received no use. The decision was made that it must go and in its place the North American Database was created.

The last major change to the board came in February and March of 1986. By that time it had outgrown the 340k of storage available in two 1541 drives. The system was upgraded to a Commodore 128 with two 1571 drives each containing 340k thereby doubling the capacity of the system. The faster speed of the 128 with its enhanced basic also led to a major program rewrite.

At this time, the ANARC BBS operates in the 300/300 baud, 8 bit, no parity, full duplex protocol. The ANARC BBS is an open board; a user does NDT meed a password to get on-line and everyone has full access to the board. Since it went on-line the BPS has logged over 1300 callers. Use has gradually built up and over 150 calls per month are now being taken.

As regular features of the International Forum, the ANARC BBS carries Radio Nederland's monthly bulletin, Programme News; Radio Canada International's Program Previews and the electronic version of Radio Sweden International's, Sweden Calling DXers. The European DX Council's (EDXC) bulletin is also featured. We have recently made an inquiry to HCJB about the availability of advanced program informaton.

For our users, the system has available 12 public Bulletin Boards as well as private E-Mail. Public Bulletin Boards include:

1. Mail Box, the main message center.

- 2. Help-Me, for DXers with questions and problems.
- 3. Data-Update, for posting corrections & additions to the database.
- 4. Log Report A, for loggings & DX tips, 2000-4899 kHz.
- 5. Log Report B, for loggings & DX tips, 4900-6199 kHz.
- 6. Log Report C, for loggings & DX tips, 6200-11699 kHz.
- 7. Log Report D, for loggings & DX tips, 11700 and above.
- 8. QSL Reports, latest QSL information.
- 9. Computer Corner, latest computer info. and tips.
- 10. Technical Topics, receiver reviews & other tech-info.
- 11. Buy & Sell, all the GOOD BUYS.
- 12. Club News, users may post their radio club's news.

The ANARC BBS has features not found in all radio specialty bulletin boards. The first is the NORTH AMERICAN DATABASE which contains schedules for stations broadcasting to North America in English. Information contained in the database includes: station name & location, times on the air, frequencies, target areas and days heard. The North Ammerican Database is compiled from Dan Ferguson's GUIDE TO ENGLISH SHORTWAVE BROADCASTS. Dan will shortly be supporting the BBS with interim updates to increase the database accuracy.

The second feature, which is unique to the ANARC BBS, is the ability to make propagation predictions for any station in the database. Users have access to routines that give: solar flux & sunspot numbers, A & Boulder K indices, solar & geomagnetic activity, station distance & bearing, sunrise & sunset times for the user's & station's locations as well as the times of darkness path to the station. In addition, the user can access a routine to predict the LUF, MUF & HPF for the 24 hour period. The ANARC BBS is online 24 hours per day at 1-217-368-3124. We welcome user feedback so that we can continue to improve the service. Users can leave their feedback on the FEEDBACK section of the BBS or by writing to us at: Bill Ktause;, ANARC SW BBS; 401 E. # ELIGIBILITY

The 1987 DX Championship is open to all DXers residing in North America (as defined by the country list of the North American Shortwave Association (NASWA)). Members of the NADXC Administrative Committee and the judges are excluded from participation.

### LISTENING PERIOD

The contest listening period will commence at 0000 UTC on March 14, (Friday evening local time) and end at 0000 UTC on March 16 (Sunday evening local time). The DXer can choose any continuous or noncontinuous 24 hours within the contest listening period. Any portion of a one-hour period counts as a full hour, therefore the period 2150 to 2210 UTC counts as two hours. Contestants should submit a summary of time periods listened.

# PRIZES

Trophies will be awarded to the Top 3 finishers in the DX Championships. All entrants will receive a participation certificate indicating that they competed in the 1987 North American DX Championship. The certificates for the Top 20 will have their place of finish in the DX Championships indicated on their certificates by Numero Uno's resident artistic designer-John Herkimer.

## SCORING

Contestants are to log as many stations as possible from as many countries as possible within the prescribed listening period. A station is a shortwave broadcaster whose transmissions are intended for reception by the general public. Each transmitter site of a broadcasting organization will count as a separate station. Different services of the same broadcast organization do not count as separate stations. Transmissions of a single broadcast organization on various frequencies may only be counted once. The use of multiple frequencies does not create as many new stations as frequencies used. For country counting and station counting purposes, the country list of the North American Shortwave Association (45 Wildflower Road, Levittown, PA 19057) will be the sole criterion.

The 1987 NADXC will utilize the 31-49-60 meter bands. These bands are defined for contest purposes as follows:

31 meter band = 9.4 to 10.0 MHZ 49 meter band = 5.9 to 6.3 MHZ 60 meter band = 4.7 to 5.2 MHZ

Participants are required to submit a running log to include country, station, frequency, time, date, SINPO, and the basis of station identification (i.e. spoken ID, interval signal, language, program, known // frequency checked, etc.)

For contest purposes, all clandestine stations and hobby pirate transmissions will be considered one "country". The clandestine/pirate "country" will not count for the "Continental Achievements". Although Antarctica counts for country counting purposes, it will not count for the "Continental Achievements".

Each contestant is required to total his own entry and provide a summary of the number of countries, stations, and continents claimed to support the point totals. Logs will be judged on accuracy, completeness and neatness. If the judges cannot read a log, that log will not be counted for scoring purposes. The decision of the judges is final.

## FEES

A small administrative fee of \$2.00 plus a business size SASE must be provided for each contest entry. All entries must be postmarked by Monday, March 30, 1986 and sent to:

Thanks to Dan Robertson for a tip on an undocumented feature of the NRD-525. Sometime this past summer, JFC modified the RUN button to togole the main tuning knob between a rate of 2 kHz and 20 kHz per revolution. It also affects the frequency stepping increments of the UF and DOWN arrow keys. This was in resonnse to the initial criticism that the tuning rate was too slow. Four weeks later. Media Network; announced this change and said that on the latest units shipped, the word "improved" has been added to the JKC label. The manual should reflect this addition. If you bought an NRD-525 in the last few months, check it out. My unit, shipped in late August, has the improvement... but no label change.

Other notes: Radio Tirana sent along a program schedule in early December listing times, target areas, and meter bands... but no exact frequencies. The fit between what I received and the frequency information in Hauser's column last month matches up well, based upon what I have checked so far. Some listings have been dropped because I cannot determine by listening if the schedules are still good. This includes Irag and Nigeria on 15120 kHz. There is nothing on that frequency from 1900 UTC.on... until the VDA signs on at 2130 UTC with Creole to the Caribbean. Where did Irag and Nigeria move to? SCDX recently reported that Belgium changed from 5910 to 5900 for its 0030 UTC broadcast and RAI. Italy, retimed its English from 0100-20 to 0120-40, but on December 25 Belgium is still on 5910 and RAI still runs English at 0100 UTC. I found DX shows from Argentina on Thursdays and Fridays; they are now included in the list.

I wonder how many of you noticed Radio Havana on the morning of November 18th tearing up 31m. At 1200 I was trying to listen to Radio Beijing on 9535 kHz, and severe inteference around 9533 iHz limited reception. I finally traced it to Havana on 9550, radiating spurs plus-and-minus 17 kHz.

Jonathan Marks of Radio Nederland interviewed Jeff White of Radio Discovery, Santo Domingo, on November 27's Media Network. Jeff indicated Radio Discovery was considering a new schedule effective December 2: 0000-0400 Tue-Sat on 6245 khz, 1800-2400 Sat-Sun on 19045 HZ with programming in both English and Spanish. Transmitter power is 1 kw. I haven't heard it vet...

I have put up a BBS and you are welcome to use it. The board supports public and private messaging and conferencing. The first time caller can read bulletins, read and write messages, list files available for download, and upload files. For now, downloading files and joining conferences are only permitted after the security level is changed, usually within 24 hours. Leave a Comment to request the security level change. Aside from text files, the BBS's files are oriented to the IBM PC, compatibles and clones.

If you would like to arrange a schedule on HF. I am back in operation on the low bands. Drop we a note electronically or via the USPO.
