Targeted Listening

One of the biggest challenges to program listeners is choosing what to listen to. Program and frequency guides help one make a more informed choice, but program listening does require one to prioritize one's listening effort. One technique I use is Targeting. By Targeting I mean the practice of selecting a broadcast service from a part of the world often in the news. The political turmoil in Japan coupled with strained US-Japan relations provides plenty of news fodder, and I have become a regular time-shifted listener to Radio Japan News Round.

Radio Japan News Round airs for 30 minutes weekdays at 1100 UTC on 6120 kHz (RCI relay) for Eastern North America. with transmitters in Japan also used. Aside from recent general propagation disturbances. 6120 kHz is rocking chair quality here in Eastern Pennsylvania. The program format features specific segments. After a small portion of cultural chatter on such matters as the weather and a bit of culture, the program kicks in with News, with headlines from around the world. Then comes Japan Undate, which focuses on domestic Japanese news of international interest. This has been the most interesting segment of late with the continuing political saga. Business and economic news closes out this segment. Then follows News Focus which looks at a single international news item for approximately five minutes. Asia Scene then takes a quick look at two or three stories from elsewhere in Asia: most days then feature Topic Of The Day, again a single issue segment on a lighter topic such as entertainment or culture. A recap of news headlines and a tidbit of cultural repartee between the program hosts closes out the program. About the only thing missing I would particularly enjoy is a press review of headline and editorial content from leading Japanese daily newspapers.

The 1100 UTC timing places News Round in the portion of my morning routine when I'm away from the radio. Thus, I record the program for the commute to the office or the next morning's exercise routine.

Radio New Zealand International

I have just received an updated schedule from Adrian Sainsbury, RNZI Frequency Manager. Some highlights:

0500 Weekdays on 11900 kHz: Checkpoint, a current affairs program; 0630 weekdays, Ears, a program for young people. 1050 Weekdays on 6100 kHz: Asia Pacific Business Report. 0910 alternate Thursdays on 6100 kHz: Mailbox, RNZI's listener feedback program. There are other airings in addition to these, but these should propagate best to North America.

Music Tip

If you're looking for a daily music fix, John Figliozzi suggests Radio Austria International's 1230 UTC broadcast easily heard on 13730 kHz. This is Radio Austria International's German language "B" program. There are a few German language announcements, but most of the program is music. Various music types are featured.

BBC World Service Highlights

There is word of upcoming service cuts at the BBC that will impact North America more than most areas. The most probable approach will be the reduction in parallel frequency use. The BBC is emphasizing local placement of its marquee programs (Newshour, Newsdesk) on public radio stations. When you inspect the highlights shown below, you'll see a greater percentage of programs are

presented a total of four times, versus the three-time presentation typical of the recent past.

As for May program highlights, the Shakespeare season continues. Tales of travel are also subjects for several features.

Shake:peare Today In addition to last month's highlights:

Tuesday, May 11, 2330 UTC: Omnibus includes the feature What Shakespeare Knew, looking at the intellectual and scientific background of the period, along with perspectives on politics and religion. Omnibus is a 30-minute feature with repeats Wednesdays 1001 and 1930, and Thursdays 0230.

Thurscays, beginning May 12th, 2330: The Reduced Shakespeare Radio Show is a six-pa-t 30-minute series with a novel interpretation of Shakespeare by America's Reduced Shakespeare Company. The Los Angeles Herald has described the RSC as "Shake speare as written by 'Readers' Digest', acted by Monty Python and performed at the speed of the minute waltz." First airing Wednesdays 1530; also repeated Thursdays 1030.

Fridays, beginning May 20th, 1215: Shakespeare On Trial is a three-part 30-mir ute feature looking at the playwright's reputation from a global and contemporary point of view. Is Shakespeare the greatest writer who ever lived, or does his standing simply reflect the worldwide stature of the English language. First airing Fridays 0730, also repeated Fridays 1930.

Science and Technology

Mondays beginning May 16, 0015: A Step Too Far is a six-part 15-minute series with a philosophical bent. The program examines six major scientific and technological advances and the disasters which followed. What happens when we try to go a step too far, when a desire to innovate and improve leads to disaster? First airing Sundays 0445; also repeated Mondays 1445 and Wednesdays 0815.

Monday, May 16th, 0101: Mind And Body is a single 45-minute program exploring the increasing evidence that mental health leads to physical health—normally one considers the reverse to be true. Can we become physically fit by becoming mentally fit? First airing Saturday May 14th 1901; repeated Monday 1515.

Music and The Arts

Mondays beginning May 16th, 0145: Crossing The Border is a six-part 15-minute series exploring the merging of serious and popular music. This includes the mixing of music styles across cultures. Does this mean a comeback for classical, or its demise as we know it? First airing Sundays 0715; also repeated Tuesdays 1445.

Mondays beginning May 16th, 2215: Duke Ellington—Jazz Genius is a four-part 30-minute series tracing Ellington's career from his late 1920s radio shows at Harlem's Cotton Club through his most successful and prolific period to his continuing influence today. Repeated Tuesdays 0630, Wednesdays 1615, Fridays 1030.

Sundays, 0101: Play Of The Week highlights: May 15, Blithe Spirit: Noel Coward's most successful play features a novelist, a spiritualist, a dead first wife and a murder plot. May 22, Marvelous Party chronicles the relationship between Noel Coward and collaborator Esme Wynne, spiced by Wynne's renouncing of the stage and her calling as a Christian Scientist. May 29, Racing Demon begins at 0030 and details the struggles of four Anglican clergymen in south London. This adaptation features a reprise of Oliver Ford Davies' award-winning performance as the Reverend Lionel Espy. Play Of The Week is repeated at 1201 and 1901 with May 29th times 30 minutes earlier.

Light Entertainment

Tuesday, May 24th, 0230: Masterbrain brings back the two sets of 1993 winners and runners-up of radio's Brain Of Britain and television's Mastermind. The first portion of the contest uses Brain Of Britain rules, and the second portion Mastermind rules in which each contestant has two minutes to

answer questions on a specialist subject of his or her choice. First airing Sunday 2030; also repeated Monday 1215 and 1715. Masterbrain is a prelude to the return of...

Tuesdays, beginning May 31st, 0230: Brain Of Britain returns for a new 17-week season as one of the Beeb's most popular programs. For the uninitiated, Brain Of Britain is a general knowledge quiz show. First airing Sunday 2030; also repeated Monday 1215 and 1715.

News and Feature Programs

Thursdays 2215: Network UK is a weekly 30-minute program on issues and events affecting the lives of the people of the UK. There's a mix of serious issues and cultural topics, often spiced with debate from multiple perspectives. The program originates from the various states of the UK on a rotating basis, but a given week's program normally includes items from all over the UK. First airs Thursdays 0730 and 1615.

Sundays beginning May 8th, 2330: Extraordinary And Plenipotentiary is a three-part 30-minute series examining the international network of embassies and how they evolved and became established. The use and abuse of diplomatic privileges and responsibilities are explored. Where do the traditional skills of a diplomat fit in with today's world? First airing Sundays 1401; also repeated Mondays 0630 and 1001.

Sundays beginning May 1st, 0230: Discursive Excursions is a three-part 30-minute program interviewing seasoned travelers about their exploits and how they reacted to extreme conditions. The May 8th programinterviews polar travelers Sir Vivian Fuchs, Sir Alexander Glen, and others regarding the mental and physical problems they have encountered at the ends of the earth. The May 15th program interviews desert travelers Sir Laurens Van Der Post, Wilfred Thesiger, and others on the discomforts and high points of their Saharan and Arabian desert travels. Repeated Sunday 1615, Monday 0730, and Wednesday, 2215.

Sunday, May 22nd, 0230: Cannabis—Weed Or Wonderdrug? is a single 30-minute program contrasting marijuana's status as a mind-altering drug and as a treatment for such diseases as AIDS, multiple sclerosis, and other ailments. As hemp, cannabis has commercial value as a source of fuel, paper, and fabric. This comparison overlays the growing movement to decriminalize marijuanain a number of developed countries. Repeated Sunday 1615, Monday 0730, and Wednesday, 2215.

Saturdays beginning May 28th, 0015: Marriage And The Throne is a three-part 15-minute series recounting three dramatic stories of marriage and divorce from the the history of the British royal family. The first program looks at the divorce of George IV and Queen Caroline. When George became king in 1820, he wanted a divorce, and the government worked to make sure Caroline's reputation was more scandalous than George's. The current royal family difficulties pale by comparison, promises the BBC. Repeated Mondays 1930 and Tuesdays 0915.

Sports

Mondays, beginning May 16th, 0445: All The World's A Football Pitch is a five-part 15-minute series exploring the social and economic background to soccer on the eve of World Cup '94. English failure, Italian politics, and Brazilian corruption are reflected in the performance of their respective teams. First airing Sundays 2015; also repeated Mondays 0915.

Coming Up...

Thanks to John Carson Jr. of Norman, Oklahoma, I have a copy of the detailed Radio Budapest schedule through June 1994. Several interesting programs—I'll be sampling them in May and reporting on them in the June Journal. Until then.

HOWDY!

Well, here's another fine mess l've got myself into, Stanley. A hearty hello to my old radio pals who broke into hives upon seeing my name atop the masthead. Felicitations also to the rest of you, friends and enemies I've yet to make. Here's the personal poop: I'm 44, a most-of-the-time writer and a part-time musician. Been in the hobby since 1962, not counting occasional sabbaticals coinciding with rampant hormone attacks. I'm also imateur callsign NN2U, and can sometimes be heard working CW (all bands), buzzing the ANARC net (Sundays 10 am Eastern 7240 upper), and generally annoying the residents of 3910L. I've been interested in African DX for a long time, and edited a SPEEDX column about same to stave off depression during the Reagan-Bush years. Consider yourselves warned: I steadfastly refuse to take this hobby too seriously. Depending on how tired or irritated l am when I sit down to put this column together, my overall tone may sway from highly opinionated to extraordinarily silly. Please bear with me, or complain to the management.

Now, at the risk of boring you pros to tears, here's a how-to for the Africa-deprived.

DOES AFRICA REALLY EXIST ON SHORTWAVE?

Of course it does, but in a form not at all like Radio Nederland or the BBC et al. There is not a single African country who points their antennas at the U.S., fires up their transmitters during our evenings, and broadcasts a program in English to North America (the exception is Egypt, but since their audio sounds like a boom box with its speakers ripped to shreds, it doesn't count).

What's their problem? Sheesh, where do I begin?

For whatever reasons, Africa is overall a financially unsound, politically unstable continent. A whole lot of Africans don't make in a month what it cost you to join NASWA. With hands full trying simply to feed, clothe and educate themselves, few governments or individuals have the time, resources, or inclination to consider external broadcasting.

Generally what shortwave exists in Africa is there for domestic consumption: to cover large tracts beyond the reach of mediumwave and FM signals. In many cases, these shortwave transmitters (and associated antennas) are leftovers from the days of colonial rule. After 30+ years of continuous service in hostile physical environments, much of this equipment is simply beat to death, and its operators have neither the money nor technical wherewithal to refurbish or replace. Second, third and fourth transmitters have been cannibalized just to keep one transmitter working (the exact situation for Radio Nigeria). When foreign aid allows them to overhaul their broadcasting infrastructures, broadcasters inevitably install small and relatively inexpensive FM relays, keep shortwave only to fill

in voids in domestic coverage.

What that leaves you - the SWL/DX'er - with is a ragtag aggregation of ill-maintained, frequency-wandering, underpowered, undermodulated signals to try hearing. Nearly everything easily heard from Africa - relays of the BBC, VOA, RFI, etc. - can be better heard from other sites, and has little to offer by way of authentic African flavor. Which leads us to...

THE TROPICAL BANDS

Domestic services of African shortwavers operate from 3200-3400 kHz and 4770-5100 kHz (the so-called Tropical Bands). Signals in these bands propagate long distances mainly over darkness paths, i.e. the sun should be down in both the originating country and wherever you are. But it ain't that easy.

The sun rises in East Africa at around 0100-0200 UTC, and in Western Africa as late as 0500 UTC.



Lucky for us, those are nighttime hours for most of North America. If you're having trouble envisioning this, check out Figure 1 (guaranteed not to scale). The shaded area indicates nighttime.

Under ideal propagation

conditions, this means that anyone in the eastern 2/3 of North America should be able to hear most Tropical Band Africans...presuming they're on the air!

Africans signing on at 0300 include Botswana, Burundi, Comoros, Djibouti, Lesotho, Madagascar, Malawi, Mozambique, Rwanda (in better times), Sudan, Tanzania-Zanzibar, Uganda, and Zaire. Zambia hits the air around 0245, with Ethiopia on at around 0325



This brings us to 0400 UTC. Take a gander at Figure 2.

By now, all of North America is in darkness, along with the western half of Africa. What a coincidence. 0400 is when you'll (hopefully) find Congo, Cote d'Ivoire, Nigeria and Somalia signing on for the day. At 0430, they're joined by Cameroon, the Central African Republic, Chad and Niger.



Hmmnm. In Figure 3, we Americans are completely in the dark (1s usual...) and Africa west of Benin is in the hour before daybreak. This is when Angola, Benin, Chad (Mondou) and Gabon sign on. A half hour later, look for Burkina Faso, Ghana and Togo.



By 0600, the only parts of Africa not in daylight are from Senegal through Liberia. Signing on at 0600 are Liberia, Mali, Senegal and Sierra Leone, with Mauritania sleeping late and coming on at 0630.

This is all fine and dandy for insomniacs. What if I'm asleep by 0300-0600+...what do I get to hear?

Uh...you can try for Kenya and Madagascar at 0200. Or leave work early and hear VOA and BBC relays. But generally, if you listen only between 0000-0300, you'll hear nary a peep from Africa. In the immortal words of Bruce Hornsby, "that's just the way it is.

There's lots more to discuss when it comes to hearing real African DX. Were I to lay it all out now, there'd be no room left for the JOURNAL's other knowledgeable and noble editors to show you their stuff. Stay tuned.

AROUND THE HORN...

CAMEROON: Radio Garoua currently broadcasts news in English at 05, 14, 18 and 21 hours (Yaounde national news), and at 1330 (Garoua regional news). (BBCM). Freq's as per WRTH (AQ).

GABON: RFI and Africa No. 1 are currently wrestling over contract renewal for the use of Africa No 1. ANO contends the lower rate demanded by RFI endangers its survival, while RFI is holding out for "a better rate for the French taxpayer." Meanwhile, here's the sked for Swiss Radio International via Moyabi, effective 27 March - 24 September 1994: on 6135 kHz to Africa: 2000 English, 2030 French, 2100 Italian, 2130-2200 German: on 12035 kHz to the Americas: 2215 German, 2300 Italian, 2330-2400 Spanish. (BBCM)

DJIBOUTI: RFI's plans to build a relay station here remain on hold until the French government approves financing. RFI argues that building new site would "be cheaper then to rent frequencies." The planned site would cover the Indian Ocean and Fast Africa.

GHANA: The GBC has undertaken to extend FM coverage to all the regional capitals. FM transmissions have already begun from Kumasi, Sekondi, and Dormaa Ahenkro. (BBCM)

KENYA: On 8 March, KBC announced major changes to improve its services in the course of this year. These will include two dishes for satellite reception, a second TV channel and an FM radio station. (BBCM)

LIBERIA: Newcomer "Radio ELRL" broadcasts from Gbarnga on 6090 kHz plus an FM channel. Sked is 1000-1830. (BBCM) If it sticks to these times, this'll be a major

challenge to North American DX'ers, probably audible near their sign-off no earlier than December of this year.

MOZAMBIOUE: According to BBCMS, Radio Mozambique plans to install four new transmitters before this year to extend its broadcasting radius, which now reaches only 30% (mediumwave a mere 15%) of the country's 16 million people, RM Technical Director Engineer Rufino de Matos has stated that, following a grant from the Japanese Government. a new medium-wave transmitter will hit the air in August. Matos also announced plan to replace a transmitters in six provinces with more powerful transmitters. Studio equipment in those provinces would also be replaced. Germany is expected to participate in the implementation of that project. He said that a new transmitter given by UNICEF is to come into operation in Zambezia Province by May of this year. Transmitters in Nampula and Cabo Delgado Provinces "may come into use before the end of the year and the others next year," Matos said. Engineer Matos noted that RM currently faces serious technical and financial problems, adding that its equipment is obsolete. "We are working with equipment that has seen some 50 years of service," he said. The condition of the equipment means frequent breakdowns and repairs are difficult, causing transmission and frequency fluctuation problems. (BBCM)

Two new radio stations have been given permission to operate in Mozambique: Radio Miramir (linked to the Universal Church of the Kingdom of God) and Radio FM (belonging to the Multimedia company). The Machava parish and the archdiocese in Nampula have also

applied for radio stations. Maputo-based Cardinal Don Alexandre has also requested permission to open a radio station on behalf of the Catholic Church. (BBCM)

NIGERIA: Delegates of Nigeria's Radio, Television and Theatre Workers Union on 14 February urged federal and state governments to, as a matter of urgency, replace all obsolete equipment in their broadcasting organizations to sustain the broadcast industry in the country. (BBCM)

SAO TOME: Sao Tome authorities are presently negotiating with German radio [presumably Deutsche Welle], which wants to establish a relay here. Last June, Voice of America installed its transmitters to Africa in Sao Tome. (BBCM)

SÍERRA LEONE: The Wesleyan Mission in Sierra Leone has installed a new AM radio station, broadcasting to Makeni town and its environs. According to the Mission, the station will transmit both religious and community service programs covering health and education. Initial tests are scheduled for two hours in the morning and three hours in the evening. The station, located at the Wesleyan Conference Center at (?Romankme), will broadcast mainly in local languages. (BBCM)

SOUTH AFRICA: SABC's domestic services ran 24 hours during the last week in April for the election. Although no surprises are expected, election results won't be finalized for several weeks after the polls closed. Unfortunately, the domestic services are down in the QRN this time of year, and Channel Africa's English programs remain a tough catch in North America; your best bet is 9695 kHz between 0500-0600, best past

C530 when Radio Free Europe pulls the plug. (AQ)

Radio Vryheid [Afrikaans for Radio Freedom], a new, unlicensed, right-wing station, began broadcasting on 19 March. Aiming to promote Afrikaans culture, it opened with Afrikaans raditional music. Fransmitters either completed or under development in Kimberley, Theunissen, Warrenton and Douglas would eventually give Radio Vryheid access to all of the Orange Free State and the Northern Cape as far as Kuruman. The station operates 13 hours daily. (BBCM)

Another new station, Radio Keroo, is targeted to begin broadcasting from Beaufort West, serving much of the Great Karoo including De Aar. Radio Keroo will have no political affiliation. The station, said organizer Ms. Olwyn Wessels, would be cultural and educational and would be used to help "the healing process in South Africa." (BBCM). [Certainly neither station will appear on shortwave. - AQ]

A month before the recent elections, South Africa empowered its new Independent Broadcasting Authority [IBA] to oversee the deregulation of the airwaves. Amendments to the IBA enable the continuing granting of temporary broadcasting licenses. (BBCM)

SUDAN: Sudan's President, Gen. Umar al-Bashir, has stressed the importance of supporting the official media organs and promoted the directed ones [shortwave, no doubt] affiliated to Omdurman broadcasting corporation. Gen Bashir made the remark [on] Tuesday [29th March] while receiving Minister of Culture and Information Abd al-Basit Sabdarat. Sabdarat briefed Gen. Bashir the progress of work developing and modernizing Omdurman broadcasts. He also called on supporting...the station for expatriates services. (BBCM) [Presumably that means shortwave? This bears watching. - AQ]

CLANDESTINE (LIBYA): Following up last month's report in Listener's Notebook, the Voice of the National Front for the Salvation of (Arabic: Sawt al-Jabhah al-Wataniyyah li Inqadh Libya), ex-Voice of the Libyan People, is audible only via satellite. Those of you so equipped should try Eutelsat-II-F2 at 16.0 degrees East using an audio subcarrier on the Turkish commercial HBB TV transponder (11617 MHz vertical). (BBCM)

CLANDESTINE (WESTERN SAHARA): National Radio of the Saharan Arab Democratic Republic (Arabic: Al-Idha'at al-Wataniyah lil-Jumhuriyah al-Arabiya al-Sahrawiyah al-Dimuqratiyah) supports the Polisaro Front and is hostile to Moroccan policy on Western Sahara. Its current shortwave frequency is 11800 kHz, parallel 1544 mediumwave (believed to emanate from a transmitter in Tindouf, Algeria), 576 kHz was last heard in 1988, but continues to be announced. Current sked, on 11800 and 1544 kHz: Spanish: 0000-0100 (irregularly); Arabic: 0600-0800 Sat-Thu, 0700-0900 Fri, 1800-2400 daily. (BBCM)

IN RWANDA...

As you are no doubt aware, Rwanda has been in deep turmoil since 6 April, when President Habyarimana's airplane was blown up with he and the President of Burundi on board. Fighting continues along tribal lines, with the ruling Hutus and the rebel Tutsis at eachothers' throats.

The ongoing slaughter is the consequence of many years of

political and tribal unrest in the tiny African country. The Human Rights Watch group has accused the Rwandan Defense Ministry of issuing "broadcasts over the radio attacking the political opposition and inciting violence against civilians sympathetic to the Rwanda Patriotic Front, leaving no doubt that it was referring to Tutsis. Such broadcasts inflamed the situation further and contributed to thousands of Tutsi murders by the army and militia."

On the Internet on 11 April, Finnish DX'er Jorma Mantyla reported "The rebel station Radio Muhabura was heard daily with very fine reception on 6285.2 kHz. The station fades in around 1800 UTC on 6285.1 kHz and then they slowly drift to 6285.2 kHz. Usually they close down with a nice Tutsi melody at 2007* but on Friday April 8th they had extended their schedule and they were still on the air at 2100 UTC.

According to some news Radio Muhabura should have news in English at 1900 UTC but this seems to be irregular. At 1800 they broadcast in French. On Sunday April 10th at 1855-1920 UTC they suddenly had a programme in English called "Weekly Broadcast". They started with news describing how army troops had destroyed a Tutsi village in Rwanda. Then the high commander of the "Rwanda Patriotic Front" Kagame read a long press release where the front declared to be ready negotiations. for Later another representative of the front interviewed. He called the newly formed government of Rwanda as "a clique of extremist politicians". He absolutely denied that the front had assassinated the late president Habyarimana. The crash of the airplane was called an accident. The government Radio Rwanda

blamed many times and was said to broadcast misleading propaganda. The present government was also accused of threatening evacuations from Rwanda. Radio Muhabura claimed that the government had refused Belgian airplanes to use the Kigali airport. That is why airplanes used for evacuation were forced to use the airport of Bujumbura in Burundi.

At the end of the programme there were terrible descriptions about the situation in Rwanda. There is lack of food and water in the town and government army troops are gathering dead bodies from the streets of Kigali.

No addresses or any other information about Radio Muhabura or the front operating the station was given at the end of the English programme. The announcer simply said: "Good night... end of weekly broadcast".

The programming and technology of Radio Muhabura sound rather professional. I'd guess that the power of the transmitter is some 5-25 kW. (Mantyla - Finland/INTERNET). See Listener's Notebook under CLANDESTINES - AFRICA for more. (AO)

According to German newspaper accounts, the 11 staffers of Deutsche Welle who were stranded at the relay site near Kigali were flown [to Bujumbura? - AQ] via U.S. helicopters. Belgian troops then flew the staff to Nairobi. Although the station is located but a few kilometers from Kigali, the streets between the site and the capital city were reportedly mined, and staffers were warned to stay put until rescued. (BBCM). No word yet on the status of the transmitting site itself, which has fallen quiet. Sites in Germany, Malta and Sri Lanka have since taken up the slack on former Kigali frequencies. (AQ)

LAST THOUGHTS...

Whether used to shape buying habits, create a national mindset, or topple governments, broadcasting has always been a political act. Nowhere is this more evident today than in Africa. The explosion of listening and viewing alternatives generated by high-power relays of Western broadcasters and by satellite dishes has forced state broadcasting monopolies in many African countries to grudgingly let loose the reins.

The result has been a veritable flood of independent broadcasters - licensed or not - on the continent, mostly on the FM bands. To say the governments are uncomfortable with the new diversity of political viewpoints on the air would be a great understatement. Reactions have been predictable; the following are all quoted from BBCM:

CONGO: "In Congo state media will only be allowed to broadcast official news." GABON: Opposition's Radio Liberte, organ of the National Rally of Lumberjacks [RNB], was destroyed by government security forces on 22 February." GHANA: "The minister of information...has called for the formation of advisory boards for FM stations to ensure that

they serve the purposes for which they have been started." KENYA: "On I March, after a year's absence, Kenya Television Network resumed local news coverage." MALI: On 18 February, the Malian government announced it was shutting down a private opposition radio station with close ties to opposition groups [Radio Kaira, one of seven private stations in Bamako], GUINEA: "Radio Frequence (?Gondalaye), Guinea's first private radio station, was closed down by government security forces 72 hours after it commenced broadcasting. On 10 March, the station, which had broadcast test transmissions of musical programs, was occupied by men in uniform, who ordered journalists and technicians to stop broadcasting immediately."

Much as happened in Eastern Europe, the inevitable exposure of people to new ideas will have great repercussions. Privately-owned broadcasting will change the face of Africa. With a little skill, patience and luck, we African DX'ers will "be there" as it happens.

CLANDESTINES-MIDDLE EAST Radio Freedom-News Center Iraq 11695 is on Thursdays (UTC) only signing on at 2200 in Arabic. The station is mixing with BBC-WS broadcasting from Australia. (IIJ April 28th)

PERU Radio America 6010.6 is active around 2300. (PFA WRT11LA newsletter No. 3) This one was believed to have left shortwave for good. (IIJ)

RUSSIA Voice of the Assyrians as of April 2nd, this station broadcasts on Saturdays only on 17890, 12075 and 7305 in Assyrian, Farsi, Arabic and Russian. (Nikolai Rudnev April 11th) Radio Islamic Wave is a new station replacing Radio Rukhi Miras. It is heard from 1500-1530 on Fridays only in Russian on 17890 12075 and 4055. (ibid.)

Radio Pamyat is temporarily off the air due to financial difficulties, but they plan to resume operations soon. (ibid.)

UNID Indo-Chinese station 4703v heard between 1000 sign on and 1155 sign off with non-stop music. (TIN Relampago Dx No. 37 April 8th)

VIETNAM Radio TV Gia Lai 4788 was inactive as of the middle of April. (TIN Relampago Dx No. 37 April 8th)

Equipment Review

JPS COMMUNICATIONS NTR-1 WIDEBAND NOISE AND TONE REMOVER

JPS Communications, Inc. has recently introduced the NTR-1 Digital Noise and Heterodyne Filter. It provides some of the best features of their premier NIR-10 DSP noise reduction device at an affordable price and in an extremely user-friendly format.

The NTR-1 is a two pound black box measuring 1.7 x 6.5 x 5.1 inches (HxWxD). There are only four front panel controls: Power On/Off, Notch, Noise Reduction and Bandwidth (Wide/Narrow). These are pushbuttons that are accompanied by LED's to indicate their status. There is also a frontpanel 1/4" stereo headphone jack. Along the back are RCA jacks for audio in and speaker out and a coaxial jack for DC power (+11 to +18 volts at 800 mA is required - no AC adapter is supplied). The price is \$169.95, including shipping when ordered directly from JPS and an AC adapter is \$16.00 additional.

The NTR-1 is connected between the speaker output of a receiver (usually 3.2 to 8 ohms, but the input impedance of the unit can be changed to 47 K ohm for special applications) and a 4-8 ohm speaker is connected to the NTR-1. A source of appropriate DC power is connected and the unit is ready to use. The audio output level of the processor is controlled by the receiver's volume control. An internal automatic gain control sets the signal level fed to the noise reduction circuitry so optimum results are obtained regardless of the receiver's volume setting. The built-in audio amp provides 2 watts into an 8 ohm load, so there's plenty of volume.

SIMPLICITY ITSELF

The NTR-1 is as easy to use as it is to hookup. Once switched on, the noise reduction, notch filter and bandwidth functions can be selected in any combination. The noise reduction processing is based on the dynamic peaking algorithm used in the NIR-10. It dynamically constructs band pass filters about the coherent portions of a signal (voice or data) and reduces incoherent components such as white noise. This works in real time. so you can compare processed to nonprocessed audio without any delay. The amount of noise reduction (6, 10 or 15 dB) is selected by an internal jumper setting. The 10 and 15 dB settings are best for pure communications signals, such as SSB, while the lowest setting works best for AM signals containing music. If the narrow bandwidth setting is selected along with noise reduction, the unit defaults to noise reduction parameters that are best for SSB, CW and data transmissions. The notch filter provides up to 50 dB of attenuation of up to four simultaneous tones with a response time of less than 5 milliseconds. The bandwidth switch selects either of two audio passband responses: Wide is 160-6600 Hz at -6 dB or Narrow at 90-3400 Hz.

WHAT WILL IT DO FOR ME?

The notch filter function is nothing short of phenomenal, just like the NIR-10. In most instances, the offending tone is eliminated before the listener is aware of it. The noise reduction feature works well. It made listening to 60 meter African signals in the afternoon much more pleasant by taking out all of the hiss and fuzz in the audio. Weak

signals dramatically jump out of the "mud" when the noise reduction is engaged. I found that I preferred to set the internal jumper for the lowest degree of noise reduction as there was some distortion of speech and especially music at the higher settings. If I needed more noise reduction, I could select the narrow bandwidth and noise reduction simultaneously, as described above. The audio bandwidth filtering was the least satisfying feature of the NTR-1, but in all fairness, it is designed to be a wide-band unit for listening to broadcast signals. The narrow bandwidth is in many instances still too wide for effective rejection of adjacent channel interference. This is the area where the NIR-10 really shines, due to its steep filter skirts and a ljustable passband shift. The NTR-1's narrow setting was occasionally very useful

on noisy signals in removing high frequency hiss - this sometimes gave better results than engaging the noise reduction function.

The NTR-1 is built to the highest standards and feels very solid in use. There is a one year warranty. If you're looking for the benefits of DSP audio processing at a reasonable price and in a virtually "set and forget" format, the NTR-1 is perfect. If you're looking for maximum performance as regards adjacent channel interference rejection, and don't mind twiddling a few knobs to get it, you should probably go for the more expensive NIR-10. YAESU FRG-100 FILTER UPDATE - Jerry Stuart dropped me a note concerning the excellent service he received from Yaesu in updating the AM filters in his FRG-100. Although Yaesu said the repair time was running 4 to 6 weeks, Jerry got his back in about a week. RADIO SHACK DSP AUDIO FILTER - Radio Shack has entered the DSP arena with a new audio filter. It is the model DSP-40 with a catalog number of 21-543. It provides noise reduction, heterodyne rejection and audio passband filtering (three values for SSB and three for CW) with a built-in speaker for \$79.95. Reports I've seen on the computer bulletin boards indicate that the notch and audio filtering work well, but the noise reduction is not up to the standards set by the JPS Communications products. Remember that Radio Shack has a thirty day unconditional warranty, so if you don't like it, you can return it.

KTWA FILTER FOR NRD 515/525/535 - Kiwa Electronics has announced a filter enhancement for he Japan Radio NRD 515/525/535 receivers. This is a 3.5 kHz bandwidth (at -6 dB) filter with a shape factor of <1.8 to 1 to provide an intermediate selectivity value between the stock 6 and 2.4 kHz bandwidths. The filter is available on a circuit board for installation in one of the optional filter positions on the NRD's filter board for \$73 or the filter can be ordered alone for \$63 and will directly replace the wide filter. Shipping is additional. Installation is available for an additional \$30. Kiwa Electronics, 612 South 14th Ave., Yakima, WA 98902; 509-453-5492 or 800-398-1146.

BURUNDI—Radio Burundi 6140 An official from this station recently commented on the frequent breakdowns in their transmitter: The transmitter has been breaking down frequently for some time. It is an old transmitter, dating from 1983 but was actually installed in 1987 after being stored in far from satisfactory conditions. Furthermore, spares for the transmitter are no longer manufactured, and there is a big problem in obtaining them.

The station would like to replace the transmitter but cannot afford to do so. The worst and most sensitive breakdown lasted from 17th October to 20th December 1993, a period that coincided with a serious crisis in Burundi with an attempted coup. Many people certainly thought there was some complicity on the part of the radio station, but in fact the breakdown during this period was for technical rather than political reasons. The station was noted on March 19th for the first time since the end of January. (BBCMS Summary of World Broadcasts No. 12 March 25th) Radio Burundi was heard again on 6140 on 15th April for the first time since 27th March. (Ibid. No. 16 April 22nd)

BULGARIA—Radio Bulgaria The site at Varna now operates on the following schedule: 7240 0200-0300 Bulgarian 0300-0400 Turkish 0400-0430 Greek on Sundays only. 0430-0500 Albanian 0500-0530 Greek 0500-0630 Turkish on Sunday only 0530-0600 Serbo-Croat on 9775 1500-1800 Bulgrian 7260 1930-2015 Greek 2015-2100 Serbo-Croat. All 100 kw. (Berg Numero Uno No. 1266 April 8th)

CANADA—CFRX began broadcasting in 1937. CFCX has always co-sited with CFRB, but has used a separate antenna system. The present CFRX array of two 50' vertical towers was originally configured for directional radiation to the northwest. However, several years ago, at a time when there were problems with one of the driven elements, the configuration was changed to omnidirectional, using the southern-most mast.

The original CFRX transmitter was designed and built by CFRB technical personnel at the first CFRB transmitter in Aurora, Ontario. The power output of CFRX has always been 1000 watts, although in the latter years of the old transmitter, this was difficult to maintain. Problems continued to appear in the operation and maintenance of the original homebuilt transmitter, with a resulting deterioration in audio quality. Early in 1983 the decision was made to purchase and install a new 1 kW transmitter for CFRX. The present transmitter was delivered in Decemeber 1983 and was comissioned on the 31st. The new facility is located in a room next to the CFRB transmitters.

The transmitter was manufactured by Elcom-Bauer of Sacramento, California. The design was basically their Model 701B, with the tank circuit of the final stage redesigned and an RF drive stage added after the standard RF oscillator card. The transmitter is now designated a 701B-HF. It is a classic plate-modulated design and is capable of producing high levels of modulation, continously, as is required for the 24-hour-a-day operation of CFRX.

The program material is derived from the same links as used for *CFRB* and is processed at the *CFRX* audio rack, using CRL processors. The programming is simulcast of *CFRB's*, except for a *CFRX* id that runs once an hour. (CFRX info sheet via Radio News Bulletin February)

CHINA—A delegation from Radio Moscow International visited China from 5th to 12th April. A protocol on cooperation between Radio Moscow International and China Radio International was signed in Beijing on 1 ith April. The document consists of 10 articles. (BBCMS Summary of World Broadcasts No. 16 April 22nd)

CLANDESTINES-Please note rather than judging a peoples' particular struggle as just or unjust, I place stations/ programs under the clandestine listing rather than a unique country listing when they fall into one of two categories: 1-A disgruntled group, government or country outside of a state broadcasts to that state in order provide information and influence events. instance, the various programs brokered by RMI fall into this category. 2—A group is able to broadcast from a particular disputed region. When these regions are not recognized as independent countries by the community, these stations are considered to be clandestines. These can be groups out of power and on the move, such as the Khemer Rouge, or can be emerging states, such as Eritrea was a few years ago. (HJ Apri 7th)

MOLDAVIAN REPUBLIC OF PRIDNESTROVIE - Radio Dniester International 9620 has verified with a plain card mentioning that they are transmitting from Grigoriopol site, also known as Kishiney Also note how the station spells its name. A. Komar, Chief Editor, also kindly enclosed some information on the station and his country. "We are awfully sorry for the bad quality of our signal. The worst of it is that we are not able to get rid of interferences. The Republic of Moldova properly jams our broadcasting. Our station started working in March 1993. It was created in order to tell Europeans and Americans about the situation in Pridnestrovie as we see it. The recognition of the Moldavian Republic of Pridnestrovie is our main purpose. Pridnestrovie is the eastern region of Moldova. Before the collapse of the USSR it was a part of the Moldavian Soviet Socialist Republic. After 1990 all the republics of the former Soviet Union have been facing economic and ethnic problems and Moldova is not an exception. Moldova tried to solve its ethnic problems by force in favour of native population at the expense of nationalities. Pridnestrovie, whose population is multinational, has proclaimed human rights to be above ethnic ones. Inevitably it led to self-proclaiming of the independent Pridnestrovian republic on September 2, 1990 for providing equal rights for all nationalities. In summer 1992, Moldova attempted to surpress our republic by military actions. The war, as any civil war, has led nowhere. Now ideological pressure by Moldova continuing. Moldova tries to block any information about our republic. We hope to overcome international blockade with your assistance. The goal of our radio-station is to spread as much information as possible about our young republic, about our proud. independent and free people which has paid with thousands of human lives for its freedom." CLANDESTINES MIDDLE EAST .-- Al-Ouds Radio A Jordanian magazine recently published an article by a reporter who visited the station (excerpts): When I arrived in Damascus, I immediately began to look for the radio building. Few people were familiar with the place. Therefore, it took me some time before 1 managed to reach the radio building. It was not a big surprise to me when I found nothing but a small, old four-story building, the first story of which is occupied by the radio station. This building is surrounded by shops and other residential buildings. The only thing that distinguishes it from other buildings is an armed guard standing at its gate. I was not surprised because I knew that the radio officials wanted to keep its location secret so that it would not become an easy target for attacl s or acts of sabotage. Al-Quds Radio has managed to worry and annoy Israel, which was prompted jam it despite the high costs amounting to millions of dollars. For this purpose, Israel used jamming devices at the builting of the Ramallah radio, something Israel has not done against any other Arab radio. Al-Quds Radio began its experimental transmission in 1987, and officially announced its rame on 1st January 1988. Only 20 days after the beginning of its official transmission, the Zionists began to jam the radio. The radio broadcasts statements issued by Palestinian resistance factions, which call for strikes and demonstrations. It also transmits patriotic songs and follows Palestinian developments and broadcasts these developments as soon as the necessary information is available. In one occasion, Al-Quds Radio was forced to make 56 frequency changes to evade the Zionist jaraming. The continuation of these jamming attempts by the enemy gave the workers of the radio lots of experience in changing frequencies quickly-in less than two minutes. It is noteworthy that the radio broadcasts on three bands: the medium, short and FM bands. The radio airs its programmes ir seven languages, in addition to Arabic. These languages are: Hebrew, Russian, French, Italian, English, Spanish F.omanian. As a matter of fact, the radio has rot thus far received any real feedback from target listeners on these programmes. In an opinion poll conducted in London last year, Al-Quds Radio came ahead of both the BBC Arabic Service and Radio Monte Carlo. To obtain its news stories, the radio depends on a network of correspondents inside the occupied territories. Correspondents use fax machines to send their news reports to the radio in Damascus. The radio also has subscriptions to several international news agencies; and this enables the radio to cover Arab and international developments. Nonetheless, the radio airs news agency-datelined Palestinian news stories only after it receives a confirmation of these stories from its correspondents in the occupied territories. (BBCMS Summary of World Broadcasts No. 14 April 8th) Try 5910 at 0600. I have never seen a schedule that indicated that they were using languages other than Arabic on shortwave. (HJ)

COLOMBIA—HJZ1 15-50 3100 is the new station name for the harmonic here. This is the former Radio Fantasia. Their address is: Calle 22C No. 31-01, Bogota and the verification signer is Luis Fernando Saavedra D. (Klemetz Numero Uno No. 1267 April 15th)

Radio Catolica 3580 is located in Cuatro Esquinas, Tuquerres, Narino Department. (ibid.)

Meridiano 70 4925 has shutdown. (ibid.)

La Voz de Guaviare 6035.1 heard 1010-1038 April 13th with rustic music and id as: Estamos presentando su programa 'Por las Tierras de Colombia', el programa mas sintonizado en la manana en La Voz de Guaviare en la cadena RCN. Big emphasis on this program being for the campesinos, or rural peasants. For example, La musica que lleva el sentimiento de nuestros amigos del campo (The music that carries the feelings of our friends in the country) and La mejor musica para nuestros amigos del campo (The best music for our friends in the country). Read excerpts from several letters from local listeners and asked for others to write in. Fair (Don Moore)

COSTA RICA—The AWR station in Costa Rica, Radio Lira, has finished up moving its transmitter site. Originally the antennas and transmitters were located at the Adventist university, just outside Alajuela, Costa Ricanot too far from San Jose. However back about 1990, or maybe it was early 1991, bought the SW transmitters of Radio Impacto and Impacto's Cahuita transmitter site on the Caribbean coast a little ways south of Puerto Limon. Impacto had been an anti-Sandinista propaganda station, supposedly a commercial broadcast but more likely a CIA front. Anyway, Impacto had used AM and SW from a site near San Jose to broadcast to Nicaragua. Later when Manuel Noriega became a problem for the US, Impacto added a 50 kW MW (AM) transmitter at Cahuita to broadcast anti-Noriega programming to Panama (really behavior for commerical strange a broadcaster, hi!). But after Noriega had been removed and the Sandinistas lost the election in Nicaragua in 1989-1990, Impacto suddenly closed down and was put on the market. The AM transmitter and transmitter site in San Jose, the only part of the station that had any commerical potential in Costa Rica, were purchased by a popular local radio announcer who wanted his own station. AWR bought the Cahuita site & MW transmitter, plus the shortwave transmitters at the San Jose site. Since then, AWR has been in the process of moving the ex-Impacto SW transmitters to Cahuita MW Cahuita. converting the transmitter to SW, and moving its own Alajuela transmitters to Cahuita. Alajuela is about 100 miles as the crow flies from Cahuita, so by the transmitter site rule, AWR via Alajuela was a different station than AWR via Cahuita. If you logged/QSLed AWR in Costa Rica before 1992 you already have the Alajuela site. If you logged/QSLed them afterwards, you may have either depending on the frequency heard. (Don Moore April 8th)

CZECH REPUBLIC—Radio Prague continues to use the Rimavska Sobota transmitter site in Slovakia but has stopped using the Velke Kostolany site in the same country. (Radio News Bulletin March)

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC - Presidential elections will be held in the Dominican Republic on Monday, May 16th. The main candidates are Dr. Joaquin Balaguer—actual president of the country and Partido Reformista of Social Cristiano-who received about 35% of the vote in the 1990 presidential elections; Juan Bosch-ex-president of the country and leader of Partido de la Liberacion Dominicana-who received about 34% of the vote in the 1990 election; and Dr. Jose Francisco Pena Gomez-leader of Partido Revolucionaire Dominicano---who received about 25% of the vote in the 1990 elections. The same candidates usually run again and again for office in this country. On May 16, and for perhaps the next two days, there is the possibility stations will be on the air all night long in a network named La Voz de la Junta Central Electoral. No independent station identifications will be heard, only this one. [Look for the possibility of shortwave broadcast stations reactiviating during this period providing a rare opportunity-RAD]. This lasts about two or three days in total. As usual, some stations drop from the network, but they are not allowed to broadcast any other news or even music during this period. You are either part of the network or silent! (Objio NRC DX News April via Richard "Quake" D'Angelo April 19th)

EQUATORIAL GUINEA — Radio Africa has an English program, Wonderful Words of Life, put out by the Salvation Army at 21(0 on 7190 Saturdays and on 15190 at 0730 on Thursdays. (Salvation Army Radio Ministry via Rhodes Dx'ers Calling April)

ESTONIA—Radio Estonia Criminal charges have been filed against the leadership of this station for possible squandering of public funds. (BBCMS Summary of World Broadcasts No. 13 April 1st)

FRANCE-Radio France Interational According to an AFP interview of 14th April. RFI's director general and chairman of the board, said that RFI intended to continue "fulfilling the missions" entrusted to it "by the government", particularly by continuing its foreign language broadcasts. In March RFI was called into question by an adviser to the minister of communication, who claimed that "people listened to RFI to hear French." According to RFI's Director General, such rem uks demonstrate "a total lack of knowledge of the station's obligations as specified in its terms of reference, by the law and by the instructions given by the government". Additionally, RFI and Africa No I are currently engaged in hard bargaining over the renewal of the contract for the use of Africa No 1 transmitters in in Moyabi, Gabon by RFI. The Director wants "a better rate for the French taxpayer" who is financing RFI. "knowing that the rates applied by Africa No 1 are the highest in the world." He also said that RI'I would like a new transmitter to be built in Djibouti to cover the Indian Ocean and East Africa. According to the director, "it would certainly be cheaper to build a new [transmitting] center than to rent frequencies, as advocated by the supervising bodies". (EBCMS Summary of World Broadcasts No. 16 April 22nd)

HUNGARY—Hungarian Radio Sacked radio employees under retirement age should be reappointed, the fact-finding delegation of the International Federation of Journalists (IFJ), uniting 300,000 journalists from 90 countries, concluded after a 44-hour stay in Hungary. On 4th March, 91 state radio employees were dismissed and 38 sent to retirement, including several leading editors and reporters. Opposition parties accuse the government of having given their tacit support for the firings, which also affected a number of journalists known for their oppositional views. The head of the IFJ believed that the employees were dismissed for political reasons while the station maintains that were let go for financial reasons. (BBCMS Summary of World Broadcasts No. 13 April lst)

racio broadcasting company Kazakhstan is to be closed down and a republican corporation of Kazakhstan's television and radio is to be set up instead. The head of state says his decision has been caused by objective necessity: it is obvious that the state broadcasting company has lost the struggle for racio audience to the numerous commercial studios and stations in Kazakhstan, as well as to programmes broadcast from Moscow. (BBCMS Summary of World Broadcasts No. 14 April 8th)

LAOS-Here is Tony "Ironman" Orr's special report filed from Luang Prabang, Laos on April 18th: The regional station at Luang Pr. ibang (7164v) is on the air but due to power shortages is an on-and-off affair. Oddly en jugh, reception of Luang Prabang is better in Vientiane. No sign of the regional stations at Phongsali (frequency?) or Houa Phan (4660). I would suspect they are inactive or if active their transmitters are in such poor shape that they would only be heard at very short distances. Lao National Radio in Vientiane is on 49 and 41 meters with muddy modulation. I have pictures of both Luang Prabang and Vientiane buildings but no tours are given to foreigners! Tons of Chinese (stations) everywhere, especially on 41 and 49 meters. For some weird reason the radio I am using (Iceally purchased) omits 4.7 to 4.999 khz and then picks up at 5000 to 5150. You figure that one out mate! (Tony Orr April 18th)

While all the target countries of the proposed Radio Free Asia have denounced the se vice, what follows will give you an idea of the nature of their objections. (HJ) From Pasason, Vientiane, 9 February 1994-Excerpts from commentary published in Lao People's Revolutionary Party newspaper. In ernational public opinion has welcomed the US move to lift the 30-year trade embargo against Vietnam. Everyone has praised the decision of President Clinton on this issue as it was considered an appropriate act, in line with the trends of the final decade of the 20th regarded by era century, an industrialized countries, including the United States, as one of achieving cooperation and mutual understanding in all fields. In the light of this atmosphere, why did the US Senate recently once again approve the establishment of Radio Free Asia with the intention of beaming news broadcasts to China, Myanmar [Burma], Tibet, the DPRK, Cambodia, Vietnam and the Lao People's Democratic Republic? It has said with a straight face that the residents of these countries have not had full freedom to express their views. It has also noted that Radio Free Asia will serve as a tool to gather views in different fields from the people of these countries. This may not be the true purpose of Radio Free Asia. There must be other purposes. Radio experts are of the view that the new Radio Free Asia broadcasts will create interference on frequencies used by broadcasters in the various countries in this region. Radio Free Asia has [as published] also reprimanded the various nations in the region by saying that they have not maintained the full rights and freedom of people to express their views. The Lao people, like the peoples of other Indochinese countries, China, Myanmar, Tibet and the DPRK, already enjoy full rights and freedom of expression. They can speak freely on whatever they want without needing Radio Free Asia. They have also exercised the right effectively to safeguard their sovereignty and territorial integrity by opposing outside intervention and aggression under various forms. Economically, the United States has announced the end of the trade embargo against Vietnam. It has taken a valuable step. Why has it now announced the establishment of Radio Free Asia? In spirit, this contradicts the economic interests of the peoples in the region. BBC radio on 29th January expressed the view that the United States wants to set up Radio Free Asia because of its experience with its Radio Free Europe and Radio Liberty contributing to the collapse of communism in Europe four to five years ago. If the BBC is correct, the new Radio Free Asia will not be characterized by creation at all. Its purpose also runs counter to the earnest aspirations of the various nations in this region, which want to create mutualunderstanding and promote and expand cooperation in various fields with all countries in the world, including the United States. In general, no matter what is behind the establishment of Radio Free Asia, if the owner of a radio station fails to understand the essential requirements, the true purpose of the establishment of the station will certainly become clear to the world. The peoples in the region to whom the broadcasts of the station will be beamed towards will even enhance their spirit of self-mastery and the spirit of being the owners of their countries, strengthening their cooperation in various fields to check all acts of outside intervention regardless of the form. (BBCMS Summary of World Broadcasts No. 8 Febraury 25th)

The station announces that it is the radio service of the Liberia Communications Network, that it is owned and operated by International Promoters and Associates and that it is licensed by the NPRA (National Patriotic Reconstruction Assembly) government. It is heard between 1000-1830 in English. (BBCMS Summary of Broadcast Schedules No. 15 April 15th)

MALAYSIA—RTM is offering a new, stunning, multi-colored sticker pennant. (Pavanello Play Dx No. 786 April 18th)

MEXICO—Radio Universidad de Sonora 6115 is inactive. (Zeller Numero Uno No. 1265 April 1st)

MOZAMBIQUE—Radio Mocambique According to the PANA news agency, The finance ministry has bowed to strong pressure and increased this year's subsidy to Radio Mocambique. Earlier, the finance ministry had tried to freeze the station's allocation from the state budget at 1993 levels despite inflation of over 30%. This plunged the radio into deep financial crisis and threatened its ability to act as a national public service during the forthcoming election campaign. The finance ministry has now agreed to release an additional 1.77 Billion meticais (about 312,000 US dollars) for the radio to purchase essential equipment and services this year. (BBCMS Summary of World Broadcasts No. 14 April 8th)

NAMIBIA-"The Director-General of the Namibian Broadcasting Corporation, Mr. Nahum Gorelick, has warned politicians against considering television more important than radio in Africa. In a speech...(he) said that it was hardly surprising that the African people, the great majority of whom could neither read nor write in the colonial languages of French or English, had been quick to adopt radio which 'communicates in their own language'. However, he said: 'There is a dangerous tendency for politicians to consider television to be more important at this stage of technological development and one must be careful not to exclude radio especially with content relating development information.' The rural world was a 'priority sector' for radio.... The use of African national languages broadcasting away from its 'unilateral and elitist' conception, and had begun to strengthen the African cultural personality.

Certain rural radio services had enabled the populations to get into dialogue with the national authorities. They had also stimulated a certain commonality of interest between ruril populations.... (As to television,) aside from its cost it remains an elitist medium and difficult to 'decode.... One of the main problems for African television is finding good African products for the public.'" (COMBROAD March via Don Moore)

NORTH KOREA—KCBS-Sariwon 2350 has been off the air for several months. (R:lampago Dx No. 35 March 25th)

PAKISTAN—Radio Pakistan 15190 A new frequency heard with dictation speed news from 0230-0245. Parallel 17725. (Bob Padula April 1st)

According to *The Indian Express* newspaper, Pakistan has set up "more clandestine radio stations in Pakistanioccupied Kashnur" in its campaign against Indian civil & military authorities in the Indian portion of Kashmir. These stations are using six different languages spoken in Kashmir. (COMBROAD March via Don Moore)

PAPUA NEW GUINEA—NBC 6040 is st Il active here. (Seager Australian Dx News April)

PARAGUAY—Radio Nacional 6025 has been inactive here for two years. (TIN Relampago Dx March)

Radio Nacional 9735 returned to the air a ter several weeks absence. Heard at 0800. (Relampago Dx Logging No. 35 March 25th)

Radio Cardinal AM Stereo 15200 has plans to operate here. (TIN Relampago Dx March)

I'ERU—Radio Internacional de Peru 3397 (955-1035 April 10th with ID at 1002, greetings to listeners, folk mx. This was almost all true Indian folk mx, played only with flutes and percussion. These were the only instruments available to the Incas until the Spanish arrived and introduced stringed instruments. Really good music! Fair. (Don Idoore)

Radio Otorongo 4108v is the correct name of the station heard here in January 1993. Otorongo is the name of a local jaguar. (Klemetz Numero Uno No. 1267 April 15th)

Estacion X 4593.5 is now only on FM. (P Capo M. WRTHLA via Shortwave News April)

Radio Estacion Laser 4705 not heard lately, but their address is: Jr. Faustino Maldonado 308. (Klemetz WRTHLA ibid.)

Radio La Hora 4858v 1014-1035 April 9th Good signal with folk mx & talk in mix of Spanish & Ouechua. Several IDs and LOTS of ads. All the ads were being done on the spot by the announcer and he just smoothly switched back and forth between the two languages within the same ad. Obviously a fluent bilingual. Especially interesting was an ad for "International Motors", a car sales company. I would think that anyone who has made enough money to buy a car in the Peruvian economy would know Spanish, even in Ouechua were his native language. But, the ad was still bilingual. Other ads included Panificadora San (bakery), Libreria San Andres (bookstore), & Transportes Mora (bus company). Also gave sked of Sunday masses in two main cathedrals. Another announcement told of new facilities being developed to improve the tourism industry & stressed the importance of tourism to Cuzco. 1Ds as La Hora esta con ti. Radio La Hora and Esta contigo, Radio La Hora. Good signal. (Don Moore)

Radio La Oroya 4904.8 A new one, signs on at 1028 and seems to be on in the evening too. (Valko Numero Uno No. 1266 April 8th) 1043-1109 April 9th with folk mx (mostly guitar, as per Dave Valko who discovered this new one), time checks, possible ID at 1059. Fair signal, but faded out fast after 1100. Same day Dave e-mailed me about this station, I received a San Francisco Examiner article about La Oroya on the Internet Peru list. The article notes that "More than 90 years of mining and smelting...have turned La Oroya...and the nearby Mantaro Valley into what one U.S. environmental expert calls 'a vision from hell'.... La Oroya is a quintessential company town, a dingy cluster of homes dominated by the enormous smokestacks of the Centromin smelter. Smoke billows into the Andean sky. Pipes pour untreated waste into the Mantaro River, whose banks are piled high with black slag heaps. The company's stranglehold extends past La Orova throughout the Mantaro Valley and beyond. Its refineries, concentrators and seven mines dot the central Andes. At the Morococha mine 20. miles from La Oroya, sickly yellow-gray tailings sprawl across a vast plain, and acid mine drainage has turned a nearby lake deep red.... The company's worst mine is at Cerro de Pasco, where acid mine drainage has 'killed' the San Juan River and filled it with heavy metals including iron, lead, cadmium and zinc." (Don Moore) This station used to operate years ago on 3350 with 400 watts, but they seem to be using a new transmitter now. (Inoue Numero Uno No. 1267 April 15th)

Estacion Yurimaguas 5046.3 inactive, only heard on FM. (P. Capo M. WRTHLA via Shortwave News April)

Radio Frecuencia San Ignacio 5700 address given on the air as Jr. Villanueva Pinillos 330. (Klemetz WRTHLA via Shortwave News April)

Radio Frecuencia San Jose 5858.4 located in San Jose in Lambayeque Department, was heard until 0010 sign off on March 20th only. (Klemetz Numero Uno No. 1267 April 15th)

Radio Paucaratambo 5984.7 1000-1013 with young lady giving Spanish ID and a request for local listeners to write in. Into huaynos with male announcer doing announcments. Except for ID, all further talk in Quechua. Fair. Thanks to Dave Valko for discovering it! However, to correct Dave, I think this is Quechua, not Aymara. I believe Aymara isn't used anywhere in Cuzco Departmento (Don Moore)

Radio Oriente 6190 this regularly heard station has not been heard since April 10th. (HJ)

USA—WRMI The latest is that our engineers have been making lots of modifications to the transmitter in order to filter out any possible harmonics, using a spectrum analyzer to check results. They think they have the problem solved, and are ready to resume some very short (about 5-minute) tests at various times (during daytime only) in coordination with the FCC and the FAA-hopefully to start within the next few days. Meanwhile, we've been swamped with reception reports for the few days we were on the air with 50-kilowatt tests. Most of the latest ones are from the Caribbean and Latin America (including Peru, Uruguay, Argentina, Nicaragua, Puerto Rico, Venezuela, Panama, etc.), and have indicated good to excellent reception throughout the region. So we know the transmitter and antenna are doing the job they're intended for. But we're also continuing to receive lots of reports of fair, good and excellent reception throughout the U.S. and Canada, which makes North America a viable secondary target area—something we

weren't sure would be the case. The skip zone off the back of the antenna appears to go as far as Tampa/St. Petersburg (about 250 miles from Miami). We don't have a good feeling yet for the skip zone off the front of the antenna. (Jeff White April 26th)

WHSB has a new antenna project (dualband 4x4, oriented 72 deg, ±15 & 30) underway. Thomcast is the supplier—this is the resultant of the merger/purchase of ABB and Thompson CSF. (C. Ed Evans, Senior Station Manager March 28th)

Radio Free Europe The Czech language broadcasting section of this station is to move from Munich to Prague this spring as a cost-saving measure. Until the end of September 1995, it will reside in the Czech Radio building in Prague-Vinohrady, but the station said that sharing a building with Czech Radio does not constitute a merger or mutual dependence. (BBCMS Summary of World Broadcasts No. 12 March 25th)

VOA The GAO U.S. (General Accounting Office) issued a report in January entitled "Voice of America: Station Modernization Projects Need to Be Justified" (GAO/ NSIAD-94-69). Here is the official abstract of this report: Voice of America: "Station Modernization Projects Need to Be Justified GAO/NSIAD-94-69, Jan. 24 (12 pages). The end of the Cold War, technological advances. and organizational changes in U.S. foreign broadcasting programs may render some of the of America's (VOA) shortwave modernization projects obsolete before they are finished. Democracy is spreading in many parts of the world, host country media have become more reliable broadcast sources, and VOA and Radio Free Europe/Radio Liberty audiences have shrunk. By the turn of the century, direct satellite broadcasts involving high-quality signals may be available. Despite these trends, VOA plans to continue to build new shortwave stations and modernize existing ones. More than half of the \$900 million VOA plans to spend on modernization through 2003 is for shortwave projects that have not yet begun.
