DX NEWS NOVEMBER 14, 1934.

Good day members, we hope that the news which we have for you this week will be of great interest to all of you.

First of all we are in receipt of a card from Earl Roberts, who with Ray Lewis and C. G. Huber are working on our Mexican Nights which seem to be coming along very nicely at the present time. Earl advises us that he had just received an airmail letter from XETH Pueblo, Mexico advising him that they would be on the air for our club on the morning of January 13 from 2:00 to 3:00 A.M., E.S.T. Now the thing we urge each of you to do is to write a letter, a nice polite one, to WEDC Chicago, Ill. who operate on 1210 kycs. asking them if they will please stand by during this hour for an International Goodwill broadcast from this station, who incidentally operates on their same frequency. We feel that it is your duty to do this in favor of XETH, we feel confident that if WEDC receives enough requests to stand by for this broadcast that they will co-operate with us, for they very kindly did likewise for us last season when we wrote them about the broadcast which was to take place over YV3BC.

We want to thank J. Warren Routzahn, C. G. Huber and any others that sent us the information that WNEL was heard testing during the frequency tests last week on Tuesday morning, from 4:10 to 4:30 A.M., E.S.T. No doubt this will be a monthly check and we would advise all of you to try for them next month at that time.

Joe Becker, Sr. our Vice President sent us a post card last week advising us that he had just received a letter from KEAB San Francisco, Calif. in which they advises him that they would run a DX program for the members of our club on Wednesday morning, November 7 from 3 to 10 A.M. They said that no doubt their letter would reach him too late for him to notify us, nevertheless we hope that some of you were able to hear this broadcast and sent KEAB a letter of thanks for the fine program. Joe also advises us that he heard KICM testing on November 9 and the announcer said that after the Inaugural program on Sunday at 8:30 the call letters will be WOC. It is quite evident that they are ready for their new call letters according to this information.

We want to thank Howard Schlobahn for arranging for several frequency check dedications for the members of our club. The first of which will take place over station KOOS 1200 kycs. Marshfield, Ore. from 4:00 to 4:20 A.M., E.S.T. on Monday morning, December 3 and the second of which will take place over station KFIZ 1420 kycs. Fond du lac, Wisconsin on Thursday morning, December 6 from 3:50 to 4:10 A.M., E.S.T. We urge that you will all listen in to these broadcasts and send in reports to the station for they will certainly be greatly appreciated. Howard also advises us that WFBZ 1200 kycs. Cincinnati, Ohio conducts a frequency check program the last Friday morning of each month from 3:00 to 3:15 A.M., E.S.T. in addition to the one they run the beginning of each month for the F.C.C.

C. G. Huber, our faithful Advisory Chairman sends us the news that WDAY Fargo, N. D. 940 kycs. tests the third Tuesday morning of each month from 1:00 to 4:00 A.M., E.S.T. the first of which will be held on November 20.

We have had quite a few requests for us to repeat that list of Canadian frequency checks which we sent you two weeks ago, it is found on #3.

 - B. 2nd - Brach 'Vis-o-glow' Lightning Arrestor with neon tube.
 - C. Most verif points - Night Light - 2 candle-power
 - D. Most Thanx points - Night light - 2 candle-power
