DX NEWS

NOVEMBER 21, 1934.

First of all we have a new member to welcome at this time, he is Dr. O. W. Gibbs, 424 Wayne St., Dallas, Texas. We certainly do hope that you will find your membership in our club very much worthwhile and that our Bulletins will be a great help to you during your DX efforts this season.

We want to thank Joe Becker, Sr. our Vice-President for having arranged for a DX program for the members of our club over radio station WIBG 970 kycs. Glenside, Penna. for Friday morning, November 23 from 6:00 to 7:00 A.M., E.S.T. We trust that you will all listen in and send WIBG a card or letter thanking them for this splendid broadcast. Joe also advises us that WMBR 1370 kycs. Jacksonville, Florida will dedicate their December frequency check to the members of our club. WMBR tests on Thursday morning, December 6 from 3:00 to 3:20 A.M., E.S.T. We urge you all to listen in and report on this broadcast.

John J. Barlow our faithful CPCman in Berkeley, Calif. sent us word about 10 days ago that he had arranged for a special broadcast to the members of our club over station KVL 1370 kycs. Seattle, Wash. on Sunday morning, November 25. from 3:00 to 4:00 A.M., E.S.T. Unfortunately we did not have room for a write-up on this broadcast last week in our Bulletin owing to a lack of space. Please be sure to show your appreciation for John's fine efforts by sending KVL your reports on this broadcast.

We also want to thank J. A. Meakin another of our excellent CPCmen for having arranged for a broadcast for the members of our club over station KVOA 1260 kycs. Tucson, Ariz. on Saturday morning, December 1, from 2:00 to 4:00 A.M., E.S.T. We know that you will all do your duty and send KVOA a lot of fine response to this broadcast.

Radio Station WEEU, 830 kycs. Reading, Penna. have advised ye editor that they are planning on running their first DX program for this season on Sunday morning, December 2 from 3:00 to 5:00 A.M., E.S.T. They have further advised him that the period from 3:00 to 3:30 A.M., will be dedicated to the members of our club. Mr. Savage, the writer of this letter requests that each of you send them a report on this broadcast.

This coming Sunday morning finds a DX program on the air over station LS-2, Buenos Aires, Argentina. This is the much talked of 40 KW transmitting station from down in South America that has been heard quite frequently this fall breaking through our local stations early in the evenings. Inasmuch as this is the case, we feel confident that they will be heard very well all over these United States and Canada on Sunday morning, therefore allow us to suggest that you will all try for this station who will use 1190 kycs. during the course of this broadcast. They will be on from 2:30 to 4:00 A.M., E.S.T. We feel certain that if reception is any good at all this station should come through in mighty fine style.

Arthur H. Brackbill and Benjamin Goning send us word that KYW are now testing their transmitter in Philadelphia, Penna. These tests are conducted right after KYW leaves the air in Chicago. The music on these test programs comes in very strong and clear but thus far the announcements have been rather weak.

We hope that you all were up to hear the mighty fine broadcast that KYA San Francisco, Calif. presented for the members of our club this past Sunday morning. They certainly came in mighty strong and clear and gave the NRC a fine lot of publicity. Ye editor was particularly impressed with the idea of repeating each call letter in code after it had been announced by the announcer in charge of the program, this seems to be a very clever idea, for anyone missing the call letters owing to static or other interference, could still hear the dots and dashes which represented their call letters. We want to take this opportunity of thanking KYA for their splendid contribution to the members of our club. We hope that they will get a lot of fine response to this broadcast.

John C. Kalmbach, Jr. one of our newest members advises us that if any of our members would like to correspond with German DXers that they should address a letter to Secretary of the Amateur Broadcasters' and Receivers' Association, Berlin W15, Blumenthalstr, 17, Germany. Thank you very much for this information Mr. Kalmbach.

John S. Wyborski, 3151 Cedar St., Philadelphia, Penna. comes forth with a request for help in identifying a station which he hears on about 51 meters or 5850 kycs. He says they announce as the Voice of Central America and also mentions Cartago. He will appreciate hearing from any of you that can assist him in identifying this station.

KUSD 890 kycs. Vermillion, South Dakota sends a letter to ye editor advising him that they are going to run a DX program on Saturday morning, December 15. from 2:00 to 3:30 A.M., E.S.T. They also mention in their letter that they will dedicate the time from 2:30 to 3:00 A.M., to the members of our club. We certainly do appreciate this courtesy on KUSD's part and we hope that you will show your appreciation by sending them your reports on this broadcast.

We have discovered here at club headquarters that CJAT 910 kycs. Trail, British Columbia can be heard quite well during their regular broadcasts whenever radio reception is anyways fair at all. Those of you that have not logged CJAT as yet, may we suggest that you watch for them around 1 A.M., E.S.T. every morning for we are sure your efforts will be rewarded by hearing this station.

The Aussies have practically disappeared but in their place we find the Europeans beginning to show up. Luther E. Grim, our publicity manager was the first to notice them returning to the air in the early A.M.'s. Post Parisien and Fecamp have been well heard here at club headquarters during the past week. These two French stations seem to be the best bets so far as the Europeans are concerned. However a station was heard this past Monday morning on 658 kycs which we are inclined to believe was Cologne, Germany for this station began fading out badly around 1:45 A.M. which seems to be characteristic of German stations at this time of the year. The best time to try for Post Parisien and Fecamp are around 2:10 to 2:15 A.M., E.S.T. any morning. P.P., uses a frequency of 959 kycs and Fecamp uses 1459 kycs. both of these stations return to the air around the above mentioned time. They come in so well that they will surprise many of you that have never before heard them. A. J. Cabral reports hearing the Europeans in fine fashion around 7 PM in the evenings at his home in Provincetown, Mass. Those of you living along the Atlantic Coast
