DX NEWS DECEMBER 1, 1934.

This week we are off to a late start, hence we hope you will pardon the heading we are using on this week's Bulletin. We certainly hope that you all had better luck this week with your DXing than we did here at headquarters. This turned out to be just about the poorest week we had this season so far.

First of all we want to welcome the following as new members of our club: A. L. Drake, 2505 Revere Ave., Dayton, Ohio and J. L. Cooper, 1043 Sherburn St., Winnipeg, Manitoba. We certainly hope that these gentlemen will find their memberships in our club very beneficial to them in their DX efforts.

Last Thursday afternoon we received the following telegram, "Unable to broadcast DX program, Sunday morning, December 9th owing to mechanical difficulties. Very sorry. Signed-Radio Station CFRN. We read this telegram on the WORK DX Club, but we realized that this only reached a small percentage of our members. These prizes are open to all DXers who send in a correct report from the most distant point. KIT will be on the air from 5:30 to 6:00 A.M., E.S.T. The third special is from WAWZ 1350 kycs. Zarephath, N. J. This station will be on for our members from 6:00 to 7:00 A.M., E.S.T. Let's all send in our reports on all of these broadcasts and many thanks to Floyd for his fine efforts in securing these dedications for our members.

In our hurry last week we neglected to show CFQC Saskatoon in our DX Calander in their special for our club. However we had given you a write-up containing the particulars for this broadcast the week before.
