**IMPORTANT NEWS;-** This past Sunday morning we were very much surprised here at club headquarters to pick up Rennes and Fecamp, France both of whom were very fine around 2:00 A.M., E.S.T. According to this we believe that the Europeans have already begun to come through, so we therefore suggest you watch the channels of those Europeans that have been best received in other years. We might mention at this time that Fecamp is now operating on 1113 kcs this season. These stations are generally best received between 12:30 and 2:30 A.M., E.S.T. It seems as though we DXers were going to get another lucky break too, for lately KEAW 960 kcs., Reynosa has been signing off at 2:00 A.M. which will afford all of us an opportunity to hear Post Parisien at 2:12 A.M. if this good fortune continues. You will recall that this is the time that P.P. comes on the air every morning in the week, except Sunday.

J. Warren Routzahn one of our CPCers reports that WJBO will present a DX program for our members on Sunday morning, December 3 from 2:00 to 4:00 A.M., E.S.T. ## SHORT WAVE DEPARTMENT

Our president has considerable work on his hands producing the weekly publication. The editor of this department bestowed upon "your honor" the task of organizing a short wave committee to assist in the development of our SW Division. In the eyes of the executives of this Club, such a motion would be a decided benefit. Ed Brandon is anxious to know your personal opinion of this action.

The WFLA transmissions this past Saturday were cancelled as a result of technical complications in the transmitter. WLFSG, the chief operator was unable to state definitely when the station would resume activity, but the assistant operators expressed that there is little doubt that temporary repairs will probably allow the rig to return to the air late this week. Well, as long as WLJEC does not get entangled in the repair work, every thing will be OK. Nearly died laughing while he tried vainly to get the 160 meter tri tet oscillator working. But more about that later.

We understand that XIQ is planning some changes in the rig. The transmitter will "get tho works" shortly. NDU and NDL were exchanging some exciting reports in the recent tropical disturbance one night last week. These Coast Guard stations use channels in the vicinity of 60 meters. HJ4ABE has a wonderful signal on 5,950 kc.

Mrs. William Scott of Lebanon, Penna. writes that she is anxious to log stations in Japan, Russia, or China. Here is a list of recommended stations.

Do you know whether CECD is the short wave station of CMCD? Cuba has been coming through with fine strength lately. Even the broadcast stations have been remarkably clear. CMX and CMQ were rating with many of our locals during the past week.

W9XBY has a radio program for DX hounds Friday evenings at 8 PM. E.S.T. W9XBY is on 1530 kc. W9XBY has considerable competition here at New Canaan with WLKBS only a few miles away. Yet all in all, we heard most of the last week's program. If you haven't heard it as yet, mayhap it will be worth your while.

Our ten meter transmitter will not take the air before the end of the year. We hoped to be on the air by the 1st of this month, but the construction of the unit has been necessarily delayed. WLJEC will take the air, however, with in a few weeks working on a channel of 1800 kc. Among other things WLJEC will commence activity on the five meter band, as a portable unit.

HC2CW is reported frequently on 8,640 kc. Early last week CT1AA was trapped in the maze of antennas at WFLA. CT1AA is pushing a fine signal into this neck of the woods on his carrier frequency of 9600 kcs.

Carl Forestieri, New York City - Reports that the two new Venezuelan SW stations are now on nearly every night from 7 to 10 P.M. One is YV1ORSC known as La Voz de Tachira. The other is YV1CRS on 52.45 meters.

The other is YV8RB La Voz de Lara, at Barquisimeto, Venez. 51.60 m, 5880 kcs., TG2X La Voz De La Policia Nacional, Guatemala on 5940 kc. has an R9 signal at 9 PM nearly every night. 2RO is on every night except Sunday on 31.13 meters, 9645 kc at 6 PM EST with news from the War Zone. Did you know...that XETF, 6.12 megs., Vera Cruz, Mexico will DX simultaneously with their 1220 kcs, xmtr on November 20 for one hour, starting at 11:30 P.M., EST...that YV2RC, Caracas, Venezuela, S.A., will DX from 8:30 to 9 P.M., EST on December 3, 10 and 17th. They use 5.8 megs., 51.7 meters...that ETA 18.27 mets., ETB, 7.62; ETC, 11.93 megs., are heard best morning, afternoon and evening, respectively speaking...that a new station in Cuba (no location reported)--CECD, is being heard on 6.4 megs...that YVQ, Maracay, Venez. (6.67 megs.) will now verify. Address Ministerio de Fomento Servicios de Radiotelegrafia, Estacion Naciones de Radio, Maracay, Venezuela.

DO YOU KNOW...that KLLA, 1390 kcs., Little Rock, Ark., will DX every Saturday from 12:30 to 3 A.M., EST...that KDON, 1210 kcs., Del Monte, Calif. is reported testing at present...that WBOQ (WABC's phantom on 860) will DX for the NNRC on December 15, from 3 to 4 A.M., EST...that PRF4, 923 kcs., Rio de Janeiro, Brazil are being heard (as mentioned before) but one must get them before their sign-off at 9 P.M., EST...that the official schedule of WOP, 1120 kcs., Boston, Mass., is from 7 A.M. to 5 P.M. EST, starting November 4th...that WFIL, Philadelphia, will build within this month two portable short wave transmitters, to rebroadcast programs from nearby points around and in Philly...that WSYR-WSYU (latter call apparently used at times), 570 kcs., Syracuse, N. Y., are increasing their power to 1000 watts, from 250...that KNX, 1050 kcs., Hollywood, Cal., is now applying for 500 KW!!...that KLS, 1440 kcs., Oakland, Cal. will probably move to 1280 kcs., as the local FCC examiner has OKed this request...that it looks as if the first part of the broadcasting spectrum "shakeup" will center on "regional" channels. (We're writing an article on this for another part of the bulletin as it is too long for DX Chatter)...that WARD, 1400 kcs., Brooklyn, N.Y. (one of the stations deleted after November 15th in Brooklyn), is fighting hard for its life, circulating petitions amongst Jewish citizens (to whom its programs are almost entirely dedicated) which are to be subsequently sent to the FCC for their consideration...that the time for TA DXing is soon here (latter part of November; all of December and first part of January, after which signal starts to fade. Stations on the following channels would get 5000 watts, instead of what they may have now: 590, 610, 620, 900, 920, 940 and 950.

Seventeen channels would entitle any station on them to get the now maximum power of 1000 watts night, but a group of them would receive 5000 watts day: 1010, 1220, 1230, 1240, 1250, 1260, 1270, 1280, 1290, 1300, 1320, 1330, 1340, 1350, 1360, 1380 and 1390.

The remaining sixteen would remain unchanged, with varying power of 250 to 1000 watts night, but with some of these stations receiving an increase of day power, with 5000 watts as "tops": 550, 560, 570, 580, 600, 630, 780, 880, 890, 930, 1120, 1400, 1410, 1430, 1440 and 1450.

The Mutual Broadcasting System (WOR, WGN, WLS and CKLW) are rumored to be expanding into a coast-to-coast chain, by the first of the year. The stations expected to enter are: WMAC, Boston; WCAE, Pittsburgh; WGAR, Cleveland; KKK, St. Louis; KMX, Hollywood and a possible new station in Kansas City.
