IT'S IN THE NEWS...that WAYX, Waycross, Ga., will increase day power to 250 watts...Ditto for WGL, 1370 kcs., Ft. Wayne, Ind...W3XDD, 1550 kcs., Whippany, N. J. owned by the Bell Telephone Laboratories, Inc. granted increase in power to 50,000 watts...WPEN, 920 kcs., Philadelphia, Penna. to increase day power to 500, night power to 1000 watts...CKY, Winnipeg, Manitoba granted permission to change frequency from 910 to 960 kcs., this change was made in hopes of eliminating interference from another Canadian and a Mexican station...WOV, New York now has a chain of 10 stations, representing the largest hook-up for any foreign-language program. Those stations included in this chain are, WRAX, Philadelphia; WIGC, Bridgeport; WEAN, Providence; WAAB, Boston; WABY, Albany; WIBX, Utica; WNBO, Auburn; WSAY, Rochester and WGAR, Cleveland...rumor has it that F.D.R. appointed Frank R. McNinch chairman of the Commish in an effort to silence complaints about monopolies and that in the future there will be no more newspaper-owned stations, nor web-owned stations, also that each of the present Commish will be subject to close inspection, so that a decision can be reached as to which will stay and which will go...the following calls have been assigned, KEIA, Central Broadcasting Co., Centralia, Wash; KTBC, State Capitol Broadcasting Ass'n., Austin, Texas; KRAB, Redlands Broadcasting Ass'n., Lufkin, Texas; WTFI, Liberty Broadcasting Co., Atlanta, Ga., changed to WAGA; WMBR, Memphis Broadcasting Co., Memphis, Tenn., changed to WMPS...CBF, Vercheres, Que., and CBL, Hornby, Ont. are the calls assigned to the new 50,000 watters which are now under construction in Canada, in line with this it is noted that the Canadian calls are going to be shorted in many cases, such as CRCM to CBM, CRCT and CRCY will be amalgamated under the new call, CBT...still more Canadian changes, CRCW to CBW; CRCO to CEO and CRCV, Vancouver to CBR...KSUB, 1310 kcs., Cedar City, Utah have advised that they intend to DX each Friday morning from 1:15 to 2:15 A.M...KID, Idaho Falls, Idaho to increase day power to 5,000 watts...WCBS, Springfield, Ill., to increase day power to 250 watts...KSFO, San Francisco, Calif., to increase day power from 1 to 5 KW...Wyoming Broadcasting Co., Rock Springs, Wyo., granted a construction permit for a new station to operate on 1370 kcs., 100-250 watts...Berger & Freeman, Coeur d'Alene, Idaho a permit for new station on 1200 kcs., 100 watts daytime...Twin City Broadcasting Corp., Longview, Wash., a permit for new station on 780 kcs., 250 watts, daytime...WABY, Albany, N. Y., to increase day power to 250 watts...WSMB, New Orleans, La. to increase day power to 5,000 watts...WBCM given permission to hike day power to 1,000 watts. (Bay City, Mich.)...WIOD-WMBF, Miami, Fla., to change frequency from 1300 to 610 kcs...WEAN, Providence, R. I., to increase day power to 5,000 watts...WNBC, New Britain, Conn., to increase day power to 1000 watts...WLB, Minneapolis, Minn., to change frequency from 1250 to 760 kcs., and increase day power to 5,000 watts... Ditto for WCAL, Northfield, Minn...
