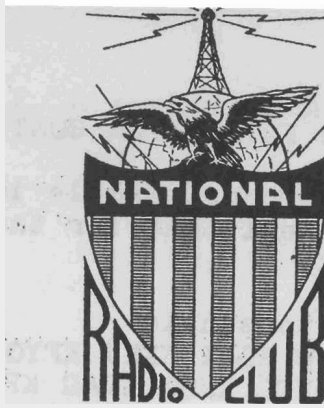

DX GLEAMINGS

IT'S IN THE NEWS that....it has been estimated that the 24,000,000 radio sets in use, consume approximately \$150,000,000 in kilowatts each year, and that there are estimated that there are about 5,000,000 sets in this country which are practically obsolete...WLW, the Nations' Station, are now broadcasting 20 hours daily during week days, their sked still holding 18 hours on Sundays...Hearst Radio, Inc., are rumored to be on the verge of breaking KEHE, Los Angeles and KYA, San Francisco, away from the McClatchy Chain...CJRM, Regina are said to be having trouble finding a site for their transmitter, their present location is right in the path of the new Trans Canada Airlines service and they have been ordered to find a new site, before they will be granted license. The main trouble is said to be that they can not find available power supply...CBS has finally changed it policy, and in the future do not be surprised to hear electrical transcriptions on WABC until 9 A.M...WLS, The Prairie Farmer Station have petitioned the FCC for permission to erect their own antenna, in the past they have rented the aerial system of WENR...Canadian interests are going to the Havana conference with the idea in mind to put in a complaint about the interference some of their stations are receiving from the high powered Mexican stations. At the present time there are only four cleared channels assigned to Canadian stations...WIOD, Miami, Fla., is now operating on 610 kcs., in place of 1300 kcs., where this station has formerly operated for many years... the weekly meeting of the FCC was postponed because of hearings in a legal case which held their interest.

We have just received a letter stating that WEEU, 830 kcs., Reading, Penna., will begin their regular weekly DX Tip Period on Saturday morning, November 6 at 10:30 A.M., E.S.T. Ye BCB Editor will again write the continuity for these broadcasts. It is our hope that you and your friends will all listen in on these broadcasts and send your letters of appreciation to the management of WEEU for having again granted this concession to the DXing Fraternities.

As Clearing House Manager for this Season, your broadcast band editor is trying to make some sort of arrangements with the stations who are at the present time engaged in all night broadcasting. The first station to have answered his appeal was WEXL, 1310 kcs., Royal Oak, Mich., who state that their present schedule of broadcasting is as follows: 8:00 A.M. to 4:00 A.M., E.S.T. daily, except Sunday, and excepting the period from the 8th to the 14th of each month when they sign off at 2:00 A.M., E.S.T. Thus, it can be seen that they have shown their consideration to the DXers by adhering to a schedule of this type. The Clearing House is also trying to ascertain whether another series of test programs from foreign stations has been arranged by the Bureau of Standards at Washington, and has accordingly written to them to get this information. Just as soon as this information is received, we shall notify all the clubs accordingly.
