A clipping from Montreal gives us this information. "A new link to the CBC basic network, station CHGB opens Thursday, Sept.8th. CHGB is located at Ste.Anne De La Pocatiere.The new station will operate with 100 watts power and will be fed NBC prgrams through the CBC." Since we are not informed as to the frequency of the new CHGB, we cannot tell you where to look for them...so we hereby appoint Bill Stone to investigate the matter and advise us of his findings. Better tell us what province that city is located in, Bill.

KXOX have already verified a goodly number of NRC reports. They are sending out a printed card with the call in half-inch outline letters. Entire printing is in black on regular cards. Ken Rogers signs for the station.

Perhaps they will have a few early morning testswith the same equipment later on. They are rather hard to hear since their signal is monitored in the daytime, so if you need them,keep looking for possible tests.

Bob Botzum tells us that KITE verified with a letter. The majority of the fellows who first reported KITE received a two-color mimeo'd card. Maybe these cards are all used up, so there's your chance, youse guys that prefer letter veries.

The FCC no longer list WTAQ as one of the stations required to check frequency each month. However, we note them on with a check on the second Tuesday from 4:15 to 4:30 EST. WTAQ operates on 1330 Kcs. Try for them next month at the same time.

WIBX, 1200 kcs., Utica New York has been sold to J. Curtis Willson and Emile J. Gough. The sale has not as yet been approved by the FCC but it remains as a formality. In as much as a change in ownership frequently means a change in call letters, we believe that you will be interested. Whether or not WIBX will change call remains to be seen, but if you need them, they will be checking frequency on October 10th at 3.00 to 4:10 and it might be a good time to add the to your log.

On Sept. 15th, the Texas State Network, with key station in Dallas and Fort Worth will inaugurate service to 23 stations in 23 major Texas cities. The new network will furnish 17 hours per day of the best live talent. The new setup is headed by Elliot Roosevelt and consists of the following stations: KFJZ, KTAT, WRR, KXYZ, KABC, KGNC, KFYD, KBST, KGKL, KRBC, KPLT, KRRV, KCMC, KFRO, KGKB, KAND, WACO, KTEM, KNOW, KRIC, KLUF, KRIS and KRGV..

Harry Gordon tells us that XELO are on 670 kcs, rather than 580 as listed in the last Radex. Harry also adds that some station is QRM'ing CMBL on 750 kcs. after WJR signs off. We've heard the same thing and suggest that you keep after them to see what the other station is. And say gang, Harry is having a special set of headphones made. The new phones will have about 50 to 60 feet of cord. (I measured it Mr. Knight and it's only 44 $\frac{1}{4}$  feet. HG) Here's why... Harry was experiencing some very good DX on the morning of Sept. 4th. The time was about 2:25 AM and he was tuned to a station on 1370 which he swears was something "red hot" and was patiently awaiting the call letters. Then at that unthinkable hour, he was called out of the room on business and when he returned the station had left the air. Harry vows that he'll never get caught like that again.

The increasing period of darkness means that additional stations are audible at their sign-on in the morning. Perhaps it would be a good idea to compile a list of sign on times, particularly of the hard-to-hear stations. How about it Pete Clarius? We've heard that you're quite a hand at such jobs. Here's a starter for you.... CHSJ, 1120 kcs., St John N.B. sign on each morning at 5:00 AM EST. They are now heard quite well at that time.

Just another reminder... please do not forget to send Radex your list of stations for their proposed "Parade of the States" series of DX Programs. This seems very worthwhile and we want NRC to back them.

Harry M Gordon-Erie Penn. Several of the members wrote into HQ and asked if I ever did any DX'ing, well boys I do DX and have been for the past 14 years, but as long as the ole bulletin gets the reports that it does why should I take up the space where there are so many members that send in reports that are better than mine. But here goes for my report, Hi. For the month of September I will say that I havent had a better month for DX in the past three or four years, signals have been very strong, the major stations on the west coast could be heard with R/7-9 signals almost any morning. September 4th heard XELO, KPPC, CJRC, KMPC, KFPY, KELA and Sept. 5th KOY, KSO, KXYZ, KFXM, Sept. 6th KMPC, KJBS, WOMI testing, a station on 980 kc, to weak to get calls at 4:30am also one on 760 kc at 4:40 to weak for calls but could have been KXA, KSAN 1420 kc, a new call for KGGC a new 24 hour station. Sept 7 KXOX testing KFAC at 4:15 with an R/9 plus, WSAZ 1190 testing, WLS, 4:40am testing SOS a spick on 1350 kc calling Allo Allo Allo Allo and playing the same number over and over, signal was R/7-9 (SA/3-5 around 4:00 am EST, this is the third morning that I have heard them. September 8 KFJM testing and asking for reports, that Spick was on again this morning on 1350 at 4:00 am, KPLC at 4:15 with test, KFYO at 4:35 with test, KGCU, 4:40am with check. Also one other tip WCOU, 1210 kc has come on with their program every morning at 5:00am EST, you have to catch them signing on the air as thats the only time I have ever heard them speak English all the rest of their program is in French. Heard them sign on the first time on Sept. 4 and every morning up to the 10th.

Cy writes -In the past years my DX-ing has been confined mostly to short wave stations, but with the coming DX season I hope to log a good number of BCB stations. Some of my BCB veries are: CFCO, CHWC, WACO, WAWZ, WCAH WEBQ, WEEU, WEAO, WGCM, WGST, WHAM, WHAZ, WJEJ, WMT, WNAD, WOW, WNBO, WPTF, WSUI, WWNC, WWVA, KABN, KFI, KGDY, KGNO, KLZ, KOA, KVOO, KVOR, XES. Have logged a number of new ones for me in the past week but nothing exceptional. My receiver is a Hallicrafters Super Skyrider.

Bob Botzum-Reading Penna. New stations heard are, KITE, KTRI, KTKC, KXOK, WGAN, KDNT, CMKD, KPAB. So far KITE, KTRI, KTKC and KXOK have verified. KTRI informed me that they have been on the air since July 12th. WGAN heard after 8pm DST regular. KPAB heard at sign off 1st Wed on Commercial test but not enough dope to send report. For the week of Sept 3rd heard for new new stations, WHBL, WLBZ, KGA, CFCF, WEDC, KSAL and WFIL the latter was a test of their auxiliary xmitter, and will not count as a new verie. Heres that mystery Spick again, Bills says that he heard him on the 9th playing organ Music, the same number over and over again at 3:30am EST, then calling Allo Allo Allo, Bill says its a Cuban (well it sounded like one to me also OM.) Heres Bills report for the past two weeks, Sept 3rd 1:45-2:00am EST--WEDC Chicago: 2:30-3:00 KSAL Salina: KFI and KNX booming in. Sept. 4, reception bad, local static heavy. KNX and KFI hammering in note they have been strong for the past two weeks. Sept. 12th, Static bad, but KPAB giving a good signal up here, in spite of same. Sept. 13th, following heard-- WCOU-1:00 WLBZ-1:15 WJEJ--for a new one, strong from 1:27-2:00. KYA--for another new one, 2:30-3:00. WISN testing 2:00-2:30; WBAL-2:20, WFBR-2:25, WAIM-3:15-3:30, with one swell program, worth fifteen minutes of anyones time, a real treat. KFVD-3:20, KOAM--testing 3:00-3:30, KVI-3:30, KFI and KNX nearly breaking the tubes, so strong. The coasters were fair below 1000 kcs, but KYA was the only one heard above that point. Sept 14th, WHLS heard on FCC 5:00-5:15, program messed up badly by WBLK on RB. KGKO, on 570 came in FB on their test. Other stations heard on Sept. 11--KGLO at 1:45, WSIX at 2:15, KID at 3:00 with a test program, KNX and KFI booming in. KWJJ heard at 4:15. New veries here are:--CFCF, WATL, KGA, KXOK, WNBZ, WAZL and WGAN. Reports out to:--KYSM, WCOU\*, KSAL, WEDC, KGDE, KWOC, KPAB, WJEJ, WLBZ-2 and WHLS. Not much DXing will be done the rest of this week, as I will be working late every night, and on Friday, I start work at eleven-thirty PM and work all night.

Arthur Brackbill-Lancaster Penna. By the way I started DX'ing this morning an added one new station---WBRK. Also heard KDNT and KPAB, but static was so bad I couldnt get any dope on them. VPD-2 "Radio Suva" 9.555 megs has increased their power to 10kw & have added 3 more channels namely 6.130-15.160 and 11.895 megs. The Stations formerly of Austria will have their power increased to 50 kw. The Vienna SW Network will consists of " OER2 6.072 megs., OER3 11.801, OER4 9.57 and OER5 15.190 megs.(Bob Hoynes.)
