The FCC did not vote unanimous for this change and there is a slight poss-ibility that it may flare up again befor the change is made. We hope WHBF will be more interested in DX reports on the new frequency than they have been on the old one.

And what was that crack about WGRM asking for the truth on their signal strength etc. It seems as though they doubt some of the state-ments that they received from DX fans. We agree that it is proper to be honest with a station when reporting reception but on the other hand we know of several instances where stations have responded more readily to R/9 QSA/5 reports than they have to poor receptio reports. Two sides to the question-but we belcive it is better to give the station a truepic-ture of their signal as it is received rather than stretch it into more than it really is. If WGRM dont take care of DX reports better than they have in the past, they are not deserving of any reports, let alone true reports.

"COUNTING VERIES"

The question of how to count veries has come up so often, that I would like to say a few words on this subject.

There never was, and never will be, one system originated that will be favorable to all DXers.

In a recent meeting of the Minnesota DXers, this question was brought up, and not a single DXer agreed with another's method of counting his or her veries.

Some DXers count a station 2 or 3 times, if they are verified on as many different frequencies. Personally, I count a station only once, no matter how many different frequencies they are verified on. This brings up the argument that a station may be heard well on one frequency but can't be heard at all on another channel.

I count a station over again if they change call letters and I verify them over again. Some DXers disagree with me. If I verify a station over that has changed locations, I call it another station, while some other DXers will not count a station over again unless they have changed location to another State. But they will count a station over again if they changed location to another city and also changed their call at the same time.

There are many different methods of counting veries and each one has her or his own system. After all each individual likes to run their hobby, to their own liking, for they are the ones that are really getting the most enjoyment out of their hobby.

I say to let each one count their veries, the way they like, but I firmly believe that there are 3 rules that every honest DXer should follow, and they are "Be true to your hobby" "Be true to yourself and be true to your fellow men."
