In a letter received from our Cuban friend Enrique Hidalgo, we leard of a new station for Havana. Enrique says that station CMCP, a new station now under construction will start broadcasting soon. They will use 1050 kes., and power of 2000 watts The QRA:-of CMCP will be:-Palacio de los Deportes, Edificio del Nuevo Fronton. La Habana Cuba.

A general shift in frequencies has been ordered for the Cuban stations by the Cuban Communications Department to conform in part with the North American Regional Pact agreed upon last winter.

ABSPECIAL DX FROM SOUTH AMERICA---PRF-3 960 kc., Sao Paulo 5000 watts in Brazil will dedicate a Special DX program for the NRC and NNRC on January 22 1939 from 2:00 to 3:00am EST. This time may be changed from 2:00-3:00 too 3:00 to 4:00 AM EST.

That Reilley (Reilly) man says that he is having some wonderful mornings with his receiver. He has reports out to 2YA and 3GI which are new catches from down under and adds that 2YC are On 840 kcs, but that has difficulty getting a log on them. Pat adds that the present time is very best for TP reception and that KGU KGMB and KHBC are all coming in well.

Art Brackbill sends word that the CPC stationaery has arrived and that his committee will get to work immediately. Art adds that two of the pictures he snapped at Kittanning turned out very good and that he will see to it that they are passed around to anyone that's interested. PRD2, Rio de Janeiro, Brazil apparently were not heard on their DX of October 15th. It seems as though a carrier was audible at different times during the scheduled time but that it was some USA station testing. We hope that PRD2 will DX again when conditions may be more favorable.

We announced two weeks ago that WIBC, 1050, Indianapolis had started a regular schedule on Sept. 25th. Now we leard that WIBC is not yet on the air and that report was in error. Our humble apologies, pals, but we just took the other guys word for it. News is that WIBC will not go on untill late in October but we'll guess the first part of November to be safe.

Dan Yapp says that WHBF sent him a card of verification and advise that they will be using new frequency of 1240 kcs., and increased power of 1000 watts sometime around January 1st. They add that WHBF will appreciate reports on the new set-up.

George says that he has worked forty states on his little CW transmitter and that he is working hard for the other eight.
