My latest catches are WFMJ CBV WSNJ WCNC KWVC WISE for 1076 verified log, New ones reported to are:-WSKB WDSM WDMA XEXM LR3 Lr2 LT5 LR6 LTL OAX4A and LS2 (all heard in AM). OAX4A was on the air most all morning Monday (30th). KGMB is still on 1320 kcs.Also heard KXA KGU WISE 1YA 4YA aBL KRSC and LS2 today (Oct.31st) XEDH on 1340 and XEXM on 1400 in Mexico Cnty are good now. Say Jim Walker, Merlin Steen, Elwood Boroski, Kermit Geary, old man Dick Cooper, Art Robb and all the rest why not enter the S & E contest, it is free and boy what prizes are offered to the winners.

JOE LIPPINCOTT-East Vassalboro Me. (Now using a 23 Tube Scott set) (Look out you guys from now on.HMG)

VONF seems to show up pretty well some evenings now that WGAN signs off quite early.. October 27th.Around 7:30 P, I tried the Scott and heard a fairly strong Spic on 1103 or 1104 also weak stations on 854 and 625 so I think chances are good that I may hear some SAs. I think the one on 1104 was Colombia but missed the call even though I listen for an hour. Sigs on 1104 were Q2-4/R4-6. (October 30) I have been listening during the evening and have detected stations on 625, 854, 882, 1104, 1114, 1122. Of these 1104 has been the best but I am not sure of its identity My guess is that it is Colombia but there in none listed in Radex. HJ3ABD used to be on that channel although listed on 1110. I have no idea who is on 1114 either. I hope that I can clean these up later. (October 30 AM) OAX4A on 854 hrd as early as 3:40 and still on after 5:05 when it was Q4/R5. Quite a good readable sig,.Identity was also clear. A broadcast from Argentine was heard from LR6 R5 on 870 ???R5 880, and LS2 R7 on 1190 first heard it about 3:55 and it was on for some time with all talking program. About 16 TPs were heard with 1YA the best ar R6-7. KGU was heard at sign off of WJR.. CKCK signed off at 2:00 on 1010. Last night more than 75 stations were R9 at 10:00 PM KFI was R7 and KOA also R7 with no interference from CMHT. The Cubans seemed out of the picture with CMCF not even heard through WCCO as usual. Who was the strong spic on 690 heard about 5:30 AM. I think it was a Mex but am not sure. It gave an address in Texas (NOTE OM that was XET they sign on at 5:30 AM EST.HMG) Also who was on 820 with electric organ at 4:14 on R2-4 and weaker than the run of 1000 watt west coasters. KGB was R4-6 on 1330. KHQ R6-7, KMPC on 710 was R5, KWJJ R5 KJBS R5, KFVD R6.
