GILBERT HARRIS-North Adams Mass. Elliot Rossevelt, son of the President of the USA and head of a Texas network announced on Nov.1, the formation of a new coast-to-coast chain of broadcasting stations. Roosevelt said the new chain would operate in competition with the CBS, NBC and MBS. The chain is incorporated as the Trans-Continental Broadcasting Co., incorporated under laws of state of Delaware. The chain will include four 50 kw stations and the majority of them in the 500w power rating. This from a NYC paper.
