RICHARD DANEKER-Lansdale Pa. Having just enclosed my fee of \$2.00 for l yr membership, I think it fitting to introduce myself and tell a bit about my DX activities. I am 27 yrs old married and belong to the NNRC IDA WDXA and Radex clus, at the present writing I have a log of almost 900 BCB stations and about 300 SW, making a total of close to 1200 stations heard. I have 718 BCB veries from 19 countries (OM check the NRC VIS/VIC rating, and enter yours.Ed) on SW I have 166 veries from 54 countries making a total of 58 different countries verified. Have been DX ing since the spring of 1936. Operate a 6 tube Grunow receiver untill last October when I bought a Hallicrafter SX-24 Man! What a fine receiver, works beautifully on both SW and BCB. Take it from me Hallicrafters SX 24 is the buy. I have all the states in the USA verified Europe, North and South America, Central America and New Zealand verified on the BCB. The antenna I use is a 100 ft Marconi, 30 feet high running approximately NE by Sw. This seasons best reports (or I should say catches) are 1YA 2YA 3YA 4YA 2YC 2YH in New Zealand. Underlined are verified. 6WA and 6WF in Australia, EIAR in Tripoli, FQN (verified) in Miquelon; Toulouse, Lyons PTT; Paris Ptt; Bordeaux; Radio Normandy; North Regional; LR6 LR3 LR4 LS11 LS2 (last two are verified) YVLRF YV3RA TIX TILS TIEP HJBJ HJAH HJAA XEAG HOK HJAN EIAR in Milan Italy, XEAO CKMO CKWX TG1 TGQ and Riga Latvia all on the BCB. (All underlined are verified)

ED FEICHTNER-Erie Pa.I thought I had better get a report in or else some one might think H.M.G. cut my aerials down. (Thats a joke, someone else did that job.H.M.G.) Nothing much to report managed to get a few veries in KWFT TILS KVFD WSAI WORL CJCS KHSL WENY and CFRN. I was up sunday AM and managed to hear HOK WLPM and WFIG. I was also uo on the 19th and hrd WDLP, I also was up On the 20th but was unable to log HOC too much WHOM, One of these days I'll fool you guys who I owe letters to and answer them. It seems here in brie we have some difficulty in answering letter, ask Harry he knows Hi. (Your trouble is different than mine OM. Ed Has the Wagner trouble, you know what I mean.Ed.)

JOE BECKER-Hamilton Ohio. WDLP was hrd on 3/18/40 on their initial test program they completely drowned out WIL. KTW hrd on 1220 ke dedicating to the NRC. WGBR had a nice program for our club, and said entire program dedicated to the NRC. WSAJ sent me a verie card marked 4th consective freq check report. I have very little trouble getting veries from the USA stations, have no delinquent USA stations. Peleive it or not, with delinquent USA Stations and active stations had since I began DXing I have the nice total of 1000 USA stations verified. Only USA reports out are KHUB WLPM WDLP. I all wyas said I never give up once I hrd a radio Station, I keep after them untill I verify them, but it is a different story now, because I have entered these on my Black list page, TIXD XEAI XEAU XESM XEBZ XMKH CMKZ LR6, I have sent each of these 8 at least 3 follow up letters to some I have sent at least 6 follow ups, some of them have received at least 3-4 or 5 dimes. No sign of HOC or TIRS on the 20th, I tried from 3:15 untill nearly 4:30 AM (OM there was some last minutes "Interruption" on the HOC program, and I was notified to late to get word to them. Word arrived Saturday, program was suppose to be 20th., so it was to late, to notify them More later on this. Ed.)

I am hoping that the elections coming up next week in Canada will have the stations staying on late but I have my doubts as the results are generally out very quickly...505---What was the station on 1370 kes sunday morning March 10 broadcasting a request program from 5:21 till 5:57 and probably longer. Was this WATL Atlanta. Hrd KCNO testing 2/17 at 2:40 EST. On 2/18 I hrd KTW broadcasting for the club. Luchily they continued after 4:00 because from 3:00-4:00 they were about R2 and as KWSC was testing with an R9 signal, But after 4:00 KTW went up to R6 at times.

The first time I ever could get onough dope on 2YA they came in here so good that I could not use all the volume on 1 2 3 4YA I could hardly believe it. There was very little fading on their signals. KGU was also hrd but they had a very deep fade out. I cant kick on this set as my battery set never had the volume this set has this is a 11 tube set, there is only one feature that I dont like about it. That is the way they have the kilocycles marked off. They only have it marked off at every houndred. But I am going to mark it off myself. I have not done very much DXing here of late. Not feeling so very good. WHSY testing (new location in Appleton Wis) signed at 2:56 m. 808--- SOS--who was on 1.370kc 3:05-3:40am playing records-no announcements, played "Penny Sernade" and "I promise you "at 3:30am. Who was on 1210 kc at same time testing. (all the above was on March 16) WGRC is on till 2:05am EST, daily on 1370kc., WHBO 1310 hrd testing for RCA in Riverhead L.I. 

### --HOW TO FILL OUT REPORT FORM--



The above is the graph, if you will note the station signal here fades in an out, the above QSA gives you the readable signal's. QSA-0 Nothing understandable.. QSA 1-Just readable enough to decipher whether music or speach is in program, but insufficient to disinguish the type of music whether orchestra, pinno, singing, violin, etc... QSA 2-Sufficiently readable to understand whether orchestra, singing, man or woman speaking, but with speech readable only in isolated words...QSA 3-Fairly readable Speech readable in patches thru a background of noise.... QSA 4-Quite readable, although occasionally portions of speech or music are not quite followed... QSA5-Perfectly readable, every word absolutely distinct. (Now you can get the idea of the QSA reading above) As to the minutes marked below, I change these according to the amount of time I log a station, you may count each line as 1 minute, or count each line for 3 minute periods instead of having 3:05 then count your lines to the one that runs clear across the QSA reading you will find you will have, starting at the left 4 blocks over to this line that runs thru the QSA reading, if you are logging three minutes to a line then mark in 3:12, as you note I started this graph at 3:00 AM. As to your R signals mark the peak of the signal at the top and carry the signal down to the bottom, say your peak is R5 start with R5, then hark in R4 R3 R2 R1 regardless if the station would fade to the RI position allways fill it in this way. Its very easy to get on to fill out this graph after you have worked a few, just make notes every few minutes as to the R reading and SA reading. (More next week on this form)
