GEORGE LUTHER-KEARVILLE TEX. I offer the following changes to the Mexican list in the bulletin, observed from my location near the border. On 1420 XEH-Monterrey (here instead of 1250kcs, dominates channel eves) On 790 kcs XEDF-N Laredo (here instead of 1260kcs, can be hrd daytimes) and ADD on 1420kc-XEWK-Irapuato (hrd in Dec) also 1550kc-XEML-Mex City (last hrd about 4 months ago) also On 980kc-XECA-Tampico (last hrd last spring not sure if on now) and 1030kc-XEQR-Mex City (they say 1030 but are usually 1025)

During Nov-Dec had program and calls in English 9-10EWT eves 5 nights weekly but have quit or changed hour. Some nites they are strong, like a 5KW and others more like 100w. On 1340kc none appear on list. Latest here gives ZEAA there, also XEBK the last RADEX put XEBK on 1320kc. I think RADEX wrong, for frequently I hrd a Spick daytimes on 1340 interfering with KVIC-KAND-KFPL before it went kerplunk which I feel must have been XEBK. On 600 a new Torreon Mex here, havent got his call yet but it is not XEOH. Hear him some eves but too much KR0D-WREC. On 1600 I'd like to know myself. On for some months with evening commercials for Westinghouse but only "Eckes" clear so far. Not much power, usually QRAed by sideband WALB-XEMC and State Police. Maybe some of you fellows with Scotts and Hallcrafters to narrow the channel might get him, if you can hear him at all. In not news before I joined NRC the following on XEG might be of interest. This sta was closed by the Mex govt in Sept for alleged Nazi leanings of ownership. It was later reorganized with virtual US ownership, just enough Mex holdings to make it legal there, resuming early in Dec. Part of stock holding is in Kansas and QRA was given Peabody Kansas in Dec, which is home of White Cross Tobacco Cure they have permoted somewhat. Havent hrd this QRA lately so San Antonio must be main office again. When XEG closed XEAW promptly pulled wires for the 1050 channel, but after XEG was restored the MEX FCC must have had to do an about face on XEAW. The latter must now put up with 1570 only unless they can work politics for another freq for a 2nd outlet. Not much since last week. KR0S only new one, 1/29 with reg FCC 2:40-3AM EWT. Also WGIL were on with FCC 4AM EWT on. KGDM now operating on 1140, seems not so strong as when 1000 watts, must have directional.

EUGENE FRANCIS-DETROIT MICR This being my first DX report to the club, I think a resume of my activities is in order. The first station in my log book is dated Jan 1 1939 so I have been in this game for a little while over four years. Began verifying stations about two years ago and have accumulated 555 verifications to this moment of writing. Every state has been heard and verified, ditto Canada with the exception of Saskatchewan, which has not been verified. No difficulty there, only laziness on my part. KGFX is, I am sure, just about the most difficult K station to hear, regardless of its centralized location, and the toughest W seems to be a tossup between WMAM, WMRO and WFVA. These stations never test (do they?) and appear reluctant to put on specials. I suppose it is possible to log them but it takes infinite patience. I have eardrumitis or some similar affliction from trying to hear WMAM through WKBN. Well-maybe tomorrow. Still need the following W's to complete my log of these stations. WGBG WRRF-WAYS-WJPA-WBBA-WMRF-WMAM-WIGM-WOSH-WALL-WBNY-WLAN (if operating)-WCRW-WKRO-WMOR-WDBC-WMIS-WCAT-WJHM-WJAP-WSON. Incidentally, WAOV still seems to be WAOV. Consider my best Eastern veries CHGB-WFVA and WKGA; my best Midwesterners W9XC-WMRO and KFOR. My best western, KGBU-but dont get jealous. This is the one station I have verified that I never heard and regretfully, will never hear. Just one of those things. Most veries from Texas-36 and New York-29. Have had five DX thrills that I dont think I'll easily forget. In the order of the impression they made on me, they are- 1 Logging First west coast stations, 3 in one night (KPO-KFI-KNX Feb 18 1939) 2-My first frequency check mornings. A Wed and Thurs in June 1939. I didnt know anything about checks at that time and logged stations faster than I could write them down. They seemed to be everywhere-19 in all for two mornings and the best of the lot was Missouri; 3 Logging 48th state-Wyoming in 1940; 4 Verifying 48th state-Nevada in 1941. 5 Logging my first TR-Lyons on 1393 Jan 1943. Never did hear a TP farther than Hawaii and have still to positively identify my first Latin American outside of Cuba or Mexico, although I believe I have heard several. Work for the War Department on Radio Inspection of Government Vehicles. Swell opportunity to combine work and hobby. IA with Army though.. Swap SWL cards with anyone interested.

LEFTY COOPER-BROOKLYN N.Y. Veries in from WCAX-CKBI, signers for WCAX is John C Quill c.e.; CKBI-Jerry Prest, position not stated. CKBI's verie is worth while-swell orange colored modern stationery. I now have 1014 veries. DX done 1/29 WLAP testing R9 2-2:30 and KR05 hrd again behind WEXL at 2:30 on reg last Fri check; 1/30 CHPS hrd on test asking for reports at 2:45AM. WINN test at 3:10 behind WJW; 2/2 WLVA on its reg check and WCBT came on around 3:17g; WLVA stayed on until 3:32. At 3:30 WFTC came on with reg 1st Tues check which I thought had been discontinued. I hope WCBT didnt ruin WFTC's check but I'm afraid they did because Roanoke Rapids and Kinston are only about 75 miles apart. WLVA in Lynchburg is only 110 miles from WCBT too. All 3 have about equal R9 and WCBT had an interesting program. Sorry we didnt have a clear channel for the program because it certainly deserved it. I guess we booted one this time. I can hear W8X0 weakly in with the carrier of WHO on 1040 figure that out. WCBT picked the time for their program. We asked for 4-5AM TO Dick Cooper-I am running low on CPC stationery. Could you send me some??? Lefty.

LEN KRUSE-DES MOINES IA. Finally, after months from DXing I was very fortunate in hearing the clubs special this morning from WTCM, a swell program for our club. Really glad to see our long list of future club specials coming up and thanks to the CPC committee headed by Ernie Cooper. Lets all make an effort in dialing for these specials.
