Now how to get WPRP-WPAB and WICA? Antenna masts repaired and a new antenna is up. It is a patched up job of my favorite Zep type. Flat top is of #12 soft and #10 hard drawn copper, 130 ft long and 50 ft high. At point where impedance was thought to be highest, I coupled on to an old parallel wire transmission line of low impedance with a Lynch transformer. It is surprisingly good on SW especially with the DEBO and gives good loud sigs on the BCB. Guess I will have to wait until later in the year to give it a good try on these waves however. (Well Herb I still have to get mine back to normal but will get at it this next week I hope-Ray)

WIBU's 2nd verie was a letter verifying an eariler report and KBPS sent their rather strange card. I havent sent any reports out and probably wont all summer. Anyway I want to thank you and all the swell fellows in the NRC who so kindly helped me out when ever I had a quiry or asked for help. Lets hope we have a honey of a season this coming winter. Incidentally can anything be done about WCBT???? LOOK LEFTY. )OK on the FCC news Bill, send it along and I will get it in someway)

AL BARTHOLOMEW-BRADFORD N.Y. Tnx for info on WEGO. By the way where is WJMA in Va or Fy. (Its in Va, Al.) I caught WMUR one evening after trying nearly all season. Usually all I hear is WIP or WIOD. Have tried for WAYS but no luck. Received a card from KBPS after writing them. It does not specify verify unless written in. Lucky we have a letter veric. Well as to my report of the past seasons DX. Not too many but still quite a few for me, 35 of them out of 39 reports sent out. Those failing to reply are KEQ-CMCH-HJCS-WING. First 3 not much expected due to war & censorship and the last not a good report. Was my first season that I didnt verify at least one foreign station outside USA or Canada. Canada was very good to me and I added CKWF-CHMT-CHOW to complete Ontario for 1st time. CHAD completed Quebec once again. CJVI was added to cut down those needed in B.C. Leaves me 4 active Canadian stations unverified not including CJFA and brings my total to 113 Canadians verified. Balance of seasons veries are of course all USA, all which were welcome additions Seasons highlight for me was KBPS after 11 years of DXing for them. They are still a 100 watter you know. Others that I consider my best catches were KBON-KWKW-KWLK-KSJB-WMUR-WBBB-WSAP-WSRR-KWAL. KWAL however was a duplicate verie. Still have quite a number left to gun for next season. 36 in fact. Doesnt seem possible that one time during my DXing I cut my wanted list to 7 stations needed in USA. Guess that will never happen again. Never have been able to verify either California-Oregon-Washington or South Dakota completely. Altho every other state has been completed at least once and many several times. My home state NY leads my veries with a 77 total. California 2nd with 65 verified and Texas 3rd with 63 verified. Oh yes my total is now 1337 verified. (Nice going Al)

It was too bad that I didnt know Charles Norton's address before I left as I was in Oakland every night for the 2 and half weeks I was stationed at Alameda.
