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TIPS and LPO REPORTS

December 2 1944

Your Editor had the pleasure of having P/O Eric Whitworth-Dunedin, New Zealand as his guest on Nov 27-28th. Every one here at 325 Shirley enjoyed his presence and it is hoped that Eric enjoyed his visit as much as we did. It is hoped that he will return to Buffalo in the very near future. Eric and Pop had a swell gab fest until 3AM and then it was DX, until 7 AM believe it or not. Eric copied WAJR but CKVD was not heard although the SX-25 and Scott were both tuned in. Eric also copied several others as they came on and we both hit the hay at 8AM only to be up again at 12:30 PM to land a couple more that can be heard here daytimes. Eric started to copy WHBC on 1480 kcs in Canton, Ohio but all of a sudden it changed to WHOM in Jersey City. A swell talk was had about his home land and about the New Zealand DX Club. Now I really want to get down there in that DXers Paradise. All in all it was a swell visit from a very swell fellow. Good luck to you Eric and come back real soon.

LEFTY COOPER-BROOKLYN N Y Well I finally did some DXing and had pretty good luck. CHEX and KBWD were both heard on their dedications on 11/22. KBWD was only R 3-4 while CHEX had a live show and good too and really boomed in. Both received a report. I couldn't hear the titles of the Marches KBWD played but thanks to my attendance of the summer Goldman Band concerts here in Brooklyn, that I logged them all OK. That evening I was surprised and happy to receive another visit from the Iowa Kid, Len Kruse and we had a swell time DXing on a very good evening. WHBU on 11/23 was hrd s/off along with WHIZ at 1AM. WJBJ was testing (hope all you who need that one heard him then) at 2:50-just a test, nothing regular. WTCM heard s/off at 3:06 and 2 went off at 3 on 1450 kcs, probably WNOE and KRIC. WHUB and WIBU both checked 3:30-4 regular 4th THURS checks. 11/25 CKWS received with good signal on their DX-another fine show and they were new to me. 11/26 Up all morning (instead of out all morning) and logged 3 new ones. At 12:15 AM WENR-WGN and WMAQ all had same program, but not on any of the networks. At 1:13 I ran into CKRC coming thru KXOK and KVOB and the latter 2 went off at 2:02 and CKRC at 2:04₂ AM. They have a short news broadcast at 2AM and are easy to log them, R-7. I caught all these on sign offs WHIO-WING-WBNS-WCAE-CHMI-CMCY-WINN (s dedication featured Henry Busse's Orch and out tips., Very enjoyable program. At around 3:10 there was some strange noises on 1240 kcs dont know what it was. I believe I heard WNEC testing between 3:22-3:59 on 1340 kcs. It was almost as loud as WHAT and better than WEXL. WERC testing, still on 1490 kcs and over riding PWSW-WJBK at 4:18. 11/27 Finally logged CJRL (Hi Dr Kirk) this morning R-5 or so, with fine program and CKRN was doing very nicely against WHBC, about even in volume. WGGGA hrd s/off at 4, maybe check.

PAT REILLEY-JAMESTOWN N Y 11/21 Who checked on 1230 kc 4-4:15 for RCA in New York???? KBWD could hardly be heard because noise was lousy. 11/22 A station on 1340 kcs checked at 3:14 but couldn't catch call, it was a K station, a mexican on 1250 from 3:30 to after 4 but too noisy when they announced to catch call. 11/23 A houseful of company, didn't get up; 11/24 WHOP could hardly be heard thru QRM and static; 11/25 CKWS reported to but static was lousy, WBYN finally verified after 3 tries, wrote to Geo Krovitz, Xmr operator at his home 7919 20th Ave., Brooklyn 14, N.Y. This makes 1299 in the log; 11/26 Too noisy and back to bed; 11/27 CJRL quite good. WGGGA on a check at 4:31, could not get a peep out of CKRN. The 3 BBC stations on 877-1122-1149 kcs were all good until after 4 AM. WROX back for 1300 varies in log with Charles R Hicks as c.e.. David M. Segal, station manager.

CPL ROBERT BROWN I visited Larry Yarnes and hrd my 1st 2 Alaskans KFAR Co "E" 3rd REGT was fair and KFQD who was good. Were able to copy hit A G F R D # 2 thru most of KECA's tone test program. At same time Fort Ord, Calif. KGU was fair & KGAB was good but far from (cont Pg 5)

CPL BOB BROWN cont its best. If Larry and Gene Allen tell you boys they heard Eurpoe on the BCB, I'll second them, for my money we positively identified the BBC transmitter on 877 kcs. The signal was very weak but several items could have been logged for indentification.

JOE BRAUNER-WILLIAMSVILLE N Y Just getting back to DX again, due to the illness and death of my Father recently. DXing has very much been forgotten these last few weeks as a result. All specials were missed. Nothing new to report except that WHTD was logged on their 7AM s. on recently, very much WRMed by WING etc. Only veries are nice letters from WHTD & KEVR. Then this morning 11/28 when TA's broke out all records for reception at my QRA. BBC stations on 877-668-767-1122 and 1149 kcs were really coming in, most of them being solidly readable until past 3AM. Also one sounding like a German on 658 and another on 841, unidentified TA on about 720 and what was undoubtedly SBV on 1086 kcs, at least the announcing certainly resembled that which I've heard on Swedish SW stations. Besides this many other unidentified signals and hetrodynes all over the band. Very interesting but I'd much rather have fished one of my needed USA or Canadians out from behind WCOL or WHAT etc. (Sorry Joe and you can be sure sympathy comes from us all-Ray)

JOE ENZ-BROOKLYN N Y Reports out to CKPC-CKWS-CKRN and hope to get CKVD this AM. Also forgot to mention CJRL. Here is one I'd like to get dope on, while waiting for CJRL a station on 1150 broadcasting French and German at 3AM announced as United National, American Voice (in German) Verlinge Natzion Amerikas Stihme. This station gave war news in German, plays Yankee Doodle, then drum beats 3 short, one long, letter "V" 4 times. I am German descent and understand and speak it good. I wonder if that's the so called TA heard on 1149 kcs. I dont believe it is a TA but an unknown USA station giving no call. Veries in from CKPC, card and letter, WWDC-^WFEA cards. (Well boys what say on Joes station ??????)

HAROLD HOWARD*WAPAKONETA O Reports out since last week art to WGRM-KBWD-CHEX on NRC DX-WAAT-KOH for a new state-KPRO-WIBU. 11/26 WINN on NRC DX. They read our tips twice and gave our club some swell publicity. They also advertised that they need 2 regular operators and one Chief Engineer; 11/27 WGGG stated that starting with this broadcast they would verify all reports if addressed to the Chief Engineer; KCKN-WFCI for another new state. CJRL on their swell DX. Their signals were very steady and I copied them 100% for over an hour. Also KGIW (I hope they verify) and CHEX on reg sked at 6:30 AM. Only 5 veries received in past week, KR0D-WBNJ-WBLK-CKEY-WOL. For BILL GABRIEL-I have an old issue of All Wave Radio in which there is an article listing some meanings of call letters. As soon as I can get a little time I'll copy them and pass them along to you. Also for any one else who may want them, just drop me a line (203 E Augleize St. and I'll get them out as soon as possible. For DAVE THOMAS-About your WIT on 560 kcs. many stations check and test with the Washington Institute of Technology and I have heard stations abbreviate as WIT instead of saying the whole name. My guess is that what ever your station was, they were testing with W.I.T.. I wont venture a guess as to what the 560 was.

HERB CAMPBELL-ATHENS PA There is very little DX activity here this season. Are working the longest hours yet and this early AM stuff is a little more than I can take except in small doses. On NRC DXes CJRL and WATW have yielded needed veries. KWBU has been reported and informal reports went to WBNY-CHEX. Very sincere regrets were sent CKPC who were on the air too late for me to hear. Some darned noise here sounds like seconds being ticked off with loud plops, would drive you nuts. Remember remarks about sash cord to support aerials. To Mc LEOD-If you are using the braided sort, I will bet it is good for 5 years and will last as long as that galvanized steel cable #0 Think. used for clothes line. Will stretch.

NEWT MC LEOD-W PERU ME We have had foul weather here lately and plenty of noise with some what erratic reception. Monday night most of the band was dead and WCOV and WRDO were hrd till after 11 PM which never happened before that I remember. Missed KBWD but did get CHEX after a 15 minute wait although carrier was on at 5AM. Power company has been putting in new poles, maybe a little less noise-MAYBE. Veries received lately from KWAT-KOA and a report of Nov 10 1943, also CKPC a letter and card. Notice that CHGS sometimes shows up here in the afternoon. Yesterday VONF blew in at 12:30 PM just in time to say they were closing their first period and would be back on at 6PM (4:30 PM EWT) To JOE ENZ- I dont think VONF has any YL's, Aubrey March and Bob McLeod are the only announcers I have heard. I see another of those Mexicans has gone commercial. XEMO was on Nov 23rd with plugs for Tumbling Blocks. Got CKWS this AM but WDBJ covered their 100w stand by rig. Wonder if anyone has heard their 15 watts link? By the way does anyone remember the call of one of those Super-powered Mexicans back about 1932? Which used a balloon to hold up its verticle? The wire broke and the balloon drifted off and I believe the station was later closed down due to the type of commercials and interference it caused. I believe KDKA tried the balloon stunt at one time to see how a verticle would work. 11/27 Best AM from coast to coast. CJOC thru and on top of KYW-CFCN covering KLRA; CKCK on top of 620 kcs and another western Canuck on top of WICC at times. CKOV really loud as soon as KVOG off and right after CKOV came KOH. Other end of band wasnt so good but I got CJRL off and on and seemed best 4-4:30. CKRN a chinch here. Also the usual mess of TAs, all loud. Thought I had a couple new ones but they turned out to be WLWO, must be a leak some where. I do think I got a TA on about 795, had it only a minute but it sounded like the usual Axis POW program. KMJ at 2:55 with not a sign of CKEY. Also think I had KGMB at times. (OK Next, the other stamps within a week-Ray)

DICK COOPER-KITTANNING PA Well fellows it happened. I got a verie from Alaska. KPAR's swell letter arrived after 10 months. They said they begged apologies for having unwritten neglected to answer it. Then "We're more than happy to verify your reception of KPAR at 2:45 AM EWT Jan 22 1944" Also a verie from KBWD on the NRC dedication and A W Stewart, c.c. says he is also supervisor of Police Radio, City and county KGNW. Also KBWD will check Dec 18th 4-4:15. Enjoyed the swell progr, of CHEX and the boys at CHEX mentioned tuning in KBWD as per the DX calendar. Best shot of the season was CJRL's excellent program which was received very well. Reception conditions good most of morning. Terry Sands really gave the NRC plenty of plugs and acknowledged the reports on the last program as well as making dedications to our officers and directors. CKRN just barely hrd in back of WHBQ at sign on. Same AM KEX was testing at 4:15; KGU was strong. Numerous TAs showed up well and one on 997 kc was hrd a few mins. Presume this to have been Hilversum. CFRN logged s/off at 2:04 which was new for me. KFBB in the clear from 1:05 on Mon AMs. Note KFBB dop MALEY. KEVR copied this AM also, so it was the best AM of the season for me. CPC results away under par. I guess most of the stations are having a tough time to maintain reg skeds let alone run early morning programs. This is the best TA season I have ever experienced, but even so I dont get much kick out of them. Sure do appreciate the reports from all you fellows that have been making our bulletins 100%. Only wish I had more time to DX and write letters.

BILL STONE-TORONTO ONT Well here I am again, feeling a little more like life than I have in past 3 weeks. Have my 2 major operations over and hope to be out of here soon. Now the QRA is Bed 14 Ward "B" S W A. (OK Bill and we all wish you a very speedy recovery. Hope that you will get that wish of yours very soon.-Ray)

S/SGT AL MALEY-HIGHLAND FALLS NY The AMs of 11/26 & 27 best for DX in quite a spell. Sat night I decided to make an alnite spell thru the AM of the 26th and was pretty successful. WBIR and WAFJ taking over their respective channels at 1:15; At 1:30 copied CKRC for report, altho the whole Blue network (KVOD-KXOK-KOH) was on top of them. CKCK hrd s/off at 2:03 after which I copied KTAR for a report. Had a swell card and EKKO stamp from KTAR some years back but lost it, so I'll have to try again. Monday AM woke up at 3:30 and copied CJRL for about 40 minutes or so. They were pretty poor considering the swell conditions prevailing at the time. At best they were Q 3-4 R 5 and never held the same R Level for more than 5 seconds. Maybe I need a new receiver. WGGG on freq check from 4:15-4:30 stating they have not verified in the past, but commenced with this program they would answer all reports. That should be good news for some of the boys. CKRN came thru WHBQ pretty well and I copied them for a full hour. Was that Roger Legge doing the announcing, or did the announcer just refer to him at one point in the program. WINN came thru on NRC special Sunday AM and gave us plenty of free advertising. Apparently he never heard of Albert Hi. Also gave call as CVRN instead of CFRB. In case you didn't hear him, Vernon Nunn was asking if we knew of any engineers running around loose, as two of them are needed at WINN. ELLERT STANGELAND-JUANITA N.D. Suppose you boys would like to know what my equipment consists of. Its just a 1936 Musicaire (Coast to Coast's trade name for a Sentinal) 6 tube battery operated. No high line here yet. Just 6 volt winchargers. Only static is the winchargers on SW, the lightning in summer, when too busy to even look at a radiol. It is way too soon after the heavy work season for me yet to hear any DX. Guess I dont have much chance of hearing stations across the Atlantic or Latin America, or TPs on the bcb for that I will have to stick to SW but I enjoy bcb DX all the same. Dont nothing so far this fall except can hear WFAF-WOR every evening without much trying. Living almost in the geographic center of the continent should have some advantages tho. I should be ablt to hear quite far in all directions in the US. (OK Ellert and good DX)

JAMES KAUER-CLEVELAND O I dont get much chance to DX in the early AMS. I would like to hear more NRC DXes but for some reason they do not fall on week ends. Set I use is the family bcb receiver and if I am planing to hear a DX it means staying up till the program comes on. On school AMS I get up at 6:15 CWT. It isnt often I get a chance to hear DX on those mornings. Most of my DXing is done from sunset to MDT and sometimes in the mornings around 6AM. Receiver is an old 5 tube Radiola (1931-30) and I havent the slightest idea why it works at all. The 2 RF stages dont work but if I pull out the tubes to set does not work. Have added several wires etc to increase regeneration and also an antenna tuner which greatly increases signals on the lower part of the band. Havent been able to get good reception this year on freq above 1050 kc. However reception below that is very good. Will try to find out what the trouble is. So far no luck. CBK comes in about 5:45PM; TIPG has swell signal nearly every nite and TIGPH on 605 kcs is often heard. I graduate from High School in Jan and I become 18 Jan so it looks as if my DXing time may be limited for the duration. I think that the freq column is swell, dont have to look thru all the reports for information. (LPO means Distening Post Observers)
