BOB WEAVER-YORK, PA. I was awaiting the current issue of "DX News" to get the reaction of the members to the WAAN DX program which yours truly and two guys by the names of Routzahn and Criswell had the pleasure of participating in. It was very gratifying to note that the boys seemed to like the program. It was our idea to try to give them a little scmething cut of the ordinary. From all reports there seems to have been some other station who had their carrier on during the course of this bondeast, and of course since they were on the same frequency as WLAN did considerable damage in limiting the distance which WLAN's signal reached. At any rate, I was a bit disappointed that they didn't reach the West Coast, & I imagine that: the staff of the station must have felt somewhat the same way. I saw Eugene Garnes today, I might add that he formerly worked in the same radio store with me prior to landing a job as Ass't Eng. with FLAN, & he said that to his knowledge the furthest report has been read from Iowa.
