1st-Frequency check skeds. If known to be regular.

2nd-Verie Signers of USA who do not Qsl regularly.

3rd-V/S and Qth of stations outside of USA and Canada.

4th-Early S/on or late S/off of hard to hear stations (not 7am til 12 midnite).

5th-Information as to the initial equip. tests, provided it will be published in time to be of benefit to all or most members.

In other words, Al feels that only news that will be of help in logging and verifying stations should be included in Dx Down The Dial. All other items such as hearing a station on such and such a date should be in the Musings Of Members sections. We agree with Al on these points but we have to print something here and as this has been in the bulletin before and a vote taken on it we feel that most of all members agree to these points. But items are items and we try to print them all, no matter what their value may be so that we do not slight any members sending in items of small value or interest to others.

Will not promise but seeing as I work a half a day on Sat. and and Sept. 1st being a Holiday. I may get up to Buffalo for a day anyway. That would be on Sunday Aug. 31st.
