### NNRC & NRC NOW CO-OPERATING ON DX PROGRAMS

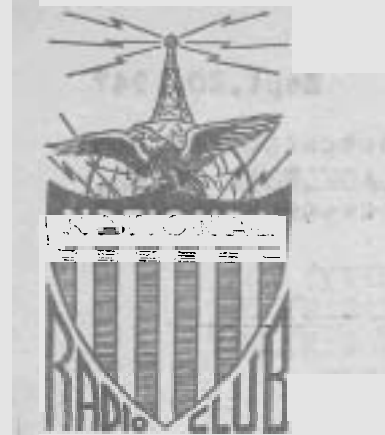

The following 8 new veries were received since the last bulletin: KXLA WBGE WEXT WHAN WHAW WHAW WIMS WMAM ZBM. KXLA & WHAN were nice printed QSL cards in envelopes, & ZBM was a neat card. Am tickled pink to get WMAM's swell letter. I was lucky to catch this rare one for 10 minutes on a special test on 8/26. Also pleased to add WHAW's letter. According to it, this call was used only on the morning of 8/28, their reg call being WKLY. Guess everybody has ZBM's card now. There has been a great deal of increase in activity on the air the past 10 days, with 13 new stations heard on ETs. A total of 119 reports were sent to the following new catches: 9/5- WCOM & WVOK on ETs, 9/7- KENT on reg. sked. & WJDA & WBEX on ETs; 9/8 - WWST & KSIW on ETs; 9/9- WIKY on f/c. WBRO & WOTW on ETs, & WHUN on a DX broadcast. 9/10- WHFB on ET. 9/11- WKNX on a special test, & WHAB on ET. 9/12- WAND on ET. 9/13- WKMA on f/c. 9/14- WWOL on ET. 9/15- WMNC on ET, & KSAC testing their new 5 kw. transmitter. I was certainly glad to get that last one. Everyone should have heard this very rare catch because they must have covered the country with goo signals, they were R-8 here. CONTEST FOR SEASON 1947-48.

- 1) The 1947-48 DX Contest will be on a mileage basis. All stations heard and verified on the broadcast band from 540 keys up to and including 990 keys will be eligible. Only legitimate commercially licensed broadcast stations will count.
- 2) Eligible stations must be heard after 12:01 AM, October 1, 1947 and not later 11:59 PM, March 31, 1948. Veries from above eligible stations must be in contestants hands by June 30, 1948
- 3) Points will be computed as follows:

| c) From 1,001 to 1,500 miles from listener                          | 2 Points.. |
| d) From 1,501 to 2,000 miles from listener                          | 3 Points.  |
| e) From 2,001 to 2,500 miles from listener                          | 4 Points.  |
| f) Over 2,500 miles from listener                                   | 6 Points.  |
- g) N.R.C. DX Specials and Specials listed as dedicated to "All Clubs" will count 3 Points plus whatever distance category it falls in. The Specials will count 3 Points only if less than 500 miles from the listener. Only one special from any one station will count.
- 4) National Geographic Map used by the contest mgr. will be the final authority.
- 5) There will be an entry fee of 25¢ from each member entering the contest, which must be mailed to the Contest Mgr. by October 31, 1947. All money will be used for prizes. New members may enter within one month of joining club and Rule 2 will apply.
- 6) Contest is open to any NRC member in good standing and he must still be in good standing at the end of the contest to be eligible for any prizes.
- 7) Contest Manager will be, Tom Carberry, Jr., 22 Louvaine Drive, Kenmore 17, N. Y. and any assistance he may deem necessary.
- 8) Contest manager at his discretion may call in any verie and if contestant fails to comply, his contest standing and entrance fee will be forfeited.
- 9) No prize will be over \$2.50 cash and there will be at least five prizes for first five positions, plus 50¢ for members reporting the most NRC "All Clubs" DX Specials.
- 10) Only one verie from any one radio station will count.

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 The Board acted real quick on the above rules and in this way it could be published in this issue instead of the Oct. 4th bulletin as was originally planned. Thanks to them for the quick work. If it is ok with our Editor, the results will be published in the second weeks bulletin, once a month beginning with the Nov. 8th issue. Have your first months results in to the Contest Mgr. by October 31st. It is hoped that we'll have a bang-up entry list this year, so sit down NOW and send that quarter in before it slips your mind. You might take a map out and look over the possibilities in your location. You'll see that this is about as fair a contest that could be worked out for everybody concerned. Before this list of rules has even been published, we have five entries so keep up the good work. Regarding the prizes, there will be at least five and we have a very nice donation from Stan Morss. Any changes in the prizes will be listed in future bulletins but remember there will be at least as many as Rule 9 states with the possibility of more being added.
