I've been wanting to send in a report for quite some time but haven't just had any extra time. Haven't done any DXing since coming to Altoona last March except last week, WNBK & WPDJ. Last season I had 205 heard and 171 veries. I didn't get a chance to send any follow-ups or it probably would have been better. WJSW expects to be testing on Oct. 6 on 1290. It's sort of hard to get that information from the competition, but that's it. It will be night-time directional 500 W. beamed NW. Here at WRTA we will DX for the clubs any good night. Same goes for WFBG where there is some changes being made in the antenna. Couldn't get to the Convention this year. We are a little short of help here & are putting in 55 hours a week, so that doesn't leave much time to get away. WTWS in Clearfield probably never will get on the air. They have had their antenna up for 9 months but nothing since. (Ed. note: Joe is an engineer at WRTA.)

Verie total is 1259 & there must be 200 that can be added in the next couple of months. My contest entry is on the way to Tommy Carberry. Had a swell time at the Convention, & am looking forward to next year. Got a kick out of Carroll's annual bit of verse. Too bad he composed it so soon - he won't get in any DX this winter now with that off his chest. Carroll is probably the world's best poet when it comes to rhyming such words as beer, ale, champagne, whiskey, etc. WAND gets the honors for prompt verification. Heard them on 2nd test stating all reports from NRCers had been verified & they welcomed more. A swell letter, back from them in 2 days!

Dave Thomas - Proctorville, O.

(First report for several months.) Been testing almost every known receiver on the market today during past several months, & a full detailed comparison between each will be told in special URDXC article in the near future. Over \$3,000 worth of receivers were investigated & compared in the tests. Today received a TELEFUNKEN (supposed to be one of the best foreign-made sets) but unless I change my mind it will be sold or given away before the month is over. If it was not damaged in transit from Germany it is a poor receiver, when put up against some best USA makes. First dial is very crowded on 1400-900 Kc/s., & 900-500 Kc/s. spread way out. New Telefunken no short-wave. 130-350 Kc/s. fair. No off-on switch on it, & only can be turned off & on by pulling it out from power line. But there is one thing about it - it is one of the strongest and best built receivers I have ever seen (in cheap price lines, USA) sturdy built & can take it. Only 2 panel controls - volume & dial tuning. On side, band switch. I was very much disappointed in it & will let it go on unless change my mind real soon. If that is the best Europe puts out, now see why DXers limited over there to the higher powered USA stations. Instructions are all in German, & it may be that I have not found all the fine points yet, but think I have. Few good to fair veries in during summer: CEPR Prince Rupert on test. 50 watts. Saigon, French Indo China, 1050 Kc/s., Ceylong on 600, & few others. So many new ones on the air it is hard to keep up with them, but here in Ohio some latest on are WWSW WAND WBEX. 2 veries in from ZBM here, with no follow-ups. They're R8 every Mon. AM at 4, until after 5 here, in clear, easy. Also verie from Battleship Missouri on special broadcast heard some time ago. Daytime catches keeping me busy are WBEX WMOA WKBC WQWR WWOL WREF WPDJ WWGP WABZ WEAS WSUA WFWO WMUS, & dozen or so others. Sure have me on the jump - new ones come on faster than I get reports off. Think I had YVICE the other a.m. on 730 Kc/s. but not sure, nor will I report it until verie is in. I'm not so hot on foreign languages.
