Anybody ever ask you what "DXing" is? Well, here is a short thesis on the subject, by Derek Wherton, NRC member in Chicago, as submitted to us by Leo Herz, of that city.

"What is DX? Let "X" equal the unknown, and "D" equal distance, then "DX" equals the hobby of finding distant, unknown radio stations on your home receiver.

"DXing is the ideal hobby for anyone who loves geography, who feels the lure of far-away places, yet has little hope of traveling there himself. With one hand on "DX Down the Dial" and the other hand on a good map or atlas, he comes to feel a kinship with every cross-roads and corner of our U.S.A., and many countries abroad.

"DXing is a hobby which costs almost nothing to pursue, and is therefore especially suited to those interested in radio, who cannot afford to operate short-wave amateur transmitters.

"The hobby of DX is as old as radio broadcasting, which first started in 1922 with KDKA in Pittsburgh, Pa., & celebrates its 25th anniversary this year.

"Many old-timers in this hobby have verifications, by card or by letter, numbering into the thousands. Among these are letters of historical interest from pioneering stations which no longer exist.

"DXing is increasing in interest. With each passing month of the post-war expansion in radio, the number of new stations is growing by leaps and bounds. Some of these stations will survive the years to come, others will be extinct in a few years. DXers have a ring-side seat in watching the struggle for this survival and expansion.

"The thrill of picking up a rare signal which he hardly dared hope for, through tough interference, and of getting verification of reception, can be compared to a stamp collector's enthusiasm when he has tried for years to get a stamp and finally finds it. DX can put you in touch with other people of similar interests, all over the country. Special, early-morning programs (between midnight and dawn) are sometimes arranged for the special benefit of DX clubs.

"The National Radio Club, with Head-Quarters in Buffalo, N.Y., will welcome inquiries from anyone interested in getting into this fascinating hobby. Does time hang heavy on your hands? Do you suffer from insomnia? DX may be just what you need. A flick of the wrist, a twist of the dial - your blues fade away, you're busy for a while.
