WRITE-UPS FOR THIS WEEK'S DX PROGRAMS

- WFBG - Altoona, Pennsylvania** This program will be on on Monday, January 26, instead of February 2, and will be dedicated to the National Radio Club, the Newark News Radio Club, and the March of Dimes, and will be on the air from 1:00 to 4:00 a.m. This is a station rarely heard these days, though it is an "old-timer" as radio stations go. Again Joe Pelletier will be on hand, and send your reports to him, care of WFDG. It is a pleasure to join with this cause.
- WATN - Watertown, New York.** We feel too much cannot be said in praise of Harry Righter and his WATN frequency checks. Month after month, Harry dedicates selections to the DXers who write in, and he also plays your requests. This is a Sunday morning, and of course WATN won't be in the clear, but a good many can and do listen each month to some good-natured kidding and some nice musical numbers. So, thanks, once again, Harry!
- KVAN - Vancouver, Washington** This program will be on either on Feb. 1 or Feb. 2, so been the look-out for them on both mornings. We do not have the verie-signer's name on this program, but we believe Mr. Edgar R. Means, is still KVAN's Chief Engineer. KVAN has recently gotten unlimited time, and reports are very much desired on this transmission for the DX fans. So, everybody be sure to be tuned in, and send those reports. Arranged by the N.N.R.C.
- KFAR - Fairbanks, Alaska.** A station everybody wants to hear, and a three-hour special program for us to shoot for. They're keeping a very detailed log for this show, including musical numbers and hope for your reports. XEBZ signs off at 4:00 a.m., which should give KFAR a clear channel after that time. Mr. Jack M. Walden, Acting Chief Engineer will be looking for your reports - send them by Air Mail - 5¢ an ounce. Arranged by Ken Albrecht.
- WFAU - Augusta, Maine.** They'll be tough with interference from WEXL & WHHM, but a few tuning hints. WFAU will feature much local color, with stories about Augusta and the station, and the program will be in segments, presenting 15 minutes of Hill-billy music, Johann Strauss waltzes, Band music, and Old Favorites, though not necessarily in that order. - KOAT - Albuquerque, New Mexico.** And with this program, we begin a series of 4 DX programs from the stations of the ZIA Network of New Mexico. "We will be glad to do anything we can to make your series a success," says Mr. Merle H. Tucker, General Manager of KOAT. 1450 should be clear for at least some of this program, so let's all get in there and pull this friendly station through. Comparative reports with the programs of the other ZIA stations would be veal.
- WHWL - Nanticoke, Pennsylvania.** "The Voice for Greater Anthracite" honors us with a DX-Test on 730 Kc/s. Again, we have the interference from CKAC with which to contend, but again we look for WHWL to break through for most of us. Here, we extend our thanks to Chief Operator Mr. Bernard Hyzinski, who has agreed to run this test for us DXers. Don't forget them, and be sure to send in those reports. This station is in the heart of the hard coal mines of Penna.
- KFUN - Las Vegas, New Mexico.** The second of the ZIA Network programs takes the air on Feb. 3, and an old friend of the DXers. KFUN will be the station to honor us at this time. WQPO KKKL CKPW and AGPJ will help to hold KFUN down, but they should be heard in the east, for WITH will be silent. Let's be in on 1230 and tune for them, and send a report. Mr. E. N. Twaites, General Manager said, "We would be happy to air a DX program for your organizations." NWRC

Veries have been rather slow again this week, with these in: CPCC KOGT KOLO KTSM WCNB-DX WJNL WLEK WJWP TELS. Have sent reports out to KQW KFCO KGME KIPA WFLW KJR KROW RSFO KLWT CJNB-DX KRPL-DX KFFM WRIB-DX WKOX-DX KIMO-DX (V5SR) KFMV KBYE-DX CKRC WNAO KODI. This has been a good week for DX for us here, especially with all the specials during the past week. WCNB was S-9 in the clear on 1/11 and verie card back in 5 days. CJNB heard audibly for about 7 minutes with QRM from KSON, while WFLC was courteously off the air. KRPL also heard same warning for about 10 minutes, when WJWP harmonic and other FCs and ETs were not interfering. WJWP & WRCX, both heard well, about S-9 with good DX slows on 1/12 also. KIMO was on 1/12 with test program, mentioning very frequently the NRC & NNRC. Was this to have been a special or not? KBYE gave good signal on its special on 1/17, except that a tone-modulated carrier, possibly WJWP, was over-riding it for 30 minutes. Many thanks to the Editor for reminding Bunder that KQPI in Cody, Wyoming, gave FC on 3rd Saturday. He and I logged him for our first Wyoming catch on 1/17 with S-9 signals. WNAO testing on 850 2:45-3:30 on 1/17. On 1/10, WVLK was off prior to 4:30 AM for some reason, which was very advantageous since KFXG & KGMP were fighting it out at 3:30. It is quite a set, and now I'm looking for a pre-selector to make it even better. Funny, but the Scott seems to be human - it started to set up the first morning I used the 129, dying out from 650 on down to 540. I'm still trying to get used to all these dials and gadgets (and even sneaking an occasional listen on S.V.!) As to DX this past week, reports went out to just these: KBKI-LX (in spite of tremendous buzz here due to rain) WQPA-DX WAPX rag sked, WJHR WJCR PHAW WMON. I heard a couple of selections on 850 but WJNS had an image on that channel, making it difficult to log KBYE. I don't think I had them, but I did get a couple of tunes, which I do not think were from WJNS, so a report is being tried, just in case. No WJYU, doggone the luck. WJCR was heard in the afternoon behind WJEG, when they had a sermon on. I completely forgot WQCC, and I'm sorry, for I needed them. 1/19 - KPXJ and KCOL were of course, too late for the East so I tried for GFAB, and WPAM was on with their f/c and E-9 and in the clear, so I decided to go back to bed, since it was about 50° in the room. Nil also on KGIL - not a trace of a signal on 1200 here. I do hope you lads will tune for the specials, especially these foreign ones which I have managed to unearth - like YSO - YSW - HOX - TCL. These stations will definitely verify, so don't stay away from them. They're just as friendly to us as are the American stations - more so than some of them, hi. So what say you send in reports to them? Pardon me for putting in such a long report - it is being done only because we have some extra space, and I'd rather fill it than send out this issue with some blank space. I have heard that Hammarlund has just recently gone out of business - anybody know anything about this? Also, does anyone know what has become of my namesake in Kittanning? Don't fail to check the last page carefully - a couple of additions to the DX Calendar, and an important correction.

DAYTIME STATION SCHEDULES FROM MONTH TO MONTH.

Most of us have noted that daytime stations, even in the same time zone, have different sign-on and sign-off times. For example, WHLI's schedule is 15 minutes earlier than WGPA's on the same channel. It is your Editor's idea that if we got at least one station in each category to give us their schedule for the year-around, that then we could fit all daytime stations into categories. For example again, WHLI's schedule in January is 7:30-4:45, while WGPA is on until 5:00. WHLI could be put in "Class E-1" - Eastern Time Zone, category #1, while WGPA would be "Class E-2" and a station like say WPIE would be "Class E-3". Then we could all know when to tune for sign-ons and sign-offs of the daytime stations, by this classification. For instance, with the year-round schedules of each classification known, and published, and a new daytime station takes the air, as soon as we know one month's schedule, we'll also know its year-round schedule, which ought to help many of us to log the station at some time or another. So, any schedules of any daytime stations you may know of, send 'em along with your reports, and be sure to mention what month it covers, and we'll sooner or later be able to print a list with year-round schedules for daytime stations in each classification. Sound dizzy? It is!
