We'd like to apologize for missing a tip on WIAK, who put on a DX for the MNRC & NRC on March 12. We were notified, but mis-laid the notification.

Quite a discussion has been going on as to whather Hawaiian Time is 5 or 5 hours behind E.S.T. Mow Hall Wagner sends this letter to us, which he received from the Chamber of Commerce of Hombulk, Hawaii, which sattles this point for once and all. "Daar My. Wagner.

"We have received your letter of February 7 asking information about Hewalian Time. "Hawaii moved its clocks thand one-half hour on June 2k 1945, and established Hawaiian Standard Time as ten hours behind Creenwich Time. This action abclished the swkward two and one-half hour difference in time between the islands and the west coast of the mainland.

"It put Hawaiian Standard Time on an on-the-hour conformity with mainland time. Hawaiian Standard Time is now an even by hours behind Facific Coast Standard Time and five hours behind New York and Eastern Standard Time.

"The change was nade by the 194" Legislature upon the recommendation of the Governor.

So will try to fill this up with my late info. Veries rec are letters from WHBO-WAVU-WFAK-WSSP KFCO to bring my verie total to 1561. Reports went out to WGAI-WXAL-KOAT. DXed TDES and THURS ANS but got nothing. Hrd a lot of TTs and carriers, but it seems that no one was talking. Did hear KFYR or f/C 3/11 and said the temp in bismark was 26 below. Also their F/C is 2nd THURS 3:15-3:45. Sent out 19 follow up cards Wednesday and will now wait for results. Some were from way back. Still have about 15 more to send out and then will be caught up to Feb 1948. No veries in since Monday, so some should be dropping off here very soon. Well only about 3 weeks left for contest.

- CW-45-A Tacuarenbo, Uriguay. Have is a DX program which may well add a new country to your logs. This station has agreed to present this program for our clubs, and will use 1,500 watts power enough to get through to the scates, if the channel is clear, and if conditions are right. - WAOV Vincennes, Indiana. This progrem will immediately follow WAOV's regularlyachedulted frequency check, and will be especially for
 us Diers of the NNEC and the MEC. WADV has long been a familiar stand-by of
 the Di fene, and has always maintained a very friendly attitude toward those
 who like to thus for distant stations. We thank Mr. Edward Wallace of WAOV
 for agreeing to remain on the air after fivishing the check progrem, in order
 too make this special show available for the Diers. Arranged by the NNEC.
- WEUS Eastis, Florida. A very new station is WEUS, and it seems that only a few complet preliminary test broadcasts from them. So here we all have a great opportunity of adding them to our heard logs. The station is very such interested in its DX coverage, and is very desirous of receiving reports from all over, to check their directional array and sky wave. This frequency should be clear from coast to coast for this broadcast, so that all will have a good chance of logging WEUS. Thanks go to Mr. Frank W. Stebbins (NMBC)
- Longview, Texas Again a clear channel is envisioned in the States, but of course KHON, Honoluly, will still be on. However, no trouble is expected, and MFRC should ride through all over the nation. This program is where regular frequency check, and MFRC would like also to have a check-up on their sky-wave and coverege. For this program, we extend the nande clasp of thanks to Mr. James R. Curtis, President of MFRO, who has agreed to dedicate this check to the DX clubs and their members. Arranged by the NNEC.
- WENX Saginew, Michigan. Here is a "sunshine" station not heard very often at distant points. This special test will afford us that rare chance of logging this station. WEUX too, should have a clear channel, and with their 1.000 watts, and non-directional antenna, they should roll in for DXers everywhere. Mr. Max W. Thomas, Chief Engineer, is very anxious to have a complete check on the radiation of WENX, and enlists the help of the DX fraternity on this test. Thank you, Mr. Thomas! Arranged by the NNRC.
- WIDS Jacksonville, Illinois Another old and familiar radio station, WIDS, dedicates a test to our clubs. We are not certain of the exact time of the test, but it has even reported to be 2:30 to 3:00 a.m., which is the time they hold their frequency check, on the first Friday, and also 3:30 to 4:00. We should imagine the former time is the correct one, but we're not sure. Channel should be clear both times. Mr. G.J.Careone, C.E. will look for your reports, and WIDS has every report ever received, valuing than highly. NURC.


