It can be any time along about the last of the month. Hours of Broadcasting - 6:00 a.m. E.D.S.T. to 12:00 p.m., E.D.S.T. Type of Transmitter - Eastern Engineering, 250 watts. 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Musings of the Members, con'd

J. W. Waldron Newman - Tiffin 11, Ohio.

Thought it was about time to be sending you a few lines for your "Musings of the Members" column in "DX News." I have been a member for almost a year now, and haven't given any support to the National Radio Club other than my dues. So it is about time I sent you a few lines on what I have been doing in the way of DXing here, though I don't spend as much time at turning the dials as some of the fellows do that I read about in the "DX News." Just don't see how some of the fellows can send out so many reports to stations. So far this year I have sent out only 35 reports to stations. (My DX year runs from Oct. 1 to Oct. 1). Most of these reports were to Broadcast Band stations, though a few went out to SW stations and one to a long-wave station. Incidentally the report to the Long Wave station may interest some of the fellows. It is one of the oldest stations in the U.S., having been owned and operated by the Germans before World War I. It is a CW station and operates on 22.1 Kc/s., call WGG in Tuckerton, N.J. and is now operated by RCA. This information was given to me on a letter verie I received from the station. Veries in from BCB stations so far are: WMAQ 670; WHFD 880; WLOS 1380; WPTW 1090; KVDX 990; WELY 980; KFEL 950; WPAK 730; KMBC 980; WTRF 1290; KREI 1350; WPIT 730; WALT 1110; KVOL 1340; CJVI 900; WVLC 590; WPIC 790; WOV 1280; CHOL 680; WPF 910; WLOI 1540. KFEL at Denver has a swell card. CJVI heard on their special - sure sent a swell friendly verie letter and sent it Air-Mail. Sure makes a fellow feel good to receive a letter like that for a report. Of the 35 sent out, so far 26 are in. WLOI who have been testing lately around 4:00 a.m. also sent a nice letter and are interested in receiving reports. They are on 1540 Kc/s. with 290 watts in La Porte, Ind. P.O. Box #385. Charles F. Stinson, C.E. Heard KCRD testing on 1590 the AM of August 12 fairly good, but static bad and un-modulated carrier of WAKR helping to spoil things. Incidentally WAKR's carrier heard for hour before they s/on at 4:25 a.m. Static has been bad for DX this summer - seems to be very strong here most of the time, even on those quite-cool nights. Also on the 14th think I heard XENT back on the air. Sure that was the call mentioned. WOWO, Ft. Wayne, also on tasting on the 14th, on 1190. Static was terrific that AM, though I did stick it out for about an hour. WOWO is a local here & have never sent them a report so I did adter this test. Have tried to DX some this summer but very heavy static and all-nighters makes it a bit hard. Had planned on attending Convention this year but received a letter from Ray Edge yesterday that the Convention has been called off for this year, as not enough attending. Was a little disappointed as I would like to have met some of you famous DXers. Hope it'll go through in '49; and if all goes well maybe I can get to Buffalo for that one. Best DX to everyone. (Thanks for your swell report, Waldron! We surely hope to have some more in the future! -Ed.)

KCHY enclosed check for \$10.00 as my report was from furthest distance on their EEs. WBUX sent two ink blotters so another report sent, explaining what a DXer would like from a station. Looking forward to a more successful DX season this fall and winter - best DX to all!

Fred Van Moxness - Camp Hill, Penna.

The location here looks good. I plan to put up a 100-foot in the clear antenna on Saturday. It will be solid copper wire with probably a twisted lead-in off the end making it of a modified inverted L. I say modified, because the lead-in will be insulated. The receiver is at present at the Hammarlund place in New York for test and repair. I just sent it a day or so ago, and I don't know how long they will keep it. I hope to start DXing again on the ECB just as soon as it comes back. There is a lot of stuff to be heard daytime here that I really need. Just a quick turn across the band let me know that only about 8 frequencies are blank in the entire band at noon. The big New York stations are all good. WINS is fair, but WPCV is a total loss. With this issue, we are beginning a series of articles which we hope will be of help to DXers in adding rare catches to their logs. Your Editor has chosen several subjects, and since it is timely, we shall begin with one under the below title. Your comments will of course, be most welcome.

THERE OUGHT TO BE A "MOONLIGHT SAVING TIME."

But, unfortunately, there just isn't, but there is a DAYLIGHT Saving Time which can be of great aid in helping a DXer to add stations to his log. Daylight Saving, in most places, will end on the morning of September 26, and during this month of September, dawn is quite a bit later than it has been during the summer, and this affords the dialists to catch quite a few stations which sign on at 6:00 a.m., E.D.S.T., which is 5:00 a.m., E.S.T. Several members have difficulty in hearing New England, but that 5:00 a.m. hour this month should be one of the very best times to log some stations there. There are several 5:00 a.m. sign-ons on the grave-yard channels just asking to be logged - for instance, WALE in Fall River on 1400, which should be heard by some. On 1230, WTSV, the new Claremont, N.H. station comes on at 6:00, as do WHUC and WBVP. On 1450, WENE is one that signs on now at 5:00, while on 1400, WDOS & WELM, besides WALE, do likewise. 1490 sees WCUM, WTOR, WHAV, WIMR & WOLF on at 6:00 E.D.S.T. week-days. On 1340, WINX is one opening then, as well as WFAU. WMUR on 610 comes on at 5:00 now, and WFIL on 560 opens at 4:45 currently. WOV gets on at 3:45, while WEBB on 1330 starts at 5:30. WMJR on 1430 is another 5 a.m. station, as is WHCM on 1480. WIBX on 950 is opening currently at 4:00. WNYC gets on at 6:00 these waning summer days, including Sundays. WMBN & WWVA pop on at 3:30 now. You can also catch stations staying on Standard Time before their signoffs on any of several channels where D.S.T. stations have gotten off the air that extra hour earlier, opening the way for them. There are many instances of this, one being that WMAK, 1300, is now clear 1-2 a.m. in the East. There are many factors which operate in a DXer's favor, and we shall attempt to study them in this series of articles. Remember, D.S.T. ends in most states on Sept. 26. Chicago usually stays for another 4 weeks, which then means WSBC, 1240, is there at 6 am. Sundays. NEXT WEEK - "SEE YOUR LOCAL PAPER!"
