Musings of the MembersKermit Geary - Walnutport, Pennsylvania

Seven new veries were received during the past week, as follows: CBI KRZ, WFLB WHOB WIBE WMIE & WMIK. Of these, CBI was the usual CBC card, WMIK a nice printed card, and the remainder letters. It looks like the station heard during KCRA's DX time on 1/7 was CENW rather than KCRA. It was heard here too weakly to identify, so no verie was requested. If I do receive a KCRA verie, it will be for the duplicate report I sent them covering my reception of their Equipment Test of 3/6/48 on 1320 Kc/s. which they have failed to verify. CENW was already been verified on 1230 kc/s. with 250 watts. Regarding those WEAV letters, I try to be broadminded about "intended" veries, but it was impossible to construe WEAV's in any such way. So, I obtained an air-tight verie as described in the last bulletin. Well, conditions were on the fair side during the past week, with the following stations heard and reported: 1/20 - KTRN on Equipment Test from 3:25 to 3:38 a.m. for a 2nd try at a verie, KSGN on DX-Test from 3:42 to 4:05 a.m. with weak S-2 signals and fade-out from 3:48 to 3:57, and PEE-3 with S-7 signals on 1180 Kc/s. from 4:10 to 4:18 a.m. 1/21 - WNAG, Grenada, Miss., 1490 Kc/s., with its first official Equipment Test from 2:45 to 3:08 a.m., slightly off frequency off 1490 Kc/s., on the low side; and KXOA now operating on its new frequency of 1470 Kc/s. during its regular schedule from 3:30 to 4:04 a.m., right through XESM. 1/23 - WAYB on all A.M. for the March of Dimes; KAAA, Red Wing, Minn., 2250 Kc/s., on Equipment Test from 4:32 to 4:58 a.m., and a lucky catch, KLOK testing on 1170 Kc/s. from 5:41 to 5:43 a.m., a rare one here in the East. 1/24 - KPHC again with f/c from 2:25 to 2:40 a.m., and WFCM with an equipment test from 3:51 to 4:00 a.m. 1/25 - Conditions very poor, and WOAY was occupying 860 Kc/s. with a March of Dimes program during WFOK's test period. However, a weak station was heard in the background testing with music and tone modulation which may have been WFOK. KWAK on its regular f/c from 2:45 to 3:00 a.m. for a second try at a verie. Here's a bit of news: all Venezuelan stations have changed calls and are now using a 4-letter combination. For instance, YV5BG on 1020 Kc/s. is now YVEF. So, Al Malay and others, we'll have to re-verify all our YV catches, hi! (Kermit sends in correction on address of XEN. Old QTH was getting to XEW. Here it is - Emisora XEN - Rep. de Brasil No. 25, Mexico City, D.F.) Thanks for this info, Kermit! -Ed.

Got in at least a few minutes DX on six mornings this week with fair results. Half a dozen veries received: WTWT KFGO KOBE KSAC WLCS & WNEL, a duplicate. Reports sent WJNO WLCS WLIP WLSI KLAC WWYO WWSO KGLU KEVA WGAU and second tries to KULP & KLAS. Notice that KPLC has changed from 1490 to 1470 Kc/s. and that KIWW, San Antonio, Texas, is now in operation on 1540 Kc/s. as I've heard them after KGBC leaves the air in the afternoon. KIWW uses considerable Spanish, as San Antonio has a large Mexican population. 1/11 - WJNO 1230, f/c 3:30-3:45, announced as each 2nd Tuesday. 1/12 - WLCS, 1400, heard with f/c 3:15-3:30. 1/13 - WLIP 1060 with ET at 3:15 and WLSI, 900, ditto at 3:30. 1/14 - WWYO heard back of Mexican on 970, difficult to pull through; WWSO fair on special, but seemed to be another carrier on 1210 which made signal choppy. 1/15 - Argentine station heard on 910 at 4:00. Thought he said LRL, but could have been LR2 relaying them. At 4:13, WRNL came on and ruined any further chance of identification. 1/17 - KEVA, Shamrock, Texas, with ET on 1580 at 3:00; said they'd be on until 7:00. Anyway, I put them down as my 1,000th station heard. WGAU heard on 1340 with f/c at 3:45, but WAAA came on at 3:50 and covered him up. At 4:30, heard KNAK with ET on new frequency of 1280 Kc/s. Missed all three specials this morning - KXLC due to QRM from KLAS, but WKOB and CJFX just not heard. Best 73's. (This forwarded to Brooklyn by Ray Edge, missing last week.)

Thanks, Len Kruse, for info in recent bulletin. First of all, recent DX since 1st of year have netted not too many as had grippe nearly a week & laid off DX but those garnered were fairly decent ones. KSIJ & KNEK on 2nd, WEEC, WHOB on specials, WHEV, WLSI on equipment tests, KNOX, KMHK, KWOJ on regular f/c, ditto WGYV. WJIG & WVEZ on ETs also. CBI on special & this morning KPOJ for nearly an hour's report on their regular Saturday night recorded program. KNOX already verified was heard with both WGYV and WHBQ on at time. CBI a nice B-8 plus signal here on special so should have been well heard at least here in east. KPOJ heard with severe interference from KFAC until 5:30 when not a trace of KFAC who perhaps s/off near that time. However KFAC had a philharmonic program on at time and KPOJ dance program easily distinguished. CBX was heard last Nov. on regular schedule and they replied with their form card which does not unlike CBW's verify. CBW new card is different so I re-wrote CBX for a definite verification. They came back 2nd time with a letter of verification & I quote from part of letter: "The DX card which we mailed you is the same one which we are sending to all persons reporting reception of CBX. Yours is the first complaint to date that this card is not satisfactory. The details which you list in yours of Nov. 14th indicates quite definitely that you heard the signal of CBX, Alberta, etc." Must be mine was the first squawk. So you see you can get a definite verie out of them. Last season KOOL Phoenix & KOCH Houston both on ETs failed to verify repeated follow-ups. I recently tried a new method. I sent letters again & enclosed self-addressed prepared verification cards which both signed and returned promptly. Did same thing on KEYE in Perryton, Tex. for a report early this season. Used same method on KNEB Scottsbluff, Neb., but they haven't replied as yet. KNEB in Scottsbluff & WRSY, Hattiesburg, Miss. are both early-season hold-outs here and wonder if any member can give me assistance in getting a verie out of either? Quite a few veries back since my recent letter of Jan. 1. These include letter veries from KTJS KVMJ WIMS WNTC WEAU WHAV WNOX. WHOL WSES WFAX KSIJ WHYR WEEC WLX & CBX. Card replas from KEIO KNOX WIPR WJIG and large ones from KXXX yesterday. CHLO also verified by letter. Still CHNO out yet - they sure are taking long enough. Have sent out a few double post-cards to stations asking for f/c schedule & some replies might be of interest. Those giving sked. I sent in to Wagner for DX Down the Dial. A card from WTSV Claremont, N.H. said they had no set dates for f/c but was usually on Sat. nights late in month. However they said, "We are going to make a special broadcast for the NRC some time in January, you will probably get further details through your club secretary. Just what happened to this program? Jan. 19, WKTG, R-7. Jan. 20, KOOL, R-8. KSGN, no luck. KFRO, R-9. Other new ones that I have received besides the specials were: Jan. 4, WSEC, 3:40 a.m., Jan. 8, KELP, 3:15, R-7. Also on 1580 Kc/s, KEVA Shamrock, Texas was testing with 250 watts on Jan. 17 at 2:25 a.m. XEAW, Monterrey, Mexico was also testing. WHQX Lancaster, Ohio on with a program for the NREC. WRLA testing 1/17/49. Also on 1340 Kc/s. there was a station testing, but I did not get the call letters, sounded like WENT or WGWT testing with cycle tone, around 3:39 a.m. and gave calls sounding like these. (How about WCNC, Selma, Joe? -Ed.) It s/off at 3:40 when WAAA came on. Also on 1450 Kc/s., at 2:33 E.S.T. a station with cycle tone, mentioned 250 watts, and anyone ---, add the call sounded like KTHC or KPHC, reception rather weak and noisy. Can anyone give me any help on the 2 stations above, any help will be greatly appreciated. On Jan. 10th, I heard a station which sounded like WBEA, Brockton, Mass. For the third consecutive week I report more veries than new catches. They are cards from WYIO WTCN WMIK WKOB KGBC CEPC & CBI, and letters from WLTC WHJB & WREL, as against these catches: KIRN, 1290 Kc/s., the loudest Texas I ever heard, as it topped KRGV at 3:30 a.m., 1/20 - That morning seemed to be a "Southwest Special" as proven by the above catch and having heard almost as well KFRO's DX and KFMJ test. 1/21, I logged KAAA, 1250 Kc/s., all night, March of Dimes program, at 3:30, and WMAG, 1490 Kc/s., Grenada, Miss., first test, cominating all else on that grave-yard channel. 1/22, WIPR, 940 Kc/s., showed up ETing at 3:30, over-riding WINZ. 1/23, CEPC boomed in like a 50 kw. over all else on 1490 Kc/s. at 4:30-5:00 a.m. During the past week I ran into the following "unknowns" - 1/20 at 2:20, a tester, cycle-toning, counting and stating, "test," on 1380 Kc/s.; a "W" station s/off 950 Kc/s. at 2:28, help on them would be appreciated. 1/24, a Tennessee morning, with WIRJ, Humboldt, logged on 740, and as they signed off, WKSR came on on adjacent 730 channel with test. Also logged ESFT-DX behind carrier. (Bernie sends along a letter from WATO which states they are pleased with DX reports and they broadcast information on latest testers towards the end of their special Sunday morning show, around 3:30 a.m. - a good spot to check each week.) We herewith re-print a letter to Eldon Addy, from Jim Honey, of station WDWB, Dawson, Ga.

"Dear Sir,

"I am in receipt of your letter of Nov. 30th, 1948, with reference to a special test program on Monday morning, Jan. 31, 1949, from 4:00 to 4:30, EST.

"I shall be happy to arrange for this special test transmission under this condition. Whenever a test program of this nature is put on, stations generally receive so much mail it works an extra hardship on the office personnel of the station concerned, thus detracting from the regular schedule of work as set out for the secretary.

"I shall conduct this program personally if you will publish the information in the Club publications, to the effect that all verifications from WDWB will be taken care of if the DXer will enclose a self-addressed postcard prepared for verification leaving a space for my signature, verifying if the information is correct. This procedure will enable our station to handle the volume of mail to be expected from a broadcast of this nature.

"I am always glad to co-operate with the Radio Clubs, as I used to be a DXer myself. I hope you understand our position in regards to verification from WDWB. We are extremely short-handed.

"I shall mention the manner under which verifications may be obtained during the broadcast also. If this is satisfactory, I would appreciate your reply.

So, please take this into consideration when sending in a report on this special test. WDWB wants to put it on, but cannot answer personally each report, due to a lack of personnel, so we said "OK" to Mr. Honey. We are trusting to each of you not to ask for a letter or personal reply. May we count on you?

XVII - A VISIT TO YOUR EDITOR'S DESK, Pt. II

Now we told you we would explain a bit about the station write-ups for programs to come before the next issue of "DX News." Maybe they seem repetitious to you, and maybe you might feel they lay it on a little thick. Well, that is our intention - these write-ups are inserted mainly to please the person or persons at those stations! The main point in them for you is the name of the verie-signer, of course, and a few words about what sort of conditions are expected on that channel at the given hour. You see, we send "DX News" to each station DXing for us - they get the issue with their write-up included. We may lay it on thick, as I say, but we also do try to give a true picture - if the channel won't be clear - we say so. And, a few words also about the "Special Programs" listed on Page I. There are many monthly dedications of frequency checks now, and we list monthly programs with asterisks so you'll know they'll be on again next month if you should miss the current program. We do not call it the "DX Calendar" any more, for there are many tests listed, which cannot be referred to as DX programs, since they are daytime stations. We have to be very careful on this count, for the F.C.C. (Mr. T. J. Slowie, Sec'y) receives our magazine each week. We do not want to endanger any station, and must take the precautions which Ray Edge received from a Buffalo F.C.C. inspector. Sure, we'd like to say that the program is for the N.R.C. and was arranged by us, but we can't. We feel it is more important to have the rarely-heard station on the air than to blow our own horn. We treat programs arranged either by the NNRC or the NRC equally in our write-ups, too, as you will note every week. Then, as we put the reports on the stencils, often we miss the bottom line by a line or a few. Then we have to fill them in, of course, with little items. We often use them to remind you that NRC stationery is on sale, of that all time is E.S.T. in here, or that return postage should be sent, or that you should try to report all the special programs listed. They are little items and are not very important as DX news goes, but they are important as little reminders. Now a special page like this, and the reverse side, is not sent to any other club, or to any station honoring us with a special - it is just for your edification. NEXT WEEK - "ACCENT ON THE ACCENT."

On the reverse side of this sheet is an essay on reporting to stations, in the opinion of its author. Any one else in the club is invited to send in a similar story which we will publish when the space and time permits. We urge you, that should you differ with the opinions expressed by this NRC member, NOT to include such in your reports, but to add them below, and your Editor will print them on another special page in the future. Remember, then, not to put any differences or similarities of opinion on the subject of reports in your report, for they will have to be removed from such. We want no feuds!

## BY-LAWS of the NATIONAL RADIO CLUB

### Article 1 Name and Purpose

The name of this organization shall be the National Radio Club and shall be hereafter referred to as the NRC. The purpose of this organization shall be to promote the hobby of DXing and more specifically to promote DXing on the Broadcast Band, 540-1600 kcs.

### Article 2 Location of Club Headquarters

The NRC Headquarters shall be at 325 Shirley Ave., Buffalo 15, N.Y.

### Article 3 Eligibility for Membership

Anyone interested in the hobby of DX, and not previously dismissed from the NRC as provided in Article 13, shall be eligible for membership.

### Article 4 Club Publication-"DX NEWS"

The NRC's Official Publication shall be known as "DX NEWS". It shall be issued 34 times each year, but in cases of emergency and with permission of the Board of Directors, the Editor may change the number of issues. "DX NEWS" normally will be published weekly, beginning with the First Saturday in October and up to and including the Last Saturday in March, twice in April and September, once in May-June-July and August.

### Article 5 Dues

Dues for membership in the NRC is \$3.00 per year and should be sent to the Executive Secretary. All Officer and Members shall be required to pay dues, there being no honorary memberships. A member who has paid his dues is a Member in Good Standing and is entitled to receive the publication of the NRC known as "DX NEWS" and all other benefits of the club. If a Member fails to pay his dues when they become due, he is no longer a Member in Good Standing and is no longer entitled to receive "DX NEWS" or other benefits.

### Article 6 Board of Directors

The governing board of the NRC shall be known as the Board of Directors, and consist of Eleven members. Ten (10) members to be elected each year by the membership at large, the Executive Secretary being the eleventh. To be eligible for election to the Board of Directors a member must be in his or her Second Consecutive year as a member in Good Standing and must reside in either the Continental United States or Canada. Any member not wishing to run for election may request his name be omitted from the ballot by notifying the Executive Secretary who issues the voting instructions and ballot. The election of the 10 elected Board Members shall take place in April of each year. The 10 receiving the largest number of votes will constitute the elected part of the Board. In case a vacancy occurs on the board, the person receiving the next highest vote in the previous election shall be named to this vacancy. The term of office for Board Members shall be for ONE year beginning with the day before Labor Day and terminating the day before Labor Day the following year.

### Article 7 Duties of the Board of Directors

It shall be the duty of the Board of Directors to administer the affairs of the NRC and to promote the interests of the NRC to the best of its ability. Any action taken by the Board must be by at least a majority of that Board. Likewise any action taken in the name of the NRC must be approved by the Board.

Any NRC member may submit items, proposed article changes or additions to the By-Laws for action by the Board. This can only be done through the Board Chairman and must be signed in ink by the member submitting the item. It will be mandatory to disregard any unsigned item.

Article 7 Duties of the Board of Directors cont

Items shall be restricted to those only vitally necessary and all others will be passed by, with a letter explaining the facts from the Board Chairman to the member submitting said item. In cases where the member submitting the item is not satisfied with the Board Chairman's explanation, he can insist that the item be brought before the Board for a vote.

The Board Chairman only, has the authority to submit questions to the Board Members for a vote, except when he is unable to do so. It then becomes the duty of the Vice Chairman to submit the items. Such communications from the Board Chairman to the Board Members shall be marked with the heading "Official Business". Such communications or others marked "Official Business" must be held strictly confidential. Board Members shall reply to such communications requiring a vote within 10 days. If no reply is received within the required time limit it shall be assumed that the Board Member does not care to vote on the matter. If he ignores such communications for 2 consecutive times, action shall be taken as provided for in Article 13.

Article 8 Club Officers

The following Officers shall be named by the Board of Directors to serve for ONE (1) Year terms. President-Vice President-Chairman of the Board-Vice Chairman, who must be Board Members other than Vice President. The Board shall also name the Executive Secretary-Editor and CPC Chairman, ONLY when a vacancy occurs. They also name all Committee's. The naming of the above Officers shall take place as soon as possible by a newly elected Board of Directors.

Article 9 Duties of the Officers - President

The President shall represent the NRC in all matters in an Official capacity so long as any action that he may take is in agreement with the Board of Directors. He shall vote on Board matters ONLY when there is a tie vote among the other Board Members.

Vice President

The Vice President has no active duties. He cannot become President if a vacancy occurs, by succession.

Board Chairman

The Board Chairman is responsible for the proper execution of all NRC affairs. He has the power to appoint any committee's or to call upon any member to assist him in so doing. Any action taken however must be approved by the Board. He will send to the other Board Members a release, once a month if necessary. In cases of emergency a release will be sent at once. He will see to it that all business conducted by the Board, requiring a vote will be published in "DX NEWS" at intervals. Each item along with each Board Members vote will be published and sent to all NRC Members. He shall not submit any item that would require the spending of Club funds without FIRST getting an opinion from the Executive Secretary and then the Board will be guided by that opinion.

He shall once every 3 months send a condensed financial Statement to the other Board Members and President.

Vice Chairman

The Vice Chairman shall have no authority other than that of a regular Board Member UNLESS the Board Chairman becomes unable to carry out his duties or resigns. He shall then assume the authority of the Board Chairman and continue until the Chairman is again able to resume his duties or in case of resignation, he will assume the Office of Board Chairman until the next election and a new Board Chairman has been named.



Article 9 Cont Executive Secretary

The Executive Secretary shall perform the duties of Publisher-Secretary-Club Treasurer and shall not be eligible to hold any other Club Office. He shall have a vote in all Club matters, same as Board Members. All Club dues shall be sent to him. He shall be responsible for the following;- Issue membership cards; Keep an up to date membership list; Keep a complete record of all money paid to the club along with all money spent by the club. The buying of all club supplies for the publishing of "DX NEWS". The mimeographing and mailing to the members copies of "DX NEWS". Once every 3 months send a complete financial statement to the Board Chairman. For the records and permanent equipment owned by the NRC.

Editor

The Editor shall be responsible for the cutting of the stencils comprising the bulletin other than "DX DOWN THE DIAL" and "BOARD NEWS TO MEMBERS". He must see that the stencils are sent to the Executive Secretary. He shall not be eligible to the Office of Board Chairman. He has the right to appoint, with the approval of the Board, any assistant Editor or Editors he needs to assist him in his work. He may use his own discretion in selecting material for publication, that is he shall have the right to exclude from publication any members report or portion thereof which he believes would not be in the best interests of the NRC. Any problems arising from the exclusion of such material from publication must be dealt with through the Board.

Article 10 Committees - Courtesy Programs Committee

The CPC Chairman shall be responsible for arranging Special DX Programs for the NRC and shall work hand in hand with the Board and Editor for the best interests of the NRC. The CPC Chairman, because of the amount of work involved shall not be eligible to be Board Chairman. The CPC Chairman shall appoint as many members to his committee as he deems necessary to carry out the work of the CPC. The CPC shall also include the work of a Publicity Committee and in as many ways as necessary and possible, to promote the hobby of DX. The CPC shall be responsible for the preparing material to be read on DX Programs dedicated to the NRC along with write ups etc in any hobby magazines etc. The CPC Chairman shall if necessary appoint members for this work.

Article 11 Annual Convention

The annual NRC Convention shall be held on the Saturday and Sunday before Labor Day and Labor Day at Club Headquarters, unless decided otherwise by the Board.

Article 12 Complaints-Accusations and Correspondance

When the Board Chairman receives an accusation or complaint from a member or officer regarding a violation of any Article of the NRC by another member or officer, he will immediately inform the accused and ask for a reply. Upon receipt of that reply the Board Chairman will send both the complaint and reply to the Board for action. In such cases the complainant and the accused will refrain from corresponding with each other until action has been taken by the Board and a verdict has been given. Both the complainant and accused will abide by the Boards verdict.

All correspondance from one officer or member to another officer or member which does not bear the heading "Official Business" shall be considered personal correspondance regardless of whether it has been written or typed on Club Stationery or not. The Board shall have no power to settle any dispute arising from such correspondance unless it contains something that is in violation to any Club Article.

Article 13 Reprimands and Dismissal from Membership

Any Officer or Member of the NRC found guilty of conduct detrimental to the best interests of the NRC by the majority of the Board, shall if the Board finds it to be a minor offense, be reprimanded by the Board Chairman. If the offense is judged to be a major one, he shall be dismissed from the NRC. Any Officer of the Club soliciting members to join another DX Club by asking them to drop their NRC membership and/or making derogatory remarks about the NRC shall be dismissed from his Office and from the NRC if found guilty of said offense by a vote of the Board. He shall likewise be ineligible for re-admission to the NRC. In case an Officer is accused of misconduct, he shall not be allowed to vote on the matter.

Article 14 DX CALENDAR

It shall be the duty of the Editor to list all DX Programs-Tests etc that have been arranged by the NRC and other legitimate DX Clubs. In listing these DX programs the Editor will give credit to the NRC or other Club responsible in arranging said DX. Where a DX has been arranged in the name of one or two persons, the Editor will list it as just a DX or leave that part blank.

Article 15 Contests

All NRC Contests and rules thereof must be approved by the Board. The NRC will not honor any verification entered by any member in any contest unless the Station verified was heard on a receiver within 25 miles of the members official residence. However if a member is attending college or spends week ends and vacations at home, he may enter verifications received from reports sent from either location providing the distance between the two points is not over 100 miles. If the distance is greater than 100 miles he may choose either those received from reports sent at college or those from his home, but not both. The rule likewise applies to any member sent to another city by his employer, that is if the distance is not over 100 miles, he may enter verifications from both locations. Otherwise he must make a choice between the two locations. However in cases when a member legitimately changes his official residence from one location to another, he can count veries from both locations. However only 2 locations can be used, if he moves more than once, he can only count veries from the FIRST TWO official residences.

Article 16 Return Postage

Every member using NRC Stationery or Report Forms or mentioning that he is an NRC Member, shall be required to enclose return postage when sending a reception report to any station and asking for a verification, unless said station specifically states that return postage is not required. Any violation of this article shall be dealt with under Article 13.

Article 17 Amendments and Additions

The By-Laws may be amended or additions made thereof by a Two-Thirds (2/3) majority of the Board of Directors.

Article 18 Pledge

All Officers and Members pledge themselves to uphold the above Articles to the best of their ability. Each Officer and Member will receive a complete set of these By-Laws. Please keep them for future reference.

The Club Officers will receive a card which they will sign, acknowledging thereby that they have received, fully understand and agree to abide by the By-Laws of the NRC. The cards will be kept on file by the Board Chairman.
