DX here lately just about limited to tuning in the many fine DXes, not much else heard, a cold put a damper on AM sessions too this past week, but it's all gone again now. New ones here since the last report have been few. KSUM very well heard on 2/13 DX. WCVA on ET 2/15, and several times since. KXIC really giving CKLW a run-around for a time between 6:30 and 6:45 p.m. on 2/15. KLNR on f/c 2/18. WRYO heard sometimes, very poorly between 5:45 and 6:00 p.m. after CHUM goes off, but usually too much WMGM and WWGP to even identify the Pa. signal, and lastly, WKBS, quite good on his 3:00 to 6:00 DX test, WTND really pounding in and KSBW, fair at first, poor after 5:20, on that grand brace of DXes of this morning. I'll begin this week's report with the tips that I hope will be helpful. A three-colored Radio Station map is now available from "Broadcasting" Magazine - address for it is, "National Press Club, Washington 4, D. C." 60¢. WOV didn't sign on until 6:00 Saturday morning, so maybe that will enable DXers such as myself to get WNAM. WINS s/off Sunday mornings at 4:00 a.m. Since last reports, I have received verie-letters from KSVP KGBC WCVA & WLAM, and cards from WJOL & KLOU, KRRO & WHIS. By adding WANS, 1280, Anderson, S.C. and KWAK to my heard log, it now stands at 1630. Feb. 20 - WKBS & WTND's DX-Tests came in fine, and deep fader on 1350 might have been KGHF instead of KRLC. I submitted scattered data to both with explanation. 2/21 - WANS, 1280, in clear 3:00-3:35 s/off. WATO-DX boomed in, 3:36 on, latter publicizing WTSV's DX. Accompanying the letter were two tickets to Radio City - in San Jose, that is. Can anyone of you fellows make use of them? WFOM states that they usually test on Friday mornings between 2:00 and 4:00 a.m. WJPD's frequency check is the second Wednesday from 2:15 to 2:30 a.m. Reception conditions were fair during the past week, with the following stations reported: 2/16 - WLSI on f/c from 2:33 to 2:45 a.m. for a duplicate report; WMGW on DX from 3:00 to 4:00 a.m.; CMKZ with special program from 2:57 to 4:03 a.m.; KDET, Center, Texas, 930 Kc/s/, on ET from 4:04 to 4:17 a.m., and WDIA on f/c from 5:45 to 6:00 a.m. 2/18 - KCFH, Cuero, Texas 1600 Kc/s., on equipment test from 3:37 to 3:58 a.m. 2/20 - WKBS on test program from 3:53 to 4:35 a.m., and logged again on regular schedule from 7:02 to 7:35 a.m., and KCOG, Centerville, Iowa, 1400 Kc/s., on equipment test from 4:55 to 5:15 a.m. 2/21 - WANS, Anderson, S.C., 1280 Kc/s., on its first equipment test from 2:49 to 3:10 a.m.; WSAL, Logansport, Ind., 1230 Kc/s., on equipment test from 3:09 to 3:30 a.m., and WTSV on DX program from 4:30 to 5:00 a.m., thanks to the publicity given on the WAPO and KWHI DXes. TIMELY TIPS ON TUNING TOUGHIES  
XIX - IT IS NOW POLITE TO POINT

Modern-day radio is quite advanced from the early days - at least in some ways. The modern directional transmitting antenna is what we are thinking of, at this time. In fact, so effective are some of them, that we have, at times on a DX program, sworn that the station was not on the air! So, we must take into consideration just which way each station's mullis are pointed. A season ago, KOLT DXed, and here in the east, they were heard by only a scant few. Now, in this issue, on another page, is printed a letter from WWSW, in which Mr. Schloss explains something about the directional antenna they are erecting for use on 970 kilocycles. Then we know of the complicated antenna system in use by WTAC, Flint, Michigan, which protects several different directions. Then you often run into the "ton of bricks" signal from a station transmitting with a directional antenna - which indicates that you are "on the beam" with their transmitting antenna. So, these days, don't always assume that a weak signal is very far away, for it might be fairly near by, but might be operating directionally. Then again, the strong signal might be quite remote - something like that exhibited by ~~WKLO~~ when DX is good, here in the east. You can notice the difference in directional and non-directional arrays, and here is one example - on 1080, several members in the east have reported hearing WKLO, Louisville, Ky., shortly before sign-off in the twilight. Well, it so happens, WKLO is a full-time station! They did not sign off, but merely turned on their directional antenna at sunset! That's how effective a directional wire can be! Now, this directional business is also important in receiving antennas, but is not so highly effective as on the transmitting end. For one example, your Editor has a NE-SW wire which is very directional in favor of New England. By tuning to 840 kilocycles in the daytime, and using this wire, WKNE, New Britain, can be heard very beautifully. By switching to an E-W antenna, WKNE goes right out, and WVPO, Stroudsburg, Pennsylvania, takes over. The same thing can be done on 1450 every morning between 1:00 and 1:30, simply by changing antenna I can listen to either WWDC or WFOR. One antenna will favor the west, another the south, and so on. By an arrangement with the lead-ins connected to single-pole, single-throw switches. One common wire is connected to all, running to the antenna post of the set, and any one, all, some, or none of the different antennas can be used. We heartily recommend this arrangement, if space permits. And the birds in your neighborhood will like it, too - it'll give them some other place to sit. We have not decided on the subject of the next article - it might be something on these new FCC tests - if we get the info.
