THIRD ANNUAL MID-WEST DX CONVENTION

"HEADACHE TIME"

Also sometimes known as Daylight Saving Time, begins for many areas on Sunday, April 24, 1949, at 2:00 a.m., E. S. T. We ask all when sending in summer reports, please to continue to list your catches and hours in EASTERN STANDARD TIME to avoid confusion as much as possible. Eastern Standard Time will continue to be used in times mentioned in "DX News." And with the advent of Daylight Saving Time, our frequency check list becomes a bit more unreliable for stations located in the areas where Daylight Time will be used. Some of these continue to come on at the same hour in Standard Time, while others change their f/c hour to conform with their Daylight Time. For example, station WATN in Watertown, N.Y., which dedicates its frequency checks to us all year long, will now be on from 1:00 to 1:15, E.S.T., or 2:00 to 2:15, E.D.S.T. through and including their check of August 29. Yet all stations in the daylight time zones do not change like this, so you'll have to double-check the list, looking an hour ahead of the listing for stations in these zones, and if not heard then, look at the actual time printed in the list. We expect to issue a brand new list around the beginning of October, so please continue to send in new f/cs you might hear, and also please, if they are in a D.S.T. zone, try to ascertain whether they will be on that same time when the station returns to Standard Time, or whether they will then be on an hour later. Thank you.

KGKL, 960 Kc/s., on short test till 3:30 a.m. and then WHAK, 960 Kc/s., Rogers City, Mich. on ET using classical music. On the 25th, I logged KRAI, 1230 Kc/s., Craig, Colo. on test till 3:30 E.S.T. WAGO had a nice DX. Then WONE, 980 Kc/s., Dayton, Ohio, was logged on his sign-on at 5:30 E.S.T. Saturday A.M. I overslept and so missed WARE and WISC. DX slowing down to spring-time pace here with only the following new ones heard in two weeks. 3/14 - WHAK with ET, also KGST with remarkably strong signal. 3/18, KCONY, not very easy, but clear at times on DX. 3/20 - WDOV like a local on his DX. 3/21, CKEN very weak, but good signal quality, readable for a few words through WWSW at times, heard about half the time during WWSW silent period. 3/23, WJBB on ET's. 3/26, WARE on DX, 3/27 - KBKO on DX. Verices in are letters from KAYX WHAK WKNK WSHB KWRE KSCB KGST WEAL KULP KPHC WFTR CHNO WFBG. Nice cards from KYOU WALE KCBQ WVPO KTAT. My own card from KMHT. A drive on delinquents is under way and some of above are the result of follow-ups. KGST was interested in the fact that 1600 was clear in the East Mondays and indicated future tests, if any, might be held on that day. On recent DXes, we heard WFAX and WNDR with good signals on 3/15. KCONY fair strength but noisy air on 3/18. WDOV like a local, on new time, 3/19. WCONR, 3/30, 970 Kc/s., with good signal. 3/21, a rather poor DX morning found WHEM audible on 1340 a.m. with easily readable signal. KERO a total loss, not a trace on either date. CFAB and CKEN about the same, very weak, able to follow program about $\frac{1}{4}$ of the time, and no more. 3/22, no trace of WKRF back of the Mexican. 3/26, a very poor DX date; normally 8-7 WVOM was mostly S-O, S-1 at best, but WARE made it at times, being best during final 10 minutes when 100% readable. I have noticed on the bottom of the "DX NEWS" pages various requests for additional reports; however I do not know whether you want reports from a new member like myself. The past week has been the slowest on verices, and perhaps the best for sending out reports. Two separate verices from WWL, and single verices from KXKE and KLAS constituted all the incoming reports. March 12 - All I could bring in were the high-powered babies. WCCO was QRM'd, believe it or not, by the side-band of little WKAB at 1:05 a.m. KCA at 1:30 a.m. WEL at 2:03; WDE, WNBC, ZEG, and finally WJJD at 5:20 a.m. All time is E.S.T. March 15 - f/c of KSCB 3:00 a.m. to 3:15. March 18 - KCONY came in pretty good QSA4 R6 in their f/c at 3:19 a.m. I hope someone in the NRC gets their \$10.00 DX prize. Last for the night was KRUX. March 19 - Same static gives me a hint of the coming summer. It is time once again to check over the results of the past DX season and I find that although I got off to a late start I did manage to add 200 new stations heard to total 1700 while I have nearly 100 new verifications to total 1192 with 32 letters still out, some of which will probably answer in due time. So while the quantity is fair in consideration of the time put in on the hobby of DXing; the quality is rather poor. With the exception of a slight improvement toward the end of the season, far west DX seemed to be pretty well hidden behind some sort of an "iron curtain" or probably actually the peculiar weather conditions that prevailed between east and west all winter. One very bright spot was the find bunch of Canadian DX broadcasts lined up by Bill Stone and others which allowed me to add 12 new Canadians on DX and I heard 2 others on regular broadcasts.
