Latest reports from here went to: WHOM KCNY WARE WBBQ KLZ KLTI CKBL WONE WFR (in daylight) KOMO WHKK CKRC & WTCH (also in daylight.) Those underlined have verified so far. Other veries received lately were from WKKW (DX special) WEW0 KULP & KTAT (all DX specials) and WGRD who finally verified my DX special of February, 1948. WBBQ came through with a government post card while KLZ sends a nice yellow card with red call letters and blue photos of their new transmitter and mobile unit. WHKK sends a patriotic red, white, and blue card with red call with a border surrounded by stars. KTAT provides a government post card with blue call letters. All of the rest confirmed by letter. WKKW says I was the first Wisconsin listener for them. WEW0 uses a 234 foot vertical tower, while KTAT's tower is 192 feet high. I heard WONE (Dayton's new 5 kilowatt on 980) at 8:00 p.m. with the "Music Room" program and I thought that the announcer's voice sounded familiar. It turned out to be Frank Pollack who used to be at WEXT here for some time. WONE had a four-tower array with the major lobe in my directions which accounts for their terrific signal here (S 8 to 9 every night and S-2 all day long on a 6 tube Sky Buddy.) WARE says my report was from the farthest distance they received on their equipment test of March 26. I finally landed KOMO on their early-morning transmission with 50 kw. non-directional. Musings of the MembersEugene Allen - 1013 Mariposa St., Vallejo, Cal.

Reading of the trouble various DXers are having with high-noise-levels is right in my alley as one of my jobs with local power company is tracing radio noise. First, for the DXer, find out the voltage of your nearest power line, and if it is above 4,000 volts, then MOVE as any line above 4 kilo-volts is generally noisy. If your distribution voltage is 4 KV. (and most of them are) then look for the noise in your block or area covered by your transformer. 90% of our troubles are caused by heating pads, tropical fish warmers, and furnace thermostats. In fact, anything with a thermostat on it is responsible for most trouble but look first to a heating pad. Find out if anyone is sick or ailing in your block or area covered by your transformer and you'll have a strong clue to its location. A portable radio equipped with loop and signal meter will when walking under the power line, lead you to the source of the noise. That is, in most cases, the nearer to the noise, the louder will it be heard on your portable. April 19, I heard KRLO, Sioux Falls, S.D. sign on 1320 at 7:00 a.m. but CKIW kept me from a report. WSKB on 1250 heard at 6:35 a.m. for my second report to them. Other reports out to ~~WJMW~~ CJDC WTTT KCBS WLOU WDAF. Veries in from KWFT KAYS KONO KCBS WDAF and finally WGRD (it had been so long I'd most forgotten). KONO now on 24-hour operation, promptly verified when I requested a number on a certain date. This has been the third time a request number has brought a verie as they consider you a regular listener then. KRDO heard well on special on the 18th, but no luck on XEBI nor XECZ. Will be shifting my DX activities to 10 and 20 meters bands as they are looking up at present. Good vacationing to all club members and fellows - make it a real vacation - leave that portable radio at home! 73's. (Very interesting commentary, Gene - Ed.)

DAYLIGHT SAVING FANS FEWER, BUT NORTHEAST WILL STICK TO IT (sent in by Ralph Johans)  
NEW YORK, April 7 (AP) "The city-dominated Northeastern States will cling to the Daylight Saving System this year, but they have not won converts elsewhere in the U.S.  
"In fact, the number of Americans enjoying the extra hour of sunlight in the evening will be smaller in 1949, since populous California does not plan to use "fast time" as it did in 1948.

"Nearly all communities using Daylight Saving, including Buffalo, will go on the new time at 2:00 a.m. April 24. It will extend five months until Sept. 25.

"A nation-wide survey indicates at least one-third of the nation's 145,000,000 citizens will live under the new time this summer.

"In Tennessee, the 1949 Legislature banned the system completely.

"The Indiana Legislature passed a law making standard time official for the entire state. But Indianapolis and other cities plan to use "fast time" through "recommendations" of City Councils."

"In Ohio, a bill for state-wide Daylight Saving was killed.

"Seattle plans to use Daylight Saving Time. A bill in the Washington Legislature to prohibit anything but standard time failed by a single vote.

"Maryland is one state in which "fast time" has won new friends. Several rural holdouts have capitulated. In neighboring Virginia, on the other hand, Norfolk rejected it.

"Some cities that had Daylight Saving Time a year ago have abandoned it this year. They include Los Angeles, San Francisco, Detroit, Chattanooga, and Nashville."
