Musings of the MembersClarence Mustoe - Box #292 - Coeur d'Alene, Idaho.

During the past DX season I have tried to get new fellows interested in DX as a hobby by displaying my DX equipment in the local college and high school and by advertising in the local paper and over the local station KVNI and through the various DX programs that I have arranged such as were put over KVNI KRLC KXLO KFIO KBOL KRDO. As a result I have improved the relations to a certain extent with some stations and DXers, and among DXers and those interested in becoming DXers. Besides carrying on my own DX activities during this DX season and enlarging and improving my receiving equipment and total veries to over 900 and hearing stations of 3,500 watts power at a distance of over 7,000 miles. I have acted as an assistant CPC with NNRC arranging programs with the previously-mentioned stations. I have been editing a BCB DX column in two other clubs trying to acquaint others (DXers of both bands) with BCB DX and by personal letters I have been endeavoring to help those beginners and others to improve their DX activities or get started whichever the case may have been. A few days ago I thought I heard station KHIT testing, upon inquiring as to the fact of their actually testing, which was a negative reply. With future correspondence with them they became so interested with trying to find out if their signal could be heard in my area that they went to special effort to do a test later than 2:00 a.m., C.S.T. which is after west coast stations usually sign off. When they had decided to do such a test, they sent me a telegram to tell me of it, and I notified DXers in Spokane and their signal came in equally well in both areas. Another example that I haven't experienced before in my 10 years of DXing took place about a month ago when near-by station KSPT took to the air to test. I sent them a report of their reception. With their veries they sent me a self-addressed card requesting more information on any further test programs that I might happen to hear. I am not writing this as a matter of patting myself on the back as some may think but to show that (whether you do or don't) it is possible for one in the wide-open spaces of the north-west to promote DXing to the people and thereby enlarge our membership - as I for one want to have more hobbyists near at hand to be able to have a personal contact with other than just by mail. (Nice work, too, Clarence - Ed.)

With DX weather on the downgrade, not too much was heard since last report and the few veries received were mostly below average quality too. New stations were these: 5/8 - WBRM and KJCK, 1250 and 1570 respectively, on ET's. 5/10 - WRXO, 1430, KNUJ, 860, both on ET's, and WAEB and WNOR on regular hours. 5/13, WWWR, Russellville, Ala., 920 Kc/s., 1000 watts also on ET's. Plus new local WUSJ on 1340. Veries, a plain card from WGVM, good one from KIFI, fair from WAEB. Nice letter on FM letterhead from WUSJ which looks like an FM verie. Nice letters from KXJK and KVOB (Thanks, Ken!). KCNY returned my letter with his usual note, a second letter to him brought a definite verie on my own card. Also sent own card to KTLW and got it back OK to add to pretty, but useless-from-verie-angle KTLW card. KYNO sent fair form letter verie. And that's the DX story here. Except that KJCK opened officially May 15th with a 7:30 a.m. to 8:30 p.m., E.S.T. schedule. His letter gave this news and thanks for a report, but no mention of its correctness, etc. On the hold-out situation, a drive on old delinquents brought back at least my own cards from many, a few remain steadfast. The oldest, in this order, are WJQS WVCG WIVY WROW WNNC WHSY WDXI WSSO WMRA. Lot more recent ones who have not yet had follow-ups, including a few who put on DX tests for us. Bernie Duffy - 68 Watchogue Road - Staten Island 14, N.Y.

With Lefty's kind assistance during May 14's visit, finally counted and catalogued my veries. They number 1,178, as against my heard list of 1689 - that's the result of 21 years of rather constant DXing. My veries number 841 letters and 537 cards, thus fairly even in type. If I followed the policy of verifying local and semi-locals, I could boost my total quite a bit, but I don't think I will. I feel suffice it to get confirmations from the seldom-heard ones, or from DXing near-bys. Another happy result of our get-together that evening was that acting upon Cooper's valuable tip that WVFO is in the clear during May at 8:00-8:15 p.m. EDT. I then logged the elusive "Voice of the Poconos" despite bad over-lap by adjacent channel local, WNYC. Since my previous report, I added XEFW WDXB WBFM KNUJ WWRW WLCS WEAT WTTT and the first mentioned. WWRW is a new one on 920 Kc/s. in Russellville, Ala. that tested all night 5/12 and 5/13, and WTTT is the old WBAY, 1490 kc/s. in Coral Gables that resumed twenty-four hour daily operation 5/16. WDXB "holds its own" nicely on the same channel all A.M. Sundays. WAAT no longer operates all night, resultantly 960, 970 and 980 kc/s. are "open for developments". Balancing off these catches I received these veries, nice printed cards from WAEF WBTU WAEB WNOR and WJAN. Very attractive letters came in from KNEW, KRUZ & WJMP, plainer ones from KPRO KWOE KYLH WAGE WREG and WBEC, the latter just resumed 24-hours a day schedule. KFTI sent a picture folder showing members of their staff as its "veries." Despite advancing summer weather, reception here remains surprisingly good. I'm anxious to know who was testing on 1280 Kc/s. 5/16 at 2:15-2:30 E.S.T.

MY DX appetite was considerably sharpened at Easter by the arrival of a Hallicrafters SX-25 receiver. My old National gave me fine service, but despite its recent shot in the arm, sadly needed replacing. Twelve years of service makes any receiver a veteran of retireable age. As a result, my log has jumped from 1165 to 1204 in slightly less than a month. At this time of the year, that's not bad DX. One of the reasons is that I didn't previously have access to the 1500-1600 Kc/s. section of the band. So I have been performing a clean-up job on many of the stations at the top end of our spectrum. The set has also made available several daytime broadcasters in neighbouring Michigan and Ohio. Here is the way things look, day by day. April 16 - KJAY, 1440, on all-night program. April 17, KGBC, 1540, at 2:09 on regular broadcast. Then KARM on 1430 before 3:00 a.m. sign-off. WJEM on 1440 at 2:32. KDWD on 1380 came through at 4:15 with a fine signal. KSWO's annual Easter program on 1380 Kc/s. finished off the morning. April 18 brought several on f/c's. WGEZ at 2:04, 1490. WWRW at 2:17, KPBC at 2:26, WROX at 2:33, WROB at 2:45, all on 1450. I haven't had 5 new ones an hour for years. April 20th brought KIRX for only one announcement on its NNRC DX, so just a thanks card sent. Then KRUS on 1490 at 4:03, KVOX, 1340, at 4:16, KYNO on 1300 at 4:35. April 23rd, I caught KXAR on 1490 at 2:32, WVOT testing on 1320 at 2:42. April 24th, WALE, 1590, 2:00-2:15. WDXB on 1490 through WWSW, WWXL, at 3:20 on 1590, WBHB on 1240 at 3:46, f/c. The 29th gave up KNEW on regular program at 2:00. KREI, 1350, briefly at 2:27, April 30. WPPM, 560, at 2:20 asking for reports. May 1, KEFL, 1400, at 3:06. May 2, WBIZ at 2:00 on 1400. May 11, caught KNUJ on 860 test. May 13, WWRW on 920 at 2:13 test. KWGJ on 1450 at 2:45 f/c. KFTM, 1260, at 3:03 test. He has a real nice signal here. May 14th, we connected with KJCK on 1570 at 2:32, KBRZ at 3:43 on 1440 - they are taking the air at noon today (May 14), officially. WFTC, 1280, at 5:00 s/on, WJMO on 1540 at 5:15 sign-on, WLEO on 1450 at 5:30 sign-on. Have just aquired a real old jalopy of a typewriter, and it has really been getting a workout sending out reports. It's very stiff, and my fingers have been taking quite a beating. It sure is great having a receiver that can separate most channels 100%. I never knew what real selectivity was before. Copying two stations on the same channel is often easy now. Here's hoping my DX steam stays up all summer. But this pace can't continue forever. (Cominz to Buffalo, Steve? -Ed.) Is the Cuban on 1150 CMBQ? I get the CMB- part, but not the Q. (That's right! -Ed.)

We want to make sure you all will give considerable consideration to the big Buffalo National Radio Club convention, and so frequent mention is being made of it in these pages. For a time you'll enjoy every minute, and treasure every day, don't miss this year's get-together. Meet your fellow DXers in person, and have a grand time hashing over the good old subject of DX.
