LATEST ON THE NRC CONVENTION

Well, boys, just one more issue before Convention Time, so we want to bring you abreast of what has been done so far. Your Editor has a letter from Ray Edge, and Ray says he will cut a page for the August 13 issue, in which he will outline the complete menu and ask you to send back the slip at the bottom, on which you may check your first and second choices. Ray has requested we not give out this information until the August issue, but let me say that it sounds delicious, and I'm already getting hungry thinking about it. The price for our Convention Dinner, to be held on the early afternoon of September 4, 1949, will be \$2.50, plus 25¢ for a tip, making a grand total of \$2.75 for the dinner. Ray is to be congratulated for obtaining such a reasonable price for us in these times, and at a very fine Buffalo Restaurant, the Colvin Casino. We have a private room reserved for our Convention, so we will not be bothered by outsiders.

Jim Kauer - 7220 Hacker Avenue - Cleveland 3, Ohio

Probably you will have to look through the files to find out who Jim Kauer is - due to the scarcity of reports from this direction for over a year. There are several reasons for the lack of reports and DX from here. School work is a constant reason, but severe noise on the broadcast band and an amateur ticket are bigger reasons. I'm now W8DND. I got my ticket last September and also got a first class readitelephone ticket. I have used the former but my commercial ticket is just rusting away, hi. The only ham rig now on is on 160 and 80 meters, but I have been on 40. Present projects are getting on 40, 20, and 2 meter phone. I have 3 potent watts on 2 meters but no receiver. It's amazing to be able to work cross-band across town holding the antenna in your hand - a half wavelength long. As for DX, I did better on BCB - I tried FM DXing for a while - the QSL percentage there is much lower than on BCB so gave it up. I have aquired veries from TTPG and H1ST. It took me 3 years and 7 reports to get TTPG to QSL and then they say short-wave! Nuts. I see that Earl Bake is still in there plugging on BCB. I've been trying to convert him to ham radio. I don't know whether I will be able to get to the convention this year. Take it easy, and don't let the hot weather get you down. (Hi, Jim, and don't listen to him, Earl - try to get to Buffalo, though - Ed.)

The "heat-wave" has us in its clutches here, the past three weeks. Temperature range has been from 90° to 96° daily, and a few thunder storms. (See you in Buffalo, Sid - Ed.)

Very little done in the way of DXing at this den the past month. However, had an enjoyable three-day visit with Eldon Addy, and you can be sure DX really got a going-over. Then on 6/16 added KDZA (1230) Pueblo, Colo. with a f/c 4:45-5:00 a.m. Station WBAY (1360) Green Bay, Wis., (formerly WTAQ) heard on regular schedule 6/19 from 7:00 to 8:00 a.m. in the clear. Then in July on the 2nd, logged WTVB (1590), Coldwater, Mich., on ET 2:15-2:30 a.m., followed same A.M. by a test by WMRC (1440) Greenville, S.C., on their new frequency with increased power. Incidentally, WTVB was offering a \$5.00 prize for the farthest reporter. Stations WWXL, WDXB and WTTG all continue their weekly all-night programs on Sunday mornings yet. Here are some items from the New Zealand "DX Times", released June 27: KSW - LXH, Hamilton, N.Z., 2 kv., 1310 kc/s., officially opened July 2nd. 580, WIEW operates 6:00-4:00 a.m., XEFW (810) opens 5:30 a.m., gives address as Brownsville, Tex; KFEL (950) all night heard around 5:30 through 2UE; KVON (970) opens 6:00 with news; KING (1090) seems all-night; KLAS (1230) Variety Parade to 7:00 a.m., WCPO (1230) all night June 4; WBIR (1240) opens 5:00; WNDR (1260) opens 4:00; KIOX (1270) s/on 6:00; KUBA (1290) s/on 5:00 on Sundays; KTRN (1290) off 1:00 after MBS News; WJHP (1320) heard midnight, KOCY (1340) s/on 6:00; KHON (1380) s/off 5:00; WATL (1380) closes after news at midnight; WLOS (1380) s/on 5:00; KYAK (1400) off after news, 3:00; KLUF (1400) NBC News to 1:00; WTRR (1400) f/c 4:30-4:45 June 4; KLIZ (1400) f/c 4:00-4:15, June 4; WING (1410) all night; WRBL (1420) s/off midnight; KMLB (1440) operates 6:00-1:00; KEYS (1440) off 1:00; WSPB (1450) closes 12:05 a.m.; KXOA (1470) s/off now 3:00; KWIK (1490) commences Spanish 7:30 a.m., KSTP (1560) off 3:05, after news; WAPX (1600) s/off after news, 1:00. KCRG (1600) off 1:00, after news. We are now in mid-winter and the poorest season for DX here from North America. Indians, etc., are very good around 3:30 a.m., local time, 10:30 a.m., E.S.T., and I have added several new loggings. Also have written some Philippine stations. North American reception is best here just before dark, 4:00-6:00 p.m., local time, 11:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m. E.S.T., after which the Aussies take charge except for above 1500 kc/s., which is free, and some nights the North Americans take complete charge. Our "midnight" season is during our summer when stations are heard opening the day's transmissions from 5:00 E.S.T. onwards, to the P.S.T. ones opening at 9:00 E.S.T. or 2:00 a.m. here. Some nights the mid-nighters are received well, but KOMA, etc., can be heard ever night, WLOS, WRBL, etc.; are also consistent around 5:00 a.m. Seems to cover the news here, the changes, etc., in "DX News" most interesting, just a pity they missed our June issue, nevertheless they will be welcomed next month. Regards.

Well, a few reports went out since last bulletin and they were to WINK on test, KIJV on f/c, WGAU on f/c, KVGB on with flood reports, and WXRJ on f/c. The only new veries arriving since last report is a very nice letter from WWRP, also letters from KIJV CKBL for their DX and KBKO for their DX, KNUJ and a letter from WGAU to replace old verie card. Total now 1611. Hope to see you at our annual convention over the Labor Day week-end. Full and final details will be published in the August 13th bulletin. However, here will be the cost for the Banquet Dinner, and the lunch served at Pop's House. The Dinner will be \$2.50 per person with an added 25¢ for the tip. To pay for the food and refreshments served Saturday evening at Pop's House, there will be an additional charge of 50¢. So when you make your reservations later you will have to remit with that reservation a total of \$3.25 per person. A list of hotels and their addresses will be published in the August 13th issue.
