The following reports were sent out: 10/19 - WJBF (ex-WTNT) on f/c from 2:45 to 3:00 a.m.; too much QRM from WITH & WNOR to hear the DX program which was to follow from 3:00 to 3:15 a.m., according to the Oct. 1 "DX News." That evening, CMHD was logged on 890 kc/s. from 7:00 to 7:30 p.m. over-riding WLS. 10/20 - WPKE on its regular monthly f/c from 2:00 to 2:15 a.m. 10/22 - WERE on regular schedule from 7:10 to 7:46 p.m. 10/23 - WCBA from its regular Sunday A.M. sign/on at 7:30 a.m. until 8:00 a.m., with QRM from WORK. Week-day sign/on time is at present 6:30 a.m., but will probably be 7:00 a.m. in November. That afternoon, logged WRCW on 590 kc/s. from 1:45 to 3:00 p.m. for another try at a verie. 10/24 - WKRG was heard through WOR on a brief test from 3:42 to 3:44 a.m., and WJCD, Seymour, Ind., 1390 kc/s/, was heard on equipment test from 3:58 to 4:23 a.m. No sign yet of Aussies or Zedders, and this is usually their peak season.

Plenty of work here so not too much time for DX, however I have got 11 reports out this season, mostly for at least a half-hour's reception. Letters have come back from WLS KUSD WWSW & CBO. With cards from WRMN KSVP & CBW. Reception hasn't been very good but the Northern Lights were beautiful to see here if not to hear especially on the evening of Oct. 15. I straightened out my outside antenna to 70 feet N-S. The SX-28-A lacks pep since I got it back. The S-20-R is 10 times more effective. I will have it fixed soon. I found too that if I add the difference in frequency to the highest station in frequency and on the resulting frequency get both stations. This would only work on the SX-28-A and could be minimized by tuning the antenna trimmer. I tried WGEN 930, WEBR, 970, on 1010 and also WBNY 1400 and WKBW 1520, on 1640. Both worked and could be eliminated. That's all for this time. (Glad to have your report, Bob. I get WINS-WMGM (1010-1050) on 1090, distorted. -Ed.)
