To all: When sending your list of VERLFICATIONS to be entered in our contests. the following system should be used to make it easier at this end. Domestic Contest: Call - Location - (City-State) - Freq. - Area No .- (whether it is first or and) - Date reported and the date your verie was received. Foreign Coniest - Call - Location - (City-Country) Freq / - Mileage from your location (if over 1,000 miles) - Date reported, and the date your verie was received. DX Specials - Call - location - (City-State or City-Country) Freq. Mileage from your location, power used by station; Eate reported, and date verse was received. For all contests, stations to be eligible must of course be verified, and for the period of October 1st, 1949, up to March 31, 1950. Also; Stations in the Continental U. S. and Canada only count in the Domestic contest. ALL OTHER STATIONS only eligible in Foreign Contest.

LETTER FROM WBZ, BOSTON, TO HAROLD STEIN of NRC.

Dear Mr. Stein:

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"Thank you for your reception report of March 13, with respect to the confusion in your mind concerning the call letters WBZ and WBZA. I can clear that up by advising you that these two stations operate synchronously and carry the same program. WBZ is a 50,000 watt station in Boston and WEGA is a 1,000 watt outlet on the same frequency in Springfield. Mass, approximately 100 miles to the west. This is one of the few, if not they only, synchorenized broadcast operation in this county, and has been so operated for the past 20-odd mears. I hope that explanation clears the confusion, with respect to this operation, in your mind. Very truly yours,

MEMBERS:::

We have received comments in the past few weeks concerning our stand on weekly issues, increased dues, etc., and we have decided that you are entitled to know just how your dues are spent. Therefore, the figures below, which are our anticipated budget for the 49-50 season are presented for your study.

Grand total of both expenses is \$2.85

The \$1.91 total given in the left hand column is constant irregardless of the number of members, material costs being the big item. However, you members can help out by sending in your dues early so that notices are not necessary.

However, the figures in the right hand column are pro-rated among the members. In other words, the more members the less cost per member, for example, 20 more members will drop the 94 cents to 81 cents and 40 more members will drop it to 72 cents, a savings of 22 cents.

You will note that at the present time only 15 cents of each members dues is left to take care of tip cards and to build up a surplus. This does not leave very much margin to take care of any unforseen contingencies, as, -an increased postage rate was being prepared for Congress when they adjourned. Now, we can see three ways to increase this margin:

- 1. Decrease the number of issues per year.
- Increase the yearly dues.
- 3. GET MORE MEMBERS.

We like to get DX NEWS every week and are sure you do too so # 1 is out. We believe \$3.00 is plenty to spend in one place on a hobby, and with the strikes, et al, we want to leave the dues at \$3.00. That means that additional members is the best way to lower costs. However, this item is one that depends on you members alone to carry out. Only you members can spread the word around among your DX pals and corries about how good you think the NRC is. Don't forget to tell them that we are the only Club that issues weekly bullctins in the DX season. We specialize in Broadcast band only, too. You members must think the NRC is the best Club or you wouldn't rejoin every year as you do. Well, don't be shy about it, tell your friends. We'll do our part in sending out sample bulletins but you members must do the selling and tell us where to send those samples.

Now, lest you think the Club is on the rocks and that is the reason for this spiel we are going to give you the status as of Oct.31,1949. After 2 months of very heavy spending, \$224.81 in all, supplies are built up so we can operate for a year and a half without any more buying. Over 650 #s of paper are on hand besides envelopes, ink and stencils. After this

spending spree, the Club is \$60 in the red, which we do not consider bad.

However, as you can see, the budget is not set up to make such large purchases nor to replace major equipment. FOR_PROFITABLE BUSINESS, WE ARE GIVING YOU MEMBERS TOO MUCH FOR YOUR MONEY. Well, we want to give you your moneys worth and that is why we asked for donations for the mimeo machine.
