Musings of the Members

Grant Batson - R.D. #1 - Sherman Road - Westfield, N.Y.

First of all, to Ralph Johanns - who is the French Canadian on 900 kc/s. on Saturday AMs with old-time square dance music and all announcements and dance calling in French, seems like Montreal - who? In 2 weeks' DX, only 13 reports out. Several mornings of late static very bad, but Pacific stations continue to come in. 1/30 - KNOR DX on 1400 was QRM'd but got 45 minutes. 1/31 - KSTN on 1420 kc/s. 2:44-3:01, hope a verie shows up. 2/1 - KBZY test on 1490 kc/s., 4:00-4:28. 2/5 - WCOJ on 1420 DX was perfect here 3:02-3:30, so good I reached into the receiver and shook hands with the CE! And WBLT Bedford, Va. testing on 1490 3:32-4:19, who over-rode WTOR on DX, but got the latter one 4:29-5:00. For lack of more DX re-verified KPOA 5:26-6:00 Q3-4 R9. No more DX till 2/8. WOHI on 1490 3:30-3:45 TT. 2/10 - WMDD 3:10-4:00, heard no better than S7. 2/11 KHBO on 1490 kc/s. ET logged 4:20-4:40 behind KRKT but over KWIK. 2/13 WAFB on 1480 testing new 5 kw. RCA transmitter and KDIA on 1490, Auburn, Cal., 4:10-4:30. WTCN not on, probably due to FCC. KERG saluted with organized attacks of static, though KIT and KXOB heard signing off. Couldn't definitely identify but know they were on, then at 4:00 - bang, came WJAY. Veries - 13 BCB, 1 for SW. WARE KTLN WJAY KVMA KNBY KDRS KXRA WMTW KBZY KWHN KPOA (? days) WOHI & KFFA. This concludes all the Arkansas morning stations, veries back. Also BEG11 on 15.22 megs. By the way fellows WJAY is either Mullins or Marion, P.O. Box 41 at either town. V/s is Robert D. Webb, C.E. Letterhead verie lists both as correct. CBW on 990 comes in nights here 5:45 p.m. and has a battle with WNOX and WIBG. KJCK, Junction City, Kans. signs off at 7:00 p.m. and has a real tussle with CBI and XERF. As a rule, at 6:30, CBI is tops and then KJCK comes in strong and of course after that, the Max is ruler over all. Gave a short try for WCAT on 645 kc/s. but King Static ruled as to any attempts. To Ray Edge, My WDEV verie came in 4 days, but yours was mislaid. Al Bartholomew - funny how KWRC came for you, I couldn't sock it through 1450, and CJDC clocked R-9 at 2 breaks here but in general was battling the Mexican. Neither one then was much good. Here's what I told Wagner last week I'd put in the bulletin - On 2/1 I was on a truck trip to Bradford, Pa. and of course asked information about WESB (1490). They have been on the air about 3 years and as per "DX Down the Dial" last week, 7:00 a.m. to Midnight. Here's what has been getting my goat. I don't recall seeing where anyone has reported hearing them - why? I asked a guy down there where they were located. "Over across the creek," he said. Well, no wonder I can't get them - the antenna tower is well over 200 feet below the mountain tops. Don't think they are any more than local area coverage. Musings of the MembersJack Rhea - 710 South Hampton - Springfield 4, Mo.

Tell, long time no report: DX has been going fair, while not logging too many, have added some pretty good calls. Quality for quantity I guess. For Frey: Looking for the letter - and hey Pop Edge: not driving the Olds any more - got me a Chevy! Since the last report, have added the following to the logs - 1/14, heard KCNC before leaving for work in the AM. 1/15 brought KTKT on regular, KWBG and XEOR on ETs. The 16th saw WLRP at sunset and very weak. 1/19 was up at 5:00 studying for finals, and caught the sign-ons of WAGA and KWOB. The 21st I heard two DXes - CJOR and WLNA (CJOR was very weak, while WLNA was S 7-8 the whole time.) On the 24th I logged KEXO on regular, WLET & WNAH on f/cs and WGRA on their ET. Had to get up on 1/28 for the Arkansas parade and logged several others in addition to the fellows from the "home state." Some more notes must surely be due from me so here goes. I have had a month's vacation over Christmas - which is our summer, and during that time I have been out at my crib fishing and DXing. I logged about 100 new stations and got about the same number of fish. The biggest fish was a 6'6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " shark which I had to kill with a sheath knife over the side of the boat. Jan. 1 - KYW WJHP. 2nd - WENC KROP KYOR. 3rd - WSFC WHIS WGGG WDEF WJBC KMLB. 4th - WTHI KIT WDIG WOBS WOBB KONP. 5th - KERG KOWB. 6th, heard a test on 1510 kc/s., s/ off 8:40 NZT, 3:40 AM EST. ??? 7th - KTED WMGA WJMO. 8th - KRNO KUGN. 9th - WDUN. KOCA WEDC WCRS KAWT WVLK KWBC WAVE CBM. 10th - KELD WJNO WGAP KWRL WLOW WVCG. 11th - WHBF KFDX WCFL KBOA. 12th - WEAR KPHO KCGU WISL. 13th - WJOS KWLC KFJB. 14th, nil. 15th - XEOR KSWs. 16th - WFCI KWCR-DX KMUR-DX WFBR KCOK WPAM WCRK (never tuned 1490 so mided KCSU DX). 17th - WCMA WSGC WHKP. 19th - KDSX. 18th - WKPT. 20th - KXO KXLO WJBW. 21st - KROD. My latest veries are WABY which was logged on its f/c -(my most distant 250 watt verie.) KSJO 2LG 2XA KVET WPTR KNBY KNEU KRTN WHCC. Consider KENI, 550 kc/s., my best logging - Alaska is as tough as Pa. here in N.Z., so WPAM gets second. I consider the 30th of Dec. was the best night for reception I have heard in my DX career. Logged 10 from 3:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m. EST. The most remarkable signal being WMRY, 600 kc/s., 500 watts. It was on a par with N.Z. 10 kw. stations! Re those 2-tone signals - I hear them here on 1600, 1510 and on 950 kc/s. Appear to me to be on Eastern Seaboard. Just a footnote to say that Sunday, Jan. 29 yielded WMRC WNAV & KSTB, the first 2 on with March of the Dimes. 1400 kc/s. the same night (29th) EST had March of Dimes - said had been on since 1:30 previous day, and was going until 7:30 a.m. Call like WGBM or WBGW. (How about the new WGBG, in Greensboro, N.C.? -Ed.) Feb/6 - WNOR, 1230, all night, WJAY opening 4:00 a.m., 1280, KCLO 1410 and WFBG, 1460.

Not much DXing here in last month, since I've had to confine it to the weekends. But the next couple of weeks may be fruitful, with this institution being shut down on account of "coal shortage." On 2/13, reports sent to WAFB, 1460; KSMA, 1450, 3:30-3:45 test; KAWT, 4:00-4:15 test; and WJAY. On 2/15, KCRV, Caruthersville, Mo., 1370, all AM test; KRUS test at 4:00; KSEI just before sign/off at 2:00, and KCRA 3:30-4:00 Midnight Melody program. Veries surely are slow with only about a dozen last month, bringing total to 1615. Have been able to clear off some oldies, however, with success on the 4th follow-up from WKLX (Alexander Hudgins), WDUZ (Robert C. Nelson, Mgr.) and WUSN (W. M. A report like that should never be sent, but if any member still does wish to send reports in that category, please don't mention that you are a member of the National Radio Club, for such a poor report gives us a bad name. A station may get 30 fine reports, with return postage included, but one bad one, like on Page 4, without postage enclosed, is the one that they will remember longer. It's that way in other fields too - the poor example is the one many people judge organizations by. It shouldn't be, of course, but it does seem to be true. So send the best report you can every time.
